1. [CASAS] is currently living in PEPRIME. Headquarters interest in [CASAS] and possible operational leads which might accrue through contact with him was detailed in referenced dispatch. He was contacted by a Headquarters case officer at his home on 3 May 1963. [CASAS] was friendly and stated he would be willing to cooperate with KUBARK in any reasonable activity directed at unseating the Castro regime in Cuba. He subsequently provided personality information on several individuals working for the Castro regime and classified (by [CASAS]) as his close friends.

2. Ramon ALCUE (301-334089) was one individual listed by [CASAS] in this category. According to the latest information available to Headquarters, ALCUE is the Cuban Counsel General in Mexico City. Referenced dispatch also contained information in some detail on ALCUE as obtained during his (CASAS) debriefing by PEPRIME authorities in Opa-Locka, Florida. It also requested that Mexico City provide traces on ALCUE and comment on the nature of his activity there. To date we have no record of ever having received a reply to this request.

3. During our 3 May 1963 meeting with [CASAS] he provided the following information on ALCUE:

4. Ramon ALCUE, born about 1912, is presently employed as a Counsel with the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City. He is a long time friend of [CASAS]. They met during the mid-1950's when both were involved in revolutionary activities attempting to bring about

a democratic socialist regime in Cuba.

A Spanish teacher and was assigned to the Cuban province.

He was a very close friend of KALINOVICH. KALINOVICH was reportedly murdered by a group of Cuban revolutionaries.

KALINOVICH was "killed in action" while fighting "Counterrevolutionaries".

AZCUE was living in France and is believed to have been arrested by French authorities on charges resulting from his involvement in smuggling peacocks and other exotics into

France. [CASA] believes that AZCUE has ~~had~~ five children.

During early 1961 while in Mexico City, [CASA] extracted 04 AZCUE in order to obtain advice re the advisability of his defecting from the Castro regime and requesting political asylum in Mexico. As a result of this contact, [CASA] obtained 04 the impression that AZCUE is suffering from a desire to leave of funds. Since AZCUE is son-in-law of a man and a "heavy dresser", he feels this situation unpleasant. AZCUE also habitually has a mistress which in turn is a drain on his pocketbook.

b. According to [CASA], AZCUE is an avowed draftman who studied architecture at the University of Havana, although he never obtained a degree. [CASA] described him as a kind, 04 "lively" man, very "party-go-happy", and one who "dances with the wind". He doesn't seem to have the powers of concentration or dedication which would allow him to successfully pursue any endeavor to its conclusion. [CASA] feels AZCUE may have dedicated himself to the Castro regime since it offered him a purpose in life and a feeling of belonging to something.

c. [CASA] also described AZCUE as "possessing exceptional personal bravery". He felt that should AZCUE be approached by KUBARK and requested to cooperate in an illegal capacity, the physical danger involved in such activity would not play a major role in affecting his decision. In summary, [CASA] told that if AZCUE were approached by him on the basis of their long friendship, if suitable monetary compensation were offered coupled with suitable ideological arguments, there would be a reasonable chance that AZCUE would accept KUBARK's proposition as an agent to operate against the Castro regime. [CASA] cautioned 04 that these impressions were based on the acceptance he had with AZCUE during 1961 in Mexico City. It is possible that these and friends have converted AZCUE into an ~~agent~~ Castro supporter 04 ~~subversive~~. [CASA] is willing to detail this in writing on the basis of his assessment of AZCUE's personality.d. [CASA] suggested that it would be helpful in any approach to AZCUE, to attempt to convince him that Fidel CASTRO was directly involved with those revolutionaries responsible for ~~KALINOVICH~~ CASTRO's murder. Due to their close friendship AZCUE was apparently deeply affected by ~~KALINOVICH~~ death.e. We advised [CASA] ~~to~~ ⁰⁴ directly advise him that he would be willing to work cooperatively with us in an operational approach to recruit AZCUE indicating the possibility of a trip to Mexico City with a Headquarters case officer, and to report in the affirmative. He did state that before making a final decision he would have to weigh our specific proposal in terms of the timing vis-a-vis his regular employment and the danger that might accrue him and his family through such activity. In any case, we are proceeding on the assumption that [CASA] will cooperate with us on this matter and be available for a trip to Mexico City, if needed.

Mexico Station is therefore requested to contact and forward to Headquarters at the earliest practicable date an assessment of AZCUZ including comments on the possibility of using [CASAS] in a recruitment approach.
