MENORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SURJECT: Meeting with AMCORE-2

On 19 November 1968 ZEEPHAT wearing disguise, using the name John Kennington, and introducing himself as a Headquarters representative met with AMCORE-2. The meeting held in a Key Colony Motel cottage on Key Biscayne was also attended by William S. WIBALDA. The purpose of the meeting was to bring AMCORE-2's propaganda output into line with Station objectives and to confirm WIBALDA's authority as his MOFIRM case officer.

ZEEPHAT said that he had come to Minmi to talk with the persons that WOFIRM had chosen to continue its propaganda activities concorning Cuba. The prime spokesmen upon whom WOI-IRM relied for this purpose are AMSTRUT-2 and AMCORE-2. The reason he wanted to talk to these persons was to ensure that they understood what the desired line is and that they speak with one voice. WOFIRM sponsored propaganda toward and concerning Cuba had been subject to the inevitable process of erosion that accompanies any situation of political stalemate. WOFIRM would like to get a simple message across to Cuba, i.e. WOLADY accepts the necessity for continuing social progress throughout the Hemisphere and that it, therefore, has no interest in a return to the pre-revolutionary days with the accompanying stagnation of that era in Cuban demostic politics but would like to see a situation where progress across the board was possible - in short the situation that Fidel promised but then corrupted.

AMCORE-2 began his presentation by saying he had been asked to take lines and follow tactics in his propaganda that were unacceptable to him:

- 1. He had been asked to say "good things" about Castro. This he could not do as it would represent a "leftist" line that would be a departure from his established public position and would constitute an abandonment of his policy against identifying himself with any ideological line left, center, or right.
- 2. He questioned the wisdom of discussing events outside of Cuba since he felt constrained by the presence of military governments in Ricaragua, Peru, Panama and Argentina that would find applause for liberal developments offensive. He said he had been tailoring his material for general kil consumption rather than for Cuban audiences because he felt his present major vehicle, Radio Libertad, was not received in Cuba.

In response ZEEPHAT suggested that AMCORE-2's 1958-59 efforts to raise money to buy arms and planes for Castro and his public support for Fidel in 1959-60 helied his claim to being neuter politically. In any event, the matter of an ideological tag was semantic - the issue was his willingness to espouse the same sentiments and aspirations for reform and change that he stood for ten years ago. AMCORE-2 said this would be no problem for him and would permit him to claim a consistency of position. ZEEPHAT explained that his target, as for ANSTRUT-2 and all of us, is Cuba first and foremost. The targot is a selected rather than a wass one. Because of this, AMCORE-2's present vehicles, i.e. his broadcasts on MQBA and his writing for Diario were well suited for our purposes as we have reason to believe that this limited target group watch very carefully what is said by persons they consider to be unofficial spokesmen in Miami. These are good starting places while we look for additional outlets should the product warrant them. AMCORE-2 agreed to renew his treatment of the theme of the betrayed revolution, criticizing events in Cuba only in the context of when and where they fail to live up to the promises of 1959; citing examples of positive achievement elsewhere for comparison with the absence of conditions permitting similar progress in Cuba; and encouraging the Havena political establishment to take stock of what would be possible if

The for a Fidel vereing faustral to progressive movelengers—he made a pitch for a great faustral to permit it to increase its power. The pitch was deferred. He also ratsod the duestion of a hother the Mexican Government's policy on Cuba was a fair subject for attack. ZEEPHAT said that he preferred that AMCORE-2 concentrate on the more positive program outlined above rather than taking on the policies of a government with which this country maintained a close relationship. He also said that AMCORE-2's scripts concorning U.S. domostic politics and personalities, e.g. attacking Senator Fulbright, urging votes for Mr. Nixon and discussing the policies of the two major parties, were totally unacceptable as they violated the operating charter of MOPTIMI. ZHEPHAT closed by underscoring WINALDA's role as the WOFIRM coordinates of radio activitius conducted by AMCORE-2, AMSTRET-2, AMRAZOR-1 and AMLYRIC-1, Those discusaions were friendly and easy. The implementation is as unpredictable as the personality of this vain and ambitious man.
