A Cuban exile who was prominent in politics at the Provincial level in Cuba, source is well known by the Cuban exiles and SOURCE: has reported objectively on their political maneuvers. This information was obtained from Orlando Puente Pérez.

- Orlando <u>Puente</u> Perez, secretary to former Cuban President Carlos <u>Prio Socarrás</u>, said that while on a trip to the West Coast in mid-October 1963 he had talked with Luis Somoza, former Nicaraguan President, who was planning to make a trip to Japan. Somoza asked Puente to tell Prio that the latter could count on Somoza's full support, and as soon as he returned from Japan, a mobilization of men in Nicaragua would begin for attacks against Cuba. According to the present schedule, such attacks would start taking place in early December 1963. Puente strongly asserted that all equipment necessary to wage a campaign against Fidel Gastro is available, including aircraft and trained pilots.
- Prio has delegated to Puente the responsibility of completing the details of the plan with Jaime Varela Canosa, President of the Association of Veterans of the Bay of Pigs (AVBC), Aldo Vera Association of Veterans of the Bay of Pigs (AVBC); Aldo Vera Scrafin, leader of American Parriotic Action Movement (NMPA). Elay Gutierrez Menoyo, leader of the Second National Front of the Escambray (SFNE), and Nino Diaz, all of whom have agreed to participate in Prio's plan by contributing men. According to Puente, Somoza has decided to let Prio himself carry out the plan for the fight against Castro. Puente feels that, despite Prio's indecisive character, he has decided to spend the money needed for the job, since he feels that this is his last opportunity to windicate himself in the guess of Cuban and House States pariously vindicate himself in the eyes of Cuban and United States nationals.
