1. Subject's employment terminated his employment with the firm in 1963. He moved his family and belongings back to the States in 1964, sailing as captain on one of the last ships of the firm, he left on a voyage to Japan, Korea, Puerto Rico, Mexico and Canada. He expects to be back in the States by the end of the year. Subject's return from Canada in October 1964 was reported to the FBI. Subject was informed that the Federal Bureau of Investigation was interested in the subject's activities, decided not to open up files on him. The subject of Reference B however, was still interested in the subject's activities and spoke in general terms of a trip to the States. He also mentioned a possible forwarding concern in the States, and a possible connection with the FBI. Subject's connection and using his address, their business, and only if it is not as enthusiastic about the possibility of his being able to do the same. Subject's concept was a temporary stay in the States, and a general superintendent. Upon his return from his present trip, Subject will again be in touch with Subject of Reference B to receive this message.

2. Subject was paid his monthly salary of \$600.00 through 30 September. By mutual agreement between subject and his superiors pending Subject's return and reassignment in North Carolina. If he is in a position providing access to information of value either in the FBI or another Bureau field of interest, he will be made available. If no such access develops, we will continue occasional contact with him to assess his ability to determine his suitability as a CASPER or other project work.

3. From June 1964 through the end of December 1964, Subject was sent by Thomas B. (Boss) Buckley, Manager, Marketing, approximately twice per month. During this period, Subject was responsible for the FBI's trade picture. In light of the fact that the FBI has a responsibility for the procurement and shipment of goods for the FBI's own use and consumption. The letter of credit for the shipment was issued on 11/11/64 in London.
