1. The following paragraphs summarize information relayed telephonically to the Bureau, and are forwarded to you for confirmation and for your files.

2. On 28 April 1968, [REDACTED] representative in [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] a [REDACTED] visited the American Embassy, at the request of the local [REDACTED] Ambassador, and reported that he had seen a man in [REDACTED] on 23 April 1968 who strongly resembled newspaper photographs of Eric Stavro Galt, who is currently wanted in connection with the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King. [REDACTED] said that he saw the Subject at the desk of the [REDACTED] Hotel on the afternoon of 23 April when both were checking out of the hotel. [REDACTED] was accidentally given the hotel accounting receipt for the Subject, on which he noted "Name: [REDACTED]". In a short conversation with Subject [REDACTED] learned that Subject was employed by the [REDACTED] and was en-route to [REDACTED] on an 18 month contract. Subject told [REDACTED] that he had recently arrived in [REDACTED] from [REDACTED] via [REDACTED] on [REDACTED] Airlines.

3. The above information was relayed to the Bureau upon receipt by our duty officer on 29 April 1968. We were advised that the Bureau records did

[redacted] [CF] departed the U. S. on 9 October 1967 for employment with [redacted] [CF]. He has been resident in [redacted] [CF] since that date, except for the period 10-23 April, when he went to [redacted] [CF] on leave. Date of Birth: 24 April 1933. Occupation: Welder. Home Address: [redacted] [CF] Married, wife in U. S. Father: [redacted] [CF] (city and state not recorded).

5. [redacted] [C] representative also obtained a passport photograph of the Subject from the [redacted] [CF] and is forwarding the photo to our Headquarters. Later on 30 April, [redacted]
