Re: Status of Records Review

Dear John:

In order to assist us in laying out a strategy to complete the Review Board's work, we wish to pose several questions about the overall status of the CIA's review of records. In so doing, we do not intend to impose a significant burden; rather, we are asking for best estimates based on readily available information.

The questions are as follows:

- (1) What is the total amount of CIA records (in numbers of documents, pages, linear inches or any other appropriate measurement) identified as assassination records? If there are any publicly available lists or indices of these records, please provide us with copies.
- (2) Of that amount, how much has been processed and sent to the JFK Collection at NARA? How long do you anticipate it will take for you to process the rest?
- (3) Have you identified any sets of records as potentially responsive to the JFK Act, but as to which you are uncertain whether they should be processed as assassination records? If so, please describe the size and general content of these sets of records.
