Re: ARRB Review of 12 House Select Committee on Assassinations (HSCA)
Records Referred to the FBI by NARA

Dear Carol:

I am enclosing copies of twelve (12) records that the Review Board intends to review at its meeting of June 25-26. Should the FBI wish to request postponements in any of the records, we ask that evidence in support of such requests be forwarded to the ARRB by June 18, 1996.

The Review Board believes that these HSCA records may be among those referred to the Bureau by the National Archives and Record Administration (NARA) during its initial processing of HSCA material under the John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act (JFK Act). None of the records is FBI-originated. None, in our judgment, contains substantive FBI equities. Our Board would therefore like to clear these documents for public release.

All of these records are associated with New Orleans District Attorney Jim Garrison's investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy. Eight of the twelve records are investigative memos, interview transcripts or correspondence generated by the investigation. One record is a transcript of a contemporaneous interview conducted by a New Orleans media outlet in connection with its coverage of the investigation. Three of the records are associated with the HSCA's follow-up of Garrison investigation leads during the Committee's 1976-1978 proceedings.
