

Fed. Reg. notice insert at end of text and before list of determinations:

Three further points of explanation are in order:

(1) Three of the records listed below (124-10058-10009, 124-10239-10385, and 124-10275-10359) were the subjects of a prior notice of determinations (published at 60 Federal Register 62066). Since that notice, the Review Board decided to reconsider its determinations on these records. Upon reconsideration, the Review Board decided at the December 12-13, 1995 meeting to sustain one additional redaction in each record, but to postpone the opening of the records in full for five years, rather than until the year 2017, as originally determined.

(2) Copies of two of the assassination records listed below, 180-10097-10495 and 180-10087-10362, are already available to the public in unredacted form as part of the House Select Committee on Assassinations (HSCA) materials at the JFK Collection maintained by the National Archives at College Park, Maryland. The Review Board nevertheless took action with respect to these assassination records because the United States Secret Service wished to redact some of the information contained therein.

(3) Prior notices of final determinations have referred to postponed records' "next review date." Starting with this notice, the Review Board is adopting the term "release date," which more accurately describes the intent of the Review Board and the statutory effect of its determinations. See, e.g., 44 U.S.C. 2107.9(c)(3)(B) (Review Board, whenever it sustains a postponement, must "designat[e] a recommended specified time at which or a specified occurrence following which the material may be appropriately disclosed to the public"). The Review Board intends that records

postponed under its prior determinations should, at the specified “next review date,” be opened in full to the public.
