This memorandum briefly summarizes the status of missing original Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) case files or portions of case files in the President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection (JFK Collection) and documents the National Archives and Records Administration's (NARA) efforts to reconstruct these records, where possible, from duplicate copies of documents located in other FBI files.

As the JFK Collection was first compiled and reviewed in the 1990s, the Assassination Records Review Board and the FBI designated some records as "not believed relevant" (NBR) or "not assassination related" (NAR). The FBI retained custody of the NBR/NAR records and postponed their transfer to NARA until a later date. Every document or group of documents ("serials"), however, received an indexed Record Identification Form (RIF) and FBI inventory sheet for insertion into the JFK Collection.

After an extensive search, neither the FBI nor the National Archives could locate a small number of NAR documents or case files.

This compilation represents NARA's efforts to reconstruct the original file or portions of the file, as completely as possible, with duplicate copies of documents located in the FBI field office and headquarters files within the JFK Collection. Each reconstructed file or compilation contains a Record Identification Form, an explanatory cover memo, existing administrative documents available within the JFK Collection, and copies of identified duplicate documents. The table below summarizes the status of FBI file BH 66-2280, Serials 10 through 25.



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


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

NOTE: By teletype dated 8/10/77, captioned "Harold Weisberg v. U. S. Department of Justice (USDC), D.C. (Civil Action No. 75-1996), Freedom of Information Act Matter, Bureau Deadline August 31, 1977," to all above offices except Miami, instructions were issued to reproduce MURKIN files for FOI-PA regarding Weisberg's law suit. FOI-PA purposes, however, did not require serialization accounting and the field was instructed to include only documents not directed to or received from FBIHQ and Memphis.

Recipients of this teletype have been contacted telephonically in an effort to coordinate these two projects involving the MURKIN files.

Offices in question were determined by the HSCA to be key offices in the MURKIN investigation. By letter dated 7/28/77, the HSCA requested field office files with the exception of Chicago and St. Louis, which were added at the conference on 8/16/77. Field office files involved consist of approximately 150 sections and 12,500 serials.

At the meeting on 8/16/77, HSCA officials desired that the Congressional Inquiry Unit (CIU) review all incoming field office serials and check each against the FBIHQ and Memphis files to insure that all communications were actually received and filed. This request was rejected and a compromise was reached whereby the CIU will check a small random sampling of field serials to verify their existence in either the FBIHQ or Memphis file.

Meeting on 8/16/77, at the HSCA office was attended by Mr. Blakey and Robert Lehner of the HSCA; D. O. Coulson of the Legal Counsel Division and J. T. Aldhizer of the CIU. In addition, this matter was coordinated on 8/17/77, with Robert Keuch, Special Counsel to the Attorney General, who is conducting liaison with the HSCA for the Department of Justice.

The above described magazines have been reviewed and found to be without notations of any kind. An enclosed FD-302, Serial 819, dated 4/12/68, and memorandum, Serial 2118, dated 1/7/69, explain how and why these magazines were obtained.

It should be noted that the Xerox copies of the four Mayfield Cleaners and Hatters receipt books are not as legible as might be desired. This is due to the fact that they were made from carbon copies, themselves not highly legible.

Although the reason as to why the serial numbers are missing is not determinable, it is felt that all could be simply the result of mis-serializing. This theory is supported indirectly by the fact that some numbers have been used more than once within this same file without having been discovered until this review of the file.

The enclosed serials have been separated according to the respective volumes from which they came, and arranged chronologically.

Serials 495 and 496 are copies of California Identification Records for HARVEY EDWARD LOHMEYER and THERAL BURNS LYMAN respectively. These serials are actually enclosures to Serial 497, an airtel to Memphis, however, they have been xeroxed and enclosed to maintain continuity in chronology.

NOTE: The HSCA's requests were included in a letter to the Attorney General from G. Robert Blakey, Chief Counsel and Director, HSCA, on 12/13/77. It is believed the HSCA is considering interview of some agents involved in COINTELPRO activities against King and SCLC and in the MURKIN investigation. The HSCA has requested expeditious handling of its King related requests and, therefore, a Bureau deadline in this matter is being established.

Counterintelligence efforts against King and SCLC were carried out in the substantive investigative files as well as under the COINTEL Program. Therefore, the field is being required to provide case agents in all of these matters.

It is believed the HSCA is considering interview of some agents involved in COINTELPRO activities against King and SCLC and in the MURKIN investigation. The HSCA has requested expeditious handling of its King related requests and, therefore, a Bureau deadline in this matter is being established.

Counterintelligence efforts against King and SCLC were carried out in the substantive investigative files as well as under the COINTEL Program. Therefore, the field is being required to provide case agents in all of these matters.

Kennedy and Martin Luther King, Jr. In connection with the King matter, the HSCA has been advised that the National States Rights Party (MSRP), Jesse B. Stoner and Dr. Edward Fields were subjects of electronic/surveillance by the FBI. HSCA, by letter dated 2/8/78, requested access to FBI materials pertaining to electronic surveillances of these subjects during the period 1956 through 1965.

Appropriate records at FBIHQ disclosed the below information concerning electronic surveillance of the following subjects:

(1) Subject of microphone surveillance from 2/28/64 to 3/1/64 at the Sheraton Hotel, Louisville, Kentucky (LS 337-RAC*). This hotel was site of an MSRP convention but installation was not feasible except to cover the motel room of Fields.

It is noted that FBINQ files reveal authorization of other electronic surveillances of the NSRP, but installation in those instances was not completed. The HSCA request is being interpreted to include only instances where actual surveillance was conducted.

On February 22, 1978, Coleman D. Geary, III, Special Agent, assigned to the Birmingham, Alabama, office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), was interviewed by Michael Eberhardt and Peter Beeson, staff members of HSCA, in their office located at 3rd and D Street, Southwest, Washington, D. C.

The following matters were discussed generally:

Agent Geary's bureau service and assignments in the Birmingham Office since 1956; spere of influence, membership and propensity for violence of Klan organizations, National States Rights Party, white citizens councils, black militant groups in existence during the 1950's and 1960's; any type of threats known by Special Agent Geary to be made against civil rights leader Martin Luther King during the period of time in the late 1950's and 1960's, when he was active in civil rights movement in Alabama and in the south; policies of the FBI concerning canvassing sources and informants prior to and during the period of time civil rights leaders were traveling in Alabama and in the south in the 1950's and 1960's; the extent of dissemination of any pertinent information obtained through these canvasses of sources and informants; J. B. Stoner's involvement with the National States Rights Party and Klan organizations, and his involvement in bombings in the south in the 1950's and 1960's, as well as information as to any national or foreign contacts with individuals or similar-type groups as mentioned above, he may have had during this period of time.
