Interview: In accordance with the request of Team #1 and relative to their "Motive Issue," specific questions were asked of Mr. Barbe.

(Subject was previously interviewed 2/14/78)

Answer: The conversations that Mr. Barbe can remember were very brief and occurred over a two-week period. Oswald's exact words are hard to remember, but his personality and behavior seemed very immatur and quiet.

Question 2: Who usually initiated the contacts of Oswald?

Answer: Mr. Barbe in no idle conversation.

Question 3: Did most of their conversations center on politics or other topics?

Answer: Lee Harvey Oswald had to enter his work schedule into a spiral notebook called "An Oiler's Log."

Mr. Barbe stated that this log was written different from the other oilers. Oswald, in Barbe's opinion, was either trying to determine if anyone read the log or was trying to glorify his job. The notebook contained entries such as "changed master tapes," "checked millimeters of machine," or words to that effect. These books were given to the FBI and they had Mr. Barbe initial the pages with Lee Harvey Oswald's writing. Mr. Barbe believes that only the pages with Lee Harvey Oswald's writing were taken by the FBI.
