: American Defectors

Reference is made to a verbal request to you from the DC/OS for information regarding any American citizens who have defected to the USSR, Red China, or other Satellite countries during the past sighteen months—other than Bernon F. MITCHELL and William H. MARTIN, and five other defectors regarding whom Mr. OTEPKA of the State Department Security Office already has information (i.e. Robert Edward-WEBSTER, EE-18854; Lee Harvey OSWALD, MS-11164; Libero EICCIARDELLI, MS-8295; Vladimir SLOBODA, MS-10565; and Joseph DUTKANICZ, MS-10724).

tecurity files reflect that the subjects of the attached memorands are additional American citizens who have defected to the Sovietz or their Satellites during the past eighteen months.

Several of the above referred to defectors have been of interest to CIA:

Herbert Lee NORTHRUP, 48923, was a staff employee of this Agency from May 1951 to May 1958. A more detailed summary than that included in the attached group has been prepared on him.

Robert Edward WEBSTER, EE-18852, and Nicholas PETRULLI, EE-19439, were subjected OO/C requests on 29 May 1959 and 18 June 1939, respectively, with a view to their being debrisfed upon their returns from visits to Russia. Neither was interviewed by CIA, either before or after their visits.

With reference to Nicholas PETRULLI, it is noted that his commission Michael Thomas SCHIRALLI, SSD 34233, is a former CIA covertiemployee, who was assigned to the Robalo site in Panama under Project FI-HOPETUL and also took part in PASUCCESS. As of July 1954 he was to be debriefed as he chose to return to private employment. SCHIRALLI advised during an IRD interview in May 1953

SCHEALLI was born and raised on Long Island; and nabsequently was employed in various places on Long Island. From February to April 1950, he was employed by a TV firm in Valley Stream, Long Island;

Vindimir ELOBODA is currently of interest to Security in view of his assignment (prior to his delection to the Seviet Union, viz East Germany, on 3 August 1760) to the 513th Military Intalligence Group in Frankfurt, Germany, (EGIS Conter). Here he had contact with at least one representative of CIA and was in a position to have learned the identities of CIA personnel at the EGIS Center.

William A. MORGAN has been of interest to Security to that on 27 March 1959, CLOA requested a check on him, in connection with his contemplated use by the Canno Dook/WH for purposes of contact and debriefing. However, WH cancelled its request as of 5 May 1959.

Edward NIXON, on a September 1960, approached a CIA agent in Freedy's Bar in Damastone and engaged him in conversation, following which our agent found himself under surveillance. The surveillance continued for two days, after which our agent was approached in Freedy's Bar by an unknown G-2 officer who asked him about NIXON; and thereafter the surveillance caused. (The owner of Freedy's Bar had reported NIXON; to G-3, as he said he was raining his business.)

White defectors to Cuba and the UAR may not technically be defectors to Seviet Satellite countries, it seems a close thing, and the names of such known defectors to the past eighteen ments have been in duded in this memorandam.
