Visiting ELOBODA is currently of interest to Security in view of the accignment (prior to his defection to the Soviet Union, via Last Germany, on I Angust 1960) to the 513th Military Intelligence Orean in Frankfurt, Germany, (EGIS Center). Here he had contact with at least one representative of CIA and was in a position to have learned the identities of CIA personnel at the EGIS Center.

William A. MORGAN has been of interest to Socurity to that on 27 March 1959, CI/OA requested a check on him. In consection with his contemplated use by the Cuban Dook/WH for purposes of centact and debriefing. However, AH cancelled its request as of 5 May 1959.

Edward NIXON on a September 1960, approached a CIA agent in Freedy's Bar in Damactee and engaged him in conversation, following which our agent ferne himself under surveillance. The surveillance continued for two days, after which our agent was approached in Freedy's Bar by an unknown C-2 efficer who asked him about NIXON; and thereafter the surveillance ceased. (The owner of Freedy's Bar bad reported MIXON; to G-2, as he said he was ruining his business.)

While defectors to Cobs. and the UAR may not technically be defectors to Soviet Satellite countries, it seems a close thing, and the names of such known defectors to the past eighteen meathe bave been induced in this memorandum.
