I. Introduction.

III. Ambassador PISIVER's emperation with Fereign Almister of the Dominian Republis.

4. In addition to Mr. PANLEY's statement, the WH Division has copies of Embassy dispatches He. Moh and Moh of 9 and 11 February 1957 entitled, "The MURPHY and de la MALA cases" which report labbassador W.T. PHELYTR's conversation with the Desimious Republic's Foreign Minister, HERMERA. The Foreign Minister, in conversation with the Ambassador, had informally complained of the "disrespect and impedence" of U.S. Charge d'Affairs, Richard H. STEPHMS and the alleged "incumniose" of Mr. BHETT questioning the verscity of official Desimican statements portaining to the death of a Desimican astional, is la MALA. 5. The Ambassador's dispatches to the Department of State indicated that he did not share the views of the Foreign Minister.
