Dear Ar. Sauger:

The purpose of this letter is to try, once and for all, to determine the final whereabouts of Amelia Carhart and Fred Moonan. As you know, their flight ended in an unexplained mustery in the early hours of July 2, 1937. Momenous people have written about this flight and what took place after it was concluded, but there is not one positive shread of evidence pointing to the final destination of these people and what there final hours of life were like.

The United States Navy spent untold dollars in 1937 to try and locate Miss Eachart and Mr. Moonan. They were unable to make a complete survey the to the fact that some of the area was under the control of the Japanese Espire.
