Dear Sir:

The National Broadcasting Company is planning to broadcast the arrival at Oakland Airport of Amelia Earhart at a date which, as you know, is still undetermined. The broadcast will include not only a description of the landing but we hope an interview of Miss Earhart herself. Our telephone facilities connecting Oakland Airport to our studies at 111 Sutter Street have been installed by the phone company terminating adjacent to the Naval Reserve hangar at the Oakland Airport.

We have information to the effect that Miss Earhart's plane may be taxied into the Reserve hangar immediately upon landing and before she disembarks. It would therefore be highly desirable from our standpoint to secure advance permission for our party, consisting of approximately six men; announcers, technicians and the man in charge; to have entry to the hangar, both at the time of the broadcast and also sufficiently in advance of broadcast time to permit of necessary testing. We realize that the hangar as Government property is not normally open to non-service people, but earnestly appeal for your cooperation on this occasion.

As a point of information for yourself, our New York Office has made all the negotiations with Miss Earhart's management for this broadcast as an exclusive NBC feature, and it is therefore incumbent upon this Western Division to provide the necessary facilities. Obviously, if Miss Earhart's plane does taxi into the hangar immediately, and is blocked from our microphone by intervening crowds, we will be in a rather embarrassing position.

We hope it is not presuming to urge a reply at your very earliest opportunity.

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

#### MEMORANDUM FOR THE ADMIRAL:

SUBJECT: Flight of Miss Earhart.

- 1. The data on this subject available on board consists of:
  - (a) A file of despatches based on Secnav despatch 1315-1544 of February, 1937.
  - (b) Memorandum to Chief of Staff from Fleet Aerologist Officer outlining aerological plan.
  - (c) File of letters between Chief of Staff and Mr. Putnam, and to Captain Whiting, Commanding FAB Pearl Harbor.
  - 2. The general arrangements for the flight are as follows:
  - (d) U.S.S. WHIPPOORWILL take station midway between Honolulu and Howland Island.
  - (e) Coast Guard Cutter ROGER B. TANEY to Howland Island with aerological unit.
  - (f) Lieutenant A. E. True, Aerological Officer, is on board the U.S.C.G. ROGER B. TANEY. with two aviation succlassics
  - (g) U.S.S. ONTARIO to take station midway between Howland Island and British New Guinea.
  - (h) Aerological unit to be placed on board U.S.S. NECHES and BRAZOS, which will be enroute between Pearl Harbor and the West Coast during the approximate period of the flight.
- 3. Attention is invited to the last two despatches on the file outlining the limits of radio frequency at which the ONTARIO and WHIPPOORWILL can operate.



Dear Capt. Pickens:

Thank you for your letter of January 23rd and for all the trouble you are taking in connection with these matters.

I am, as suggested, taking the matter up with the Bureau of Navigation and also with the Pan American Airways people.

Please express to the Commander-in-Chief the gratitude of Miss Earhart and myself for his generous cooperation.

When Miss Earhart gets to Honolulu the preparation of a weather map covering the next two hops -- to Howland and New Guinea -- will be vastly important. We will attempt to secure some special data from points in that general sector and in Australia. Which data will be useful in making a forecast at Honolulu. We would also, through you, pick up any data available from Naval vessels in the region.

If possible will you please do the necessary to designate an aerologist at the base in Honolulu to cooperate with us in this matter. If in order, I request that he be informed of the situation and requested to cooperate with Miss Earhart. If you will let me know his name I will put in touch with him our representative at Honolulu, who will be in general charge of handling the shore end of the flight at that point. Then they can coordinate their arrangements.

In line with your suggestion, I will appreciate it if you will supply an aerologist from the Navy Air Station in Pearl Harbor to accompany the Coast

MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief of Staff.

With reference to paragraph 5, the aerological officer at Pearl Harbor is Lieutenant A. E. True, attached to the Fleet Air Base. He is the only aerological officer in that vicinity and could probably be of most help by remaining at Pearl Harbor and cooperating with Mr. Cogswell. Radio facilities at Pearl Harbor will permit reception of weather from the South Sea Islands and Australia, relayed by Naval Radio at Samoa or Guam.

Lieutenant True made a trip on the RAMAPO to China this past summer and should be quite familiar with aviation weather facilities from Pearl Harbor to Australia.

With reference to paragraph 6, it is assumed that an aerographer is wanted and not an aerologist (this is a slight technicality which is often confusing. An aerologist is a commissioned officer, an aerographer an enlisted man holding the rating of aerographer, chief, first, second, or third). Mr. Putnam evidently misconstrued your letter in which you mentioned that an aerographer could be made available for the Coast Guard Cutter, DUANE. At the present time the following enlisted personnel are attached to the Fleet Air Base, Pearl Harbor:

Lindeman, T. Chief Aerographer Hartman, J.M. Aerog. 2/c House, F. W. Aerog. 3/c Beason, C.A. Aerog. 3/c

Lindeman is best qualified for the temporary duty on the DUANE, particularly if it should involve any forecasting duty from Howland to New Guinea, though I believe the final decision for the flight from Pearl Harbor to Australia should be made at Pearl Harbor, where the most complete radio and weather facilities will be available. If this plan is decided upon, anyone of the other men are qualified to make pilot balloon soundings and surface reports.

During the Fleet Problem several of these men will probably be sent out on advance base operations for the patrol squadrons, probably leaving Pearl Harbor one or two weeks ahead of commencement of the Problem.

Dear Mr. Putnam.

The reply to your letter of January 15th has been delayed by the Flagship's absence at sea. The Commander-in-Chief, U. S. Fleet, stands ready to assist you in the proposed flight in any way he can. As regards your request for the services of Lieutenant Stevens for the first few weeks in March at the Naval Reserve Air Station at Cakland, unfortunately Lieutenant Stevens will be absent in the Canal Zone and Caribbean for the period 2 February - 27 March, and therefore his services will not be available.

The ordering of officers to temporary duty and especially so when such duty involves travel expense, is not within the province of the Commanderin-Chief, but comes under the Bureau of Navigation in the Navy Department. I suggest that you get in touch with that Bureau and see if they find it possible to order an experienced aerologist for temporary duty at the Naval Reserve Air Station at Oakland in connection with the proposed flight.

The most experienced officer qualified for aerological duty is Lieutenant T. J. Raftery, now stationed at Naval Air Station, Anacostia, D. C., but owing to the distance invalved and the possibility that his services cannot be spared, it may be that he can not be ordered.

There are a number of officers in the Fleet on the West Coast and at Naval Air Stations San Diego and Pearl Harbor, Cahu, who can be made available for this temporary duty if you can make the necessary arrangements with the Bureau of Navigation.

Probably your very best weather advisor is the weather predicting organization Panama Airways Clipper Ship organization at Alameda, California.

At present, owing to the scarcity of reports from ships in the Pacific, weather predictions in regard to the area of your proposed flight are extremely difficult. If you will keep me informed when you feel reasonably sure of the approximate date, we will arrange to get you complete weather information from any naval snips which may be at see in the area. Unfortunately such ships will be few and far apart.

I suggest that you arrange with the Coast Guard to have an aerographer on the cutter making the trip to Honolulu and Howland. A qualified aerographer with necessary equipment from the Maval Air Station Pearl Harbor, can be supplied if agreeable to the Coast Guard.

The most difficult part of your weather problem appears to be from Howland on to Australia. Over this area I regret to say that we are in no position to be of much assistance. It will be necessary for you to arrange to obtain such weather reports in that area as you may be able to obtain.

I note you desire to keep this matter confidential, and will be governed accordingly.

Dear Capt. Pickens:

This is in tardy acknowledgment of your letter acknowledging mine of December 7th informing the Commander-in-Chief that the proposed refueling operation of Miss Earhart's plane at Midway Island has been abandoned.

For your information the present plan contemplates a direct flight from Honolulu to Howland Island. You are doubtless aware that on January 12th the United States C.G. Cutter Duane left Pearl Harbor for Howland with personnel and equipment to construct an emergency landing field thereon.

From Howland Miss Earhart contemplates flying to New Guinea, probably using the airport at Lae there. From Lae she hopes to proceed to Port Darwin and thence on the conventional airways route to Karachi.

We are grateful for the Commander-in-Chief's intimation that he will be pleased to render such assistance as may be practical.

When Miss Earhart made her solo flight from Honolulu to San Francisco, we were greatly assisted by Lieutenant Emory W Stephens, then stationed at Pearl Harbor as, I think, meteorological officer. His knowledge of Pacific weather, and his cooperation were tremendously valuable.

Since then Lieutenant Stephens has been to Howland and has cruised much of the southwest Pacific involved in Miss Earhart's plan. I am advised he is now on board the U.S.S. Wright.

It will be most helpful to Miss Earhart, and greatly appreciated, if it were possible, if Lieutenant Stephens could be temporarily assigned to the Naval

Reserve Air Station at Oakland so that he could be there after the first of March for a few weeks. If this could be done, the entire weather problem for the Pacific stages of the journey would be focused through him. Miss Parhart for instance, would not take off from the est for Oakland until the weather probabilities, as diagnosed by Stephens, were satisfactory westward to Australia.

Will you please let me know if it is possible to grant this request.

For your information I am advised from Washington that the Coast Guard Cutter will make another trip from Honolulu to Howland immediately prior to the flight, taking out gasoline, a couple of mechanics, and standing by at the island until her arrival, rendering radio navigational assistance and ultimately returning the personnel from Howland to Honolulu.

If by any chance a Naval vessel in the course of its duties should be in the general vicinity, it would, of course, be most helpful if such vessel should be stationed at the time of the flight somewhere on the route between Honolulu and Howland or, even better, southwesterly of Howland on the general course to Lae and British Guinea.

Please understand we are deeply appreciative of the generous cooperation thus far given and we do not want to impose unduly. The suggestions are made on the chance that they could be acted upon with reasonable convenience from the Navy's standpoint.

I shall be headquartered at this office until mid-February; and thereafter at Union Air Terminal, Burbank, California, in connection with final preparations for the flight.

You understand, of course, that the entire project remains for the present confidential.

### MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief of Staff.

- 1. In connection with the proposed flight, the Commander-in-Chief may render assistance in the following ways:
  - (a) Provide observations of winds aloft by ordering aerographers, (one man with pilot balloon gear to each ship), to several of the ships transiting the Pacific during March. Information of wind conditions aloft along the route would be of great assistance in planning the flight and, also, during the flight if radio communication is maintained. Below is a list of the prospective movements for March:

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An aerographer in the BRAZOS, NECHES, and KANAWHA would ensure adequate information of winds aloft.

- (b) Direct all Naval vessels transiting the Pacific to make surface reports every six hours as at present for Pan American Airways during the present strike.
- (c) Send an aerographer from Fleet Air Base, Pearl Harbor, with expeditionary equipment to Howland Island in the Coast Guard Cutter leaving Honolulu just prior to flight. This man would provide special surface and upper air reports of extreme value to the flight from Honolulu to Howland Island. The information obtained while down there would be of great value for future patrol plane operations since we have very little weather data over this area.
- (d) An aerographer in the ARCTIC on the trip to Samoa 30 January to 22 March would provide additional data from Pearl Harbor

to Samoa and if the flight were scheduled between 13-22 March. additional observations, surface and aloft, from Pearl Harbor to San Francisco.

It is not known what arrangements are being made to obtain weather reports along the route. Surface reports and upper air data will be required from San Francisco to Pearl Harbor, Howland Island, South Sea Islands, (to watch for tropical hurricanes, frequent this season of the year), and Australia. Naval radio facilities at Samoa are available to collect and forward the South Sea Islands reports direct to Naval Radio at Pearl Harbor for further transmission to Oakland.

Special arrangements will have to be made to receive the Australian weather reports and such other reports as may be available over the route from Howland Island to New Guinea, since all Australian weather broadcasts are sent out on low frequency of limited range (probably 800 miles).

- The files do not show any Naval vessels which will be in the general vicinity between Honolulu and Howland, or between Howland and British Guinea, during this month. The ONTARIO is at Tutuila and the GOLD STAR and PENGUIN at Guam; both about 1400 miles from the general route.
- Lieutenant E.W. Stephens is attached to the WRIGHT and will be enroute to and in the Canal Zone Area during most of February and March (2 February to 27 March). Other officers qualified for this assignment are:
- (a) Lt.Comdr. C. J. Maguire, Naval Air Station, San Diego.
- (b) Lieutenant Arnold E. True, Fleet Air Base, Pearl Harbor. (c) Lieutenant Robert O. Minter, Staff Commander Battle Force. (d) Lieutenant T. J. Raftery, Naval Air Station, Anacostia, D.C.

Lieutenant Raftery has had the most experience with Pacific weather. He was at Pearl Harbor for two years and Scouting Force Aerologist for two years. However, he is on duty at Anacostia. other officers have had several years of aerological duty.

In view of the fact that the RANGER. LANGLEY, and LEXINGTON aerological units will be in the San Diego area during March, one officer could be made available for this assignment.

Several confidential reports of weather conditions from Pearl Harbor to Samoa, including Lieutenant Stephens' report, are available in our files.
