The President has requested me to reply to your telegram of January 8, 1937 advising him that the plan arranged by Admiral Standley to refuel your plane west of Hawaii on the proposed round the world flight this spring has been abandomed and that you intend to land, instead, on Howland Island, if the construction of an emergency landing field on that Island is completed by that time.

An allocation of Federal funds has been made by the President to the Works Progress Administration to enable the Bureau of Air Commerce to carry out the construction of such a field.

Just before you left for South America I wrote you about my proposed round the world flight this spring and hoped for Navy cooperation in refuelling west of Hawaii, which was subsequently kindly arranged by Admiral Standley. Since then the necessity for such difficult and costly maneuvers has been obviated and instead I hope to land on tiny Howland Island where the Government is about to establish an emergency field. Commerce approves my plan, Interior very cooperative, Coast Guard ditto, all details arranged. Construction party with equipment due to sail from Honolulu next week. Am now informed apparently some question regarding WPA appropriation in amount three thousand dollars which covers all costs other than those borne by me for this mid-Pacific pioneer landing field which permanently useful and valuable aeronautically and nationally. Requisition now on desk of A. V. Keene, Bureau of Budget, Treasury Department. Understand its moving requires Executive approval under circumstances could you expedite as immediate action vital. William Miller, Bureau of Air Commerce delegated by Roper and Johnson to work with me is familiar with entire situation. Please forgive troublesome female flyer for whom this Howland Island project is key to world flight attempt.
