It is a great pleasure to be with you tonight to welcome Miss Earheart to the shores of our Bay and to the city of Oakland. But as for introducing Wiss Earheart,—even to so distinguished an audience——

Miss Earheart, I would not dream of introducing you to any audience in America. We all know you already.

But to welcome you to a band of Californians, to that intrepid body of women who have pioneered to California, is a great privilege.

Our generation came in the first automobiles, by gas, over roads of which you can not dream.

Our mothers came by steam in the earliest trains, amazed at the comfort with which they got their children through,—letting them sleep and eat and play on the train for six days.

Our grandmothers, thought their pioneering was deluxe, --all the way in more or less comfortable boats, windpower, exc pt the trail across
