

Amelia Earhart and her navigator, Fred Neonan, have come to grief in their perilous round-the-world flight. Several hundred miles from Howland Island, in the mid-Pacific, their great plane--fitted cut as a flying laboratory--is down---stranded on a coral reff it's believed from fragmentary and weak radio calls for help. Up to that point, their globe-circling trip---their hops from continent to continent, had been a triumph of flying and air navigation. Coast Guard Cutters, and Navy ships and planes are rushing to their aid, among them the Aircraft carrier Lexington, under forced draft from San Diego, with seventy-two planes aboard. The two intropid fliers missed the tiny dot that is mowland Island in their twenty-five hundred mile hop from New Guinea, and were forced down by lack of fuel. For hours their plight was a mystery--a mystery of world concern, but the Coast Guard Cutter Itasca new is reported near them, certain that they are still safe and sound. (open--(3 sec--to end)

Subject No. 2.

(open-5 sec-to mills) The Mayor of Johnstown says the strike is broken, but despite a heavy downpour, a crowd estimated at twelve thousand, massed at Faith's Grove to cheer various strike leaders and to hear Governor Earle's advice to oust all Red agitators from steel union ranks. (open-2 sec-to end)

Subject No. 3.
