FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C.** § **552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) Intelligence Records. To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that any such records do or do not exist.

Part 2: The standard responses below apply to all requests for records on individuals:

- (i) Requests for Records about any Individual—Watch Lists. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of any individual's name on a watch list pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(7)(E) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that watch list records do or do not exist.
- (ii) Requests for Records about any Individual—Witness Security Program Records. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could identify any participant in the Witness Security Program pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(3) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(3), 18 U.S.C. 3521, and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.
- (iii) Requests for Confidential Informant Records. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of confidential informant records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(7)(D), (b)(7)(E), and (b)(7)(F) [5 U.S.C.§ § 552 (b)(7)(D), (b)(7)(E), and (b)(7)(F)] and Privacy Act exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C.§ 552a (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records would reveal confidential informant identities and information, expose law enforcement techniques, and endanger the life or physical safety of individuals. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

Part 3: General Information:

- (i) Record Searches and Standard Search Policy. The Record/Information Dissemination Section (RIDS) searches for reasonably described records by searching systems, such as the Central Records System (CRS), or locations where responsive records would reasonably be found. The CRS is an extensive system of records consisting of applicant, investigative, intelligence, personnel, administrative, and general files compiled by the FBI per its law enforcement, intelligence, and administrative functions. The CRS spans the entire FBI organization, comprising records of FBI Headquarters, FBI Field Offices, and FBI Legal Attaché Offices (Legats) worldwide; Electronic Surveillance (ELSUR) records are included in the CRS. The standard search policy is a search for main entity records in the CRS. Unless specifically requested, a standard search does not include a search for reference entity records, administrative records of previous FOIPA requests, or civil litigation files.
 - a. *Main Entity Records* created for individuals or non-individuals who are the subjects or the focus of an investigation
 - b. Reference Entity Records- created for individuals or non-individuals who are associated with a case but are not known subjects or the focus of an investigation
- (ii) **FBI Records.** Founded in 1908, the FBI carries out a dual law enforcement and national security mission. As part of this dual mission, the FBI creates and maintains records on various subjects; however, the FBI does not maintain records on every person, subject, or entity.
- (iii) **Foreseeable Harm Standard.** As amended in 2016, the Freedom of Information Act provides that a federal agency may withhold responsive records only if: (1) the agency reasonably foresees that disclosure would harm an interest protected by one of the nine exemptions that FOIA enumerates, or (2) disclosure is prohibited by law (5 United States Code, Section 552(a)(8)(A)(i)). The FBI considers this foreseeable harm standard in the processing of its requests.
- (iv) Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets. The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheet. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative "FBI file." An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (d)(5) information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action proceeding;
- (j)(2) material reporting investigative efforts pertaining to the enforcement of criminal law including efforts to prevent, control, or reduce crime or apprehend criminals;
- (k)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to an Executive order in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy, for example, information involving intelligence sources or methods;
- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence:
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

YOUTH INTERNATIONAL PARTY, aka

/Yippies IS - MISCELLANEOUS

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An article, which appeared in the 2/2/68 issue of the "Now York Post" entitled "Gaily Gaily, Hippies Going Into Politics" by William J. Eaton, indicates that a new group called "Youth International Party" with a high command of 25 "Yippies" is promoting a fun-and-games youth festival to be held in Chicago during the National Democratic Convention in late August, 1968.

A representative of the House Committee on Un-American Activities has advised that a Committee source claims that Dick Gregory, a prominent Negro comedian, and Jerry Rubin, an official of the National Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam, are the two main functionaries of this organization, and that membership will be drawn from such organizations as the Students for a Democratic Society, Progressive Labor Party and Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee. According to the source, members of this organization have already been given the task of destroying electrical television and radio wires at the Convention and the organization allegedly has plans by which passes to gain admittance to the Convention can be obtained.

You should immediately initiate a discreet investigation of captioned organization to determine the identity of the leaders and members of this group and ascertain specific details concerning their plans to disrupt the National Democratic/Convention. Insure that adequate informant coverage is/established in this group to enable the Bureau to keep abreast of their future plans and activities.

Submit results of your investigation in form suitable for dissemination to reach the Bureau no later than 30 days from the date of this communication.

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

NOTE:

An inquiry was received from the White House concerning captioned organization based on a letter received by the White House from the House Committee on Un-American Activities dated 2/8/68. By letter to Mrs. Mildred Stegall dated 2/13/68 we advised that we have no information indicating that comedian Dick Gregory and Jerry Rubin are affiliated with this organization, but pointed out that previous information has been disseminated to the White House regarding plans of various new left and black nationalist elements to disrupt the National Democratic Convention.

Among other things, the source made an observation to the effect that some of the more radical members of an organization known as the Youth International Party and the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party could make an attempt to harm the President during the forthcoming Presidential campaign of at the Democratic National Convention scheduled for August, 1968. The source stated that of his personal knowledge, Lawrence Guyot of the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party has talked about the desirability of killing the President. Lawrence Thomas Guyot, Jr., Chairman of the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party, has been interviewed by Special Agents of this Bureau concerning these allegations at which time, he furnished the following information: NOTRECORDED ! He is currently campaign manager for Charles Lyers, Field Secretary, National Association For the Midwincoment-of Colored People for the State of Mississippi, who is seeking a seat in the United States House of Representatives from the Third Congressional District, Jackson, Mississippi. The aim of the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party is to take control of the Democratic Party in the State of Mississippi as he believes the existing Democratic Party is not a true representative body of the Democrats of Mississippi. The Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party does plan to send delegates to the coming Democratic Convention in Chicago, Illinois, as it did in 1964, in an attempt to be seated as the Democratic Party representatives of the State of Mississippi. The delegates who will attend the Convention have not been chosen.

Mr. Guyot declined to state what action would be taken by the delegates of the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party in the event they are not seated.

Mr. Guyot claimed that he has never heard of the Youth International Party and, therefore, knows nothing about the organization.

Mr. Guyot has issued no instructions to members of the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party regarding cooperation with groups which advocate physical harm to the President of the United States. The Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party certainly has no intention of committing acts which would result in his injury. The organization has been an active group and will continue to be such, but it is not an organization that advocates or commits acts which would result in physical abuse of our elected representatives. Mr. Guyot does not know of or have liaison with any group which openly advocates such action.

He stated there have been no meetings of the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party in which those participating advocated harming the President or directly threatened the President. If Guyot stated that, of course, he does not know the source of the information which has created the rumors that the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party might harm the President but that there



Youth International Party; also known as "Yippies," Demonstration at State University of New York, Stony Brook, New York, February 27, 1968.

On February 26, 1968, the Bureau of Special Services, New York City Police Department (BSS, NYCPD), advised that at approximately 3:00 AM, February 27, 1968, a group of Yippies would travel from New York City for a mock raid at the State University of New York (SUNY), at Stony Brook, New York. On February 26, 1968, John L. Barry, Commissioner, Suffolk County Police Department, Hauppauge, New York, confirmed the above and stated that this was apparently to be a mock tactic to protest a narcotics raid on the above campus conducted by his department on January 17, 1968, when thirty students were arrested on narcotics charges.

On February 27, 1968, the Intelligence Squad, Suffolk County Police Department, furnished a throwaway leaflet which was distributed at the SUNY. It contains a heading: Youth International Party, 32 Union Square, East, New York, New York, with a caption "Yippie Cops Raid Stoneybrook, Stoneybrook University, Stoneybrook, New York, February 27, 1967 - 6:00 am." This release read as follows:

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Youth International Party, also known as "Yippies," Demonstration at State University of New York, Stony Brook, New York, February 27, 1968

"This is a happy raid. These indicted Stoneybrook students are being sentenced to a joyful concert by the Fugs and a performance by the Pageant Players. There will even be dancing in the halls before classes. We have found balloons, candy, flowers and other goodies in their rooms which we feel are sufficient grounds for these arrests. We wish to make it clear at this time that there has been absolutely no complicity on the part of the University Administration with the Yippie police. As a matter of fact, they are still asleep. However, the student body shows every indication of awakening.

We are trying to contrast the authoritarian, gestapolike behavior of the Suffolk County Police with fun and peacefulness. The failure of the school administration to back up the students in the face of the recent police abuse has created a vacuum. It is being filled by a growing number of students who are articulating and working toward a community which will be a place where spirits and minds can be free."

The Suffolk County Police Department advised that the group, most dressed in "hippie" attire, arrived at the SUNY campus at approximately 6:00 AM, February 27, 1968, but were not permitted to enter the campus on the instructions of the University administration. They gathered in the vicinity of the main gate of the campus where they sang songs and played music and danced. The gathering was orderly. No arrests were made. The group dispersed at approximately 11:45 AM. At that time, at the request of the English Department, a small group was permitted to enter the campus under the sponsorship of individual students for the purpose of putting on a performance for the English Department.

On March 4, 1968, Detective Lieutenant Warren Buckward, Intelligence Squad, Suffolk County Police Department, advised that on February 27, 1968, he and Detective Guy C. Zeuner of his department observed the activities of the group in the vicinity of the Commercial Trade Building, 32 Union Square East, New York City, and at the University. He said that he was advised by Detective Robert Cea, BSS, NYCPD that the group was under the leadership of Keith Lampe, a former English Professor at Queens College, Flushing, New York. Detective Cea interviewed Lampe and the latter advised him that the Youth International Party hoped to organize forty-fifty people in fifteen vehicles at 3:30 AM on February 27. 1968 and then proceed to Stony Brook, New York, to execute a satirical raid on G-Dormitory at SUNY, fafter which there would be music by the Fugs, a rock-and-roll musical KEITH RXLAMPE group, and satirical plays.

At 4:10 AM, on February 27, 1968, approximately sixty persons, of which approximately fifteen were female, left the 32 Union Square area, New York City, in a fifteen car cardvan, and proceeded to Stony Brook, New York. They arrived at 5:35 AM. They were greeted at the main gate of the University by the Campus Security police, members of the Suffolk County Police Department, and students displaying signs such as "Go Home, we have had enough trouble." The raiding group carried no signs and did not parade. There were no incidents and no arrests.

Keith R. Lampe

On September 22, 1965, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished a list of names maintained in the headquarters of The Gus Hall-Benjamin J. DAVIS Defense Committee (H-DDC). The purpose of this committee is to raise \$100,000 for the defense of HALL and DAVIS.



GUS HALL BENJAMIN J. DAVIS

HALL and DAVIS were indicted by the Federal Grand Jury, Washington, D.C., on March 15, 1962, charging them with violations of Sections 786 (h) and 794, Title 50, United States Code, in that they, as General Secretary and National Secretary, CP, USA, respectively, and as members of its National Board, willfully and unlawfully failed to register for and on behalf of the CP, USA, with the Attorney General.

The indictment against DAVIS was dismissed October 9, 1964, in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.



I. Location

A source advised on March 6, 1968, that the headquarters of the Youth International Party (YIP) is located in Room 607 at 32 Union Square, New York, New York.

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In this regard, source stated that YIP has occupied. these premises for approximately two months.

II. Origin and Aims

The "New York Post" in its February 2, 1968 issue, on Page 12, sets forth an article entitled "Gaily, Gaily, Hippies Going Into Politics," which states in part as follows:

"A new group called Youth International Party (YIP) with a high command of 25 'yippies' is promoting a fun-and-games youth festival in Chicago during the Democratic National Convention in late August (U)

"The New York-based organization, whose leaders include poet Allen Ginsberg and folk singer Arlo Guthrie, hopes to lure 500,000 free spirits to Chicago for the occasion.

"It promises singing, dancing in the streets, poetry and 'making love in the parks,' according to the first announcement distributed to radical newspapers by Liberation News Service (LNS).(W)

"It is clear the top yippies don't think much of President Johnson or the 'National Death Party' he hopes to lead to a second four-year term in power.(())

"'Wex demand the politics of ecstasy!'(U)

"As for plans by Chicago mayor Daley and the FBI to halt any convention-disrupting stuff, the yippies had little but scorn. The mayor and 'J. Edgar Freako will not stop us,' they insisted.

"Participants were asked to bring blankets and pillows and assured that everything would be free during this song-and-dance-and-love-in.()

"Word of the 'yippie' activity was relayed to the commercial press by the co-directors of Liberation News Service, Ray Mungo and Marshall Bloom, who also are on the YIP committee. ()

"Mungo is former editor of the Boston University News and Bloom once edited the Amherst Student. They both wear their hair long and Bloom wears a mustache and chin whiskers."

Allen Ginsberg(N)

The Foreign Broadcast Information Service for January 22, 1965, in Daily Report-Latin America, number 14, reflected the following transmittal in Spanish from Havana, Cuba, on January 19, 1965: (U)

"The United States poet Allen Ginsberg arrived in Cuba to participate as a poetry judge in this year's contest of the Cuban Cultural Organization House of Americas. He will be part of the jury that is made up of outstanding poets from different countries."

On March 6, 1968, the first source made available a throwaway on the letterhead of the Liberation News Service, 3 Thomas Circle, N. W., Washington, D. C., captioned "An Announcement: The Youth International Party (or: YIP!) Is Born" which contained a press release datelined January 16 (1968) at New York.

Youth International Party

This press release stated in part as follows:

"A group of 25 artists, writers, and musicians have agreed to participate in the founding of the Youth International Party, or YIP, today. YIP will stage a massive Youth Festival this August in Chicago which may just coincide with the Democratic National Convention-although the two are, of course, entirely unrelated."

This throwaway also contained the following statement from YIP:

"Join us in Chicago in August for an international festival of youth, music, and theatre. Rise up and abandon the creeping meatball! Come all you rebels, youth spirits, rock minstrels, truth-seekers, peacock-freaks, poets, barricade-jumpers, dancers, lovers, and artists!

"It is summer. It is the last week in August, and the NATIONAL DEATH PARTY meets to bless Lyndon Johnson. We are there! There are 500,000 of us dancing in the streets, throbbing with amplifiers and harmony. We are making love in the parks. We are reading, singing, lauging, printing newspapers, groping, and making a mock convention, and celebrating the birth of FREE AMERICA in our own time.

"A new spirit explodes in the land. Things are bursting in music, poetry, dancing, newspapers, movies, celebration, magic, politics, theatre, and life-styles. All these new tribes will gather in Chicago. We will be completely open. Everything will be free. Bring blankets, tents, draft-cards, body-paint, Mr. Leary's Cow, food to share, music, eager skin, and happiness. The threats of LBJ, Mayor Daley, and J. Edgar Freako will not stop us. We are coming! We are coming from all over the world!

"The lift of the American spirit is being torn asunder by the forces of violence, decay, and the napalm-cancer fiend. We demand the Politics of Ecstacy! We are the delicate spores of the new fierceness that will change America. We will create our own reality, we are Free America! And we will not accept the false theatre of the Death Convention.

"We will be in Chicago. Begin preparations now! Chicago is yours! Do it!"

At the meeting, Hoffman presented the "Hippies" plans for the demonstration to be held in Washington, D. C., October 21-22, 1967, part of which consisted of dyeing the Potomac River red and firing water pistols filled with day-glow paint at the walls of the Pentagon

Paul Krassner

The April, May, June, 1966, issue of "Rights", a self-described publication of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee (ECLC) reflects that Paul Krassner, editor of "The Realist" was a new member of the ECLC National Council.

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Sharon Krebs

A seventh source advised on February 23, 1966, that as of February 23, 1966, Sharon Krebs was a secret member of the PLP while functioning as a May 2 Movement (M2M) member only.

Keith Lampe

An eighth source advised on September 22, 1965, that at that time a list of names, believed to be the mailing list of the Gus Hall-Benjamin J. Davis Defense Committee (HDDC) in New York City, included the following under the caption "College Faculty" - Keith R. Lampe, Apartment D, 639 East 11th Street, New York City "Queens College."

Philip Ochs

A ninth source advised on July 15, 1963, that Philip. Ochs attended a speech made by Gus Hall, General Secretary, Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA) at 111 Second Avenue, New York, New York, on July 12, 1963.

Jerry Rubin

On June 24, 1966, a tenth source advised that Jerry Rubin attended one session of the 18th National Convention CP, USA, held in New York City, as an observer.

On March 6, 1968, the first source made available an undated leaflet from YIP, 32 Union Square, New York City, which identifies the following individuals as the coordinators of YIP:

IV. Activities

On March 6, 1968, the first source made available an undated leaflet of YIP entitled "People, Get Ready" which states as follows:

"The leaders of the National Democratic Party are planning to meet in Chicago in August; there to enact, for the television audience, all the drama and excitement of an American Political Convention, culminating, it is understood, in the nomination of L. Johnson for President of the United States, and Leader of the Free World.

"In the face of this act of sado-masochistic folly the free youth of America will simultaneously hold an enormous International Youth Festival in Chicago; there will be music playing and people swaying, dancing in the streets. and his delegates, locked in their slaughterhouse conventionhall theatre, will make ugly speeches and play ugly campaign music, while we, the living breathing youth of the world, will make the city a theatre, and every restaurant Alice's. Already, throughout parks and vacant lots in and around Chicago, agents of the Potheads' Benevolent Association have planted hundreds of thousands of pot seeds. The long hot summer of 1968 is. expected to produce ideal weather for marijuana growing, and most of the crop should be ready for smoking by the end of Free people, free pot, free music, free theatre; a whole new culture will manifest itself to the world, rising from the ashes of America. Rock groups will be performing in. the parks; newspapers will be printed in the streets; provos and police will play cops and robbers in the department stores; Democrats and dope fiends will chase each other through hotel corridors. Longboats filled with Vikings will land on the shores of Lake Michigan, and discover A m e r i c a ! will become a river of wild onions!"

On March 6, 1968, the first source made available an undated leaflet from YIP, 32 Union Square, New York City, which stated in part as follows: (4)

"68' is the year of the YIPPIE! Over 500,000 free spirits will come to Chicago during Aug. 25-30. They will come (4)

to celebrate a free Festival of Life as a living alternative to the death of the National Democratic Party. Over one hundred music groups, celebrities and theatre groups have already agreed to participate including: Arlo Guthrie, Allan Ginsburg, Timothy Leary, Phil Ochs, Judy Collins, Paul Krassner, Country Joé and the Fish, the Fugs, Janis Ian, Richie Havens, and Dick Gregory.

"We have available 2 multicolor posters 24" by 36" by Milton Glazer and the Group Image. In addition we have a super $l^{\frac{1}{4}}$ " button, dayglo pink on deep purple, which bears our slogan YIPPIE! (The posters are fantastic bargains; similar ones by the Group Image and Milton Glazer sell for anywhere between 2-5 dollars.) Funds raised go to the festival. All orders will be filled promptly. All orders must be prepaid. Make check payable to the Youth International Party."

Judith Collins Judy

An eleventh source advised on January 4, 1966, that at that time a Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) membership card was being sent to Judith Collins through the SDS Headquarters in Chicago, Illinois. Collins was to be a member at large as she had apparently given SDS a "large bundle of money."

A characterization of SDS is attached hereto.

Lieutenant Frank Heimoski, Bureau of Inspectional Services, Security Unit, Chicago Police Department, made available information on September 23, 1966, reflecting that

New York, New York, was a member of a New York club of the W. E. B. Du Bois Clubs of America (DCA). This information also reflected that as of June, 1966, was and a singer by occupation.

A characterization of the DCA is attached hereto.

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On March 6, 1968, the first source made available a copy of a reprint of an article written by Jerry Rubin for the Underground Press entitled "Notes from an Era Yippizolean" which stated as follows concerning the planned activities of YIP:

"1968 is the year of the 'yippees.'

"A yippee is anyone who wants to be. A yippee! sounds like the name. Say it loud, and you'll see what I mean. Yippee!!

"The yippees will be in Chicago this August for the youth festival, or Youth International Party, YIP.

"The yippees were born at the Pentagon last October, although they have been developing in the womb of Mother America since the late 1950's.

"The yippees are the children of the middle class, children who refuse to 'grow up' refuse to accept the world their parents created. The yippees have had white middle-class America, and they didn't like it.

"A yippee is a stoned-idealist, moved by a vision of a future utopia. He is a romantic. It is not fear which moves the yippee; it is faith and hope.

"The yippees are fighting for their own freedom. The yippees know in their bones what America has done -- rivers of blood, man against man, death of spirit, denial of dignity. The yippee is free because he is engaged and committed to change.

"The yippee sees America as a huge prison, with her institutions (bureacracies, office buildings, armies, universities, schools) as bars. The yippees are drop-outs from that world. They were raised on horror stories of Eichmann, the bureacratic cop-out.

"The yippees are with the Vietnamese, peasant guerrillas wherever they are, and the black and other struggling people of America in this mid-20th century saga of the battle of Man V. S. Machine.

"To America's insanity, the yippees ask: 'Why?' Yippees are naive.

"The answers?

"'You're freaky-looking.'

"The Chinese are coming.

"'Watch out for the commies.'

"'Get a bath.'

"The yippee is not busy working within the system or trying to explain his actions to the Establishment or the middle-class mentality. He is too concerned with creating a clear alternative, an underground, an opposition.

"He is involved in a cultural revolution. In the process he is seducing the 10-year-olds with happenings, community, youth power, dignity, underground media, music, legends, marijuana, action, myth, excitement, a new style.

"The yippees are out there blocking traffic, throwing blood, burning money, tying up government telephone wires, milling in, (obscone) the draft, throwing live snakes into Dow Chemical executive cocktail parties.

"You probably don't agree with this description of yippee, but that's because you are a yippee, and you have your own fantasy."

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"The New Left created the teach-in, the hippy created the be-in, and the yippee is creating the do-in. America's first youth festival will be a do-in and it will take place Aug. 25 to Aug. 30 in Chicago's Grant Park.

"If that's the same time the National Death Party meets to crown LBJ, there's no coincidence! The world will see what the youth of America thinks of the Death Party and its war games. The youth festival will be a living alternative and you can take your choice.

"Imagine the sight: thousands of yippees, from 200,000 up, making their way to Chicago by thumb, magical mystery tour, bus, bicycle, car, truck, foot -- from big town

and small hamlet -- carrying sleeping bags, guitars, blankets, food -- coming together in the middle of the country at the end of the summer for a super-creative energy explosion and information exchange.

"It will be a total multi-media experience. For six days we will be together sharing and learning. Every morning all our money can be thrown into big barrels to buy enough food to feed everyone. Our own Alice's Restaurant! And that tells America how we thinks the needs of human beings should be solved -- everything free.

"The music will be free. The performers will be playing for their community. Definite already are Country Joe and the Fish, The Fugs, Arlo Guthrie, Phil Ochs, the United States of America band, Pageant Players, Bread and Puppet Theater, Allen Ginsberg, Timothy Leary, Paul Krassner and the Steve Miller Blues Band. Invitations are now going to Dylan, Eric Burdon and the Animals, the Monkeys, the Jefferson Airplane, Richie Havens, Simon and Garfunkel, the Doors, the Who, the Blue's Project, Beatles, Mothers of Invention, Mamas and Papas, Janis Ian, the Cream, and the Smothers Brothers to name just a few.

"Walk across Grant Park at any time during the youth festival and you'll find:

"Free mikes and soapboxes for anyone who wants to rap, and a

"Free mimeo for anyone who has something to pass out.

"The underground papers will come from all over the country to Grant Park to publish a daily paper for the festival. They'll do it right in the park and teach people how to start and do their own paper.

"Film-makers will hold workshops and show at night what they film during the day.

"Continuous workshops on the draft, and how to end it will be held.

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"A real school for drop-outs will appear, along with art of the streets, art for and from the people. You name it. You do it. Everyone participates -- every man is a creator.

"We'll have yippees dressed like Vietcong walking the streets and shaking hands like ordinary American politicians. We'll infiltrate right-wing crowds with short-hair yippee veterans who at the proper moment will blow minds with speeches like: 'Now, these yippees have something to say ...'

"Guerrilla theater groups from all over the country will be there. The day before LBJ arrives in Chicago we will announce to the overground press that LBJ will arrive at 2 p.m. at O'Hara Airport. And it will be our own LBJ who will be greated enthusiastically by the yippees, honored by a motorcade through Chicago, and then on to a hotel for a press conference to announce America's withdrawal from Vietnam.

"Yippees plan to paint their cars like cabs, pick up delegates, and drop them off in Wisconsin. We are infiltrating the hotels with bellboys and cooks. We are also infiltrating the press.

"We'll have our own theater-convention and nominate Bancroft P. Hogg, a pig made out of vegetables, for President and LBJ for Vice-President. After Hogg is nominated, we will kill him and then eat him. We will say to America: 'You nominate a President and he eats the people. At our convention we nominate a President and the people eat him!'

"The youth festival will dramatize the nation's most massive collective and individual acts of resistance. One night 100,000 people will burn draft cards at the same moment, with the fires spelling out 'Beat Army.' The next day all the pyromaniacs will send signed letters to the government confessing their act, and will encourage more young men to follow them.

"This do-in will be unique in that it must be a bottom-up revolution to succeed. You are needed to work on it to make it happen. It will not be done for you. We have opened up a coordinating office, at YIP (room 607, 32 Union Square East, New York, 10003, New York, phone (212) 982-5090 and we are there coordinating information.



"The Chicago power structure, especially Mayor Daley, is not going to be thrilled about our using Grant Park! But with hundreds of thousands of us, what are they going to do? It is our human right and we are confident of receiving a permit to use Grant Park.

"That week in Chicago will be a living theater of America. King will be there, also Gregory, also Spock and the peace movement. The Democrats will probably have to travel from hotel to convention hall by helicopter. Johnson will be nominated under military guard, under the protection of Army bayonets. Even if Chicago does not burn, the mass paranoia and guilt of the government will force them to bring thousands of troops, and the more troops, the better the theater.

"A lot of troops will have to stay and watch us (long hair freaks them out), diverting troops from the black community. And the yippees, being wanderers, will be all over the city.

"That Lydon Johnson and his Democratic Party cannot rule this country is becoming clearer every day. The choice is between the life of youth and the death of the Establishment. For those who don't see that now, Chicago will be an aye-opener."

On March 6, 1968, the first source made available an undated three page leaflet of YIP, 32 Union Square, New York City, entitled "Yippie Announcement! Yippie!" This leaflet states in part as follows:

"YIP is planning a 'festival of life', an 'international youth festival' from Sunday, August 25 to Friday, August 30 in Chicago, Illinois. This youth festival will take place at the same time as the National Death (Democratic) Convention in Chicago. It will be a contrast in life styles. Ours will be an affirmation of life; theirs is d-e-a-t-h.

"The festival of life is being organized by a new coalition of forces called the 'Youth International Party' or 'YIP'. All the people who come to the youth festival are 'yippies!'. Chicago police have estimated 'anywhere from 100,000 to two million'. We concur.



"The youth festival is unique in the following respects:

- "1. In addition to the protest of the Death Party and its policies, the festival presents a living, cultural, spiritual alternativé.
- "2. The festival will be an artistic event and involves artists in its conception and execution.
- "3. The festival will last six days and will be a living experience for those who come, not just a one or two-day protest.
- "4. The festival will be a participatory event, a creative 'do-in.' Activities and resources will be planned so that everyone who comes will become involved and will grow through the experiences.
- "5. Everything will be free. This will be the nation 's first major free music festival. Our goal is that food also will be free at the festival -- people will pool their money to provide free food. The festival will express our view that the needs of life should be free. We will demonstrate this through action -- through sharing.

"The following are some of the activities that will occur at the youth festival:

"--music. The following performers have already agreed to appear: Country Joe and the Fish; Blood, Sweat and Tears; Arlo Guthrie; Len Chandler; Phil Ochs; Janis Ian; the Fugs; United States of America electric band; Peter Seeger; American Expeditionary Force; The Sunshine Company; The Nitty Gritty Dirt Band; Richie Havens; Dick Gregory; Barbara Dane; Jim and Jean; Judy Collins; Steve Miller Blues Band.

"A number of performers are preparing a call soon to be widely publicized asking all artists to celebrate Aug. 25-30 as 'affirmation of life' week and not to accept any commercial bookings; and instead to come to Chicago to perform for the youth festival.

"--A major emphasis of the youth festival will be on guerrilla theater. Many interesting things are planned: we will have our own LBJ who will end the war; there may be a march of the oppressed of the world; and body paint and costumes for all who want them. The Bread and Puppet Theatre and the Pageant Players of New York are preparing happenings. YIP is asking guerrilla theater groups from all over America to come to Chicago that week to 'do your thing...Chicago is a stage...it will be a natural energy center for guerrilla theater. If _______ interested, write the coordinator for guerrilla theater, Richard Schechner, editor, Drama Review, New York University, 32 Washington Place, N.Y. 10003, N.Y., or call (212) 598-2596.

"A-A daily underground paper will be published by the underground papers and Liberation News Service.

"--Discussions and demonstrations will take place on the issue of the draft. One night 100,000 people may burn draft cards, with the fires spelling: 'Beat Army.'

"--A mock convention will happen.

"--And: free mikes for people to rap in Hyde Park fashion, mimeos also, and hundreds of small discussions on hundreds of topics.

"--magic.

"Youth festivals will take place in countries all over the world the same week.

"Our yippie calls are:

"Rise up and abandon the creeping meatball!

"'We demand the politics of ecstasy!'

"Many people are working actively to build the festival including Paul Krassner, Ed Sanders, Timothy Leary, Allen Ginsburg, Vaughn Meader, Richard Goldstein, Bob Fass, Jacques Levy, Barbara Dane, Mike Ochs, Abbie Hoffman, Keith Lampe, Jerry Rubin. Dennis Gaston and Abe Peckolick, along with people from the underground paper, The Seed, are forming a YIP group in Chicago and an office will be opening there shortly to carry on the coordination of local forces.

"A support committee is being formed in Chicago of clergymen and lawyers to negotiate with the city for permits to use park facilities. We are confident of receiving the necessary permits. The more people that are planning to come to Chicago, the more likely will be our chances.

"The youth festival is completely open. There is no 'central committee' making decisions on policy. We are working to get people there, to organize the best sound system ever, and the necessary resources. Form your own committee, hand out your own releases, plan your own activities. In fact, yippie will not happen if you personally don't get involved. Become a yippie organizer in your own city (and write us about your work)! Do it! Now.

"Because of the tremendous numbers of people expected, local groups should begin now securing their transportation -- buses, trucks, bikes, etc. You might consider dramatic bus, truck, car, bike, walking caravans across the country to Chicago! Bring sleeping bags, blankets, tents, and props.

"Money is desperately needed to provide staging, sound system, lighting, props, publicity and other resources needed to make the festival a success. If you can, make checks payable to Youth International Party and sent to our office.

"Literature, two multi-color posters by Milton Glazer and the Group Image and YIPPIE buttons and stickers are available through our office.

"If interested in hearing a speaker on YIPPEE, contact the YIP office.

"This will be the first national youth festival, the first coming together of all the people who have been involved in the youth revolution which has been taking place in America in the past decade. A lot will be concentrated in one time and place period in August and the result will be, we think, 'geometric' growth in the energy and spirit of our new culture."



Pete Seeger

On December 13, 1954, John Lautner, a CP, USA, member for over twenty years, who at the time of his expulsion from the CP, USA, in January, 1950, was chairman of the New York State Communist Party Review Commission, advised that he knew Pete Seeger as a CP, USA, member from 1947 to 1949.

Barbara Dane

On October 25, 1965, a twelfth source advised that Barbara Dane appeared at a memorial tribute to Robert Thompson held in New York City on October 24, 1965.

"The Worker" in its issue of October 19, 1965, contained an article on Robert Thompson indicating that he had died on October 16, 1965. The article described Thompson as a leading figure of the Communist Movement for many years and chief spokesman of the New York State Communist organization.

"The Worker" is an east coast Communist newspaper.

V. Miscellaneous

Confidential sources, who are familiar with certain phases of Communist Party (CP) and CP front activities in the New York City area, were contacted in March, 1968, and they could furnish no information concerning YIP.

All sources utilized in this memorandum have furnished reliable information in the past with the exception of the first and third sources with whom there has been insufficient contact to determine the reliability of their information.

AMERICAN INSTITUTE FOR MARXIST STUDIES

Axsource advised on April 9, 1963, that on April 7, 1963, at a meeting of the District Committee of the Communist Party, United States of America (CPUSA), of New England, held in Boston, Massachusetts, HERBERT APTHEKER stated he was developing an organization called American Institute for Marxist Studies (AIMS), which would eventually legalize the CP. He stated AIMS would publish literature on History, Science, Physics, Archeology and other subjects which would be put out quarterly with various supplements.

A second source advised on June 30, 1966, that HERBERT APTHEKER was elected to the National Committee, CPUSA, at the 18th National Convention of the CPUSA, held June 22-26, 1966, in New York City.

A third source advised on June 7, 1963, that on June 3, 1963, HERBERT APTHEKER spoke at the CPUSA, New York District Board meeting concerning AIMS. APTHEKER stated that AIMS would unite and strengthen the CP although the CP would not be connected with it. He stated AIMS was being formed to operate within the scope of the McCarran and Smith Acts and would legally bring Marxist material and opinions to the attention of American scholars and the general public.

A fourth source reported on August 29, 1966, that AIMS issues a "Newsletter" every other month. This source also made available the information that AIMS issues publications and holds symposiums concerning Marxism.

A fifth source advised on May 9, 1967, that as of that date, AIMS was located on the fifth floor west of 20 West 30th Street, New York, New York.

EMERGENCY CIVIL LIBERTIES COMMITTEE

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of December 1, 1951, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee:

"Emergency Civil Liberties Committee

The Emergency Civil Liberties Committee is an organization with headquarters in New York, whose avoyed purpose is to abolish the House Committee on Un-American Activities and discredit the FBI. * * * The committee finds that the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee, established in 1951, although representing itself as a non-Communist group, actually operates as a front for the Communist Party. It has repeatedly assisted, by means of funds and legal aid, Communists involved in Smith Act violations and similar legal proceedings. One of its chief activities has been and still is the dissemination of voluminous Communist propaganda material.'

'FRANK WILKINSON was called as a witness when he appeared in Atlanta as a representative of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee to propagandize against the Committee on Un-American Activities and to protest its hearings. In 1956 WILKINSON was identified as a Communist Party member by a former FBI undercover agent within the Party. Summoned at that time to answer the allegation, his reply to all questions was, "I am answering no questions of this committee." This also became his stock reply to questions when he appeared during the Atlanta hearings. * * WIIKINSON has since been convicted of contempt of Congress and sentenced to one year in jail.

EMERGENCY CIVIL LIBERTIES COMMITTEE (CONT'D)

'Disputing the non-Communist claim of the organization, the committee finds that a number of other individuals connected with the ECIC also have been identified under oath as Communists. * * *!

(Committee on Un-American Activities, Annual Report for 1958, House Report 187, March 9, 1959, pp. 34 and 35.)

'To defend the cases of Communist lawbreakers, front's have been devised making special appeals in behalf of civil liberties and reaching out far beyond the confines of the Communist Party itself. Among these organizations are the * * * Emergency Civil Liberties Committee. When the Communist Party itself is under fire these fronts offer a bulwark of protection.' (Internal Security Subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee, Handbook for Americans, S. Doc. 117, April 23, 1956, p. 91.)"

FREEDOMWAYS ASSOCIATES, INC.

The records of the New York State Secretary of State, Albany, New York, show that the Certificate of Incorporation of Freedomways Associates, Inc., was filed on March 2, 1961.

On May 24, 1961, a source advised that a report was given on "Freedomways" at a meeting of the National Board, Communist Party, USA (CP, USA), held on May 24, 1961. It was stated that the central purpose of "Freedomways" is to-develop a theory and positive criticism of currents in the Negro Movement, as well as to raise the level of understanding and discussion taking place in Negro life today and to project a socialist and pro-Soviet orientation.

On May 25, 1961, a second source advised that "Freedomways" was set up for the CP, USA by JAMES JACKSON.

The First Quarter, 1967, issue of Freedomways", self-described as "A Quarterly Review of the Negro Freedom Movement" published by Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, 799 Broadway, New York City, lists the following as its editorial staff:

JOHN HENRIK CLARKE, Associate Editor ESTHER JACKSON, Managing Editor J. H. O'DELL, Associate Managing Editor JOHN L. DEVINE, Art Editor

A third source made available information on July 1, 1964, indicating that JOHN HENRIK CLARKE attended the first and founding meeting of the American Institute for Marxist Studies (AIMS) which was held on December 19, 1963, and continued on January 10, 1964.

This source also made available information on August 14, 1964, indicating that CLARKE is an "Associate" of AIMS

On March 16, 1966, the second source advised that JAMES JACKSON, accompanied by his wife, ESTHER JACKSON, was scheduled to depart on March 25, 1966, from the United States en route to Moscow to attend the 23rd Congress of the CP of the

THE GUS HALL-BENJAMIN J. DAVIS DEFENSE COMMITTEE

A source advised on March 27, 1962, that GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, United States of America (CP,USA), stated on March 26, 1962, that the Party will form a new committee known as the Gus Hall-Benjamin J. Davis Defense Committee (H-DDC). The purpose of this committee is to raise \$100,000 for the defense of HALL and DAVIS.

"The Worker" issue of April 23, 1967, page 10, lists the address of the H-DDC as Room 1225, 22 East 17th Street, New York, New York.

"The Worker" is an east coast Communist newspaper.

GUS HALL BENJAMIN J. DAVIS

HALL and DAVIS were indicted by the Federal Grand Jury, Washington, D.C., on March 15, 1962, charging them with violations of Sections 768 (h) and 794, Title 50, United States Code, in that they, as General Secretary and National Secretary, CP, USA, respectively, and as members of its National Board, willfully and unlawfully failed to register for and on behalf of the CP, USA, with the Attorney General.

The indictment against DAVIS was dismissed October 9, 1964, in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia and the indictment against HALL was dismissed in the same court on May 4, 1966.

1. MAY 2 MOVEMENT

A source advised on March 3, 1965, as follows:

The May 2 Movement (M2M) formerly known as the May 2 Committee was organized on March 14, 1964, at New Haven, Connecticut, by a group of young people participating in a symposium "Socialism in America" being held at Yale University. The original aim of the M2M was to plan and execute a demonstration in New York City on May 2, 1964, demanding withdrawal of United States troops from Viet Nam.

The M2M was dominated and controlled by the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and had for its aim and purpose the embarrassment of the United States Government by meetings, rallies, picketing demonstrations and formation of university level clubs at which a Marxist-Leninist oriented approach and analysis was taken of United States domestic and foreign policies. This source advised on May 19, 1965, that the headquarters of the M2M was 640 Broadway, New York City, Room 307.

A second source advised on February 9, 1966, that the M2M was officially dissolved as an organization on February 6, 1966, at a meeting held on the same date in New York City, by the leadership of M2M and the Progressive Labor Party.

The characterization of the PLP has been set out separately.

PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

A source advised on April 20, 1965, that the Progressive Labor Party (PLP), formerly known as the Progressive Labor Movement (PLM); held its first national convention April 15, - 18, 1965, at New York, New York, to organize the PLM into a PLP. The PLP will have as its ultimate objective the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism.

The "New York Times" City Edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the PLP. The PLP was described as an outgrowth of the PLM. Its officers were identified as MILTON ROSEN, New York, President, and WILLIAM EPTON of New York, and MORT SCHEER of San Francisco, Vice Presidents. A 20-member National Committee was elected to direct the party until the next convention.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962 by Mr. ROSEN and Mr. SCHEER after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line".

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor," a bi-monthly magazine, "Challenge", a monthly New York City newspaper, and "Spark", a West Coast newspaper.

The April, 1967, issue of "Challenge", page 14, states that, "This paper is dedicated to fight for a new way of life-where the working men and women own and control their homes, factories, the police, courts, and the entire government on every level".

A second source advised on September 26, 1966, that the PLP utilizes the address of General Post Office Box 808, Brooklyn 1, New York, but also utilizes an office in Room 617, 1 Union Square, West, New York City, where PLP publications are prepared.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anti-Communist proviso was removed from the SDS Constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some Communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

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W.E.B. DU BOIS CLUBS OF AMERICA (DCA)

A source advised that on October 26-27, 1963, a conference of members of the Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), including national functionaries, met in Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of setting in motion forces for the establishment of a new national Marxist-oriented youth organization which would hunt for the most peaceful transition to socialism. The delegates were told that it would be reasonable to assume that the young socialists attracted into this new organization would eventually pass into the CP itself.

A second source has advised that the founding convention for the new youth organization was held from June 19-21, 1964; at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the name W.E.B. Du Bois Clubs of America (DCA) was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention.

The second source advised in September, 1966, that MIKE ZAGARELL, CPUSA Youth Director, stated that in Negro communities the Party still supported the plan to build "left" socialist centers and to solidify the Party base through the DCA. This source also advised in September, 1966, that DANIEL RUBIN, CPUSA National Organizational Secretary, stated the Party believes the DCA should have a working class outlook and be a mass organization favorable to socialism, socialist countries and Marxism, and in April, 1967, GUS HALL, CPUSA, General Secretary, indicated that the DCA primary emphasis should be on developing mass resistance to the draft.

A third source advised in September, 1967, that JARVIS TYNER was elected chairman of the DCA on September 10, 1967, near the conclusion of the Third National Convention of the DCA held in New York, New York; from September 8-10, 1967.

A fourth source advised during August, 1967, that JARVIS TYNER is a member of the National Committee of the CPUSA.

A fifth confidential source advised on September 21, 1967, that the headquarters of the DCA is located at 34 West 17th Street, New York, New York.

The "Young Socialist" newspaper was formerly described as the official organ of the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA).

The "Young Socialist" maintains office space at the headquarters of the YSA, Rooms 532-536,41 Union Square, West, New York City, and has a mailing address of Post Office Box 471, Cooper Station, New York, New York 10003.

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE

The May, 1960 issue of the "Young Socialist" (YS), page 1, column 3, disclosed that during April 15-17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA) was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of the YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles of revolutionary socialism.

On March 10, 1967, a source advised that the YSA was formed during 1957, by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The source further advised that the YSA has recently become more open about admitting that it is the youth group of the SWP and that an SWP representative has publicly stated that the YSA is the SWP's youth group.

The headquarters of the YSA are located in Rooms 532-536, 41 Union Square West, New York City.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

NEW YORK, March 19-The Yippies gave away free coffee and Danish. Then they started their straight press conference in the Hotel Americana.

"A Yippie," the first speaker explains, "is what happens to a hippie when a cop hits him over the head."

The Yippies, the Youth International Party, were formally announcing their intention of swooping down on Chicago during the Democratic National Convention in August to make music, to make love, to make merry and make fun of the electoral process.

At the definition of Yippie, there was an appreciative fitter from the speakers to come: Allen Ginsberg, the poet; Paul Krasner, editor of the Realist magazine; folk singers Judith Col-lins and Phil Ochs; film maker Jacques Levy; Alian Katzman, editor of New York's underground East Village Other; Ed Sanders, chief versifier for the Fugs, and the old Berkeley radical, Jerry Rubin, who has moved East and become a cultural revolutionary.

Dr. Timothy Leary didn't attend, but everybody said he was backing the project and would be in Chicago for the Yipple "festival of life," "the poli-

tics of ecstasy."

The Yippies, Ginsburg said, would end a "long period of domination by the war gods and the older, meno-

pausal leaders.'

The specific vibrations that can be created in Chicago if you people in the media cooperate, might best be expressed by the common mantra for the preservation of the planet whi is chanted by the Beatles and which

ls chanted here and in San grancisco." A distressed look come over the face of one media representative as Ginsberg opened a small red leather box containing a one-octave organ and began to chant, "Hare Krishna, Hare-

Krishna, Krishnaaaaaaa, Rama Krishna, Hare Krishna, Hare Rama."

They were an easy group to put down. They proposed nothing but the

put-down.

They said they would come to Chicago where perhaps "one night a hundred thousand people may burn draft cards, with the fires spelling, 'beat' Army.'" They said they would nominate and eat a pig "because it's better to eat the candidate than to have the candidate eat you." They endorsed everybody for President, "because the President is the only person in this country who is free."

For the past several years they have set the tone in American music, writing, painting and smoking. They !now how to use mass media. For American youth they've been able to make the, fashions in everything from hair styles to social attitude.

This morning they were announcing they were going to summon youth to Chicago "for a testimonial for life," as Judith Collins called it, by the easy expedient of providing free, groovy

entertainment.

"We are demanding the politics of the toe freaks and kisses," chanted Ed Sanders in blank verse, "as opposed to the politics of the worm farm, sulcidal hysteria, slums, baby broil and the natal droot cancer.' The entertainers committed to come

to Chicago are Country Joe and the Fish, Blood, Sweat and Tears, Arlo Guthrie, Lem Chandler, Phil Ochs, the United States of America (Band), Pete Seeger, the Sunshine Company, the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band, et cetera, et cetera.

Joan Baez, the Jimi Hendrix Experience, the Doors and many others will probably come according to the louder Yips. Names hardly known to adult America, but names which have drawn tens of thousands to the great jazz festivals and the monster demonstrations, the heroes of pop and poster culture.

The media, their minds half blown by this cultural assault on politics, tried to put the discourse in their own frame of reference: Wouldn't this effort divert from McCarthy and Kennedy? With Kennedy in the race, didn't the Yippies want to reassess?

"I sent McCarthy five bucks," Ginsberg replied, trying to be helpful, "and last week I spoke to Sen: Kenney before he declared. When I asked him what would happen next he said quote

... worse ... unquote."

The more ordinary peace groups, the organized political left, is meeting in Chicago this weekend to assess Kennedy's entrance and the New Hampshire results but the mood the Yipples reflect is the feeling that the world is coming unstuck, that death is everywhere, and that in the moment of universal peril, old precedents and old ways of thinking don't apply.

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

On March 18, 1968, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, made available a copy of a leaflet from the Youth International Party (YIP) announcing that a "Yip-In" would be held in Grand Central Railroad Station, New York City at midnight on March 22 (1968).

This leaflet described the proposed "Yip-In" as follows:

"It's a spring mating service celebrating the Equinox, a back-scratching party, a roller-skating rink, a theatre...with you, performer and audience. Get acquainted with other Yippies now, for other yiptivities and Chicago Y.I.P. Festival this summer.

"Bring:

Bells, Flowers, Beads, Music, Radios, Pillows, Eats,

"Meet later on at Sheep Meadow in Central Park to YIP up the Sun."

On March 22, 1968, at approximately 11:30 p.m. Special Agents (SAS) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) observed approximately 3,000 hippie-type individuals congregating in Grand Central Railroad Station in New York City.

These individuals, who were dressed in costumes and other hippie-type attire, were singing, dancing and throwing balloons with the word "Yippie" written on them. Periodically such slogans as "We Got Power" and 'Peace Now!" were chanted. Two banners were displayed, one captioned "Yippie" and the other captioned "Liberty, Equality, Fraternity". In addition, "Yippie" buttons were worn by many of the individuals.

At approximately midnight, a number of individuals climbed on top of the information booth located in the center of the Railroad Station Concourse. These individuals began throwing railroad timetables into the air and broke the hands off of the four faces of a large clock located on the top of the information booth.


At approximately 12:50 a.m. on March 23, 1968, New York City Police charged the group of individuals who had climbed on top of the information booth and made a number of arrests.

At approximately 3:00 a.m., on March 23, 1968, one half of the individuals left Grand Central Station and began to walk up 5th Avenue to the Sheep Meadow in Central Park, New York City. At approximately 4:00 a.m., the remainder of the individuals left Grand Central Station and proceeded to the Sheep Meadow in Central Park.

At the Sheep Meadow, the individuals sang songs, danced and roamed around. On several occasions, small fires were started by individuals with slats broken from snow fences in the Sheep Meadow for warmth. Several individuals were arrested for damaging the snow fences in the Sheep Meadow.

The individuals continued their activities in the Sheep Meadow until approximately 6:30 a.m. on March 23, 1968 when the majority dispersed.

Detective Gerald Mc Carthy of the Bureau of Special Services, New York City Police Department, advised on March 23, 1968, that approximately 60 individuals were arrested during the activities in the Grand Central Railroad Station, and three individuals were arrested in the Sheep Meadow in Central Park.

The Chicago "Sun-Times", a Chicago daily newspaper, Page 20, dated March 26, 1968, contained an article captioned, "On The Old Camp Ground - Ask Permit For Yippies To Tent-In At Grant Park", by Basil Talbott, Jr. The article states in substance: Jerry Rubin, an organizer of the Yippies (a New York based artist group promoting "fun and game" Youth Festival at Chicago during the time of the National Democratic Convention) and a radical from the old movement at the University of California at Berkeley, advised that George Peters, who is not a Yippie and who

Rubin said that the Chicago kick-off for the Yippie festival came Monday at a benefit for "The Seed", a local underground newspaper, at the Cheetah, 1106 West Lawrence, Chicago, a youth night club. Some of the proceeds from this benefit, which featured 11 rock bands, will go to the Yippies.

According to the "Sun-Times" article, Judy Collins, a folk singer, announced Chicago plans of the Yippies last week at a press conference in New York. She said that the Yippies were summoning young people to Chicago for a "testimonial of life" by providing free, groovy, entertainment. Entertainers committed to come to Chicago, according to the Yippies, include Country Joe and the Fish; Blood, Sweat and Tears; Arlo Guthrie, Pete Seeger and the Sunshine Company and the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band.


The "Sun-Times" article stated that a Yip-in at Grand Central Station in New York this past Saturday night became a fiasco when police used night sticks to break up a crowd of 3,000 young people summoned there by Yip.

According to the "Sun-Times" article New York police reported 57 persons were arrested on charges ranging from felonious assault and criminal mischief to resisting arrest and disorderly conduct. Two youths were hospitalized with concussions and five policemen were injured.

The "Sun-Times" article stated that Rubin and Paul Krassner, editor of "The Realist Magazine" and a Yip organizer, were observers at a conference of anti-war groups held this past weekend near Lake Villa, Illinois.


January, 1950, was Chairman of the New York State Communist Party Review Commission, advised that he knew Pete Seeger as a CP, USA member from 1947 to 1949.


On March 28, 1968, Assistant Superintendent Thomas Barry, Chicago Park District, Chicago, Illinos, advised that the Chicago Park District has received a letter dated March 26, 1968, addressed to Richard J. Daley, Mayor of Chicago and William Mc Fetridge, Park Commissioner of Chicago, requesting a permit to use Grant Park, Chicago, August 25 through August 30, 1968, during the time of the National Democratic Convention from Yip, 32 Union Square East, Room 607, New York, New York 10003. Assistant Superintendent Barry stated that according to the letter the Yippies indicated they are planning "a festival -- a elebration of life and an affirmation of man and community" and they are expecting thousands of young Americans, possibly upwards of 500,000, to come to Chicago this summer from all over the country for this festival.

Assistant Superintendent Barry stated that the letter reflected further that "because of the other affair being held simultaneously with our festival, and because of the enormous number of people expected, those attending the festival will need to sleep in the park. We are urging them to bring sleeping bags, blankets and tents.

"We are asking the city to cooperate in providing portable sanitation units. In addition, our emphasis will be on food sharing and we will ask the health department to cooperate with us in the setting up of kitchens in the park.

Assistant Superintendent Barry stated that the Chicago Park District will not issue the type of permit requested by the Yippies to the Yippies because the Chicago Park District has ordinances against sleeping and camping in Grant Park, between 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. each day and

EMERGENCY CIVIL LIBERTIES COMMITTEE

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee:

'Emergency Civil Liberties Committee

'The Emergency Civil Liberties Committee is an organization with headquarters in New York, whose avowed purpose is to abolish the House Committee on Un-American Activities and discredit the FBI. * * * The committee finds that the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee, established in 1951, although representing itself as a non-Communist group, actually operates as a front for the Communist It has repeatedly assisted, by means of funds and legal aid, Communists involved in Smith Act violations and similar legal proceedings. One of its chief activities has been and still is the dissemination of voluminous Communist propaganda material.'

'Frank Wilkinson was called as a witness when he appeared in Atlanta as a representative of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee to propagandize against the Committee on Un-American Activities and to protest its hearings. In 1956 Wilkinson was identified as a Communist Party member by a former FBI undercover agent within the Party. Summoned at that time to answer the allegation, his reply to all questions was, "I am answering no questions of this committee."

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in Juen, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and to "radically transform" the university community and provide for its complete control by students. GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anticommunist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. October 7, 1966, issue of 'New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

On April 9, 1968, a source advised that the Youth International Party (Yip) planned to hold a sit-in in the New York City Mayor's Office at 11:00 AM, on April 10, 1968, to demand the use of the Sheep Meadow in Central Park, New York City, on April 14, 1968, for a Yip-Out (music festival).

On April 10, 1968, Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (SAS, FBI), from approximately 11:00 AM until 1:45 PM, observed about forty hippie-type individuals, most of whom were wearing "Yippie" buttons, meet with representatives of Mayor John V. Lindsay outside of City Hall, New York City, to request a permit for the use of the Sheep Meadow in Central Park, New York City, on Easter Sunday, April 14, 1968, for a Yip-Out (music festival).


After much discussion, and an intermission of one hour from 12:15 PM to 1:15 PM, the group was advised by Sidney Davidoff, Assistant to Mayor John V. Lindsay, that a permit would be granted to them by the New York City Parks Department for the use of the Sheep Meadow in Central Park, New York City, on April 14, 1968, for their Yip-Out (music festival).

EMERGENCY CIVIL LIBERTIES COMMITTEE

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee:

"Emergency Civil Liberties Committee

"1. The Emergency Civil Liberties Committee is an organization with headquarters in New York, whose avowed purpose is to abolish the House Committee on Un-American Activities and discredit the FBI. * * * The committee finds that the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee, established in 1951, although representing itself as a non-Communist group, actually operates as a front for the Communist Party. It has repeatedly assisted, by means of funds and legal aid, Communists involved in Smith Act violations and similar legal proceedings. One of its chief activities has been and still is the dissemination of voluminous Communist propaganda material

FRANK WILKINSON was called as a witness when he appeared in Atlanta as a representativo of the Emergency Civil Libertics Committee to propagandize against the Committee on Un-American Activities and to protest its hearings. In 1956 WILKINSON was identified as a Communist Party member by a former FBI undercover agent within the Party. Summoned at that time to answer the allegation, his reply to all questions was, answering no questions of this committee." This also became his stock reply to questions when he appeared during the Atlanta hearings. * * * WILKINSON has since been convicted of contempt of Congress and scritchiced to one year in jail.

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THE GUS HALL-BENJAMIN J. DAVIS DEFENSE COMMITTEE

A source advised on March 27, 1962, that GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, United States of America (CP,USA), stated on March 26, 1962, that the Party will form a new committee known as the Gus Hall-Benjamin J. Davis Defense Committee (H-DDC). The purpose of this committee is to raise \$100,000 for the defense of HALL and DAVIS.

"The Worker" issue of April 23, 1967, page 10, lists the address of the H-DDC as Room 1225, 22 East 17th Street, New York, New York.

"The Worker" is an east coast Communist newspaper.

GUS HALL BENJAMIN J. DAVIS

HALL and DAVIS were indicted by the Federal Grand Jury, Washington, D.C., on March 15, 1962, charging them with violations of Sections 768 (h) and 794, Title 50, United States Code, in that they, as General Secretary and National Secretary, CP, USA, respectively, and as members of its National Board, willfully and unlawfully failed to register for and on behalf of the CP, USA, with the Attorney General.

The indictment against DAVIS was dismissed October 9, 1964, in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia and the indictment against HALL was dismissed in the same court on May 4, 1966.

Reference is made to New York memorandum dated April 11, 1968, and captioned as above.

On April 14, 1968, Special Agents (SAs) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) observed a Yip-Out (music festival) sponsored by the Youth International Party (YIP) in the Sheep Meadow of Central Park, New York City.

At 6:00 a.m., approximately 200 hippie-type individuals were milling around the Sheep Meadow.

By 11:00 a.m., the crowd had enlarged to approximately 1,000 individuals. At that time a band started playing music at the Southwest corner of the Sheep Meadow. Stands were also set up at which YIP posters were passed out advertising a "Festival of Life" in Chicago, August 25 to 30, 1968, with free music, lights, theater and magic. In addition, in one section of the Sheep Meadow a small area was also set up to accept donations of canned food goods for the forthcoming Poor People's March to Washington, D. C.

At 1:00 p.m., the crowd had enlarged to approximately 5,000 individuals and at 2:00 p.m., the crowd had enlarged to a peak of approximately 9,000 hippie-



On May 2, 1968, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that at a meeting of the Youth International Party (YIP) held on May 1, 1968, in New York City, Jerry Rubin, a YIP leader, asked the organization to call off the Chicago Festival of Life demonstration which had been scheduled for August 25-30, 1968, during the National Democratic Convention in that city. K

The source stated that after much discussion, and presentation of various views, it was unanimously agreed that the Festival of Life would be called off and that an announcement to this effect would be made in the near future.

The source stated that the reasons for the cancellation of the Festival of Life were as follows: logistics were that such a Festival would not be feasible due to the lack of facilities and finances.

The source stated the main reason for the cancellation was that the organization did not want to be responsible for the numerous youths who would attend the Festival without adequate facilities. (6

The source indicated that hippie-type groups in the Chicago area may, on their own, hold some type of activities during the National Democratic Convention.



On May 7, 1968, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that at a meeting of the Youth International Party (YIP) held on the evening of May 6, 1968, in New York City, and attended by ten individuals, the group changed the plans of their former "Loot-In" project at Macy's Department Store in New York City, to a "Macy's Giant New-Nation Celebration" to be held on June 8, 1968, from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m., followed by a celebration in the Sheep Meadow in Central Park, New York City, at 4:00 p.m.

The source stated that the group's plans now call for the wearing of costumes and the surrounding of Macy's Department Store at which time shoppers will be asked not to enter Macy's Department Store.

The source stated that the group's plans also include "spontaneous sculpture in the aisles" of Macy's Department Store.

The source also advised that the YIP is now concerned that some other group may try to hold a "Loot-In" at Macy's Department Store on their own and advertise it as being a project of YIP.







NY T-2 advised on April 30, 1968, that the Headquarters of the YIP is located in Room 607 at 32 Union Square, New York, New York.

B. Origin and Aims

The "New York Post", a New York City daily newspaper, in its February 2, 1968 issue, on page 12, sets forth an article entitled "Gaily, Gaily, Hippies Going Into Politics," which states in part as follows: (\mathcal{W})

"A new group called Youth International Party (YIP) with a high command of 25 'yippies' is promoting a fun-and-games youth festival in Chicago during the Democratic National Convention in late August. (U)

"The New York-based organization, whose leaders include poet Allen Ginsberg and folk singer Arlo Guthrie, hopes to lure 500,000 free spirits to Chicago for the occasion.()

"It promises singing, dancing in the streets, poetry and 'making love in the parks,' according to the first announcement distributed to radical newspapers by Liberation News Service (LNS).(L)

"It is clear the top yippies don't think much of President Johnson or the 'National Death Party' he hopes to lead to a second four-year term in power. (1)

"'Rise up and abandon this creeping meatball,' the leaders are quoted as saying about Guess who (W)

"'We demand the politics of ecstasy!'($\mathfrak W$

"As for plans by Chicago mayor Daley and the FBI to halt any convention-disrupting stuff, the yippies had little but scorn. The mayor and 'J. Edgar Freako will not stop us,' they insisted. (A)

"Participants were asked to bring blankets and pillows and assured that everyting would be free during this song-and-dance-and-love-in.

"Word of the 'yippie' activity was relayed to the commercial press by the co-directors of Liberation News Service, Ray Mungo and Marshall Bloom, who also are on the YIP committee.

"Mungo is former editor of the Boston University News and Bloom once edited the Amherst Student. They both wear their hair long and Bloom wears a mustache and chin whiskers."

The Foreign Broadcast Information Service for January 22, 1965, in Daily Report-Latin America, number 14, reflected the following transmittal in Spanish from Havana, Cuba, on January 19, 1965:

"The United States poet Allen Ginsberg arrived in Cuba to participate as a poetry judge in this year's contest of the Cuban Cultural Organization House of Americas. He will be part of the jury that is made up of outstanding poets from different countries."

On March 6, 1968, NY T-1 made available a throwaway on the letterhead of the Liberation News Service, 3 Thomas Circle, N.W., Washington, D.C., captioned "An Announcement: The Youth International Party (or: YIP!) Is Born" which contained a press release datelined January 16 (1968) at New York.

This press release stated in part as follows:

"A group of 25 artists, writers, and musicians have agreed to participate in the founding of the Youth International Party, or YIP, today. YIP will stage a

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" massive Youth Festival this August in Chicago which may just coincide with the Democratic National Convention - although the two are, of course, entirely unrelated."

This throwaway also contained the following statement from YIP:

"Join us in Chicago in August for an international festival of youth, music, and theatre. Rise up and abandon the creeping meatball! Come all you rebels, youth spirits, rock minstrels, truth-seekers, peacock-freaks, poets, barricadejumpers, dancers, lovers, and artists!

"It is summer. It is the last week in August, and the NATIONAL DEATH PARTY meets to bless Lyndon Johnson. We are there! There are 500,000 of us dancing in the streets, throbbing with amplifiers and harmony. We are making love in the parks. We are reading, singing, laughing, printing newspapers, groping and making a mock convention, and celebrating the birth of FREE AMERICA in our own time.

"A new spirit explodes in the land. Things are bursting in music, poetry, dancing, newspapers, movies, celebration, magic, politics, theatre, and life-styles. All these new tribes will gather in Chicago. We will be completely open. Everything will be free. Bring blankets, tents, draft-cards, body-paint, Mr. Leary's Cow, food to share, music, eager skin, and happiness. The threats of LBJ, Mayor Daley, and J. Edgar Freako will not stop us. We are coming! We are coming from all over the world!

"The life of the American spirit is being torn asunder by the forces of violence, decay, and the napalm-cancer fiend. We demand the Politics of Ecstasy! We are the delicate spores of the new fierceness that will change America. We will create our own reality, we are Free America! And we will not accept the false theatre of the Death Convention.

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"We will be in Chicago. Begin preparations now! Chicago is yours! Do it!"

C. Scope

Special Agents (SAS) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) at 11:00 AM on March 19, 1968, observed a press conference called by the Yippies at the Americana Hotel in New York City. During this press conference, JERRY RUBIN, a YIP leader, stated that the Yippies would open an office in Chicago the following week and would also open offices soon in Los Angeles and San Francisco.

On June 24, 1966, NY T-3 advised that JERRY RUBIN attended one session of the 18th National Convention, Communist Party (CP), United States of America (USA), held in New York City as an observer.

D. Initial Founders, Leaders and Officers

NY T-2 advised on March 5 1968, that the YIP was organized by JERRY RUBIN, KEITH LAMPE, and ABBE HOFFMAN, as a political youth organization.

NY T-4 advised on September 22, 1965, that at that time a list of names, believed to be the mailing list of the Gus Hall-Benjamin J. Davis Defense Committee (HDDC) in New York City, included the following under the caption "College Faculty" - KEITH R.LAMPE., Apartment D, 639 East 11th Street New York City, "Queens College."

A characterization of the HDDC is contained in the appendix attached hereto.

NY T-5 advised of October 4, 1967, that ABBE HOFFMAN attended a meeting on September 30, 1967, of the administrative committee of the National Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam, at 20 East 14th Street, New York City. At the meeting, Hoffman presented the "Hippies" plans for the demonstration to be held in Washington, D.C., October 21-22, 1967, part of which consisted of dyeing the Potomac River red and firing water pistols filled with day-gloy paint at the walls of the Pentagon.

On March 6, 1958, NY T-1 made available a throwaway on the letterhead of the Liberation News Service, previously described, captioned "An Announcement: The Youth International Party (or: YIP!) Is Born" which contained a press release datelined January 16 (1968). ()

The February 29, 1968 issue of "Win" self-described as a publication of the War Resisters League in cooperation with the New York Workshop in Non-Violence, on page 5, identified Country Joe and the Fish as a "country-folk-rock group, well known amoung west coast activists.

The April, May, June, 1966, issue of "Rights", a self-described publication of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee (ECLC) reflects that PAUL KRASSNER, editor of "The Realist" was a new member of the ECLC National Council.

A characterization of the ECIC is contained in the appendix attached hereto.

NY T-10 advised on February 23, 1966, that as of February 23, 1966, SHARON KREBS was a secret member of the PLP while functioning as a May 2 Movement (M2M) member only.

A characterization of the M2M is contained in the appendix attached hereto.

NY T-11 advised on July 15, 1963, that PHILIP OCHS attended a speech made by GUS HALL, General Secretary, CP, USA, at 111 Second Avenue, New York, New York, on July 12, 1963.

On March 6, 1968, NY T-1 made available an undated leaflet from YIP, 32 Union Square, New York City, which identifies the following individuals as the coordinators of YIP:

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II. ACTIVITIES.

A. Mock Raid at the State University of New York (SUNY) at Stony Brook, New York, February 27, 1968

On February 26, 1968, the Bureau of Special Services, New York City Police Department (BSS, NYCPD), advised that at approximately 3:00 AM, February 27, 1968, a group of Yippies would travel from New York City for a mock raid at the State Uniersity of New York (SUNY) at Stony Brook, New York. On February 26, 1968, JOHN L. BARRY, Commissioner, Suffolk County Police Department, Hauppauge, New York, confirmed the above and stated that this was apparently to be a mock tactic to protest a narcotics raid on the above campus conducted by his department on January 17, 1968, when thirty students were arrested on narcotics charges.

On February 27, 1968, the Intelligence Squad, Suffolk County Police Department, furnished a throwaway leaflet which was distributed at the SUNY. It contains a heading: Youth International Party, 32 Union Square, East

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New York, New York, with a caption "Yippie Cops Raid Stoneybrook, Stoneybrook University, Stoneybrook, New York, February, 27, 1967 - 6:00 am." This release read as follows:

"This is a happy raid. These indicted Stoneybrook students are being sentenced to a joyful concert by the Fugs and a performance by the Pageant Players. There will even be dancing in the halls before classes. We have found balloons, candy, flowers and other goodies in their rooms which we feel are sufficient grounds for these arrests. We wish to make it clear at this time that there has been absolutely no complicity on the part of the University Administration with the Yippie police. As a matter of fact, they are still asleep. However, the student body shows every indication of awakening.

"We are trying to contrast the authoritarian, gestapolike behavior of the Suffolk County Police with fun and peacefulness. The failure of the school administration to back up the students in the face of the recent police abuse has created a vacuum. It is being filled by a growing number of students who are articulating and working toward a community which will be a place where spirits and minds can be free."

The Suffolk County Police Department advised that the group, most dressed in "hippie" attire, arrived at the SUNY campus at approximately 6:00 AM, February 27, 1968, but were not permitted to enter the campus on the instructions of the University administration. They gathered in the vicinity of the main gate of the campus where they sang songs and played music and danced. The gathering was orderly. No arrests were made. The group dispersed at approximately 11:45 AM. At that time, at the request of the English Department, a small group was permitted to enter the campus under the sponsorship of individual students for the purpose of putting on a performance for the English Department.

On March 4, 1968, Detective Lieutenant WARREN BUCKWARD, Intelligence Squad, Suffolk County Police Department, advised that on February 27, 1968, he and

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Detective GUY C. ZEUNER of his department observed the activities of the group in the vicinity of the Commercial Trade Building, 32 Union Square East, New York City, and at the University. He said that he was advised by Detective ROBERT CEA, BSS, NYCPD, that the group-was under the leadership of KEITH LAMPE, a former English Professor at Queens College, Flushing, New York. Detective CEA interviewed LAMPE and the latter advised him that the Youth International Party hoped to organize forty-fifty people in fifteen vehicles at 3:30 AM on February 27, 1968, and then proceed to Stony Brook, New York, to execute a satirical raid on G-Dormitory at SUNY, after which there would be music by the Fugs, a rock-and-roll musical group, and satirical plays.

At 4:10 AM, on February 27, 1968, approximately sixty persons, of which approximately fifteen were female, left the 32 Union Square area, New York City, in a fifteen car caravan, and proceeded to Stony Brook, New York. They arrived at 5:35 AM. They were greeted at the main gate of the University by the Campus Security police, members of the Suffolk County Police Department, and students displaying signs such as "Go Home, we have had enough trouble." The raiding group carried no signs and did not parade. There were no incidents and no arrests.

The "New York Post" in its February 27, 1968 issue on page 2 sets forth an article entitled" A 'Raid' Fails on Takeoff at Keystony Brook" which states in part as follows:

"They call themselves the Youth International Party, and for short they want to be known as YIP. Their members say they're Yippies, which is not unlike today's hippies - except they claim a Yippie is the more intellectual breed.

"Early today, like about 3 a.m., they rallied outside 32 Union Square E., which is their headquarters. There were 100 of them, and they piled into 25 cars and headed east to 'save' the beleaguered students of the State University at Stony Brook, which had some trouble last month with Suffolk

"County cops who raided the campus and arrested nearly two score for allegedly possessing marijuana.

"It was going to be a 'guerrilla love feast', the YIP leaders said, and they were going on campus just the way the cops did. They planned to rouse students from their beds in the dorms and seize the cigarets, candy, balloons and other such innocent items that college kids supposedly keep in their rooms.

"'It's going to be a parody on the police raids,' said Keith Lampe, the leader of YIP, who also described himself as a lecturer on leave from the Queens College language institute.

"But the inveders from Manhattan apparently hadn't counted on the police welcoming committee of 100 that was waiting for them.

"When the yippies tried to enter the main gate, the cops raised their hight sticks, and somebody announced through a bullhorn, 'No one is permitted on the school grounds.'

"The yippies raised their voices in protest. To their surprise, a shout came from inside the campus: Go away, we don't want you.

"These were some 200 Stony Brook students who had gotten wind of what was happening and came to sound their own protest to the protesters.

"Some Yippies had tried to sneak through a cluster of trees and underbrush south of the gate, but the quick-footed cops caught up with them and escorted them back to the street.

"When the Yippies sensed that they weren't going to get onto the campus, they staged a song and dance routine on the grass outside. The show fizzled out by midmorning at the Yippies straggled back to the city."

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B. "Yip-In" Grand Central Station, New York City, March 22, 1968

On March 18, 1968, NY T-16, made available a copy of a leaflet from the YIP announcing that a "Yip-In" would be held in Grand Central Railroad Station, New York City, at midnight on March 22, 1968.

This leaflet describes the proposed "Yip-In" as follows:

"It's a spring mating service celebrating the Equinox, a back-scratching party, a roller-skating rink, a theatre....with you, performer and audience. Get acquainted with other Yippies now, for other yiptivities and Chicago Y.I.P. Festival this summer.

"Bring:

Bells, Flowers, Beads, Music, Radios, Pillows, Eats, Love and Peace.

"Meet later on at Sheep Meadow in Central Park to YIP up the sun."

NY T-14 on March 18, 1968, and NY T-1 on March 26, 1968, also furnished copies of the YIP leaflet announcing a "Yip-In" in Grand Central Railroad Station, New York City, on March 22, 1968.

On March 22, 1968, at approximately 11:30 p.m. SAS of the FBI observed approximately 3,000 hippie-type individuals congregating in Grand Central Raidroad Station in New York City. These individuals, who were dressed in costumes and other hippie - type attire, were singing, dancing and throwing balloons with the word "Yippie" written on them. Periodically such slogans as "We Got Power" and "Peace Now" were chanted. Two banners were displayed, one captioned "Yippie" and the other captioned "Liberty, Equality, Fraternity". In addition "Yippie" buttons were worn by many of the individuals.

At approximately midnight, a number of individuals

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climbed on top of the information booth located in the center of the Railroad Station Concourse. These individuals began throwing railroad timetables into the air and broke the hands off of the four faces of the large clock located on the top of the information booth.

At approximately 12:50 AM on March 23, 1968, New York City Police charged the group of individuals who had climbed on top of the information booth and made a number of arrests.

At approximately 3:00 AM, on March 23, 1968, one-half of the individuals left Grand Central Station and began to walk up 5th Avenue to the Sheep Meadow in Central Park, New York City. At approximately 4:00 AM, the remainder of the individuals left Grand Central Station and proceeded to the Sheep Meadow in Central Park.

At the Sheep Meadow, the individuals sang songs, danced and roamed around. On several occasions, small fires were started by individuals with slats broken from snow fences in the Sheep Meadow for warmth. Several individuals were arrested for damaging the snow fences in the Sheep Meadow.

The individuals continued their activities in the Sheep Meadow until approximately 6:30 AM on March 23, 1968, when the majority dispersed.

Detective GERALD MC CARTHY of the Bureau of Special Services, NYCPD, advised on March 23, 1968, that approximately 60 individuals were arrested during the activities in the Grand Central Railroad Station, and three individuals were arrested in the Sheep Meadow in Central Park.

The "New York Post" in its March 25, 1968 issue on page 2, sets forth an article entitled, "Yippies Say Cops Turned 'Love Feast' into a Riot" which states as follows:

"Officials of the Youth International Party--the Yippies who drew thousands of youngsters to Grand Central Station Friday

"night - charged today that police had turned the spring love feasts' into 'what we believe was a police riot.'

"Some of the scores of persons injured, and several of the 56 who were arrested in Friday night's melee last night told of their experiences at the hands of police in what a Civil Liberties Union lawyer called 'the worst display of police brutality I've ever seen outside of Mississippi.'

"For the city, Barry Gottehrer, assistant to Mayor Lindsay, blamed the police-Yippie confrontation in part on'a lack of communication.' He said he was 'greatly disturbed' at the incident, and said those who felt they were victims of police brutality had two legal means of recourse--the courts and the police Civilian Complaint Review Board.

"Gottehrer, who was present during the Grand Central episode, said he would report to Mayor Lindsay sometime today on the complaints of the Yippie leadership.

"The charge that the episode became a police riot was made by Keigh Lampe, 36, leader of YIP, who was a former newspaperman in Pittsburgh, and once worked for the old International News Service in Paris.

"Lampe said that the anger level is already higher than last year and warned there is a level of 'exasperated violence among young white people.' "

C. "Yip-Out", Sheep Meadow, Central Park, New York City, April 14, 1968

On April 9, 1968, NY T-2 advised that the YIP planned to hold a sit-in in the New York City Mayor's Office at 11:00 AM on April 10, 1968, to demand the use of the Sheep Meadow in Central Park, New York City, on April 14, 1968, for a "Yip-Out" (music festival)

On April 10, 1968, NY T-5 made available an undated leaflet from the YIP entitled "We Demand Music in Sheepmeadow!!" which states in part as follows:

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"After two weeks of(obscene) promises, the city has denied us the use of Sheepmeadow on Easter Sunday. By denying us the right to set up stages and sound systems they are creating a dangerous situation that could erupt into a repeat of the Grand Central Station Massacre.

"DEMAND YOUR RIGHTS!! SHEEPMEADOW MUST BE LIBERATED!!

JOIN A MASSIVE SIT - IN IN LINDSAY'S OFFICE

"ASSEMBLE: 11:00 A.M. WEDNESDAY, APRIL 10

MAIN ENTRANCE CITY HALL

"Be advised: Police are armed and considered dangerous. Let's see how the phony administrators: who have been 'embracing' MARTIN LUTHER KING'S tactics respond when those tactics are used in their own backyards."

On April 10, 1968, SAS of the FBI from approximately 11:00 AM until 1:45 PM, observed about forty hippie-type individuals, most of whom were wearing "Yippie" buttons, meet with representatives of Mayor JOHN V. LINDSAY outside of City Hall, New York City, to request a permit for the use of the Sheep Meadow in Central Park, New York City, on Easter Sunday, April 14, 1968, for a "Yip-Out" (music festival).

After much discussion and an intermission of one hour from 12:15 PM to 1:15 PM, the group was advised by SIDNEY DAVIDOFF, Assistant to Mayor JOHN V. LINDSAY, that a permit would be granted to them by the New York City Parks Department for the use of Sheep Meadow in Central Park, New York City, on April 14, 1968, for their "Yip-Out" (music festival).

JERRY RUBIN, KEITH LAMPE, ABBE HOFFMAN, PAUL KRASSNER and BOB FASS of New York City radio station WBAI were observed participating in the discussions with the representatives of Mayor JOHN V. LINDSAY and appeared to bethe spokesmen for the Yippies.

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The "New York Post" in its April 10, 1968 issue on page 10 sets forth an item entitled "Sit-In for a Yip-Out" which sets forth a photograph of a group of Yippies meeting with SIDNEY DAVIDOFF, Assistant to New York City Mayor JOHN V. LINDSAY outside of City Hall, New York City on April 10, 1968.

The item then states as follows:

"Sid Davidoff, assistant to Mayor Lindsay, tries to placate a group of yippies camped outside City Hall today. The yippies--Youth International Party--want the Sheep Meadow for an Easter Sunday 'Yip-out', an updated version of the old-fashioned 'be-in'. City officials at first insisted they could use only the Central Park Mall, not the meadow. But Davidoff later relented."

On April 14, 1968, SAS of the FBI observed a "Yip-Out" (music festival) sponsored by the YIP in the Sheep Meadow of Central Park, New York City.

At 6:00 AM, approximately 200 hippie-type individuals were milling around the Sheep Meadow.

By 11:00 AM, the crowd had enlarged to approximately 1,000 individuals. At that time a band started playing music at the Southwest corner of the Sheep Meadow. Stands were also set up at which YIP posters were passed out advertising a "Festival of Life" in Chicago, August 25 to 30, 1968, with free music, lights, theater and magic. In addition, in one section of the Sheep Meadow a small area was also set up to accept donations of canned food goods for the forthcoming Poor People's March to Washington, D.C.

At 1:00 PM, the crowd had enlarged to approximately 5,000 individuals and at 2:00 PM, the crowd had enlarged to a peak of approximately 9,000 hippie-type individuals and Easter Sunday strollers.

A number of individuals wearing "Yippie" T-shirts wandered through the crowd with buckets attempting to obtain contributions for YIP.

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During the day numerous small groups entertained with various hippie-type music.

At 3:00 PM, a small single engine airplane circled over the Sheep Meadow three times and dropped bunches of flowers.

By 6:00 PM, the crowd had dwindled to approximately 1,000 individuals who were gathered around the platform at the Southwest corner of the Sheep Meadow listening to hippie-type music.

By 7:45 PM, the majority of the crowd had dispersed.

D. Festival of Life, Chicago, Illinois, August 25-30, 1968

On March 6, 1968, NY T-1 made available an undated leaflet of YIP entitled "People, Get Ready" which states as follows:

"The leaders of the National Democratic Party are planning to meet in Chicago in August; there to enact, for the television audience, all the drama and excitement of an American Political Convention, culminating, it is understood, in the nomincation of L. Johnson for President of the United States, and Leader of the Free World.

"In the face of this act of sado-masochistic folly the free youth of America will simultaneously hold an enormous International Youth Festival in Chicago; there will be music playing and people swaying, dancing in the streets. Johnson and his delegates, locked in their slaughterhouse conventionhall theatre, will make ugly speeches and play ugly campaign music, while we, the living breathing youth of the world, will make the city a theatre, and every restaurant Alice's. Already, throughout parks and vacant lots in and around Chicago, agents of the Potheads' Benevolent Association have planted hundreds of thousands of pot seeds. The long hot summer of 1968 is expected to produce ideal weather for marijuana growing, and most of the crop should be ready for smoking by the end of August. Free people, free pot, free music, free theatre; a whole new culture will manifest itself to the world, rising

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"from the ashes of America. Rock groups will be performing in the parks; newspapers will be printed in the streets; provos and police will play cops and robbers in the department stores; Democrats and dope fiends will chase each other through hotel corridors. Longboats filled with Vikings will land on the shores of Lake Michigan, and discover A m e r i c a ! Chicago will become a river of wild onions!"

On March 6, 1968, NY T-1 made available an undated leaflet from YIP, 32 Union Square, New York City, which stated in part as follows:

"68' is the year of the YIPPIE! Over 500,000 free spirits will come to Chicago during Aug.25-30. They will come to celebrate a free Festival of Life as a living alternative to the death of the National Democratic Party. Over one hundred music groups, celebrities and theatre groups have already agreed to participate including: Arlo Guthrie, Allan Ginsburg, Timothy Leary, Phil Ochs, Judy Collins, Paul Krassner, Country Joe and the Fish, the Fugs, Janis Ian, Richie Havens, and Dick Gregory.

"We have available 2 multicolor posters 24" by 36" by Milton Glazer and the Group Image. In addition we have a super $l^{\frac{1}{4}}$ " button, dayglo pink on deep purple, which bears our slogan YIPPIE! (The posters are fantastic bargains; similar ones by the Group Image and Milton Glazer sell for anywhere between 2-5 dollars.) Funds raised go to the festival. All orders will be filled promptly. All orders must be prepaid. Make check payable to the Youth International Party."

NY T-17 advised on January 4, 1966, that at that time a Students for A Democratic Society (SDS) membership card was being sent to JUDITH COLLINS through the SDS Headquarters in Chicago, Illinois. COLLINS was to be a member at large as she had apparently given SDS a "large bundle of money."

Lieutenant FRANK HEIMOSKI, Bureau of Inspectional Services, Security Unit, Chicago, Police Department, made available informa-

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tion on September 23, 1966, reflecting that

New York, New York, was a member of a

New York club of the W.E.B. Du Bois Clubs
of America (DCA). This information also
reflected that as of June, 1966,
and a singer by occupation.

A characterization of the DCA is contained in the appendix attached hereto.

On March 6, 1968, NY T-1 made available a copy of a reprint of an article written by JERRY RUBIN for the Underground Press entitled "Notes from an Erá Yippizolean" which stated as follows concerning the planned activities of YIP:

"1968 is the year of the 'yippies.'

"A yippee is anyone who wants to be. A yippee! sounds like the name. Say it loud, and you'll see what I mean. Yippee! Yippee!!

"The yippees will be in Chicago this August for the youth festival, or Youth International Party, YIP.

"The yippees were born at the Pentagon last October, although they have been developing in the womb of Mother America since the late 1950's.

"The yippees are the children of the middle class, children who refuse to 'grow up! refuse to accept the world their parents created. The yippees have had white middle-class America, and they didn't like it.

"A yippèe is a stoned-idealist, moved by a vision of a future utopia. He is a romantic. It is not fear which moves the yippee; it is faith and hope.

"The yippies are fighting for their own freedom The yippees know in their bones what America has done--

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"rivers of blood, man against man, death of spirit, denial of dignity. The yippee is free because he is engaged and committed to change.

"The yippee sees America as a huge prison, with her institutions (bureacracies, office buildings, armies, universities, schools) as bars. The yippees are drop-outs from that world. They were raised on horror stories of Eichmann, the bureacratic cop-out.

"The yippees are with the Vietnamese, peasant guerrillas wherever they are, and the black and other struggling people of America in this mid-20th century saga of the battle of Man V. S. Machine.

"To America's insanity, the yippees ask: Why?! Yippees are naive.

"The answers?

"'You're freaky-looking.'

"'The Chinese are coming.'

"'Watch out for the commies.'

"'Get a bath.'

"The yippee is not busy working within the system or trying to explain his actions to the Establishment or the middle-class mentality. He is too concerned with creating a clear alternative, an underground, an opposition.

"He is involved in a cultural revolution. process he is seducing the 10-year-olds with happenings, community, youth power, dignity, underground media, music, legends, marijuana, action, myth, excitement, a new style.

"The yippees are out there blocking traffic, throwing blood, burning money, tying up government telephone wires, milling in, (obscene) the draft, throwing live snakes into Dow Chemical executive cocktail parties.

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"You probably don't agree with this description of yippee, but that's because you are a yippee, and you have your own fantasy.

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"The New Left created the teach-in, the hippy created the be-in, and the yippee is creating the do-in. America's first youth festival will be a do-in and it will take place Aug. 25 to Aug. 30 in Chicago's Grant Park.

"If that's the same time the National Death Party meets to crown LBJ there's no coincidence! The world will see what the youth of America thinks of the Death Party and its war games. The youth festival will be a living alternative and you can take your choice.

"Imagine the sight: thousands of yippees, from 200,000 up, making their way to Chicago by thumb, magical mystery tour, bus, bicycle, car, truck, foot -- from big town and small hamlet -- carrying sleeping bags, guitars, blankets, food -- coming together in the middle of the country at the end of the summer for a super-creative energy explosion and information exchange.

"It will be a total multi-media experience. For six days we will be together sharing and learning. Every morning all our money can be thrown into big barrels to buy enough food to feed everyone. Our own Alice's Restaurant! And that tells America how we thinks the needs of human beings should be solved -- everything free.

"The music will be free. The performers will be playing for their community. Definite already are Country Joe and the Fish, The Fugs, Arlo Guthrie, Phil Ochs, the United States of America band, Pageant Players, Bread and Puppet Theater, Allen Ginsberg, Timothy Leary, Paul Krassner and the Steve Miller Blues Band. Invitations are now going to Dylan, Eric Burdon and the Animals, the Monkeys, the Jefferson Airplane, Richie Havens, Simon and Garfunkel, the Doors, the Who, the Blue's Project, Beatles, Mothers of

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"Invention, Mamas and Papas, Janis Ian, the Cream, and the Smothers Brothers to name just a few.

"Walk across Grant Park at any time during the youth festival and you'll find:

"Free mikes and soapboxes for anyone who wants to rap, and a . . .

"Free mimeo for any who has something to pass out.

"The underground papers will come from all over the country to Grant Park to publish a daily paper for the festival. They'll do it right in the park and teach people how to start and do their own paper.

"Film-makers will hold workshops and show at night what they film during the day.

"Continuous workshops on the draft, and how to end it will be held.

"A real school for drop-outs will appear, along with art of the streets, art for and from the people. You name it. You do it. Everyone participates -- every man is a creator.

"We'll have yippees dressed like Vietcong walking the streets and shaking hands like ordinary American politicans. We'll infiltrate right-wing crowds with short-hair yippee veterans who at the proper moment will blow minds with speeches like: 'Now, these yippees have something to say...'

"Guerrilla theater groups from all over the country will be there. The day before LBJ arrives in Chicago we will announce to the overground press that LBJ will arrive at 2 p.m. at O'Hara Airport. And it will be our own LBJ: who will be greated enthusiastically by the yippees, honored by a motorcade through Chicago, and then on to a hotel for a press conference to announce America's withdrawal from Vietnam.

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"Yippies plan to paint their cars like cabs, bick up delegates, and drop them off in Wisconsin. We are infiltrating the hotels with bellboys and cooks. We are also infiltrating the press.

"We'll have our own theater-convention and nominate Bancroft P. Hogg, a pig made out of vegetables, for President and LBJ for Vice-President. After Hogg is nominated, we will kill him and then eats him. We will say to America: 'You nominate a President and he eats the people. At our convention we nominate a President and the people eat him!'

"The youth festival will dramatize the nations's most massive collective and individual acts of resistance. One night 100,000 people will burn draft cards at the same moment, with the fires spelling out 'Beat Army.' The next day all the pyromaniacs will send signed letters to the government confessing their act, and will encourage more young men to follow them.

"This do-in will be unique in that it must be a bottom-up revolution to succeed. You are needed to work on it to make it happen. It will not be done for you. We have opened up a coordinating office, at YIP (room 607, 32 Union Square East, New York, 10003, New York, phone (212) 982-5090 and we are there coordinating information.

"The Chicago power structure, especially Mayor Daley, is not going to be thrilled about our using Grant Park. But with hundreds of thousands of us, what are they going to do? It is our human right and we are confident of receiving a permit to use Grant Park.

"That week in Chicago will be a living theater of America. King will be there, also Gregory, also Spock and the peace movement. The Democrats will probably have to travel from hotel to convention hall by helicopter. Johnson will be nominated under military guard, under the protection of Army bayonets. Even if Chicago does not burn, the mass paranoia and guilt of the government will force them to bring thousands of troops, and the more troops, the better the theater.

"A lot of troops will have to stay and watch us (long hair freaks them out), diverting troops from the black community. And the yippees, being wanderers, will be all over the city.

"That Indon Johnson and his Democratic Party cannot rule this country is becoming clearer every day. The choice is between the life of youth and the death of the Establishment. For those who don't see that now, Chicago will be an aye-opener."

NY T-14 on February 28, 1968, and NY T-18 on March 12, 1968, also furnished copies of the reprint of an article written by JERRY RUBIN for the Underground Press entitled "Notes from an Era Yippizolean".

On March 6, 1968, NY T-1 made available an undated three page leaflet of YIP, 32 Union Square, New York City, entitled "Yippie Announcement! Yippie!" This leaflet states in part as follows:

"YIP is planning a 'festival of life', an 'international youth festival' from Sunday, August 25 to Friday, August 30 in Chicago, Illinois. This youth festival will take place at the same time as the National Death (Democratic)Convention in Chicago. It will be a contrast in life styles. Ours will be an affirmative of life; theirs is d-e-a-t-h.

"The festival of life is being organized by a new coalition of forces called the 'Youth International Party' or 'YIP'. All the people who come to the youth festival are 'yippies!'. Chicago police have estimated 'anywhere from 100,000 to two million'. We concur.

"The youth festival is unique in the following respects:

"1. In addition to the protest of the Death Party and its policies, the festival presents a living, cultural, spiritual alternative.

"2. The festival will be an artistic event and

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"involves artists in its conception and execution.

"3. The festival will last six days and will be a living experience for those who come, not just a one or two-day protest.

The festival will be a participatory event, a creative 'do-in' . Activities and resources will be planned so that everyone who comes will become involved and will grow. through 'the experiences.

"5. Everything will be free. This will be the nation's first major free music festival. Our goal is that food also will be free at the festival -- people will pool their money to provide free food. The festival will express our view that the needs of life should be free. We will demonstrate this through action -- through sharing.

"The following are some of the activities that will occur at the youth festival:

"--music. The following performers have already agreed to appear: Country Joe and the Fish; Blood, Sweat and Tears; Arlo Guthrie; Len Chandler, Phil Ochs; Janis Ian; the Fugs; United States of America electric band; Peter. Seeger; American Expeditionary Force; The Sunshine Company; The Nitty Gritty Dirt Band.; Richie Havens; Dick Gregory; Barbara Dane; Jim and Jean; Judy Collins; Steve Miller Blues Band.

"A number of performers are preparing a call soon to be widely publicized asking all artists to celebrate Aug. 25-30 as 'affirmation of life' week and not to accept any commercial bookings; and instead to come to Chicago to perform for the youth festival.

"--A major emphasis of the youth festival will be on guerrilla theater. Many interesting things are planned: we will have our own LBJ who will end the war; there may be a march of the oppressed of the world; and body paint and costumes for all who want them. The Bread and Puppet Theatre and the Pageant Players of New York are preparing happenings. YIP is asking guerrilla theater groups from all over America to come to Chicago that week to 'do your thing...Chicago is a stage...it will be

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"a natural energy center for guerrilla theater.' If interested, write the coordinator for guerrilla theater, Richard Schechner, editor, Drama Review, New York University, 32 Washington Place, N.Y. 10003, N.Y., or call (212) 598-2596.

"--A daily underground paper will be published by the underground papers and Liberation News Service.

"--Discussions and demonstrations will take place on the issue of the draft. One night 100,000 people may burn draft cards, with the fires spelling: 'Beat Army.'

"--A mock convention will happen."

"--And: free mikes for people to rap in Hyde Park fashion, mimeos also, and hundreds of small discussions on hundreds of topics.

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"Youth festivals will take place in countries all over the world the same week.

"Our yippie calls are:

"'Rise up and abandon the creeping meatball!'

"'We demand the politics of ecstasy!!

"Many people are working actively to build the festival including Paul Krassner, Ed Sanders, Timothy Leary, Allen Ginsburg, Vaughn Meader, Richard Goldstein, Bob Fass, Jacques Levy, Barbara Dane, Mike Ochs, Aboie Hoffman, Keith Lampe, Jerry Rubin. 'Dennis Gaston and Abe Peckolick, along with people from the underground paper, The Seed, are forming a YIP group in Chicago and an office will be opening there shortly to carry on the coordination of local forces.()

"A support committee is being formed in Chicago of clergymen and lawyers to negotiate with the city for permits

"to use park facilities. We are confident of receiving the necessary permits. The more people that are planning to come to Chicago, the more likely will be our chances.

"The youth festival is completely open. There is no 'central committee' making decisions on policy. We are working to get people there, to organize the best sound system ever, and the necessary resources. Form your own committee, hand out your own releases, plan your own activities. In fact, yippie will not happen if you personally don't get involved. Become a yippie organizer in your own city (and write us about your work)! Do it! Now.

"Because of the tremendous numbers of people expected, local groups should begin now securing their transportation -- buses, trucks, bikes, etc. You might consider dramatic bus, truck, car, bike, walking caravans across the country to Chicago! Bring sleeping bags, blankets, tents, and props.

"Money is desperately needed to provide staging, sound system, lighting, props, publicity and other resources needed to make the festival a success. If you can, make checks payable to Youth International Party and sent to our office.

"Literature, two multi-color posters by Milton Glazer and the Group Image and YIPPIE buttons and stickers are available through our office.

"If interested in hearing a speaker on YIPPEE, contact the YIP office.

"This will be the first national youth festival, the first coming together of all the people who have been involved in the youth revolution which has been taking place in America in the past decade. A lot will be concentrated in one time and place period in August and the result will be, we think, 'geometric' growth in the energy and spirit of our new culture."

NY T-18 on March 12, 1968, also furnished a copy of the undated three page YIP leaflet entitled "Yippie Announcement! Yippie!"

On December 13, 1954, JOHN LAUTNER, a CP, USA, member for over twenty years, who at the time of his expulsion from the CP, USA, in January, 1950, was chairman of the New York State Communist Party Review Commission, advised that he knew PETE SEEGER as a CP, USA member

On October 25, 1965, NY T-19 advised that BARBARA DANE appeared at a memorial tribute to ROBERT THOMPSON held in New York City on October 24, 1965.

from 1947-1949.

"The Worker" in its issue of October 19, 1965, contained an article on ROBERT THOMPSON indicating that he had died on October 16, 1965. The article described THOMPSON as a leading figure of the Communist Movement for many years and chief spokesman of the New York State Communist organization.

"The Worker" is an east coast communist newspaper.

NY T-20 advised on March 14, 1968, that at a meeting sponsored by The Resistance at the Washington Square Methodist Church, 133 West Fourth Street, New York City, on March 14, 1968, KEITH LAMPE spoke for the Yippies at which time he stated that he expected anywhere from 25,000 to 30,000 Yippies to go to Chicago during the National Democratic Convention. He stated it was not the purpose of the Yippies to disrupt the Convention or to provoke violence, but to show the Democratic Convention and the general public that a "third party was alive."

SAS of the FBI at 11:00 AM on March 19, 1968, observed a press conference called by the Yippies at the Americana Hotel in New York City. The master of ceremonies was BOB FASS of New York City radio station WBAI who described a Yippie as what happens to a hippie when a cop hits him on the head. ED SANDERS of the folk singers, The Fugs, stated

that a quarter of a million youth are going to Chicago to hold a Festival of Life during the National Democratic Convention to demand politics of ecstasy. RICHARD SCHECKNER, editor of "The Drama Review", New York University, stated 20 or 30 theater and musical groups from all over the country will begin to converge on Chicago in July, 1968. will pick up Yippies and youth along the way with street plays in various localities and bring them to Chicago. SCHECHNER stated that the whole purpose is to have good, clean fun in Chicago. PAUL KRASSNER, editor of "The Realist" magazine stated he was going to Chicago on the following weekend to do a benefit for the Underground Press. KRASSNER stated that he would call on Mayor DAIEY in Chicago the following day to attempt to make an appointment to see him while in Chicago for permits. KRASSNER then stated that the Yippies festival in Chicago would take place August 25 - 30, 1968, during the National Democratic Convention and that the festival would be non-violent. ALLAN KATZMAN, editor of "The East Village Other" newspaper stated that a newspaper called the "Creeping Meatball" would be published at the Chicago Underground Press headquarters, "The Seed."

III. MISCELLANEOUS

Informants who are familiar with certain phases of CP and CP front activities in the New York City area, were contacted in March, 1968, and they could furnish no information concerning YIP.

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AMERICAN INSTITUTE FOR MARXIST STUDIES

A source advised on April 9, 1963, that on April 7, 1963, at a meeting of the District Committee of the Communist Party, United States of America (CPUSA), of New England, held in Boston, Massachusetts, HERBERT APTHEKER stated he was developing an organization called American Institute for Marxist Studies (AIMS), which would eventually legalize the CP. He stated AIMS would publish literature on History, Science, Physics, Archeology and other subjects which would be put out quarterly with various supplements.

A second source advised on June 30, 1966, that HERBERT APTHEKER was elected to the National Committee, CPUSA, at the 18th National Convention of the CPUSA, held June 22-26, 1966, in New York City.

A third source advised on June 7, 1963, that on June 3, 1963, HERBERT APTHEKER spoke at the CPUSA, New York District Board meeting concerning AIMS. APTHEKER stated that AIMS would unite and strengthen the CP although the CP would not be connected with it. He stated AIMS was being formed to operate within the scope of the McCarran and Smith Acts and would legally bring Marxist material and opinions to the attention of American scholars and the general public.

A fourth source reported on August 29, 1966, that AIMS issues a "Newsletter" every other month. This source also made available the information that AIMS issues publication and holds symposiums concerning Marxism.

A fifth source advised on May 9, 1967, that as of that date, AIMS was located on the fifth floor west of 20 West 30th Street, New York, New York.

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EMERGENCY CIVIL LIBERTIES COMMITTEE

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee:

"Emergency Civil Liberties Committee

"1. 'The Emergency Civil Liberties Committee is an organization with headquarters in New York, whose avowed purpose is to abolish the House Committee on Un-American Activities and discredit the FBI. * * * The committee finds that the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee, established in 1951, although representing itself as a non-Communist group, actually operates as a front for the Communist Party. It has repeatedly assisted, by means of funds and legal aid, Communists involved in Smith Act violations and similar legal proceedings. One of its chief activities has been and still is the dissemination of voluminous Communist propaganda material.

'FRANK WILKINSON was called as a witness when he appeared in Atlanta as a representative of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee to propagandize against the Committee on Un-American Activities and to protest its hearings. In 1956 WILKINSON was identified as a Communist Party member by a former FBI undercover agent within the Party. Summoned at that time to answer the allegation, his reply to all questions was, "I am answering no questions of this committee." This also became his stock reply to questions when he appeared during the Atlanta hearings. * * * WILKINSON has since been convicted of contempt of Congress and sentenced to one year in jail.

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EMERGENCY CIVIL LIBERTIES COMMITTEE (CONT'D)

Disputing the non-Communist claim of the organization, the committee finds that a number of other individuals connected with the ECIC also have been identified under oath as Communists.

(Committee on Un-American Activities, Annual Report for 1958, House Report 187, March 9, 1959, pp. 34 and 35.)

'To defend the cases of Communist lawbreakers, fronts have been devised making
special appeals in behalf of civil
liberties and reaching out far
beyond the confines of the Communist
Party itself. Among these organizations
are the * * * Emergency Civil Liberties
Committee. When the Communist Party
itself is under fire these fronts offer
a bulwark of protection.'
(Internal Security Subcommittee of the
Senate Judiciary Committee, Handbook for
Americans, S. Doc. 117, April 23, 1956,
p. 91.)"

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FREEDOMWAYS ASSOCIATES, INC.

The records of the New York State Secretary of State, Albany, New York, show that the Certificate of Incorporation of Freedomways Associates, Inc., was filed on March 2, 1961.

on May 24, 1961, a source advised that a report was given on "Freedomways" at a meeting of the National Board, Communist Party, USA (CP, USA), held on May 24, 1961. It was stated that the central purpose of "Freedomways" is to develop a theory and positive criticism of currents in the Negro Movement, as well as to raise the level of understanding and discussion taking place in Negro life today and to project a socialist and pro-Soviet orientation.

On May 25, 1961, a second source advised that "Freedomways" was set up for the CP, USA by JAMES JACKSON.

The First Quarter, 1967, issue of Freedomways", self-described as "A Quarterly Review of the Negro Freedom Movement" published by Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, 799 Broadway, New York City, lists the following as its editorial staff:

JOHN HENRIK CLARKE, Associate Editor ESTHER JACKSON, Managing Editor J. H. O'DELL, Associate Managing Editor JOHN L. DEVINE, Art Editor

A third source made available information on July 1, 1964, indicating that JOHN HENRIK CLARKE attended the first and founding meeting of the American Institute for Marxist Studies (AIMS) which was held on December 19, 1963, and continued on January 10, 1964.

This source also made available information on August 14, 1964, indicating that CLARKE is an "Associate" of AIMS

On March 16, 1966, the second source advised that JAMES JACKSON, accompanied by his wife, ESTHER JACKSON, was scheduled to depart on March 25, 1966, from the United States en route to Moscow to attend the 23rd Congress of the CP of the

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FREEDOMWAYS ASSOCIATES, INC. (CONTINUED)

Soviet Union. This source described JAMES JACKSON as a member of the National Committee, CP, USA.

On July 26, 1966, a fourth source identified O'DELL as a member of the CP.

On January 30, 1961, SYLVIA M. BRENNER DEVINE,

Pennsylvania, advised

that

JACK DEVINE, mentioned on

December 17, 1960, that he was still in the CP and that the

CP is his whole life.

On July 24, 1963, a fifth source described JOHN DEVINE as a CP member.

A characterization of AIMS is set out separately.

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THE GUS HALL-BENJAMIN J. DAVIS DEFENSE COMMITTEE

A source advised on March 27, 1962, that GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, United States of America (CP,USA), stated on March 26, 1962, that the Party will form a new committee known as the Gus Hall-Benjamin J. Davis Defense Committee (H-DDC). The purpose of this committee is to raise \$100,000 for the defense of HALL and DAVIS.

"The Worker" issue of April 23, 1967, page 10, lists the address of the H-DDC as Room 1225, 22 East 17th Street, New York, New York.

"The Worker" is an east coast Communist newspaper.

GUS HALL BENJAMIN J. DAVIS

HALL and DAVIS were indicated by the Federal Grand Jury, Washington, D.C., on March 15, 1962, charging them with violations of Sections 768 (h) and 794, Title 50, United States Code, in that they, as General Secretary and National Secretary, CP, USA, respectively, and as members of its National Board, willfully and unlawfully failed to register for and on behalf of the CP, USA, with the Attorney General.

The indictment against DAVIS was dismissed October 9, 1964, in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia and the indictment against HALL was dismissed in the same court on May 4, 1966.

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1. MAY 2 MOVEMENT

A source advised on March 3, 1965, as follows:

The May 2 Movement (M2M) formerly known as the May 2 Committee was organized on March 14, 1964, at New Haven, Connecticut, by a group of young people participating in a symposium "Socialism in America" being held at Yale University. The original aim of the M2M was to plan and execute a demonstration in New York City on May 2, 1964, demanding withdrawal of United States troops from Viet Nam.

The M2M was dominated and controlled by the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and had for its aim and purpose the embarrassment of the United States Government by meetings, rallies, picketing demonstrations and formation of university level clubs at which a Marxist-Leninist oriented approach and analysis was taken of United States domestic and foreign policies. This source advised on May 19, 1965, that the headquarters of the M2M was 640 Broadway, New York City, Room 307.

A second source advised on February 9, 1966, that the M2M was officially dissolved as an organization on February 6, 1966, at a meeting held on the same date in New York City, by the leadership of M2M and the Progressive Labor Party.

The characterization of the PLP has been set out separately.

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PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

A source advised on April 20, 1965, that the Progressive Labor Parky (PLP), formerly known as the Progressive Labor Movement (PLM), held its first national convention April 15, - 18, 1965, at New York, New York, to organize the PLM into a PLP. The PLP will have as its ultimate objective the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism.

The "New York Times" City Edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the PLP. The PLP was described as an outgrowth of the PLM. Its officers were identified as MILTON ROSEN, New York, President, and WILLIAM EPTON of New York, and MORT SCHEER of San Francisco, Vice Presidents. A 20-member National Committee was elected to direct the party until the next convention.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962 by Mr. ROSEN and Mr. SCHEER after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line".

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor," a bi-monthly magazine, "Challenge", a monthly New York City newspaper, and "Spark", a West Coast newspaper.

The April, 1967, issue of "Challenge", page 14, states that, "This paper is dedicated to fight for a new way of life-where the working men and women own and control their homes, factories, the police, courts, and the entire government on every level".

A second source advised on September 26, 1966, that the PLP utilizes the address of General Post Office Box 808, Brooklyn 1, New York, but also utilizes an office in Room 617, 1 Union Square, West, New York City, where PLP publications are prepared.

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STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." . At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anti-Communist proviso was removed from the SDS Constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some Communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

CONTRACTORIAL

W.E.B. DU BOIS CLUBS OF AMERICA (DCA)

A source advised that on October 26-27, 1963, a conference of members of the Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), including national functionaries, met in Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of setting in motion forces for the establishment of a new national Marxist-oriented youth organization which would hunt for the most peaceful transition to socialism. The delegates were told that it would be reasonable to assume that the young socialists attracted into this new organization would eventually pass into the CP itself.

A second source has advised that the founding convention for the new youth organization was held from June 19-21, 1964, at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the name W.E.B. Du Bois Clubs of America (DCA) was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention.

The second source advised in September, 1966, that MIKE ZAGARELL, CPUSA Youth Director, stated that in Negro communities the Party still supported the plan to build "left" socialist centers and to solidify the Party base through the DCA. This source also advised in September, 1966, that DANIEL RUBIN, CPUSA National Organizational Secretary, stated the Party believes the DCA should have a working class outlook and be a mass organization favorable to socialism, socialist countries and Marxism, and in April, 1967, GUS HALL, CPUSA, General Secretary, indicated that the DCA primary emphasis should be on developing mass resistance to the draft.

A third source advised in September, 1967, that JARVIS TYNER was elected chairman of the DCA on September 10, 1967, near the conclusion of the Third National Convention of the DCA held in New York, New York, from September 8-10, 1967.

A fourth source advised during August, 1967, that JARVIS TYNER is a member of the National Committee of the CPUSA.

A fifth confidential source advised on September 21, 1967, that the headquarters of the DCA is located at 34 West 17th Street, New York, New York.

"YOUNG SOCIALIST"

The "Young Socialist" is a magazine published five times a year by the Young Socialist Alliance. The October, 1964, edition, the initial edition utilizing the magazine format, relates that this magazine succeeds the "Young Socialist" newspaper in an effort to provide "more facts on more general issues than a small newspaper can".

The "Young Socialist" newspaper was formerly described as the official organ of the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA).

The "Young Socialist" maintains office space at the headquarters of the YSA, Rooms 532-536,41 Union Square, West, New York City, and has a mailing address of Post Office Box 471, Cooper Station, New York, New York 10003.

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE

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The May, 1960 issue of the "Young Socialist" (YS), page 1, column 3, disclosed that during April 15-17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA) was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of the YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles of revolutionary socialism.

On March 10, 1967, a source advised that the YSA was formed during 1957, by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The source further advised that the YSA has recently become more open about admitting that it is the youth group of the SWP and that an SWP representative has publicly stated that the YSA is the SWP's youth group.

The headquarters of the YSA are located in Rooms 532-536, 41 Union Square West, New York City.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The source stated that it was also announced at the YIP meeting, that Abbertoffman would also speak to the Yippies in Chicago ("The Seed, Head Shop Owners") as to whether they can organize a two day Yippie Program in August rather than the previously scheduled six day event.

The source stated that the YIP is in financial trouble and that there are no plans for opening YIP offices on the West Coast.

A second source advised on October 4, 1967, that Abbe Hoffman attended a meeting on September 30, 1967, of the Administrative Committee of the National Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam at 20 East 14th Street, New York City. At the meeting, Hoffman presented the "Hippies" plans for the demonstration to be held in Washington, DC, October 21-22, 1967, part of which consisted of dying the Potomac River red and firing water pistols filled with day-glow paint at the walls of the Pentagon.

The "New York Daily News," January 10, 1966 issue, contained an article entitled "Word From the Left." The article stated that "three Americans who defied a state department travel ban to spend ten days in North Vietnam, arrived at Kennedy Airport last night, mouthing the Communist Hanoi line about the deep 'inconsistency' of the 'hypocritical' United States Vietnamese policy.

"The three---Yale Professor Staughton Lynd, 36, Herbert Aptheker, 50, Communist Theoretician and Director of the American Institute for Marxist Studies here; and Thomas Hayden, 23, a founder of the Leftist Students for a Democratic Society, ----were greeted by an applauding group of about fifty persons, including beatnik types..."

Characterizations of the American Institute for Marxist Studies and Students for a Democratic Society are attached.

On March 13, 1967, a third source furnished a brochure of the Militant Labor Forum (MLF) listing a partial list of speakers of the MLF which included the name of Professor Staughton Lynd.

AMERICAN INSTITUTE FOR MARXIST STUDIES

A source advised on April 9, 1963, that on April 7, 1963, at a meeting of the District Committee of the Communist Party, United States of America (CPUSA), of New England, held in Boston, Massachusetts, HERBERT APTHEKER stated he was developing an organization called American Institute for Marxist Studies (AIMS), which would eventually legalize the CP. He stated AIMS would publish literature on History, Science, Physics, Archeology and other subjects which would be put out quarterly with various supplements.

A second source advised on June 30, 1966, that HERBERT APTHEKER was elected to the National Committee, CPUSA, at the 18th National Convention of the CPUSA, held June 22-26, 1966, in New York City.

A third source advised on June 7, 1963, that on June 3, 1963, HERBERT APTHEKER spoke at the CPUSA, New York District Board meeting concerning AIMS. APTHEKER stated that AIMS would unite and strengthen the CP although the CP would not be connected with it. He stated AIMS was being formed to operate within the scope of the McCarran and Smith Acts and would legally bring Marxist material and opinions to the attention of American scholars and the general public.

A fourth source reported on August 29, 1966, that AIMS issues a "Newsletter" every other month. This source also made available the information that AIMS issues publication and holds symposiums concerning Marxism.

A fifth source advised on May 9, 1967, that as of that date, AIMS was located on the fifth floor west of 20 West 30th Street, New York, New York.

YOUTH INTERNATIONAL PARTY (YIP), ALSO KNOWN AS, YIPPIES

On May 12, 1968, Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed a group of individuals, who orally identified themselves in speeches, cheers and song as Yippies. begin to gather at 12:15 p.m. at the North Avenue Public Bathing Beach and Park, located on the "near north side" of downtown Chicago, Illinois, on the shore of Lake Michigan, at North Avenue and North Lake Shore Drive. This congregation of individuals continued to grow in size until the group numbered between 80 and 100 and was comprised of young men, women, and some children. The announced purpose of the assembly was a "Happening" to honor motherhood on Mother's Day and to pay tribute to the Chicago Police Department by presenting apple pies to police officers who had to work on Mother's Day, "which is a day everyone should be with their families and moms."

At 12:50 p.m. the group, attired in flowing robes, Indian dress, with flowers, love beads and burning incense, formed a procession headed by an individual carrying an Américan flag aloft and another individual carrying a flag with a "sunburst" center on an orange and purple background, proceeded to march out of the park. The procession, using public sidewalks and obeying directions of officers of the Chicago Police Department who escorted the march, headed to the "Old Town" section of Chicago which is located in the close vicinity of the park. The "Old Town" section of the city is a tourist attraction center, inhabited by the "hippie" and "yippie" elements of Chicago. This section of the city features expensive bars, restaurants, antique and curio shops.

The Yippie procession passed through "Old Town" adding a few of their number to the group as they marched through the heart of the commercial area of this section of the city. Tourist visitors in the "Old Town" area appeared to be delighted at the procession and used their cameras for photographing the march. During the march members of the Yippie procession offered apple pies to police officers in squad cars as they cruised by the march route. Representatives of Chicago local newspapers and television stations, with television and newspaper cameramen covered the entire event.

The march procession ultimately arrived at 1:40 p.m. at the 18th District Chicago Police Station at 113 West Chicago Avenue, which is located about one mile from the bathing beach park where the march began. The group was met on the sidewalk in front of the police stationhouse by Captain of Police Kenneth Fossier, who was Watch Commander of the Station House on this occasion. The Yippie group offered Captain Fossier apple pies, pizza mix, a watermelon and a string of love beads as gifts from the Yippies for the Captain and officers on duty at the station Captain Fossier refused the offers, explaining that acceptance of gifts was against regulations of the police department. The Captain suggested that the marchers take their gifts to St. Vincent's Hospital located in the close vicinity of the police station. The Yippie group gave a cheer for the Chicago Police Department, left one apple pie and some flowers as a token of their good will with Captain Fossier, and at 1:50 p.m. departed the police station area.

The Yippie procession then marched to St. Vincent's Roman Catholic Church Hospital at 721 North LaSalle Street. A representative group entered the hospital while the remaining members of their number sat on the public sidewalk in front of the hospital. The group that entered the hospital, headed by Abraham Peck, who identified himself as the editor of the Yippie underground newspaper, "The Chicago Seed," soon reappeared with a Catholic nun.


The nun identified herself as Sister Gertrude, Director of Donations for the hospital. Two hats were passed among the Yippie group to collect money for the hospital patients. Over \$18 was collected along with flowers and a package of incense. The proceeds were turned over to Sister Gertrude and Abraham Peck pinned a Yippie button on her white habit. The Sister expressed her appreciation for the group's generosity and the Yippies began to move on in their march.

The return march again proceeded through "Old Town", to the expressed appreciation of tourists, and with the continued escort of Chicago Police officers and television and newspaper coverage. The procession ultimately returned at 2:40 p.m. to the area where they began their march at the North Avenue Beach Park. The group assembled in the park together for picnic activity, singing and dancing. At this point it was announced by Abraham Peck that the "rock bands" that were to have appeared at that "Happening" were not present because the requested permit for the playing of amplified music in a public park had not been requested of the Chicago Mayor's Office in time to have the permit issued for this event. Peck promised that the necessary permits would be obtained for such music at any future "Happening" that might occur. Peck made the futher request of the group that they clean up the area that had been occupied, "cleaner than when we arrived, so there won't be any complaints, after all we don't want anyone accusing Yippies of being dirty." The group sounded a loud yell of approval at this suggestion. The group gathering was declared terminated at 3:25 p.m. though individuals of the Yippie assembly continued with their picnic activity.

The entire proceedings of this group was orderly and respectful to its leadership and the escorting officers of the Chicago Police Department. There were no incidents, violence, or arrests during this activity.

Reference is made to New York memoranda dated May 8, 1968, and May 14, 1968, in captioned matter.

On May 17, 1968, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that at a meeting of the Youth International Party (YIP) held on the evening of May 15, 1968, in New York City, the following information was obtained:

Abbe Hoffman upon his return from Chicago had stated that there is no YIP movement in Chicago. The police pressure is heavy and the meeting with the Blackstone Rangers fostered an impression of a city set with violence. The Blackstone Rangers are in a local gang war and do not care about the YIP. However, the people in Chicago are still interested in the August. action.

The source stated that the consensus at the YIP meeting was to have the Chicago people, "The Seed". make a greater effort to obtain permits since the Chicago press is favorable to the action.

The source stated that in effect, New York would just take care of New York yappies and a message would be sent out to the effect that each "tribe" would be responsible for its own survival including getting to Chicago as a group in any way possible. In addition, the music groups would have to make their own arrangements (





THE GUS HALL-BENJAMIN J. DAVIS DEFENSE COMMITTEE

A source advised on March 27, 1962, that GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, United States of America (CP,USA), stated on March 26, 1962, that the Party will form a new committee known as the Gus Hall-Benjamin J. Davis Defense Committee (H-DDC). The purpose of this committee is to raise \$100,000 for the defense of HALL and DAVIS.

"The Worker" issue of April 23, 1967, page 10, lists the address of the H-DDC as Room 1225, 22 East 17th Street, New York, New York.

"The Worker" is an east coast Communist newspaper.

GUS HALL BENJAMIN J. DAVIS

HALL and DAVIS were indicated by the Federal Grand Jury, Washington, D.C., on March 15, 1962, charging them with violations of Sections 768 (h) and 794, Title 50, United States Code, in that they, as General Secretary and National Secretary, CP, USA, respectively, and as members of its National Board, willfully and unlawfully failed to register for and on behalf of the CP, USA, with the Attorney General.

The indictment against DAVIS was dismissed October 9, 1964, in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia and the indictment against HALL was dismissed in the same court on May 4, 1966.

This location was described as a place which can be contacted to hire the "hippicapped" and is described as a free service which finds employment for people who have difficulty getting jobs because of their appearance, political views, background, or something which has made them unacceptable by established standards. Artists, musicians, poets and all creative people need jobs where they can express their creative abilities. The Hip Job Co-Op was described as an organization which would find creative jobs for creative people.

Sources advised that this location is to be the gathering point for the Yippies in the Chicago area where the will meet and discuss their activities. It was the opinion of the sources that this would be the logical place for dis cussions to occur or originate with respect to possible disruptive activities at the forthcoming Democratic National Convention.

The address 240 West Willow is located on an extremely narrow street, one block in length in this area, and the buildings are located on the sidewalk with no parkway or space between the sidewalk and buildings. This area is also located on the near north side of Chicago in the Old Town area, a known hang out for the hippies and Yippies in the Chicago area.

A source advised on May 24, 1968, that on the evening of May 24, 1968, various groups from the Lower East Side of New York City, including the Youth International Party (YIP) and the East Side Service Organization (ESSO) would participate in the closing off of St. Mark's Place between Second and Third Avenues in New York City, with a "stolen" play street sign.

The scurce stated that at 9:00 p.m. a one-pound magnesium flash bomb would be ignited on a rooftop which would be a "signal from God", signaling the beginning of the take-over of the street and closing it to traffic.

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At approximately 9:45 p.m., 100 hippie-type individuals began milling around the block with lighted candles jeering and shouting obscenities at the police.

Jerry Rubin and Abbe Hoffman, YIP leaders, were observed commingling with the crowd throughout the evening.

By 12:00 p.m., midnight, the majority of the demonstrators in St. Mark's Place had dispersed.

Deputy Inspector Joseph Fink, New York City Police Department (NYCPD), advised on May 24, 1968, that the New York City Fire Department had recovered a tin can similar to a coffee can, which had been used to contain the flash bomb on the roof of the building located at 33 St. Mark's Place, New York City.



"The 'rules' for playing BUST-IN are simple:

"1. Keep moving. As we all know, game-playing should really be avoided. There's no reason to be busted unless it's unavoidable. However, the Man demonstrated last week that reasons may not be necessary.

"2. If you are cracked, do not resist! Sgt. Lewis' plot seems to be to sock as many charges to you as possible. Go off to the pokey chanting Yippie, Free City, Alice's Restaurant or some other groovy thing. Do not employ some of the better-known four-letter jobbers. 'Love' is better than "(obscene)".

"3. The number of players depends on the Man's disposition. If he invites you to play BUST-IN, you have the following options:

"a. Walk to the wagon or go limp.

Smile as they carry you off, tell them you love them (careful; police think in physical terms, may take you carnally and reject your alleged advances in a forcefull manner) and thank them for their civil treatment of your civil disobedience.

"5. Don't hold. If you are and the police invite you to play BUST-IN, you recieve a FELONY CARD, which means that you lose for a long time.

"So kiddies, watch out for BUST-IN. Wells St., Saturday night, June 1st. BUST-IN. Stay off the street if you don't want to play. Stay off; BUST-IN will soon be America's most popular game. Coming soon to your neighborhood."

On May 24, 1968, first source advised individuals associated with the Youth International Party (YIP), also known as "Yippies" are contacting "Hippies" in Chicago, Illinois in an attempt to call a "happening" on May 26, 1968, in the vicinity of North Avenue Beach, a beach situated at the east end of North Avenue on Lake Michigan. The 'happening" or meeting is being called to discuss recent harassment by the Chicago Police Department who has raided the majority of organizational and fund raising meetings of YIP. The Chicago Police Department has arrested individuals on various charges which included possession of narcotics, disorderly conduct and violation of curfew. Speakers at this meeting were scheduled to discuss the use of violence at future confrontations with the Chicago Police Department.

On May 26, 1968, Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) observed approximately 400 individuals at a public meeting of YIP in the vicinity of the North Avenue Beach. Individuals dressed in the "Hippie" manner began arriving at approximately 12:30 p.m. and dispersed at approximately 4:45 p.m. There were no incidents or arrests made.

Individuals mingled in small groups and there was no noticeable formal meeting held. Activities included kite flying and listening to music provided by several rock n'roll type bands. There was no visible sign of protest.

On May 26, 1968, first source advised many "Yippies" were heard at the above meeting to express disgust over the arrest on May 25, 1968, of 73 "Hippies" in Chicago's Old Town area, a favorite gathering area for "Hippies". Steve Mrvos, leader of YIP in Chicago, was heard to state that the arrests were made on complaints by Old Town businessmen who complained that "Hippies" are not spending any money in the area and they are driving tourists from the area.

On May 26, 1968, second source advised that approximately 73 "Hippies" were arrested in Old Town on May 25, 1968. Those individuals arrested were loitering in the area around stores, impeding the flow of pedestrian traffic and sitting on parked cars and steps to residences and businesses in the area. Charges included disorderly conduct, vagrancy and violation of curfew. First source advised Steve Mrvos and Abe Peckolick, also known as Abe Peck, Editor of The Seed", an underground "Hippie" newspaper, at the above meeting called for mobilization of all "Hippies" in Chicago to gather in Old Town on Wells Street between North Avenue and Division Street during the evening hours of June 1, 1968. "Yippies" believe that large numbers of "Hippies" in the area will deter future harassment by the Chicago Police Department.

Also at this meeting an unknown individual believed to be named "Cory", was heard calling for the use of violence on June 1, 1968. He specifically called for starting fires on the near north side and the assassination of police officers who harass "Hippies." This individual indicated he had been arrested during the mass arrest on May 25, 1968.

On May 27, 1968, Sergeant Robert Willems, Desk Sergeant, 18th District, Chicago Police Department, advised that a check of names of those arrested May 25, 1968, failed to reflect any information identifiable with any individual named "Cory."

At 12:40 p.m., this group of individuals walked west on 34th Street to Macy's Department Store at 34th Street and Broadway, NYC.

At 12:50 p.m., this group of individuals began to distribute leaflets to passersby at all of the entrances to Macy's Department Store and chanted "Macy's has been postponed".

At 2:25 p.m., the group of individuals discontinued passing out the leaflets and by 2:50 p.m., the entire group had dispersed.

An SA of the FBI obtained one of the leaflets being distributed at Macy's Department Store, 34th Street and Broadway, NYC.

This leaflet, captioned "Macy's", and containing the printed name, Keith Lampe, at the end, was an announcement that the Yippies would hold a "New-Nation Demonstration" at Macy's Department Store, on June 8, 1968, from 1:00 - 3:00 p.m., with the date and time blocked out in heavy black ink.

A second source advised on September 22, 1965, that at that time a list of names, believed to be the mailing list of the Gus Hall - Benjamin J. Davis Defense Committee (HDDC) in NYC, included the following under the caption "College Faculty" - Keith R. Lampe, Apartment D, 639 East 11th Street, NYC, "Queens College".





A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on July 2, 1968, that the Youth International Party (YIP) would sponsor a picket demonstration at the New York City Criminal Courts Building, 100 Centre Street, New York City, at 9:30 AM that date to show support for their leader, JERRY RUBIN, who was to report to court for a hearing in connection with his arrest on June 13, 1968, on charges of possession of marijuana.

On July 2, 1968, at 9:40 AM, a Special Agent (SA) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) observed 36 individuals carrying small American flags who, by their appearance can be described as Yippies, picket in front of 100 Centre Street, New York City.

The pickets gave out small plastic bags containing a red pliable substance with a tag which read "Napalm US Gov Approved Dangerous Drug." The pickets also gave out a small booklet which advocates everything for free.

The pickets continued their demonstration until 10:20 AM, at which time, they went as a group into the Criminal Courts Building with JERRY RUBIN.

The source who also participated in the picket, advised that the hearing for Rubin was postponed as the

On June 12, 1968, source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised YIP leaders of Chicago Abraham Peckolick, also known as Abe Peck; Al Rosenfeld: Steve Mrvos; and Reverend Jonathan Tuttle, also known as Brother Jon, Minister Unitarian Christian Church and peace activist, were at the office of The Seed; 837 North LaSalle Street, Chicago, Illinois, a weekly underground newspaper which is the acting voice of the YIP movement in Chicago.

The aforementioned individuals were discussing an article which appeared in the May issue of a newspaper called 'The Youth Companion' by Martin Jézer who was described as being associated with 'Liberation Magazine,' New York City. This article allegedly stated that 'This summer, along with much of the Left, thousands of young people and free people will be in Chicago for the National Democratic Convention, during August, 1968. They will be there as 'Yippies', members of YIP.

Should this freaky festival of youth come off as the planners only half intend, it will offend, shock, scare, and confuse a lot of people in and out of the movement, but incumbent in its spirit, its theater, its antics, and its dress is the potential for an alternative - the possibility of a new and more human life style. The revolution is now say the Yippies; we need only begin to live it."

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FREE VEGETABLES — Hunt's Point Market, Hunt's Point Avenue and 138th Street. Have to go by car or truck between 6-9 A.M. but well worth it. You can get enough vegetables to last your commune a week. Lettuce, squash, carrots, canteloupe, grapefruit, melons, even artichokes and mushrooms. Just tell them you want to feed some people free and it's yours, all crated and everything. Hunt's Point is the free people's heaven.

FREE MEAT AND POULTRY — The closest slaughterhouse area is in the far West Village, west of Hudson Street and south of 14th Street. Get a letter from Rev. Allen of St. Mark's on the Bowerie, Second Avenue and 10th Street, saying you need some meat for a church sponsored meal. If you want to be really professional, dress as a priest and go over and ask. Bring a car or truck. A freezer unit will save a good deal of running around. Don't give up on this one. Turning a guy onto the free idea will net you a week's supply of top quality meat. There is some law that if the meat touches the ground or floor they have to give it away. So if you know how to trip a meat truck, by all means

FREE FRESH FISH — The Fish Market is located on Fulton Street and South Street under the East River Drive overpass. You have to get there between 6-9 A.M. but it is well worth it. The fishermen always have hundreds of pounds of fish that they have to throw away if they don't sell. Mackerel, halibut, cod, catfish, and more. You can have as much as you can cart away.

FREE BREAD AND ROLLS — Rapaports on Second Avenue between 5th and 6th Streets will give you all the free bread and rolls you can carry. You have to get there by 7:00 A.M. in order to get the stuff. It's a day old, but still-very good. If you want them absolutely fresh, put them in an oven to which you have added a pan of water (to avoid drying them out), and warm them for a few minutes. Most bakeries will give you day old stuff if you give them a half way decent sob story.

A&P stores clean their vegetable bins every day at 9:00 A.M. They always throw out cartons of very good vegetables. Tell them you want to feed your rabbits. Also recommended is picking up food in a supermarket and eating it before you leave the store. This method is a lot safer than the customary shoplifting. In order to be prosecuted for shoplifting you have to leave the store with the goods. If you have eaten it, there is no evidence to be used against you.

FREE COOKING LESSONS — (Plus you get to eat the meal) are sponsored by the New York Department of Markets, 137 Centre Street, Thursday mornings. Call CA 6-5653 for more information.

Check the Yellow Pages for Catering Services. You can visit them on a Saturday, Sunday afternoon or Monday morning. They always have stuff left over. Invest 10c in one of the Jewish Dailies and check out the addresses of the local synagogues and their schedule of bar mitzvahs, weddings, and testimonial dinners. Show up at the back of the place about three hours after it is scheduled to start. There is always left-over food. Tell them you're a college student and want to bring some back for your fraternity brothers. Jews dig the college bullshit. If you want the food served to you out front you naturally have to disguise yourself to look straight. Remarks such as "I'm Marvin's brother" or - learning the bride's name from the paper - "Gee, Dorothy looks marvelous" are great. Lines like "Betty doesn't look pregnant" are frowned upon.

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Large East Side bars are fantastically easy touches. The best time is 5:00 P.M. Take a half empty glass of booze from an empty table and use it as a prop. Just walk around sampling the hors d'oeuvres. Once you find your favorite, stick to it. You can soon become a regular. They won't mind your loading up on free food because they consider you one of the crowd. Little do they realize that you are a super freeloader. All Longchamps are good. Max's Kansas City at Park Avenue South and 16th Street

doesn't even mind it if you freeload when you are hungry and an advantage here is that you can wear any kind of clothes. Max features fried chicken wings, swedish meatballs and ravioli.



THE INTERNATIONAL SOCIETY FOR KRISHNA CONSCIOUSNESS is located at 26 Second Avenue. Every morning at 7:00 A.M. a delicious cereal breakfast is served free along with chanting and dancing. Also 12 Noon more food and chanting and on Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 7:00 P.M. again food and chanting. Then it's all day Sunday in Central Park Sheepmeadow (generally) for still more chanting (sans food). Hari Krishna is the freest high going if you can get into it and dig cereal and, of course, more chanting.

FREE TEA AND COOKIES — In a very nice setting at the Tea Center, 16 East 56th Street. 10-11 A.M. and 2-4 P.M. Monday to Friday.

THE CATHOLIC WORKER — 181 Chrystie Street, will feed you any time but you have to pray as you do in the various Salvation Army stations. Heavy wino scenes. The heaviest wino scene is the Men's Temporary Shelter on 8 East 3rd Street. You can get free room and / or meals here if you are over 21 but it's worse than jail or Bellevue. It is a definite last resort only.



The freest meal of all is Tuesdays at 5:00 P.M. inside or in front of St. Mark's Church on the Bowerie, Second Avenue at 10th Street. A few yippie-diggers serve up a meal ranging_from_Lion_Meat_to_Guppy_Chowder_to_Canteloupe Salad. They are currently looking for a free truck to help them collect the food and free souls dedicated to extending the free food concept. The Motherfuckers also dish out free food on St. Mark's Place from time to time.



If you are really looking for class, pick up a copy of the New York Times and check the box in the back pages designating ocean cruises. On every departure there is a bon voyage party. Just walk on a few hours before sailing time and start swinging. Champagne, caviar, lobsiar salad, all as free as the open sea. If you get stoned enough and miss getting off you can also wiggle a free boat ride although you get sent back as soon as you hit the other side — but it's a free ocean cruise, even if it's in the brig.

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You can get free food in varying quantities by going to the factories. Many also offer a free tour. However, the plants are generally located outside of Manhattan. If you can get a car, try a trip to Long Island City. There you will find the Gordon Baking Company at 42-25 21st Street, Pepsi-Cola at 4602 Fifth Avenue, Borden Company at 35-10 Steinway Street and Dannon Yogurt at 22-11 38th Avenue. All four places give out free samples and if you write or call in advance and say it is for a block party or church affair, they will give you a few cases.



FREE BOOZE — Jacob Ruppert Brewery at 1639 Third Avenue near 91st Street will give you a tour at 10:30 A.M. and 2:30 P.M. complete with free booze in their tap room.

The Sun is free. Hair is free. Naked bodies are free. Smiles are free. Rain is free. Unfortunately there is no free air in New York. Con Edison's phone number is 679-6700.

WELFARE — If you live in lower Manhattan the welfare center for you is located on 11 West 13th Street, 989-1210. There is, of course, red tape involved and they don't dig longhairs. Be prepared to tell a good story as to why you cannot work, however your looks (which they cannot make you change) might be good enough reason. This is

one place where sloppy clothes pay off. You have to be over 18 to get help. A caseworker will be assigned to you. Some will actually dig the whole scene and won't give you a hard time, others can be a real bitch. Getting on welfare can get you free rent, phone, utilities, and about \$20.00 a week to live on. There are also various food-stamp and medical programs you become eligible for. If you can stomach hassle, welfare is a must. The main office number is DI 4-8700 if you do not live in lower Manhattan.



FREE CLOTHES — Try ESSO, 341 East 10th Street or Tompkins Square Community Center on Avenue B and 9th Street. Also the streets are excellent places to pick up good clothes (see section on free furniture for best times to go hunting).



FREE LAWYERS — Legal Aid Society, 100 Centre Street, BE 3-0250 (criminal matters) and the New York University Law Center Office, 249 Sullivan Street, GR 3-1896 (civil matters). Also for specialized cases and information you can call the National Lawyers Guild, 5 Beekman Street, 227-1078 or the New York Civil Liberties Union, 156 Fifth Avenue, WA 9-6076. For the best help on the Lower East Side use Mobilization for Youth Legal Services, 320 East 3rd Street between Avenues C and D, OR 7-0400, ask for legal services. Open Tuesday to Friday, 9 A.M. to 6 P.M. and until 8 P.M. on Mondays. Some of the best lawyers in the city available here.



FREE FLOWERS — At about 9:30 A.M. each day you can bum free flowers in the Flower District on Sixth Avenue between 22nd and 23rd Streets. Once in a while you can find a potted tree that's been thrown out because it's slightly damaged.

FREE FURNITURE - By far the best place to get free furniture is on the street. Once a week in every district the sanitation department makes bulk pick-ups. The night before residents put out all kinds of stuff on the street. For the best selection try the West Village on Monday nights and the east Seventies on Tuesday nights. On Wedensday night there are fantastic pick-ups on 35th Street in back of Macy's. Move quickly though, the guards get pissed off easily; the truckers couldn't care less. This street method can furnish your whole pad. Beds, desks, bureaus, lamps, bookcases, chairs, and tables. It's all a matter of transportation. If you don't have access to a car truck it is almost worth it to rent a station wagon on a weekday and make pick-ups. Alexander's Rent-a-Car about the cheapest for in-city use. \$5.95 and 10c a mile for a regular car. A station wagon is slightly more. Call AG 9-2200 for the branch near you.

Also consider demolition and construction sites as a good source for building materials to construct furniture. The large wooden cable spools make great tables. Cinderblocks, bricks and boards for bookcases. Doors for tables. Nail kegs for stools and chairs.



FREE BUS RIDES — Get on with a large denomination bill just as the bus is leaving.

FREE SUBWAY RIDES — Get a dark green card and flash it quickly as you go through the exit gate. Always test the swing bars in the turnstile before you put in the token. Someone during the day was sure to drop an extra token in and a free turn is just waiting for the first one to take advantage of it. By far the most creative method is the use of German fennigs, Danish ore or Mozambique 10 centavos pieces. These fit most turnstiles except the newest (carry a real token to use in case the freebee doesn't work). These foreign coins come four or five to a penny. Large amounts must be purchased outside New York City. Most dealers will not sell you large amounts since the

Transit Authority has been pressuring them. Try telling dealers you want them to make jewelry. Another interesting coin is the 5 aurar from Iceland. This is the same size as a quarter and will work in most vending machines. They sell for three or four to the penny. There are other coins that also work. Buy a bag of assorted foreign coins from a coin dealer and do a little measuring. You are sure to find some that fit the bill. Speaking of fitting the bill, we have heard that dollar bills can be duplicated on any Xerox machine (fronts done separately from backs and pasted together) and used in vending machines that give change for a dollar. This method has not been field tested.



The best form of free transportation is hitch-hiking. This is so novel in New York that it often works. Crosstown on 8th Street is good.



FREE PHONE CALLS - A number 14 brass washer with a small piece of scotch tape over one side of the hole will work in old style phones (also parking meters, laundromat dryers, soda and other vending machines). The credit card bit works on long distance calls. Code letter for 1968 is J. then a phone number and then a three digit district number. A district number, as well as the phone number, can be made up by using any three numbers from about 051 to 735. Example: J-573-2100-421 or J-637-3400-302. The phone number should end in 00 since most large corporations have numbers that end that way. The people that you call often get weird phone calls from the company but not much else. There are also legitimate credit card numbers available. One recent number longed to Steve McQueen, A phone bill of \$50,000 was racked up in one month. McQueen, of course, was not held responsible.

FREE MONEY — Panhandling nets some people up to Twenty

dollars a day. The best places are Third Avenue in the fifties and the Theater District off Times Square. Both best in the evening on weekends. Uptown guys with dates are the best touch especially if they are just leaving some guilt movie like "Guess Who's Coming to Dinner?" The professional panhandlers don't waste their time on the Lower East Side except on weekends when the tourists come out.

Devise a street theatre act or troupe. It can be anything from a funny dance to a five piece band or a poetry reading. People give a lot more dough and the whole atmosphere sings a little. SMILE! Panhandle at the rectories and nunneries on the side of every Catholic Church. Contrary to rumor the brother and sister freeioaders in black live very well and will always share something with a fellow panhandler.

Also see previous sections on the use of foreign coins.

FREE BOOKS AND RECORDS — If you have an address you can get all kinds of books and records from clubs on introductory offers. Since the cards you mail back are not signed there is no legal way you can be held responsible although you get all sorts of threatening mail, which, by the way, also comes free.

You can always use the Public Libraries. The main branch is on Fifth Avenue and 42nd Street. There are 168 branches all over the city. Call OX 5-4200 for information and a schedule of free events.



POEMS are free. Are you a poem or are you a prose???



FREE GAS — If you have a car and need some gas late at night you can get a gallon and then some by emptying the hoses from the pumps into your tank. There is always a fair amount of surplus gas left when the pumps are shut off.

FREE LAND — Write to "Green Revolution" c/o School of Living, Freeland, Maryland, for their free newspaper with news about rural land available in the United States and the progress of various rural communities. The best available free land is in Canada. You can get a free listing by writing to the Department of Land and Forests, Parliament Building, Quebec City, Canada. Also write to the Geographical Branch, Department of Mines and Technical Surveys, Parliament Buildings, Quebec City, Canada. Lynn Burrows, c/o Communications Group, 2630 Point Grey Rd. Vancouver 8, British Columbia, Canada, will give you the best information on setting up a community in Canada.



If you really want to live for free, get some friends together and seize a building at Columbia University, 116th Street and Broadway. The cops come free, as do blue ribbon committees with funny long names.



FREE BUFFALO — In order to keep the herds at a controllable level the government will give you a real, live buffalo if you can guarantee shipping expenses and adequate grazing area. Write to the Office of Information, Department of the Interior, Washington, D.C.



MEDICAID — Medicaid Center, 330 West Street, 594-3050. Medicaid is a very good deal if you can qualify and can stand a little red tape. According to the new law you have to be under 21 or over 65 years of age and have a low income (\$2900 or less if you are single) to qualify. It takes about a month to process your application, but if you get a card you are entitled to free hospital and dental services, private physicians, drugs and many other medical advantages.

AMBULANCE SERVICE — Call 440-1234. You get a cop free of charge with this service. There is no way to get an

ambulance without a cop in New York.

EMERGENCY DOCTOR — TR 9-1000. EMERGENCY DENTIST — YU 8-6110.

NEARBY HOSPITALS -

Gouverneur Clinic, 9 Gouverneur Slip, 227-3000.

St. Vincent Hospital, 7th Ave. and West 11th St., 620-1234. Bellevue Hospital, First Avenue and 27th Street, 679-5487. On the above medical services you have to pay but you can file the bill or send it to the National Digger Client Center in Washington, D.C. They will pay it for you.

THE WASHINGTON HEIGHTS HEALTH CENTER — 168th Street and Broadway, provides free chest X-rays as well as other services. You can get a free smallpox vaccination here at 10: A.M. weekdays if you're traveling abroad. Call WA .7-6300 for information.

See special section on clap in this booklet for information on VD treatment.



FREE DRUGS — In the area along Central Park West in the 70's and 80's are located many doctor's offices. Daily they throw out piles of drug samples. If you know what you're looking for, search this area.



FREE SECURITY — For this trick you need some money to begin with. Deposit it in a bank and return in a few weeks telling them you lost your bank book. They give you a card to fill out and sign and in a week you will receive another. Now, withdraw your money, leaving you with your original money and a bank book showing a balance. You can use this as identification, to prevent vagrancy busts traveling, as collateral for bail, or for opening a charge account at a store.

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FREE BIRTH CONTROL INFORMATION AND DEVICES — Clergy Consultation Abortion, call 477-0034 and you will get a recorded announcement giving you the names of clergymen who you can call and get birth control information,

including abortion contacts.

Parents Ald Society, 130 Main Street, Hempstead, Long Island, (516) 538-2626, provides by far the most complete birth control information. Pills are provided as well as diaphrams. Referrals are made to doctors willing to perform abortions despite their illegality because of medieval, menopausal politicians. Call them for an appointment before you go out there. They are about to establish an office on the Lower East Side.

You can sleep in the parks during the day. Day or night you can sleep on the roofs which are fairly safe and comfortable if you can find a shady spot. The tar gets very hot when the sun comes out. Make friends with someone in the building, then if the cops or landlord or other residents give you a problem you can say you are staying with someone in the building. Stay out of hallways, don't sleep on streets or stoops, or in the parks at night.

This is our favorite way to sneak into a regular movie theatre: Arrive just as the show is emptying out and join the line leaving the theatre. They give you the car and a tank of gas free. You pay the rest. Go to pick up the car alone, then get some people who also want to go to help with expenses, You can make San Francisco for about \$80.00 in tolls and gas in four days without pushing. Usually you have the car for longer and can make a whole thing

out of it. You must look "straight" when you go to the agency.

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FREE BAKERY — Every Wednesday some people get together and cook bread at St. Mark's Church on the Bowerie, Second Avenue and 10th Street.

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Write to major corporations and tell them you bought one of their products and it doesn't work, or it shits, or it tastes bad. Most firms will send you up to a case of merchandise just to get you off their back. Try-Tootsie-Roll, Campbell's Soup and cigarette companies for starters. Also General Mills for cereals. Write to their public relations office. One day at the library and a few stamps will get you tons of stuff.

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CLAP AND THE TASMANIAN PIG FEVER - Clap (syphilis and

gonorrhea) and Tasmanian Pig Fever (TPF) are two diseases you can easily pick up for free on the Lower East Side. One, the Clap, you catch, and the other, TPF, catches you. The Clap comes from balling. There are some that claim they get it from sitting on a toilet seat but that is possible only if you dig that position. Generally, using a prophylactic will prevent the spreading of Clap. If you don't use them and you ball a lot your chances of picking it up are pretty good. Syphilis usually begins with a sore which may look like a cold sore or any other kind of sore or pimple around your sex organ. Soon the sore disappears, even without treatment, and is often followed by an inflamation of the mouth and throat, and rashes on the body. These symptoms also disappear without any treatment. But even if these outer signs disappear the disease remains if untreated. If it remains untreated years later syphilis can cause serious trouble such as heart disease, blindness, insanity, and paralysis.

Gonorrhea is more common than syphilis. The first sign of gonorrhea is a discharge from your sex organ. It may not be noticed in women. In men there is usually itching and burning of the affected areas. If untreated it can result in permanent damage to sex glands. Both syphilis and gonorrhea can be cured in a short time with proper medical attention. The doctor's instructions must be followed to the letter if you want to shake the disease. Sometimes someone will get a shot of penicillin, go home and wait three days, and seeing no change in his condition he will assume the treatment is not working and not go back for more. Some strains are resistant to penicillin but will respond to other medication. Keep going to the clinic until the doctor says No. Free Treatment regardless of age is available for Lower East Side residents at the Chelsea Hygiene Center, 303 Ninth Avenue at 27th Street. Call LA 4-2537 for more free information. You can also gets tests for a variety of other illnesses here, including hepatitis, which is common. and dangerous. Free cancer check-ups also given. Day and night phone information at 269-5300.



Tasmanian Pig Fever is a disease common to the Lower

East Side. It's the cops. You are liable to get busted for a variety of reasons. Let's face it, the Lower East Side is a ghetto and getting busted by a cop is common in any American ghetto. The following is some general basic advice and some help on the chief causes for busts - dope and runaways, although runaways are not technically busted.

The TPF is the riot control squad in New York and is called out to handle many street demonstrations. The local police come out of the Ninth Precinct located on 5th Street between First and Second Avenues. The local cops are under the direction of Lieutenant Joe Fink. There are numerous arrests down here and a working knowledge of what to do about the cops can be very helpful.

Never let cops in your house if they do not have a search warrant. Ask them to slip it under the door. They only have a right to enter without a search warrant if they have strong reason to believe a crime is being committed on the premises. Most cases without a search warrant are thrown out of court. If you are arrested, give your name and address. If you do not you will have bail trouble. You can give a friend's address. Do not discuss any details of your case with the police. Demand to see your lawyer (See Free Legal Aid Section). You are allowed a phone call and generally they will give you three. Call your closest friend and tell him you are arrested. He should be instructed to meet you in court at 100 Centre Street. On the fourth floor your friend can find out what courtroom you will appear in for arraignment. There is a Legal Aid lawyer in the courtroom who will handle the arraignment. If the charges are misdemeanors he should be used; if the charges are felonies you might be advised to get help from a private lawyer, Mobilization for Youth or some other agency. A good lawyer can get a bail reduction that can save you a good deal of time if you are_hard_up_for_bread._Bail_depends_on_a_variety_of_factors ranging from previous arrests to the judge's hangover. It can be put up in collateral, i.e. a bank book, or often there is a cash alternative offered which amounts to about 10 to 20% of the bail. Try and have your friend show up with at least a hundred dollars in cash. For very high bail there are the bail bondsmen in the area of the courthouse who will cover the bail for a fee not to exceed 5%. You will need what they term a solid citizen to sign the bail papers and perhaps put up some collateral.

DOPE BUSTS - Possession of less than a quarter of an ounce of pot is considered a misdemeanor. The penalty can be up to one year. In actuality, a conviction for possession is very rare. The New York courts are quite lenient on this charge. More than a quarter of an ounce is considered possession with intent to sell. This along with sale (to an agent) are considered felonies and punishable by terms of up to 15 years in prison. A few precautions are in order. If you are carrying when busted eat it as soon as it is cool. Never sell to someone you do not know. Never make a sale with two other people present. Agents always buy with another person or agent present as a witness. Never sell to anyone facing an indictment for they are subject to pressure. Undercover agents have some pretty interesting disguises. Black undercover cops are very hard to spot. Often undercover cops wear beards and moustaches but few, contrary to rumor, have very long hair. Long hair that takes a year to grow is not possible since agents are switched around and anyway long hair doesn't grow in Queens. Undercover cops always carry a gun so look out for that noticeable bulge or a jacket being worn on a hot day.

There is a new bill already passed, waiting for the governor's signature, that would upgrade the dope penalties, for example, sale of pot to a minor could get you up to life imprisonment. If this bill is passed and you are caught selling to a minor, pull out a gun and shoot the kid. You can only get 10-20 years for first degree manslaughter and can be paroled in 6 years. Acid and other dope, although against the law rarely result in busts and even less in convictions (heroin is another thing, of course). There are too many technicalities involved in analyzing the substance, many such as STP are not covered by the law. For this reason, they generally go after the grass unless there is a major production or sale involved.

RUNAWAYS — Laws governing runaways are equally ridiculous. Persons who look underage (under 16 for males, under 18 for females) can be stopped by a cop anytime and asked to produce identification. If you are underage or do

not have identification to prove otherwise you can be brought to the police station. There your parents or guardian is called. If you have permission to be here they let you go, if not, your parents can pick you up there. If they don't want you, you can be sent to the Youth Detention House which is a very bad trip indeed. If you are a runaway, get fake identification and quick. People who put up runaways are subject to arrest for contribut. ing to the delinquency for a minor. If you want to go home and need a contact or if you want to stay a few days in a good place call Judson Memorial Church in Washington Square, GR 7-0351. This is the first year this program has been in effect but the people running it are cool. If you don't want them to call your parents or the cops they assure us they will not. They can house and feed about twenty. five young people.

* * *

DEMONSTRATIONS — A word should be said about demonstrations. Demonstrations with large numbers of arrests rarely result in convictions. Lawyers inform us of the over 3,000 arrests in recent anti-war, yippie demonstrations, etc. there have been no convictions. This does not mean things couldn't change drastically but these are the facts up to now.

* * *

Remember when arrested give only your name and address. Demand a search warrant if they want to come into your pad. The only know cure for Tasmanian Pig Fever is revolution. Paranoids unite!

* * *

DOPE — As you probably know, most dope is illegal, therefore some risks are always involved in buying and selling. In the legal section we have discussed the selling problems. Now let us consider the problems involved in buying. Arrests are not a problem unless you are inside and happen to get caught in a raid on a major dealer. What is a major hazard is getting burned. The usual trick is to take your dough and just vanish, leaving you standing on the street. Another method is substituting oregano or parsely for grass,

chewing tobacco as hash, and aspirin and barbiturates as acid. A general rule is no bread up front. If you're getting an ounce or more of grass you are entitled to sample it. Hash can also be sampled. If you're considering buying a large amount of acid, buy one tab for a sample and try it first. Another rule is to buy from a known dealer or a close friend.

Have you considered growing your own? Being a weed, grass is very easy to grow if it gets enough water and sun. Get your seeds together, travel over to Jersey or Staten Island, find a field and plant your seeds. Draw a furrow in the ground about half an inch deep and plant the seeds about two inches apart. Cover the seeds with soil and water the area. Returning every two weeks to tend your crop will be sufficient. No matter how high the shoots get they are smokeable if dried out but it is best to let them grow to maturity (when the flowers bloom). This takes three to four months depending on soil conditions and sunlight. With a little effort, you can grow kilos galore. Growing grass indoors is a big hassle but it can be done if you construct a planting box with a light bulb or artificial growing lamp. Some hardy souls have planted grass in Carl Schurz Park next to Gracie Mansion, 89th Street and East River Drive.

There are also legal highs, the most famous of which is bananas. Scrap the insides of the banana peel and roast in a 200° oven for a half hour or until dark brown. Crumble the scrapings and roll in a joint or pack in a pipe. This will produce a mild pot high.

Mornings glory seeds will produce a high similar to LSD if prepared properly. Use only the white, blue, or blue-white varieties that are not coated with chemicals. If they have been coated a good washing in alcohol will remove it. You need about 400 seeds to get you up there. Generally there are about 40 to 60 in a packet. We prefer the following method: grind the seeds in a pepper mill and stuff them into gelatin capsules that you can get in any drug store. Another method is to boil the seeds, strain the mixture and drink the liquid. It tastes bitter but it's easier than the grinding method. It's an 8-10 hour trip. Whipped cream containers are 80% nitrous oxide or laugh-

ing gas. Hold the container upright and release the nozzle slowly as you inhale. It's really a gas; even the whipped cream gets you high.

Some people claim you can get high on cabbage centers. Others claim cigarette tobacco mixed with powdered aspirins will do the trick. A hint on grass: boil the twigs and seeds and make a very groovy tea — sort of a tea-tea.



BAD TRIPS — The best method for bringing a person down from a bad trip is calm, understanding talk by a sympathetic soul. Generally this works. Orange juice and sugar works well. A cup of sugar to a quart of orange juice. Drink as much as you can. Niacinimide, a vitamin B derivative also works. You need 1000 milligrams for every 100 micrograms of LSD. Say the tablets you have are 100 mg. That means ten tablets for each 100 micrograms of LSD. If you do not know the LSD dosage, assume 500 micrograms and use 50 tablets of Niacinimide. Too much Niacinimide cannot hurt you. Landing time for both the orange juice-sugar method and Niacinimide is between 30-40 minutes. Niacinimide has better results. It is available without a prescription and is fairly cheap. You can get a thousand tablets for about three dollars.

As a last resort you should call in a physician who can administer a tranquilizer, generally thorazine. Bellevue

should be considered a bad trip.

Be careful of drugs you know nothing about. STP is only for people who have been into acid for a time. Heroin is addictive and can be a mighty expensive habit. Amphetamine, usually called A or meth or speed, is also quite dangerous if you don't know what you are doing. Both heroin and meth are self-destructive. They ruin your appetite, often causing malnutrition. Since they are needle drugs there is always the chance of missing a vein, which leads to a stiff_arm_for_a few_days_or_of contracting_serum hepatitis from unsterilized needles. You can kick the habit by just refusing to take it for a few weeks or switching to a groovier drug. Don't get hooked on any drug, whether it be heroin, school, coca-cola, benzedrine, suburbia, meth, or politics. They can all rot your brain . . . Be advised.

communes — Communes can be a cheap and enjoyable way to live. They are a good tribal way to live in the city. Because they are tribes each has a personality of its own. This personality depends on the people in the commune and how well they get along together. For this reason the most important part of setting up a commune is choosing people who are compatible. It is vital that no member of the commune has any strong objection to any other member. More communes have been destroyed by incompatibility than any other single reason. People of similar interests (speed freaks with speed freaks, painters with painters, and revolutionaries with revolutionaries) should get together. Preferably the members of the commune should know each other before they begin setting up quarters.

Once there is a nucleus of 4 to 7 people that are compatible establishing a commune is not difficult. The first thing to do is rent an apartment. The initial cost will probably be two months rent. Don't pay more. The landlord is not legally allowed to ask for more than one month's rent as security. Don't go to a rental agency unless you are willing to pay an extra month's rent as a fee. Two ways you can find an apartment if you don't know of one are: walk up and down every street and look for rent signs; the other is to look inside the front doors of some buildings in the area for a sign giving the landlord's name. When you find buildings owned by one company there is a pretty good chance that the company owns other buildings in the area. Call that company and ask if they have any vacant apartments.

When you get an apartment, furnishing will be the next step. You can double your sleeping space by building loft or bunk beds. Nail two by fours securely from ceiling to floor about three feet from the walls where beds are wanted. Then build a frame out of two by fours at the height you want the beds. Make sure it is strong enough to hold the weight of people sleeping on it. Then nail a sheet of 3/4 inch plywood on the frame. Mattresses and other furniture can be gotten for free. See the section on free furniture. You can cop silverware in self-service

restaurants.

How you govern your commune depends on where the member's heads are. One method which works well is the Indian tribal council in which from time to time all members of the tribe (commune) get together and discuss problems that come up and solutions are worked out. At the meeting it should be decided which members are responsible for the things that have to be done (i.e. cooking cleaning, raising the rent); this assures that they will be done. It is a good idea to have a meeting when you first form to make decisions on some of the important things that are sure to arise. The first is whether you want a crash pad or a commune. The difference is that a commune is a closed unit. Other people may join, but unlike a crash pad, they may not join for one day. Other things to consider are drugs (no drugs in the pad, communal stash, etc.), property (personal, communal), age limits and so on. The important thing to remember is that with experience and basic trust for each other, this form of tribal living is by far the best way to live in the city jungle. Ask around for an experienced commune and get one of their members to come to your first tribal meeting. The more stable communes that are established the sooner we can begin to realize a freer more humanistic society.

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

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NY T-1 advised on July 10, 1968, that ABBE
HOFFMAN wrote a YIP survival manuel entitled "(Obscene) the System".
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of the YIP survival manuel entitled "(Obscene) the System"

This manuel contains on the inside cover a replica of the seal of the city of New York and lists 30 pages of things that can be obtained free in the city of New York.

Among the items are articles telling on how to obtain free subway rides by using a dark green card and flashing it quickly as you go through the subway exit gate or by using German Fennigs, Danish ore, or Mozambique ten centavos pieces, which fit most of the subway's turnstiles. These foreign coins come four or five to a penny. However large amounts may be purchased outside New York City as the transit authority has been pressing the foreign coin dealers in New York City.

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Another item describes how to use a number 14 brass washer as a dime in old style telephones, parking meters, laundromat dryers and other vending machines. This item also deals with how to use credit card telephone calls, charged to other individuals.

This manuel also contains articles on dope, explaining how to buy and grow dope and how to get "high" by various other methods.

B. Support of Striking Students at Columbia University

NY T-12 advised on April 29, 1968 that at 1:00 p.m. on April 29, 1968, the YIP held a press conference in its office, Room 607, 32 Union Square, New York City to announce what they plan to do in the event the New York City Police Department attempted to evacuate striking students who had at that time taken over five buildings at Columbia University.

According to the informant KEITH LAMPE of the YIP stated that the Yippies had 700 people that they could bring on the scene within one half hour if the police try to disburse the students at Columbia University and that the Yippies would use force if necessary to prevent the police from arresting the students. He stated he did not want to release to many details concerning the Yippie plans because there was a Bureau of Special Services, New York City Police Department Police Officer in attendance at the press conference.

The informant continued that LAMPE stated that most of the 700 individuals would come from organizations specifically identified as the Resistance, an anti-war group, the New York Workshop in Non-Violence, a pacifist group and the Yippies. He stated that these three groups have what is described as a "telephone tree system" wherein one student notifies another and by each having different telephone numbers to call they would be able to alert the 700 demonstrators. The informant stated that LAMPE said that



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the police would have to use hand combat and guns as the only effective measure to evict the demonstrating students. He said the police would not use water for fear of ruining the University books.

The informant stated that LAMPE also said that the Yippies consider life more important than property or material possessions.

The informant stated that ABBE HOFFMAN of the Yippies stated that one half hour is not too long to bring out 700 individuals against the police citing the Berkeley, California campus incident wherein it took the police 13 hours to clear the students from the University.

The informant stated that KEITH LAMPE also said that the Yippies were well acquainted with police harassment and brutality as a result of a recent incident in Grand Central Terminal in New York City. He also said that the 700 would only be the beginning and that the three above mentioned organizations, by the use of flyers, could bring out 1,000 sympathizers in a short period of time.

On April 29, 1968, a representative of the Bureau of Special Services, New York City Police Department, made available a press release from the YIP in support of the striking students at Columbia University.

This press release stated as follows:

"The Yippies, also known as the Youth International Party want to make it known that they support the striking students at Columbia. We fully support the demands of S.A.S. and S.D.S. and in particular the demand for amnesty towards all student demonstrators.



"We totally reject the use of police as a means of clearing the occupied buildings. Having experienced police brutality at the Grand Central Station YIP-IN, we are fully aware what bloodshed would ensue should the police be called in.

"For the past four days of the Columbia demonstrations we have been building up support for the students. We have established a 24-hour emergency phone system. This phone system, based on a model used in the Algerian Revolution, enables us to contact over 700 people within a half-hour. Also we have printed 3000 flyers urging people to assemble at 116th and Broadway immediately. These flyers will hit the street in ten strategic locations if and when the police are called in. We feel confident that we can produce 1000 people on a very short notice. These people are prepared to engage in civil disobedience such as the blocking of traffic, -- in particular police vans and subways in the area."

On April 29, 1968, the representative of the Bureau of Special Services, New York City Police Department, was made available a YIP flyer supporting the striking students at Columbia University.

This flyer states as follows:

"YIPPIE! YIPPIE! YIPPIE! YIPPIE! YIPPIE!

"ALL SYSTEMS ARE NOW ON RED ALERT.

"ALL SYSTEMS ARE NOW ON RED ALERT.

"ALL SYSTEMS ARE NOW ON RED ALERT.

"WE FULLY SUPPORT the demands of S.A.S. and S.D.S. students now occupying liberated zones at Columbia University. In particular we support the demand for total amnesty and reject the use of police to clear the campus of demonstrators.

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"WE SUPPORT OUR BROTHERS AND SISTERS

"IN THE EVENT POLICE ARE BROUGHT IN

C. Demonstration in St. Mark's Place, New York City, May 24, 1968 - CONFYDENTIAL

NY T-1 advised on May 24, 1968, that on the evening of May 24, 1968, various groups from the Lower East Side of New York City, including the YIP and the East Side Service Organization (ESSO) would participate in the closing off of St. Mark's Place between Second and Third Avenues in New York City, with a "stolen" play street sign.

The informant stated that at 9:00 p.m. a one-pound magnesium flash bomb would be ignited on a rooftop which would be a "signal from God", signaling the beginning of the take-over of the street and closing it to traffic.

The informant stated that the purpose of this activity would be to pressure the City of New York into providing services to hippies and to close St. Mark's Place to through traffic.

The informant stated that 1,000 leaflets announcing this activity had been printed and distributed by the YIP and motor cycle clubs in the area had been invited to participate inthe activity.

At 9:00 p.m., on May 24, 1968, SAS of the FBI observed a flash bomb ignited on the roof of the building located at 33 St. Mark's Place, New York City. This flash bomb gave off a brilliant white flash of light and approximately fifty hippie-type individuals gathered in the street cheered at its ignition.

At approximately 9:30 p.m., St. Mark's Place was packed with hippie-type individuals and usual weekend crowds when a second flash bomb was ignited in the vicinity of St. Mark's Place and Second Avenue, New York City.

At approximately 9:45 p.m., 100 hippie-type individuals began milling around the block with lighted candles jeering and shouting obscenities at the police.

JERRY RUBIN and ABBE HOFFMAN, YIP leaders observed commingling with the crowd throughout the event

By 12:00 p. m., midnight, the majority of the demonstrators in St. Marks Place had dispersed.

Deputy Inspector JOSEPH FINK, New York City Police Department (NYCPD), advised on May 21, 1968, that the New York City Fire Department had recovered a tin can similar to a coffee can, which had been used to contain the flash bomb on the roof of the building located at 33 St. Mark's Place, New York City.

Deputy Inspector FINK also advised that no damage had been done to the building located at 33 St. Mark's Place by the flash bomb.

B. HADDroxil Deputy Inspector Fink further advised that the NYCPD 10:25 p.m., on May 24, 1968, arrested and charged

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NY T-1 advised on May 28. 1968. that one of New York, Was the individual who made the flash bombs, which were set off in St. Mark's Place, New York City, on May 24, 1968.

Macy's Giant New-Nation Celebration, New York City, June 8, 1968

The "National Guardian" in its April 27, 1968, issue on Page four sets forth an article entitled "White Radicals Consider Future Actions", which states in part as follows:

> "A central question confronting white radicals is how to relate politically to the racism that permeates U. S. society and to the

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"possibility of mass repression against the black liberation movement.

"Though the subject has been under discussion for at least a year, it is clear that the white radical movement has not come to a concrete answer. In the last few months, anticipating massive uprisings in the black ghettos in the summer, the question has received increasing attention.

* * * * * * * * * * * * *

"A different type of educational activity will be carried out by New York Yippies in May, when they will hold a 'loot-in' in Macy's, New York's largest department store.

"'We want to set America's head straight about looting,' says Yippie Jerry Rubin.
'Property is theft, after all.'"

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A characterization of the "Guardian" formerly known as the "National Guardian" is contained in the Appendix attached hereto:

NY T-1 advised on May 2, 1968, that at a meeting of the YIP held on May 1, 1968, in New York City, a possible "Loot-In" project at Macy's Department Store in New York City during May, 1968, was discussed.

The informant stated that it was learned that even though the "Loot-In" would only be a jest in order to create an atmosphere of confusion in the store, the YIP organization was advised by an American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) attorney that such a project could result in a conspiracy charge against the organization should anything be stolen as a result of the advertised "Loot-In".

The informant stated that, therefore, the project was discontinued.

NY T-6 on May 2, 1968, also furnished information regarding the YIP meeting held on May 1, 1968.

NY T-1 advised on May 7, 1968, that at a meeting of the YIP held on the evening of May 6, 1968, in New York City, and attended by 10 individuals, the group changed the plans of their former "Loot-In" project at Macy's Department Store in New York City, to a "Macy's Giant New-Nation Celebration" to be held on June 8, 1968, from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m., followed by a celebration in the Sheep Meadow in Central Park, New York City, at 4:00 p.m.

The informant stated that the group's plans now call for the wearing of costumes and the surrounding of Macy's Department Store at which time shoppers will be asked not to enter Macy's Department Store.

The informant stated that the group's plans also include "spontaneous sculpture in the aisles" of Macy's Department Store.

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The informant also advised that the YIP is now concerned that some other group may try to hold a "Loot-In" at Macy's Department Store on their own and advertise it as being a project of YIP.

NY T-6 on May 7, 1968, also furnished information regarding the YIP meeting held on May 6, 1968.

NY T-1 advised on May 17, 1968, that at a meeting of the YIP held on the evening of May 15, 1968, in New York City, it was learned that with regard to the proposed YIP New-Nation Celebration scheduled to be held at Macy's Department Store, in New York City, on June 8, 1968, from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m., that KEITH LAMPE, a YIP leader, had 25,000 leaflets printed announcing this project for the purpose of counter-acting a leaflet being distributed by ESSO in the YIP name advertising the project as "Macy's Giant Loot-In".

On May 17, 1968, NY T-1 made available a copy of a leaflet from YIP entitled "Macy's Giant New-Nation Celebration" which states as follows:

"to help free us from the property fetish, macy*s will become a liberated zone SATURDAY, JUNE 8, from 1 to 3 p.m.* wear middle-class costumes and infiltrate* ask straight shoppers not to enter* 'PROPERTY IS THEFT'* give away your clothing inside and demand replacements for leaving* spontaneous sculpture in the aisles* anti-property demonstration surrounding the store* donate second-hand objects to macy*s* start free stores at the entrances*"

NY T-1 advised on June 6, 1968, that at a meeting of the YIP held on the evening of June 5, 1968, in New York City, it was decided that the proposed YIP "Macy's Giant New-Nation Celebration", to be held at Macy's Department Store in New York City, on June 8, 1968, would be postponed due to the shooting of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

In this regard, the informant stated that a group from the YIP would pass out leaflets at Macy's Department Store in New York City, on June 8, 1968, announcing the postponement of this event.

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The informant advised that no new date has been set for the YIP event to be held at Macy's pepartment Store in NYC.

On June 8, 1968, at approximately 12:15 p.m., a SA of the FBI observed eight hippie-type individuals, including KEITH LAMPE, a YIP leader, assemble at the Southwest corner of 34th Street and Fifth Avenue, New York City.

At 12:40 p.m., this group of individuals walked west on 34th Street to Macy's Department Store at 34th Street and Broadway, New York City.

At 12:50 p.m., this group of individuals began to distribute leaflets to passersby at all of the entrances to Macy's Department Store and chanted "Macy's has been postponed".

At 2:25 p.m., the group of individuals discontinued passing out the leaflets and by 2:50 p.m., the entire group had dispersed.

An SA of the FBI obtained one of the leaflets being distributed at Macy's Department Store, 34th Street and Broadway, New York City, on June 8, 1968.

This leaflet, captioned "Macy's", and containing the printed name, KEITH LAMPE, at the end, was an announcement that the Yippies would hold a "New-Nation Demonstration" at Macy's Department Store, on June 8, 1968, from 1:00 - 3:00 p.m., with the date and time blocked out in heavy black ink.

NY T-1 advised on June 19, 1968, that the YIP "Macy's Giant New-Nation Celebration" has been postponed until after the organization's "Festival of Life" to be held in Chicago, Illinois, in August, 1968.

E. Support of JERRY RUBIN on His Arrest for Possession of Marijuana

The "New York Post", a New York City daily newspaper, in its June 14, 1968 issue on page 23, sets forth an article entitled "Yippie Chief Arrested in Pot Bust", which states as follows:

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"Terry Rubin, one of the leaders of the Youth International Party-the 'Yippies'is under arrest on charges of possession of marijuana.

"Narcotics Squad police arrested Rubin, 29, in his apartment at 313 E. Third St. last night. Rubin, who was active in the Free Speech Movement at the University of California at Berkeley in 1964, was one of the directors of last October's anti-war demonstration at the Pentagon. He has described the Yippies as 'politically oriented hippies.'

"Rubin was booked at the E. Fifth St. station, arraigned in night court and released on \$1,000 bail. Police said more than an ounce of marijuana was in Rubin's apartment.

"A friend and political associate of Rubin, Abby Hoffman, charged that Rubin had been beaten by police. Rubin was treated at Bellevue Hospital early today, but the extent of his injuries was not revealed by the hospital."

NY T-6 advised on July 2, 1968, that the YIP would sponsor a picket demonstration at the New York City Criminal Courts Building, 100 Centre Street, New York City, at 9:30 a.m. that date to show support for their leader, JERRY RUBIN, who was to report to court for a hearing in connection with his arrest on June 13, 1968, on charges of possession of marijuana.

On July 2, 1968, at 9:40 a.m., a SA of the FBI observed 36 individuals carrying small American flags who, by their appearance can be described as Yippies, picket in front of 100 Centre Street, New York City.

The pickets gave out small plastic bags containing a red pliable substance with a tag which read "Napalm US Gov Approved Dangerous Drug." The pickets also gave out a small booklet which advocates everything for free.



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The pickets continued their demonstration until 10:20 a.m., at which time, they went as a group into the Criminal Courts Building with JERRY RUBIN.

NY T-6 advised on July 2, 1968, that the hearing for JERRY RUBIN was postponed as the police laboratory did not have an analysis ready of the alleged marijuana which was taken from RUBIN's apartment.

F. Festival of Life, Chicago, Illinois, August 25 - 30, 1968

NY T-1 advised on May 2, 1968, that at a meeting of YIP held on May 1, 1968, in New York City, JERRY RUBIN, a YIP leader, asked the organization to call off the Chicago Festival of Life demonstration which had been scheduled for August 25 - 80, 1968, during the National Democratic Convention in that city.

The informant stated that after much discussion, and presentation of various views, it was unanimously agreed that the Festival of Life would be called off and that an announcement to this effect would be made in the near future.

The informant stated that the reasons for the cancellation of the Festival of Life were as follows: The logistics were that such a Festival would not be feasible due to the lack of facilities and finances.

The informant stated the main reason for the cancellation was that the organization did not want to be responsible for the numerous youths who would attend the Festival without adequate facilities.

The informant indicated that hippie-type groups, in the Chicago area, may on their own hold some type of activities during the National Democratic Convention.

NY T-6 on May 2, 1968, also furnished information regarding the YIP meeting held on May 1, 1968.

NY T-1 advised on May 9, 1968, that at a meeting of the YIP held on May 8, 1968, in New York City, it was announced that ABBE HOFFMAN, a YIP leader, would speak at the University of Chicago on May 10, 1968.

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The informant stated that it was also announced at the YIP meeting, that ABBE HOFFMAN, would also speak to the Yippies in Chicago ("The Seed, Head Shop Owners") as to whether they can organize a two day Yippie Program in August rather than the previously scheduled six day event.

The informant stated that ABBE HOFFMAN would also meet with the Blackstone Rangers, a black gang in Chicago, as to what the reaction would be to whites coming to Chicago for the National Democratic Convention, since, to date, no whites, including THOMAS HAYDEN, who is now living in Chicago, or RENNIEYDAVIS, have met with the black gangs.

The informant stated that the YIP is in financial trouble and that there are no plans for opening YIP offices on the West Coast.

The "New York Daily News", January 10, 1966, issue, contained an article entitled "Word From the Left". The article stated that "three Americans who defied a state department travel ban to spend ten days in North Vietnam, arrived at Kennedy Airport last night, mouthing the Communist Hanoi line about the deep 'inconsistency' of the 'hypocritical' United States Vietnamese policy.

"The three---Yale Professor Staughton Lynd, 36, Herbert Aptheker, 50, Communist Theoretician and Director of the American Institute for Marxist Studies here; and Thomas Hayden, 23, a founder of the Leftist Students for a Democratic Society, ---were greeted by an applauding group of about fifty persons, including beatnik types..."

A characterization of the American Institute for Marxist Studies is contained in the Appendix hereto.

On March 13, 1967, NY T-13 furnished a brochure of the Militant Labor Forum (MLF) listing a partial list of speakers of the MLF which included the name of Professor Staughton Lynd.

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A characterization of the MLF is contined in the Appendix hereto.

NY T-14 advised in January, 1968, that during the latter part of 1967, RENNIE DAVIS travelled to North Vietnam where he met with representatives of the National Liberation Front.

NY T-1 advised on May 17, 1968, that at a meeting of the YTP held on May 15, 1968, in New York City, the following information was obtained:

ABBE HOFFMAN upon his return from Chicago had stated that there is no YIP movement in Chicago. The police pressure is heavy and the meeting he had with the Blackstone Rangers fostered an impression of a city set with violence. The Blackstone Rangers are in a local gang war and do not care about the YIP. However, the people in Chicago are still interested in the August action.

The informant stated that the consensus at the YIP meeting was to have the Chicago people, "The Seed", make a greater effort to obtain permits since the Chicago press is favorable to the action.

The informant stated that in effect, New York would just take care of New York Yippies and a message would be sent out to the effect that each "tribe" would be responsible for its own survival including getting to Chicago as a group in any way possible. In addition, the music groups would have to make their own arrangements.

The informant stated that the event may be cut down to three days instead of six days in order to minimize logistical problems.

The informant stated that the site of the event is flexible and instead of Grant Park, another park, or even land out of the city, would be acceptable.

The informant stated that the general consensus at the meeting, which overrode JERRY RUBIN's move to end the YIP to save his own face, was not to call off Chicago but to restructure it into more manageable proportions.



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NY T-1 advised on July 10, 1968, that JERRY RUBIN and ABBE HOFFMAN, leaders of the YIP, are presently planning to go to Chicago within the near future to meet with Mayor DALEY's aides to secure a place for the YIP Festival of Life demonstration to be held in Chicago during the latter part of August, 1968.

The informant stated that either Soldiers Field or the Navy Pier will be used and that final plans as to length and activities of the event are not formulated to date.

In addition, the informant stated that no concrete plans have been formulated to date for any demonstrations by the Yippies.

NY T-1 advised on July 16, 1968, that

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The informant stated that he further learned that ELDRIDGE CLEAVER of the Black Panthers in California had asked JERRY RUBEN of the YIP to run as vice President on the Peace and Freedom Party ticket, which would change the YIP Festival into a counter-political convention. CLEAVER stated he would bring the Black Panthers to Chicago and the YIP hopes that this would give them and, in particular

potential access to the Blackstone Rangers and other

gangs in Chicago.

The informant stated that this would also give the YIP a base from which to tap financial resources in "the left'

NY T-15 advised on July 21, 1968, that at the convention of the Peace and Freedom Party held in New York City, on the weekend of July 21, 1968, JERRY RUBIN's name was suggested as the nominee for Vice Presidential candidate for the Peace and Freedom Party; however, he did not receive the nomination. ELDRIDGE CLEAVER was nominated as the Presidential candidate.

AMERICAN INSTITUTE FOR MARXIST STUDIES

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A source advised on April 9, 1963, that on April 7, 1963, at a meeting of the District Committee of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA) of New England, held in Boston, Massachusetts, HERBERT APTHEKER stated he was developing an organization called American Institute for Marxist Studies (AIMS), which would eventually legalize the CP. He stated AIMS would publish literature on History, Science, Physics, Archeology and other subjects which would be put out quarterly with various supplements.

A second source advised on June 30, 1966, that HERBERT APTHEKER was elected to the National Committee, CP, USA, at the 18th National Convention of the CP, USA held June 22-26, 1966, in New York City.

A third source advised on June 7, 1963, that on June 3, 1963, HERBERT APTHEKER spoke at the CP, USA, New York District Board meeting concerning AIMS. APTHEKER stated that AIMS would unite and strengthen the CP although the CP would not be connected with it. He stated AIMS was being formed to operate within the scope of the McCarran and Smith Acts and would legally bring Marxist material and opinions to the attention of American scholars and the general public.

A fourth source reported on August 29, 1966, that AIMS issues a "Newsletter" every other month. This source also made available the information that AIMS issues publications and holds symposiums concerning Marxism.

A fifth source advised on May 8, 1968, that as of that date, AIMS was located on the fifth floor west of 20 West 30th Street, New York, New York.

AMERICAN LABOR PARTY

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the American Labor Party:

"AMERICAN LABOR PARTY

- "1. 'For years, the Communists have put forth the greatest efforts to capture the entire American Labor Party throughout New York State. They succeeded in capturing the Manhattan and Brooklyn sections of the American Labor Party but outside of New York City they have been unable to win control.'

 (Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 1311 on the CIO Political Action Committee, March 29, 1944, p. 78.)
- "2. 'Communist dissimulation extends into the field of political parties forming political front organizations such as the * * American Labor Party. The Communists are thus enabled to present their candidates for elective office under other than a straight Communist label.'

 (Internal Security Subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee, Handbook for Americans, S. Doc.117, April 23, 1956, p. 91.)"

On October 7, 1956, PETER HAWLEY, New York State Chairman, American Labor Party, publicly announced the American Labor Party State Committee unanimously approved a resolution dissolving the organization and ordering the liquidation of its assets.

THE "GUARDIAN" FOR ERLY KNOWN AS "NATIONAL GUARDIAN" WEEKLY GUARDIAN ASSOCIATES, INCORPORATED

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The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications", revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the "National Guardian":

"1. ... 'established by the American Labor Party in 1947 as a "progressive" weekly...it has manifested itself from the beginning as a virtual official propaganda arm of Soviet Russia.'"

The February 3, 1968 issue of the "National Guardian" announced that as of the issue of February 10, 1968, the "National Guardian" would henceforth be known as the "Guardian".

The February 10, 1968 issue of the "Guardian" is self-described as an "independent radical newsweekly" and is published by Weekly Guardian Associates, Incorporated. The "Guardian" lists its address as 197 East 4th Street, New York, New York.

The February 12, 1968, issue of the "New York Times" carried an article entitled, "Radical Editors Say Their Job Is In 'hovement'". This article stated that the first issue of the "Guardian" was dedicated by the paper's staff "To those heroic Liberation fighters who last week began a major offensive against American Imperialism in South Vietnam."

This article quoted one of the editors as saying that "Our job is to build a Radical Novement. To quote the Cuban revolutionaries, we are not only to write about it, but also to move along with it--we are movement people acting as journalists."

"The 'Guardian' takes a strong left position, but it is not identified with any organized group because it believes that an American left ideology is still in the making. One of its purposes is to break away from the cliches of the left ideology of the past."

THE "GUARDIAN" CONT'D

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This article concluded by stating that the "Guardian" is considered the largest radical weekly in America.

A source advised on August 25, 1960, that the Socialist Party (SWP) - New York Local (NYL) was founded in 1938, in New York City.

A second source stated on May 17, 1967, that the SWP-NYL was affiliated with and followed the aims of the National SWP.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as It is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an. association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and 40 "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco; California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anti-Communist proviso was removed from the SDS Constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some Communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street,

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On August 5, 1968, first source advised an administrative committee meeting of the National Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (NMC) was held at the Hotel Morraine, Highland Park, Illinois, August 4, 1968, with approximately 55 individuals attending. This meeting was chaired by Dave Dellinger, editor of "Liberation Magazine." The entire meeting dealt with proposed actions regarding the Democratic National Convention (DNC), August, 1968, at Chicago, Illinois.

Second source on May 14, 1963 advised that the Militant Labor Forum (MLF) sponsored a symposium in New York, New York. The first speaker was Dave Dellinger, editor of "Liberation" magazine. Dellinger identified himself as a pacifist. He stated it was necessary to abolish the cause of war, which is capitalism. He advocated a communist society and said, "I am a Communist," but pointed out that he was not a Soviet type Communist.

The following activities were adopted for the dates indicated:

August 24, 1968

All participants involved in actions around DNC will be directed to approximately 40 - 50 movement centers which will be established in Chicago with the three major movement centers being located in Lincoln, Grant, and Hyde Parks. Actual location of these sites have not been selected to date.

Small demonstrations will be held at such sites as induction centers, Federal Building, banks, Illinois Institute of Technology and other selected targets.

August 25, 1968

Small demonstrations to be held at hotels housing DNC delegates. Purpose of these demonstrations is to test confrontation with Chicago Police Department in an attempt to ascertain the degree of firmness on part of the police force.

August 26, 1968

Coalition for an open convention composed of backers of Senator Mc Carthy will have a rally at Grant Park. Various peace organizations have been requested to act as marshals during rally.

August 27, 1968

Demonstrations will be held during birthday party for President Johnson scheduled for Soldier's Field, large Chicago Stadium. The final plans regarding this demonstration are to be worked out at a later date.

Youth International Party (YIP) will hold a "Festival of Life" at Lincoln Park and this date during this activity, YIP will nominate and elect a pig for President of the United States. Once nominated and elected, the pig will be butchered and eaten.

Also on this date, NMC will sponsor an art festival at a coffee house known as "Strawberry Field," 4816 North Kedzie Street, Chicago, as well as "teach-ins" and "speak-outs" in Hyde Park area on Chicago's South Side, regarding proposed amnesty for military deserters and Vietnam war.

August 28, 1968

A massive march is scheduled to commence at 3:00 PM at Wacker and State Streets, Chicago, then proceeding down State Street to 43rd Street and West to Halsted. Street to the vicinity of the International Amphitheater, site of DNC. Demonstrators upon arrival at the convention site will conduct a picket demonstration between 39th and 47th Streets until presidential candidate is selected. NMC is scheduled to issue a policy statement calling for non-violence, however, if participants during this demonstration desire direct confrontation, they may do so on an individual basis.

August 29, 1968

During morning hours this date, consideration is being given to hold demonstrations at the three major NMC movement centers. No final decisions were made regarding this matter. During evening hours, demonstrations will be held at the induction center, Federal Building, Chicago Police Department headquarters, urban renewal center and other selected targets.


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

On August 21, 1968, Commander Clarence E. Braasch, 18th District, Chicago Police Department, Chicago, Illinois, advised Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) that the Youth International Party, also known as, Yippies, are planning a peaceful demonstration at 7:00 p.m. on August 21, 1968 at the Russian Visa and Travel Center. 201 North Wells Street, Chicago, Illinois. Commander Braasch advised the group of Yippies are to meet with a group of Czechoslovaks to protest the Russian invasion of Czechoslovakia. Commander Braasch advised the Youth International Party, also known as Yippies, is a loose knit Hippie type organization which has expressed a desire to disrupt the Democratic National Convention, Chicago, Illinois, August, 1968.

On August 21, 1968, Special Agents of the FBI Chicago, Illinois, observed a group of approximately 65 or 70 Yippies peacefully picketing in the vicinity of the Russian Visa and Travel Center, 201 North Wells Street, Chicago, Illinois, from 7:10 p.m. to 7:50 p.m. The pickets were observed carrying signs regding "Russia Must Go" and similar slogans.

There were no incidents or arrests.

DEMONSTRATIONS AT THE NATIONAL DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION, AUGUST, 1968

On August 1, 1968, Thomas Barry, acting General Superintendent, Chicago Park District, Chicago, Illinois, advised his office has been in receipt of an oral request from representatives of the National Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (NMC) for a permit to use Grant Park and bandshell on Chicago's lake front, south of the loop area on August 28, 1968, and Soldier's Field, large stadium in vicinity of Grant Park on August 29, 1968, for a rally of 150,000 people to protest the war in Vietnam. A request was also made to allow people to sleep in Grant Park during the week of the convention. Barry advised representatives of NMC that this sleeping request was against city ordinance.

Barry advised that permits were not granted, however, upon receipt of official written request, this request would be submitted to the permit committee for their consideration.

Barry also advised the Youth International Party (YIP) submitted a letter July 15, 1968, to the Chicago Park District requesting permission to use Lincoln Park from 11:59 p.m. August 24, 1968, to 11:59 p.m. August 30, 1968, for a youth convocation to be known as "Festival of Life". This request indicated 25,000 people would participate in this activity and portable sanitation facilities would be required. Barry stated this request would be discussed and acted upon by the permit committe at a later date.

Davis, Chicago area coordinator for NMC requested from the Chicago Police Department, two parade permits. One permit

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DEMONSTRATIONS AT THE NATIONAL DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION, AUGUST, 1968

was requested for August 28, 1968, for 150,000 people to parade in Chicago's loop from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., to protest the war in Vietnam. The second permit request was for the evening hours of August 28, 1968, 7:00 p.m. midnight for 200,000 people to parade in vicinity of the International Amphitheater, site of the National Democratic Convention, on Halsted Street between 37th and 44th Streets. These permits are under consideration.

On August 8, 1968, Thomas Barry advised the Chicago Park Committee has not acted on any of these requests for the use of park facilities as of this date, however, all remain under consideration.

Second source advised on August 6, 1968, Rennie Davis was one of the founders of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) and in the fall of 1967, visited North Vietnam.

The second source stated that it was decided at this meeting that the Yippies would henceforth operate in a more ambiguous form than before with no officers, office or telephone number.

The second source stated that in this regard, the individuals in attendance at the meeting indicated that they are concerned of being charged with a conspiracy to riot charge and therefore do not want any officers, office or telephone number for the organization.

The second source stated that consequently, there is no YIP organization at the present time but that any individual or group of individuals desiring to call a demonstration can call a press conference, issue leaflets and hold the demonstration using the YIP name.

The second source stated that during the meeting many suggestions were made to ridicule the forthcoming November elections, such as declaring a "pig" the winner, but that no decisions were made for any specific plans or activities for the YIP within the near future.

On June 24, 1966, a third source advised that Jerry Rubin attended one session of the 18th National Convention, Communist Party (CP), United States of America (USA), held in New York City as an observer.

A fourth source advised on October 4, 1967, that Abbe Hoffman attended a meeting on September 30, 1967, of the administrative committee of the National Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam, at 20 East 14th Street, New York City.

At the meeting, Hoffman presented the "Hippies" plans for the demonstration to be held in Washington, D.C., October 21-22, 1967, part of which consisted of dyeing the Potomac River red and firing water pistols filled with day-glow paint at the walls of the Pentagon.

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

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an / association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and /to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anti-Communist proviso was removed from the SDS Constitution, In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some Communists in SDS and they are welcome. national headquarters of this organization as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

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

On September 9, 1968, Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed a press conference open to the public held at 11:00 AM by Jerry Rubin, New York Yippie Leader, at 1848 North Wells Street, Chicago, Illinois.

Rubin stated Chicago Mayor Richard Daley's report concerning the recent disruption in conjunction with the Democratic National Convention in Chicago as printed in the "Chicago Tribune", a Chicago daily newspaper, was a "pack of lies". Rubin described the report as "a black paper worthy of the Nazis". He stated the report was one that "dehumanized" people and that it was authored by "sadists".

Rubin said that he was pleased with the results of the disorders and that, because of their success, larger scale disruptions would be held on high school and college campuses around the country, culminating in a mass protest in Washington, D. C., on January 20, 1969, when the next president will be inaugurated.

Rubin stated that the Yippies-will hold a "Festival of Life" in conjunction with the presidential inauguration somewhere in Washington, D. C., where they will inaugurate their own "candidate", a pig known as "Pigasus", and will attempt to move him into the White House. Rubin stated that the Yippies plan to run Mayor Daley on the same ticket with the pig as a Vice Presidential candidate.

Rubin burned a copy of the "Chicago Tribune" containing Daley's report as a symbol of protest.

Rubin stated that he will ask the networks for one hour of prime television time to debate the Mayor on the convention disorders and to state the views of the Yippies.

Rubin stated that he will hold a press conference in the near future where he will disclose the identities and activities of two Yippies who had infiltrated the Chicago Police Department approximately one year ago. In addition, Rubin stated that he would identify three Chicago police officers who recently "defected" to the Yippie movement. Rubin stated that these officers would reveal the conspiracy by the Chicago Police Department and the City of Chicago against the Yippies.


Rubin introduced an individual identified as Robin Palmer, a New York Yippie, as his bodyguard. Rubin additionally introduced Clark Kissinger who also condemned Mayor Daley's report as facist in nature.

On September 12, 1968, Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (SAS, FBI), observed a press conference held by the Youth International Party (YIP) at City Hall, New York City (NYC), from 12:15 p.m. to 12:30 p.m. Approximately 15 hippie-type individuals, many wearing yippie buttons, were observed in the group;

Keith Lampe led the press conference but would only give his first name. Lampe announced that some yippies from New York were leaving for Prague, Czechoslovakia on the 18th of September to support the Czechoslovakian's struggle against the Russian aggressors and the United States' explaiters of the aggression by the Russians. Lampe stated the individuals planned to stop in London, Stockholm and Essen (Germany) where they plan to pick up additional supporters.

Lampe also announced that the Chicago Legal Defense Committee will need \$200,000.00 for the defense of people arrested there and that contributions should be sent to Yippie, in care of the Chicago Legall Defense Committee, 127 North Madison, Chicago, Illinois.

Lampe then announced that the YIP was in the process of decentralizing into small groups throughout the country and that there is no current leadership of the organization. said that in NYC there would be small gangs of yippies, some of which will be clandestine. Lampe stated that there would be gangs in urban ghettos, which, with other organizations, would

invade high school and college campuses for the purpose of getting the students to leave the campuses.

Several other representatives of the YIP were introduced by first name only and these individuals criticized the actions of the Chicago police during the National Democratic Convention. One of these individuals read a statement which indicated that a "YIP for Self-Defense" was being formed to organize the hippie community to counteract harassment by the police. Another individual indicated that many hippies would converge on Washington, D.C. to celebrate the election of "Pigusus" on Inauguration Day.

A reliable source advised on September 22, 1965, that at that time a list of names, believed to be the mailing list of the Gus Hall-Benjamin J. Davis Defense Committee (HDDC) in NYC, included the following under the caption "College Faculty" - Keith R. Jampe, Apartment D, 639 East 11th Street, New York City, "Queens College".

It was also announced that \$200,000 willbe needed for the defense of people arrested in Chicago and that contributions should be sent to Yippie in care of Chicago Legal Defense Committee, Chicago, Illinois.

I am particularly disappointed in the manner in which the material for my use before the Elsenhower Commission and the report on the Chicago riots has been prepared. Obviously there has not been the aggressive and intensive supervision which should have been attacked to these matters. I know of nothing in the Eureau's responsibilities that has been more important than the prompt, correct and accurate preparation of this material.

Yet many matters had been left out of the material that obviously should have been included in its original preparation. There was no reference In the material for my use before the Eisenhower Commission to the Touth Liternational Party known as Vippies, notwithstanding the particularly active participation in this group by Jerry Rubin. Likewise, there was not included in the monograph to be sent to the Department and the White House some violent statements made by Rubin indicating the need to resort to force and violence. The latest statistics on crime for the first six months of the current calendar year were not included in the material for the Eisenhower presentation. No reference was made to the activities of Dellinger in the Laterial for the Eisenhower Commission notalithstanding that this individual participated in and led the movement against the Pentagon some months ago and was particularly active in the violent demonstrations in Chicago. No reference was made to the fact that Rudd, the leader of the demonstrations at Columbia University, was likewise in Chicago and took a most active part in the hostile confrontation against the police.

I could cite a number of other salient matters that were overlooked or ignored in the inclusion of material for my use before the Eisenhower
Commission. As a matter of fact, had it not been for the recollections of
Lir. Tolson and myself from various memoranda in the past which have come

I have also been most concerned at the lack of a ggressive preparation of the monograph and the handling of the reports on the Chicago riots. I have in mind particularly the fact that the bottleneck in Vachington in handler, this material was not recognized until Frinay of last week and though it was reasonable to anticipate that the same would develop in vis. ci the vilame of reports to be handled. When it was finally recognize, it took a whole day for a one-page memorandum to come through the Eureau; to reach my office at 4:30 p.m., though it started in the General Investigative Division before 9:00 a.m. It remained in some divisions several hours before being cleared for action. As I have indicated, it could have easily been anticipated that this bettleneck would occur and request for additional personnel, both agent and clerical, could have been made a number of days before.. The Administrative Division could not not until after it had been approved by me and, as I have indicated, I did not receive it until 4:30 p. This certainly shows a lettargy throughout the Bureau in the hardling of a very birule but certainly urgent request.

There does not seem to have been recognition by all chickles in charge at headquarters handling these matters the seriousness of the same not the impact of our failure to produce adequate information promptly and completely. I understand that even now the monograph on the Chicago situation has not yet gone forth to the Department nor to the White house largely because it did not have in it some of the items which I specifically asked about this morning. I want an immediate correction of this indifference upon the part of the officials charged with the primary responsibilities in the handling of this material.

I also want a report on each Monday and Thursday of exactly what progress we are making in completing the Chicago investigation and the prompt transmission of material partaining thereto to the Department and to the U.S. Attorney at Chicago. I fear here again it has been allowed to drag without prompt and incisive action by officials at headquarters.

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NATIONAL EMERGENCY CIVIL LIBERTIES COMMITTEE, Formerly Known As Emergency Civil Liberties Committee

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications", revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., contains the following concerning the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee:

"Emergency Civil Liberties Committee

"1. 'The Emergency Civil Liberties Committee is an organization with headquarters in New York, whose avowed purpose is to abolish the House Committee on Un-American Activities and discredit the FBI. * * * The committee finds that the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee, established in 1951, although representing itself as a non-Communist group, actually operates as a front for the Communist Party. It has repeatedly assisted, by means of funds and legal aid, Communists involved in Smith Act violations and similar legal proceedings. One of its chief activities has been and still is the dissemination of voluminous Communist propaganda material.

'FRANK WILKINSON was called as a witness when he appeared in Atlanta as a representative of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee to propagandize against the Committee on Un-American Activities and to protest its hearings. In 1956 WILKINSON was identified as a Communist Party member by a former FBI undercover agent within the Party. Summoned at that time to answer the allegation, his reply to all questions was, "I am answering no questions of this committee." This also became his stock reply to questions

when he appeared during the Atlanta hearings. * * * WILKINSON has since been convicted of contempt of Congress and sentenced to one year in jail. !

'Disputing the non-Communist claim of the organization, the committee finds that a number of other individuals connected with the ECLC also have been identified under oath as Communists. * * * * (Committee on Un-American Activities, Annual Report for 1958, House Report 187, March 9, 1959, pp. 34 and 35.)

"2. To defend the cases of Communist law-breakers, fronts have been devised making special appeals in behalf of civil liberties and reaching out far beyond the confines of the Communist Party itself. Among these organizations are the * * * Emergency Civil Liberties Committee. When the Communist Party itself is under fire these fronts offer a bulwark of protection.' (Internal Security Subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee, Handbook for Americans, S. Doc. 117, April 23, 1956, p. 91.)"

"The New York Times", a New York City daily newspaper, in its April 1, 1968, issue, page 13, contained an item captioned, "Draft Dissenters to Get More Help", which related that at a news conference held by the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee (ECLC) on the previous day, it was announced that the organization was changing its name to the National Emergency Civil Liberties Committee (NECLC) "to reflect our determination to develop a vital national civil liberties organization in all 50 states as rapidly as possible."

A source advised on June 13, 1968, that the NECLC is located at 25 East 26th Street, New York City.

211. This is to recommend that pertinent comments made by Abbott Hoffman, leader of the Youth International Party, at a Chicago press conference held 9/18/68 be furnished to the White House, Secretary of State,

and other interested agencies as well

as to Legats, Bonn and London.

You will recall that at a press conference held by the Youth International Party (composed of hippies and various individuals with subversive backgrounds) in New York City on 9/12/68, it was announced that some members of that group planned to travel to Prague to support the Czech struggle against the Russians.

At his Chicago press conference, Hoffman announced that a group of "yippie-type" people would depart from the U.S. on 9/22/68 to meet with 5,000 "yippie-type" people, including many "rock-type" bands and singers in Elsen, Germany. The purpose is to march to Prague to hold a music festival to confront the Russian "pigs" (police authorities). If group is not permitted to cross the Czech border, they will attempt infiltration in small units for ultimate gathering in Prague to confront Russian police. Hoffman asserted he does not expect any different type of treatment from Russian police than from Chicago police.

Hoffman stated his book, Revolution for the, Hell of It," will be released sometime in October, and that he has been approached by a motion picture concern for making a movie of his life story. However, he indicated he does not plan to work as he is a "passive" revolutionary.

Hoffman described Chicago Mayor Daley's film depicting demonstration activity at the Democratic National Convention as magnificent and exactly what the underground movement wanted. He predicted that the Yippies would continue their activities in the U.S. and would appear at polls on election day to vote for the "pig." He also asserted that "theatrical events" would be used by the Yippies in future demonstrations in opposition to every U.S. candidate for national office.

Hoffman described the American Civil Liberties Union as a "phony publicity-grabbing outfit" which let the "movement" down in Chicago. Yippies legal problems that developed during the Convention activity are now being handled by the Chicago Legal Defense Committee which is securing affidavits from witnesses for use in over \$100,000,000 civil law suits against the City of Chicago and Mayor Daley.

Hoffman was critical of FBI investigations and stated FBI Agents only laughed when he suggested they investigate police brutality. (Not included in Dissemble of MINTERICE)

A MAN AT THE PRESS CONFERENCE WITH HOFFMAN WHO IDENTIFIED HIMSELF AS TED STEIN, CO-CHAIRMAN, CHICAGO LEGAL DEFENSE COMMITTEE, STATED THAT HIS ORGANIZATION IS IN THE PROCESS OF SECURING AFFIDAVITS AND STATEMENTS FROM WITNESSES FOR PREPARING OVER ONE HUNDRED MILLION DOLLARS WORTH CIVIL LAW SUITS AGAINST THE CITY OF CHICAGO AND MAYOR DALEY GROWING OUT OF DEMONSTRATION ACTIVITY AT THE DEMOCRATIC NATIONAL CONVENTION.

Reference New York memorandum dated September 17, 1968, in captioned matter.

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on September 24, 1968, that Abbie Hoffman and Paul Krassner, both of whom are affiliated with the Youth International Party (YIP), and both of whom had speculated on the possibility of making a trip to Prague, Czechoslovakia, on or about September 18, 1968, had been unsuccessful in making this trip.

The source stated that both of these individuals are presently residing in New York City, and that they have no apparent plans which would indicate travel abroad in the immediate future.

The source stated, however, that he has received no information that did travel to Essen, Germany, for the above mentioned music festival.

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On March 6, 1968, a second source with whom there has been insufficient contact to determine the reliability of his information, made available an undated leaflet from the YIP which identifies Abbie Hoffman, Paul Krassner and Ed Sanders as among the coordinators of the YIP.

The April, May, June, 1966 issue of "Rights", a self-described publication of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee (ECLC) reflects that Paul Krassner, editor of "The Realist", was a new member of the ECLC National Council.

A characterization of the ECLC is attached under the heading National Emergency Civil Liberties Committee.

NATIONAL EMERGENCY CIVIL LIBERTIES COMMITTEE, Formerly Known As Emergency Civil Liberties Committee

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications", revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., contains the following concerning the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee:

"Emergency Civil Liberties Committee

"1. 'The Emergency Civil Liberties Committee is an organization with headquarters in New York, whose avowed purpose is to abolish the House Committee on Un-American Activities and discredit the FBI. * * * The committee finds that the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee, established in 1951, although representing itself as a non-Communist group, actually operates as a front for the Communist Party. It has repeatedly assisted, by means of funds and legal aid, Communists involved in Smith Act violations and similar legal proceedings. One of its chief activities has been and still is the dissemination of voluminous Communist propaganda material.

FRANK WILKINSON was called as a witness when he appeared in Atlanta as a representative of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee to propagandize against the Committee on Un-American Activities and to protest its hearings. In 1956 WILKINSON was identified as a Communist Party member by a former FBI undercover agent within the Party. Summoned at that time to answer the allegation, his reply to all questions was, "I am answering no questions of this committee." This also became his stock reply to questions

Disputing the non-Communist claim of the organization, the committee finds that a number of other individuals connected with the ECLC also have been identified under oath as Communists. * * * * (Committee on Un-American Activities, Annual Report for 1958, House Report 187, March 9, 1959, pp. 34 and 35.)

"2. To defend the cases of Communist law-breakers, fronts have been devised making special appeals in behalf of civil liberties and reaching out far beyond the confines of the Communist Party itself. Among these organizations are the * * * Emergency Civil Liberties Committee. When the Communist Party itself is under fire these fronts offer a bulwark of protection. (Internal Security Subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee, Handbook for Americans, S. Doc. 117, April 23, 1956, p. 91.)"

"The New York Times", a New York City daily newspaper, in its April 1, 1968, issue, page 13, contained an item captioned, "Draft Dissenters to Get More Help", which related that at a news conference held by the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee (ECLC) on the previous day, it was announced that the organization was changing its name to the National Emergency Civil Liberties Committee (NECLC) "to reflect our determination to develop a vital national civil liberties organization in all 50 states as rapidly as possible."

A source advised on June 13, 1968, that the NECLC is located at 25 East 26th Street, New York City.

Upon instructions of the Chicago Office many of the Chicago symbolized informants continuously throughout the period of the DNC furnished timely spot reports regarding the movements of various organizations, and these informants were stationed at strategic organization headquarters as instructed by that organization. Consequently these

informants were unable to provide intelligence concerning speeches given at the various rallies at the DNC.

In addition, Chicago informants have not been thoroughly debriefed inasmuch as contacting agents have been utilized full-time for interviews of new left and CP persons as authorized by Bureau teletypedated 9/4/68. These agents knowledgeable as to the activities of these individuals and are most logical agents to interview the persons authorized by the Bureau.

The names of individuals and/or organizations mentioned in LHM on whom subversive characterizations were not included, were searched through Chicago Office indices. This search was negative concerning these individuals and/or organizations or insufficient information was available from which a subversive characterization could be constructed.

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"'Part of the strategy is to make it sould like a blood bath,' Hayden said. $\boldsymbol{\mathcal{U}}$

"'The presence of thousands of police and Army troopers in Chicago will show the increasing bankruptcy, and the reliance on violence instead of persuasion and consensus by American rulers,' he added. μ

"Hayden, who said yesterday that 'tens of thousands' of young people were mobilizing for the protest, give this day-to-day battle plan:

"Aug. 20 to 24--First aid training will be given to protest monitors. They will be given instructions on how to move large numbers of protesters out of 'danger spots.'

"Bases of Operation

"Aug. 24--Forty centers will be opened in churches and storefronts to serve as training and staging areas for peace pickets.

"Aug. 25--Demonstrations will begin on Michigan Ave. in front of the delegates' hotels. (Hayden predicts that this will bring the first of many confrontations with the 7,000 LIllinois national guardsmen assigned to keep order.)

"Aug. 26--Further protest targets will be besieged, including Illinois Institute of Techonology and the University of Chicago.

"Aug. 27--An anti-LBJ birthday party demonstration will take place in front of the convention's amphitheater. Reports are that the demonstrators will bring in a 6-foot birthday cake which, when cut, will release a flock of doves.

"Aug. 28.--A mass vigil will be held outside the convention hall on Chicago's South Side."
