Based on the information you provided, we conducted a main entity record search of the Central Records System (CRS) per our standard search policy. For more information about records searches and the standard search policy, see the enclosed FBI FOIPA Addendum General Information Section.

This is the final release of information responsive to your FOIPA request. This material is being provided to you at no charge.

Duplicate copies of the same document were not processed.

Due to the age and condition of the original documents, some of the reproduced copies are extremely difficult to read. Every effort has been made to obtain the best copies possible.

For your information, a search of the indices to our Central Records System reflected there were additional records potentially responsive to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request. We have attempted to obtain this material so it could be reviewed to determine whether it was responsive to your request. We were advised that the potentially responsive records were not in their expected location and could not be located after a reasonable search. Following a reasonable waiting period, another attempt was made to obtain this material. This search for the missing records also met with unsuccessful results.

A record that may be responsive to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request has been transferred to the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA). FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) **Intelligence Records.** To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that any such records do or do not exist.

Part 2: The standard responses below apply to all requests for records on individuals:

- (i) **Requests for Records about any Individual—Watch Lists.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of any individual's name on a watch list pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(7)(E) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that watch list records do or do not exist.
- (ii) **Requests for Records about any Individual—Witness Security Program Records.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could identify any participant in the Witness Security Program pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(3) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(3), 18 U.S.C. 3521, and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.
- (iii) **Requests for Confidential Informant Records.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of confidential informant records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(7)(D), (b)(7)(E), and (b)(7)(F) [5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(7)(D), (b)(7)(E), and (b)(7)(F)] and Privacy Act exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. § 552a (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records would reveal confidential informant identities and information, expose law enforcement techniques, and endanger the life or physical safety of individuals. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

Part 3: General Information:

- (i) **Record Searches and Standard Search Policy.** The Record/Information Dissemination Section (RIDS) searches for reasonably described records by searching systems, such as the Central Records System (CRS), or locations where responsive records would reasonably be found. The CRS is an extensive system of records consisting of applicant, investigative, intelligence, personnel, administrative, and general files compiled by the FBI per its law enforcement, intelligence, and administrative functions. The CRS spans the entire FBI organization, comprising records of FBI Headquarters, FBI Field Offices, and FBI Legal Attaché Offices (Legats) worldwide; Electronic Surveillance (ELSUR) records are included in the CRS. The standard search policy is a search for main entity records in the CRS. Unless specifically requested, a standard search does not include a search for reference entity records, administrative records of previous FOIPA requests, or civil litigation files.
 - a. *Main Entity Records* – created for individuals or non-individuals who are the subjects or the focus of an investigation
 - b. *Reference Entity Records*- created for individuals or non-individuals who are associated with a case but are not known subjects or the focus of an investigation
- (ii) **FBI Records.** Founded in 1908, the FBI carries out a dual law enforcement and national security mission. As part of this dual mission, the FBI creates and maintains records on various subjects; however, the FBI does not maintain records on every person, subject, or entity.
- (iii) **Foreseeable Harm Standard.** As amended in 2016, the Freedom of Information Act provides that a federal agency may withhold responsive records only if: (1) the agency reasonably foresees that disclosure would harm an interest protected by one of the nine exemptions that FOIA enumerates, or (2) disclosure is prohibited by law (5 United States Code, Section 552(a)(8)(A)(i)). The FBI considers this foreseeable harm standard in the processing of its requests.
- (iv) **Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets.** The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks – often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheet. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative “FBI file.” An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552


- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (d)(5) information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action proceeding;
- (j)(2) material reporting investigative efforts pertaining to the enforcement of criminal law including efforts to prevent, control, or reduce crime or apprehend criminals;
- (k)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to an Executive order in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy, for example, information involving intelligence sources or methods;
- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

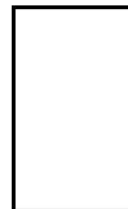

WEEKLY UPDATE September 1, 1989

These items are compiled from a variety of sources, including newspaper articles and white supremacist publications, and not all of them have been confirmed by the Klanwatch staff.

ARSON:

Spokane, Wash. Aug. 23, 1989

[redacted] was arrested for the arson of a suspected crack house. [redacted] allegedly screamed several racial slurs during the incident, including "niggers burn in hell — this is a white man's world." He was charged with first-degree arson, first-degree burglary, misdemeanor assault and malicious racial harassment

ASSAULT:

Vancouver, Wash. Aug. 11, 1989

One white and four black youths were chased several blocks by two white males, believed to be Skinheads, shouting racial epithets. The victims were not identified and no arrests were made.

Portland, Ore. Aug. 28, 1989

Six Skinheads, including three juveniles, were arrested on charges of racial intimidation after an attack on a [redacted]

The victims, who were not named, were not hospitalized. [redacted] were held on \$4,500 bond. The juveniles arrested in the incident were [redacted]

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BOMBING:

San Diego, Calif. August 1989

The office of the *San Diego Jewish Times* in El Cajon, which suffered damage from a firebomb April 22, was firebombed late Aug. 10 or early Aug. 11. Two Molotov cocktails were used in what police believe was an anti-Semitic attack.

Atlanta, Ga. Aug. 21, 1989

A package holding what appeared to be a tear-gas bomb was mailed to the NAACP Southeastern regional headquarters and spewed gas throughout the building, injuring eight people.

New Brunswick, N.J. Aug. 25, 1989

[redacted] were arrested on charges of painting racial slurs and swastikas on the wall of the Jewish student center at Rutgers University. Police say they were members of a loosely based Skinhead and "boot boy" movement.





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Through the course of the investigation various forms of information was developed that led myself and Inv. [redacted] to the suspect [redacted]. Through interviews with [redacted] he indicated that on the night in question he had met up with the other two suspects, [redacted]. After some brief conversation it was decided that [redacted] who was driving or "cruising" at the time with [redacted] in his vehicle, drop off these two persons at Rt.1 and Ryders Ln. This is just a short distance from the Hillel Foundation. At this point of the interview [redacted] maintained a lack of knowledge about what [redacted] did after he dropped them off.

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At this point we proceeded to the residence of [redacted] and interviewed him with the permission [redacted] at the time. While back at Rutgers Police H.Q. [redacted] gave a statement as to his activity on the night in question and implicated [redacted]. With these statements of [redacted] warrants were sworn out against the suspects. It was also at this time that search warrants were approved for the home of [redacted] and the vehicle of [redacted].

The following is a more detailed description of the events in the investigation along with a summary of the statements given by the suspects:

8/25/89; Through prior involvement the undersigned obtained information about certain individuals in the community who claim to be "skinheads" or display the "skinhead" attitude. One of these individuals is a [redacted]. The investigation started with a search for him in order to conduct a field interview about any knowledge he might have about the incident. When we had been initially unsuccessful in locating him we moved to the next person. Again through prior knowledge I knew that an associate of [redacted] was a [redacted]. 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and their activities on the night in question, it was learned from [redacted] that she had overheard some conversation involving [redacted] that he dropped off two persons by the name of [redacted] at the university. The exact conversation was not known. At this point [redacted] was advised of her rights and re-interviewed. Again s he denied any knowledge of this .

We then proceeded to the [redacted]. An interview was conducted with [redacted] there. After being advised of his rights he gave an initial statement about his activities. He had indicated that after spending some time with his girlfriend [redacted] he dropped her off at [redacted] then proceeded home. At this time we re-interviewed [redacted] While there b7C [redacted] had called via the telephone to speak with [redacted] talked with [redacted] At this point she told us that [redacted] wanted to talk with us again about the incident. We then proceeded back to [redacted] There [redacted] agreed to give us a non-written and non-recorded statement about his real activity on the night of 8/23/89.

He told us that after meeting [redacted] they were cruising and ended up on Route 1 near Ryders Ln. He said that once here he was advised to let [redacted] off. [redacted] states that at this time he made a turn around and went to his home. He said he does not know what [redacted] did after he dropped them off.

We learned the address of [redacted] and proceeded to that location. He was at home, and we waited a short time for his father to arrive home from work. With the full cooperation of the father [redacted] agreed to accompany us to police headquarters to discuss the matter. He was followed down by his father. While still in the parking lot of the complex, [redacted] escort pulled abruptly into the lot. It was being operated by a white male with a shaved head.

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After parking, the person exited and started directly for [redacted] who was standing across the lot from myself, Inv. [redacted]. I approached this person believing him to be [redacted]. After identifying myself he stopped and talked with me briefly. He said he was [redacted] and that he just received a telephone call from [redacted] about "some trouble with the prosecutor". He then claimed to have more "knowledge about the law" then [redacted] he had come over to assist him. I told him that [redacted] had agreed to come to police headquarters and give a statement. When asked [redacted] do the same he became very hostile and exclaimed that I would need a warrant to speak with him any further. At this point he left the area.

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Upon arrival at Rutgers Police H.Q. [redacted] was advised of his rights. 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Based on this statement and the earlier statement by [redacted] warrants were signed for [redacted]. In addition a search warrant was issued for the home of [redacted] and the vehicle of [redacted].

At this point teams of detectives proceeded to the various locations to effect the arrests. I was assigned with Inv. [redacted] to go to the residence of [redacted].

Once at the house, [redacted] was found and arrested while in his bedroom. We were permitted entry by an aunt: [redacted]. She directed us to [redacted] after I presented her with the search warrant and arrest warrant. [redacted] was taken into custody without incident and the search warrant executed. Various items were recovered from the bedroom of [redacted] that included "Skinhead" material & supremacist material.

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A copy containing an itemized list of seized property was left at the premises.

Myself and Inv. [redacted] interviewed [redacted] after he requested to speak with us about what his involvement was. After he dropped them off he drove around while they spray painted the building. He said he had knowledge of what was occurring. After awhile he returned to pick them up. 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'Skinheads' indicted in anti-Semitic case

Two North Brunswick men, identified by authorities as members of a white supremacist "skinheads" group, were indicted yesterday by a Middlesex County grand jury on charges of defacing a Rutgers University Jewish student center with anti-Semitic graffiti.

James R. Donato, 18, and Frank Bruno, 19, were accused by the panel in New Brunswick of criminal mischief, placing others in fear of bodily violence and threatening violence by spray-painting slurs on an exterior wall of the student center at the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation on Aug. 23 in New Brunswick.

The two men were arrested two days after the incident, following an investigation by Rutgers police and members of the county prosecutor's office, who charged the defendants defaced

the wall as an expression of their alliance with racist skinheads.

The damage to the building outraged college officials and community leaders. County Prosecutor Alan A. Rockoff claimed the defendants' alleged activities were initiated by their interest in "heavy metal" rock music.

Donato and Bruno have pleaded innocent to the charges.

A 17-year-old boy, who was not identified because of his age, also was charged by authorities in the incident.

Bruno and Donato were among six persons indicted last month by a grand jury in New Brunswick on charges arising from a warehouse fire in New Brunswick that caused more than \$1.5 million in damage last June. The defendants also have pleaded innocent in that case.

Series of Anti-Semitic Incidents Continues in Middlesex County, N.J.

Anti-Semitic incidents continue to plague Middlesex County, N.J.

Last summer, an entire side of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Center on the Rutgers University campus in New Brunswick was smeared with what Assistant State Attorney General James F. Mulvihill called, "gigantic swastikas," and "classic anti-Semitic graffiti."

In September, swastikas, the S.S. insignia of the Nazi special police and epithets were scrawled on a wall of the East Brunswick Jewish Center.

A month later, anonymous advertisements like one stating: "The ovens are in the kitchen. Rope them up. I'm hungry and need a lampshade" appeared in the student newspaper at North Brunswick Township High School. During the Holocaust, the bodies of Jews were burned in ovens and, in some cases, their skin used to make lampshades.

Swastikas on a Library

Last month, four-foot-high swastikas were neatly painted on the public library, two banks and a bar in New Brunswick. And two days later, a three-foot swastika was found on a private home in Carteret.

In all, there were 20 anti-Semitic incidents reported in Middlesex County in 1989, three times the average for New Jersey's 21 counties, according to the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith. Ten of those incidents occurred on the Rutgers campus.

Middlesex, which curves west and south of Staten Island, has a population of 596,000. By comparison, New Jersey has about 7.7 million people in all and reported 154 incidents in 1989. And in New York State, which has a population of about 17.5 million, there were 328 incidents.

Mr. Mulvihill said the Anti-Defamation League's statistics "sound reasonable."

Still, as incessant as the incidents seem to be, Jeffrey Maas, the New Jersey regional director of the league, said he does not believe the Nazis "are on the barricades in Middlesex County." He added, "I don't think Middlesex is any worse than Essex, Bergen or Atlantic Counties."

Special Factors

Two factors seem to highlight the problem in Middlesex. One is the presence of a county prosecutor, Alan A. Rockoff, who has placed a high priority on the reporting and prosecution of bias-related crimes. The other is the presence of Rutgers, where half of the reported incidents took place.

Experts were at a loss to explain why Rutgers draws anti-Semitic activity. The school's assistant vice president for student affairs, William Burns, said, "We've been the target of certain kids in the community who are not college students, coming on campus."

Four members of a so-called skinhead gang have been charged with desecrating the Hillel building and are awaiting trial.

But Rabbi Norman Weitzner, director of the Rutgers Hillel Foundation, said, "Those are not the ones going into the bathrooms and writing obscene statements about other people's faith or color."

Mr. Burns concurred, saying, "I don't mean to say there aren't people on campus, students or janitors or others" involved in the incidents.

Dr. George Pieczenik, a biochemistry professor who has been active in

battling the problem at Rutgers, said "there's a lot of administrative denial of the religious and racial prejudice of campus, and a fear and ignorance of how to address it." He added, "I know students who have no comprehension of what it is to be a Nazi."

Examining Attitudes

Mr. Burns insisted that the university is addressing the problem with "curricular reform, grant programs for students to create activities which they think raise the level of consciousness about these issues."

In North Brunswick Township, where the anti-Semitic ads appeared in

the school newspaper last October, residents say that the community was and is examining its attitudes about bigotry. Even before the ads appeared, a meeting had been planned to explore race and ethnic relations, and a day of workshops in human relations was held to sensitize school employees to the problem.

Harvey Paretzky, director of the Jewish Community Relations Council of the Jewish Federation of Middlesex, said discussions are under way toward creating a county human rights commission.

On Dec. 6, Gov. Jim Florio told a gathering in the Hillel center at Rut-

gers: "The ugly words and symbols are gone now, but the hurt remains. It would be nice to be able to say this was an isolated incident, an aberration, in an otherwise happy world. But that isn't the case.

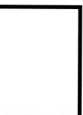
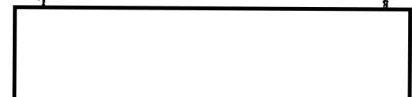
"If we just sit and watch, who will stand up for us when it is our turn to be the victim? And that time surely will come, if the seemingly isolated brushfires of hatred are allowed to burn, unchecked."

The Memories Remain

Twelve days ago, Mayor John A. Lynch of New Brunswick stood on the steps of the defaced public library and said: "Men and women of good will must dedicate themselves to help assure human rights and human dignity for everyone, everywhere. And right

here is a good place to start."

Charles Kornitzer, a 67-year-old resident of Edison Township, knows what happened after the first swastikas appeared on the walls of Budapest, well before the Nazis occupied Hungary in 1944.

Mr. Kornitzer was one of the few to survive the slave-labor battalions — hundreds of people, starving, freezing, forced to dig trenches as the Russian tanks advanced, force-marched until they dropped from exhaustion, then shot through the head on the spot. "I am convinced," he said, "that the majority of people do not understand the Holocaust."

Every time there is another incident, Mr. Kornitzer feels a jolt of dread. "I shudder," he said. "What consequences these things can lead to?"

Indiana University has been the target of vandalism, in which Nazi swastikas have been painted on different buildings. The letter from the New Order, Indianapolis, Indiana, shows a Post Office Box which was rented by [redacted] white male, born [redacted]

Begin's Bloodsoaked Past...

Begin has never made any effort to conceal his past. All of the crimes listed below are a matter of public record.

1913 – Menachem Begin born in Brest-Litovsk, Poland (now U.S.S.R.).

1939 – Flees to Soviet Union. Serves in Polish unit of the Red Army.

1942 – Soviets, for unexplained reasons of their own, allow Begin to leave for Palestine, where he joins the British army for rear-echelon duties.

1944 – Deserts the British army and joins the Zionist terrorist group called Irgun Zvai Leumi, which he soon heads. Plans and executes the follow atrocities, among others:

1946 – April 25: Murders several sleeping British soldiers in a military car-park in Tel Aviv.

July 22: The King David Hotel is dynamited. Some 97 nurses, soldiers and Arab civilians are killed, and over 100 are maimed or seriously injured; many are crippled or blinded.

December: Kidnaps and tortures three British sergeants.

1947 – March 1: Plants bomb in officers club in Jerusalem. Ten killed.

April 18: Bombs army hospital.

April 20: Bombs Red Cross hospital.

July 12: Kidnaps and torture-murders by slow strangulation with wire two 19-year old British soldiers (Mervyn Paice and Clifford Martin). Their bodies are then booby-trapped.

September 26: Guns down four police officers during the robbery of Barclay's Bank in Tel Aviv.

1948 – February: Murders three wounded police officers in their hospital beds in Jerusalem.

April 10: The Deir Yassin Massacre. Begin organizes a raid on the Arab village of Deir Yassin. Some 254 peaceful, unarmed villagers are murdered in an act of deliberate terror aimed at driving Palestinian Arabs out of their homeland. The victims include 25 pregnant women with their bellies ripped open, 52 mothers with young children and 60 other women and girls. The Red Cross finds 150 of the bodies stuffed down a well.

1977 – Menachem Begin is appointed Prime Minister of Israel and is invited by President Jimmy Carter to the White House as an honored guest.

1982 – At the height of an unprovoked Israeli invasion of Lebanon, Begin is again received as an honored guest at the White House, this time by President Ronald Reagan. The Israeli holocaust in Lebanon, which Begin ordered, resulted in 20,000 civilian deaths and 60,000 serious injuries, as well as leaving 750,000 people homeless.

But perhaps it is only fitting that this monster should become prime minister of a country which, among other atrocities, uses Arab children for slave labor, has had its air force shoot down an unarmed Libyan commercial airliner (killing 109 civilians), and has attacked an unarmed American naval vessel (the U.S.S. Liberty) killing 34 American sailors and wounding 171 others.

Result of examination:

The submitted specimens were searched in the appropriate sections of the Anonymous Letter File without effecting an identification. Representative photographs of these specimens will be added to this file for future comparison purposes.

Due to the limited amount of sufficiently comparable known handwriting and the presence of handwriting variations, no conclusion was reached whether the questioned writing on specimens Q5 and Q6 was or was not prepared by [REDACTED] whose known writing is designated K1. However, nothing of particular significance was observed.

It was determined that the questioned typewriting on specimens Q1, Q3, Q4, Q7, Q8, Q9 and Qc10 was not typed on the typewriter used to prepare specimen K2.

It was further concluded that the questioned typewriting appearing on specimens Q1, Q3, Q4, Q9 and Qc10 is a pica style of type having a horizontal spacing of 2.50mm per character. From such comparisons that could be made, this style of type corresponds to a style of type which can be found on several brands of typewriters. Although these questioned typewritings could not be positively identified as being all prepared on the same typewriter, some printing characteristics were noted which indicate this typewriting may have been prepared on the same typewriter.

Additionally, the questioned typewriting on specimens Q7 and Q8 is an elite style of type having a horizontal spacing of 2.12mm per character. From such comparisons that could be made, this type style most closely corresponds to a Laboratory standard for an L. C. Smith style of type which was introduced in 1933. Although these questioned typewritings could not be positively identified as being all prepared on the same typewriter, some printing characteristics were noted which indicate this typewriting may have been prepared on the same typewriter.

Due to the lack of sufficient characteristic defects and/or the limited nature, it is doubtful if the questioned typewriting on specimens Q1, Q3, Q4, Q7, Q8, Q9 and Qc10 can ever be identified with a particular typewriter(s), if located.

The Qc10 photocopy contains characteristics indicating it was produced on a Savin machine. This machine utilizes plain untreated paper and the indirect electrostatic photocopying process.

No watermarks or indented writing of value were located on specimens Q1 through Qc10 which would identify the immediate source of these items.

If a future handwriting examination is requested, it is suggested that numerous repetitions of the questioned writings be obtained on blank envelopes and paper of the same approximate size as the questioned specimens. These exemplars should be in the exact wording and format as the questioned writings. Additionally, undictated specimens of a suspect's writing prepared around the time of the questioned entries would be of value.

The submitted specimens have been photographed and specimens K1 and K2 are returned herewith. The remaining submissions will be returned with the results of the requested latent fingerprint examination. Photographs are retained.

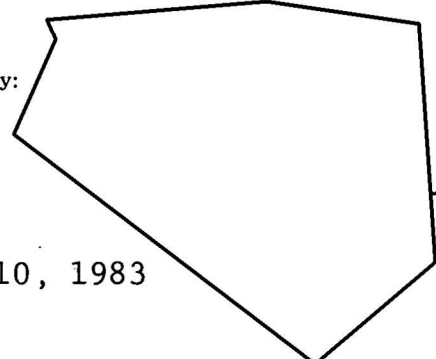

Result of Examination

① The submitted specimens were searched in the appropriate sections of the ALF w/o effecting an identification. Representative photos of these specimens will be added to this file for future comparison purposes.

② Due to the limited amount of sufficiently comparable known H.W. and the presence of handwriting variations, no conclusion was reached whether the questioned writing on Spec's Q5 and Q6 was or was not prepared by whose known writing is designated K1. However, nothing of particular significance was observed.

③ IT was determined that the questioned T.W. on specimens Q1, Q3, Q4, Q7, Q8, Q9 and Q10 was not typed on the T.W. used to prepare specimen K2.

④ The Q10 photocopy contains characteristics indicating it was produced on a SAVIN machine. This machine utilizes plain untreated paper and the indirect electrostatic photocopying process.
 From such comparisons could be made, this style of type corresponds to a style of type which can be found in several brands of typewriters.

④ IT was further concluded that the questioned T.W. appearing on specimens Q1, Q3, Q4, Q9 and Q10 is a pica style of type having a horizontal spacing of 2.50 mm per character. Although these questioned typewritings could not be positively identified as being all prepared on the same T.W., some printing characteristics were noted which indicate the typewriting may have been prepared on the same T.W.

⑤ Additionally, the questioned T.W. on specimens Q7 and Q8 is an elite style of type having a horizontal spacing of 2.12 mm per character. *See above*

⑥ No W/M's or indented writing of value were located on spec's Q1 - Q10 which would identify the immediate source of these items and/or the limited nature

⑥ Due to the lack of sufficient characteristics when defects, it is doubtful if the questioned T.W. on specimens Q1, Q3, Q4, Q7, Q8, Q9 and Q10 can ever be identified with a particular typewriter (S). It is noted.

From such comparisons that could be made, this style of type corresponds to a laterally standard for m.c. S.M.73 style of type which was introduced in 1933.

If a future H or exam is requested, it is suggested that numerous repetitions of the questioned writings be obtained on blank envelopes and paper of the same approx size as the questioned specimens. These exemplars should be in the exact wording and format as the questioned writings. Additionally, dictated specimens of a suspect's writing prepared around the time of the questioned entries would be of value.

IN REFERENCED TELCALLS, INDIANAPOLIS ADVISED THAT POSSIBLE SUSPECTS IN CAPTIONED MATTER ARE MEMBERS OF THE "NEW ORDER," FORMERLY THE NATIONAL SOCIALIST WHITE PEOPLES PARTY (NSWPP), ALTHOUGH ADDITIONAL TIME IS NEEDED TO SUPPORT OR ELIMINATE THIS THEORY. IN ADDITION, THE "NEW ORDER" CHAPTER IN THE INDIANAPOLIS AREA WAS BEING ASSESSED AS TO SIZE, STRENGTH, AND POTENTIAL OR ACTUAL THREAT. Initiation of full investigation:

On July 25, 1983, a letter was sent to the Jewish Community Center, Bloomington, Indiana, postmarked Bloomington, Indiana. The letter enclosed a business card from the New Order, National Headquarters, 2507 North Franklin Road, Arlington, Virginia, Telephone Number 703-276-1776. The letter stated in part, "The pendulum is swinging back. . ." and ". . .the FUTURE BELONGS TO US! Heil Hitler!"

On August 15, 1983, at 9:38 PM, Central Standard Time, a fire was reported at the Jewish Community Center, Bloomington, Indiana. On August 16, 1983, Detective [redacted] Bloomington Police Department advised the fire at the Jewish Community Center had been determined to be arson and a fire trail led from the alter, down the aisle, to the exit. In addition, the Jewish Center on the Indiana University campus, Bloomington, Indiana, received three similar letters to the one received by the Jewish Community Center. One of these letters contained a business card from the New Order at Arlington, Virginia, and on the reverse side had stamped the New Order, Post Office Box 29271, Indianapolis, Indiana. This Post Office box was rented by [redacted] a white male, [redacted] a known Nazi sympathizer and [redacted]. These letters also contained literature from the National Socialist White Peoples Party, Arlington, Virginia, and the National Socialist Association of Indiana.

On October 28, 1983, a letter was sent to the Jewish Studies
Program office at Indiana University in Bloomington, Indiana, from
the National Socialist Association of Indiana, Indianapolis, Indiana,
containing literature from the New Order, Arlington, Virginia, and
the New Order, Indianapolis, Indiana. All letters have been post-
marked in Bloomington or Columbus, Indiana.

From August, 1983, through October, 1983, Indiana University
buildings have been the target of vandalism in which Nazi swastikas
have been spray painted on several buildings, projection screens,
and carpets. Damage to the Indiana University buildings and the
Jewish Community Center is already in the thousands of dollars.

While no arsons have occurred to buildings on the Indiana
University campus, the Jewish groups and the Indiana University
Police Department fear this is imminent. While the letters have
all been postmarked in Indiana, one Nazi sympathizer who has been
involved in a Nazi flag-waving incident in Bloomington, has been
located in Colorado.

A full investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation will
identify sympathizers to the New Order and National Socialist Association
of Indiana, and through interview, surveillance, and other investigative
techniques, determine if they are responsible for the letter-writing,
vandalism, and arson. The objective of this investigation is to
determine if any members of the Jewish community have had their civil
rights violated and if these incidents are part of an interstate
conspiracy.

In October, 1975, it was determined that the New Order was published by the National Socialist party of America (NSPA). It was published on an irregular basis and was distributed in the Chicago, Illinois area via direct sales, handouts, as well as mail subscriptions. The New Order allegedly adhered to the principle of hatred and abuse for Jews, Blacks, and Communists. It further advocated a similar movement to that of Adolph Hitler. The Chicago NSPA is a splinter group of the National Socialist White Peoples Party, headquartered in Arlington, Virginia.

The Jewish Community Center, Bloomington, Indiana, received a letter on July 25, 1983 in which was enclosed a business card from the New Order, National Headquarters, 2507 N. Franklin Road, Arlington, Virginia, (703) 276-1776. The letter stated in part, "The pendulum is swinging back and the future belongs to us. Heil Hitler." On August 15, 1983, a fire was reported at the Jewish Community Center. An investigation determined the cause to be arson as a fire trail led from the altar, down the aisle, to the exit.

Two letters similar to the one described previously were received at the Jewish Center located on the campus of Indiana University, Bloomington, Indiana. One of the letters contained a business card from the New Order, Arlington, Virginia on which the reverse side was stamped, "New Order, P.O. Box 29271, Indianapolis, Indiana". In addition, a letter was sent to the Jewish Studies Program Office at Indiana University from the National Socialist Association of Indiana. The letter contained literature from the New Order in Arlington, Virginia and Indianapolis, Indiana. During the period August, 1983 through October, 1983, the University of Indiana has been the target of vandalism in which NAZI swastikas have been spray painted on several buildings, projection screens, and carpets. Damage to the University of Indiana and the Jewish Community Center is in the tens of thousands of dollars.

Investigation in Columbus, Ohio regarding the above fire and vandalism has determined that the New Order is the current name for the National Socialist White Peoples Party and the NAZI Party.

U.S. Person #1 (USP #1) was contacted on February 8, 1984 regarding USP #2, an individual who used to work under USP #1's supervision. USP #1 advised that on January 11, 1984 when USP #2 returned to the office after making outside deliveries, USP #1 noticed a white piece of paper sticking out of USP #2's shirt pocket. It appeared that the paper had a swastika on it. USP #1 pulled the paper out of the pocket, noticed that it was in fact emblazoned with a swastika, whereupon USP #1 exclaimed, "Oh, so you're a NAZI". USP #2 became visibly upset and left the office without speaking. Shortly thereafter, USP #2 returned and advised USP #1 that he had made a telephone call to his organization and was ordered by the organization to quit his job. The organization did not want employers to know who its members were. USP #2 did quit, but before leaving he left business cards on several desks in the office. The card read, "New Order The future belongs to us! National Headquarters, 2507 N. Franklin Road, Arlington, Virginia, 22201, U.S.A. Business phone: (703) 276-1776 Recorded message: (703) 527-1069."

Remember the Liberty?

Many Americans today remember the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, although that attack took place nearly four decades ago. Likewise, most Americans remember the Alamo, even though that battle took place in 1836.

But how many Americans remember the attack made on the *U.S.S. Liberty*? This is an especially interesting question, because unlike the attacks on Pearl Harbor and the Alamo, the attack on the *Liberty* took place only a few short years ago. And also—unlike Pearl Harbor and the Alamo—this attack was not made by a country at war with the United States, but one that is supposedly our ally!

Remember the Liberty!

On June 8, 1967, the *U.S.S. Liberty*, an unarmed, clearly marked communications vessel stationed in the Mediterranean Sea, was savagely attacked without warning in an unprovoked assault by Israeli jet fighters and torpedo boats. Thirty-four U.S. servicemen died in the attack, and another 171 were wounded.

The *Liberty's* mission was to monitor the fighting going on between Israel and its Arab neighbors, which were then at war. Specifically, the *Liberty's* task was to report any evidence picked up by its sophisticated electronic gear as to whether or not Israel was planning to use its nuclear arsenal against the Arabs. The Israelis were not about to have the United States interfere with their use of atomic weapons, no matter what the consequences might be—and so they ordered that the *Liberty* be put out of commission.

Despite the murder of 34 American fighting men, the System which governs this country has continued to give roughly \$2 billion a year in military aid to the very ones who butchered our men in an unprovoked act of blatant, premeditated aggression.

We demand that the Israeli murderers be brought to justice, and that those members of the U.S. government who have aided and abetted this outrage by their silence and complicity be punished also.

New Evidence Shows Israel's Attack on USS Liberty Far More Vicious Than Thought

STARTLING NEW EVIDENCE about the 1967 Israeli attack on the American naval vessel, the USS *Liberty*, has been brought to light in a just-released Random House book, *Assault On The Liberty*, by James M. Ennes, Jr.

Ennes was on the bridge of the *Liberty* during much of the assault. He was commissioned an ensign in 1962, and from 1965 until he retired from the Navy, he was assigned to cryptologic duties.

The *Liberty*, which was attacked in international waters off the Sinai Peninsula, was initially attacked by Israeli high performance jets. Those attacks were followed by torpedo boats armed to kill. The attack lasted for two hours, killing 34 Americans and wounding 171 others. When the *Liberty* failed to sink quickly, Israeli forces machine-gunned her life rafts and sent in troop-carrying helicopters.

Once the US Sixth Fleet rescue aircraft were on their way, the Israelis quickly apologized, claiming that her forces had mistaken the ship for an Egyptian freighter. The US government quietly accepted the excuse. But Ennes produces strong evidence to support the following new allegations:

- Pre-attack reconnaissance was more intense than the government has admitted: at least 13 orbits of the ship were made by reconnaissance aircraft before the attack, some only 200 feet overhead.

(The government claims that only three significant reconnaissance flights were made, and that only one aircraft came within five miles of the ship.)

- The identification of the ship was known to the Israeli War Room several hours before the attack, and its position plotted on a chart.

(An Israeli aircraft was heard before the attack informing its headquarters by radio that the ship flew an American flag. Bowing to the Israeli request to keep cir-

cumstances of the attack secret, however, the American government states publicly that the *Liberty* was not identified until after the attack.)

- Three days before the attack, USS *Liberty* requested the Sixth Fleet to send an armed destroyer to provide protection against attack.

(The Sixth Fleet's commander assured the *Liberty* that she was operating in a safe area, promising immediate support in the "unlikely" event it might be needed—and denying the ship's request for special protection.)

- Although the Sixth Fleet promised air support within 10 minutes of any request, the US Navy failed to protect the ship during the attack.

(The *Liberty* pleaded over the radio for assistance for more than two hours, but the Sixth Fleet—because of White House intervention and Sixth Fleet unpreparedness—failed to come to her aid.)

- Israel's explanation for the attack contradicts known facts and evidence, but was accepted without question by the American government.

(Israel claims that the *Liberty* was mistaken for the small Egyptian freighter *El Arish*, even though Israel and the US were both aware that *El Arish* was far from the area. Israel also claims that the attack occurred because Israeli motor torpedo boats falsely identified *Liberty* as an enemy vessel after erroneously tracking the ship by radar at 30 knots—although she was only moving at five knots—and subsequently called in the air strike. The strike, which in fact was called before the torpedo boats were within radar range of the *Liberty*, was organized by forces ashore.)

- A cover-up of the circumstances of the attack was ordered by President Johnson. (The President was concerned with negotiating a peace treaty in the Middle East and could ill afford a confrontation with Israel;

he thus accepted Israel's flimsy explanation, failed to investigate the attack properly, and ordered a cover-up of the circumstances that were already known.)

- *Liberty* sailors were forbidden any unsupervised contact with the press, even after the "news lid" was lifted.

(Crewmen were not allowed to talk with reporters until after a Court of Inquiry report was published. Even then, however, sailors were permitted to repeat only the official version of the attack and only in the same words the Court had used. The few interviews that were authorized were carefully supervised and rehearsed.)

- Testimony to the Court of Inquiry revealed that the attack was probably deliberate, but all such evidence was withheld from the public.

(*Liberty* officers and crewman told the Court of Inquiry of extensive low-level pre-attack reconnaissance, of the ship's American flag clearly displayed and of a prolonged and carefully orchestrated attack. All such details were ignored or classified Top Secret in order to support the government's contention that the

attack was a mistake.)

- The American public was given a distorted version of the attack.

(The public was told that the air attack lasted five or six minutes; the ship's officers recall—and testified—that it lasted 20 or 25 minutes. The US claims that the attack ended with the torpedo explosion, while in fact torpedo boats fired on the ship's life rafts 40 minutes after that explosion—and fired on the crew in the interim. The fact that Israeli forces repeatedly used napalm against the crew was never made known. Moreover, although the government claims that the ship was never in danger of sinking, officers recall that "scuttle ship," "demolish ship" and "prepare to abandon ship" orders were given.)

It is noted that KOEHL had been the National Commander of NATIONAL SOCIALIST WHITE PEOPLES PARTY.

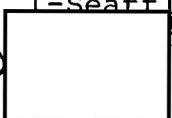

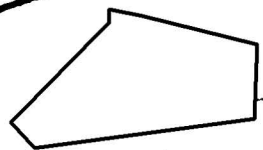

The Alexandria, Virginia Office of the FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION had initiated a preliminary investigation of the NEW ORDER, Post Office Box 88, Arlington, Virginia 22210, telephone 703-276-1776, to determine the scope of this groups' activity and their propensity for organized violent activity in the United States. The NEW ORDER also had offices at 2507 North Franklin Street, Arlington, Virginia.

It is noted that the NEW ORDER, also known as the WORLD UNION OF NATIONAL SOCIALISTS had previously been known as the National Socialist White People's Party (NSWPP) and had changed their name during December, 1982, to the New Order ostensibly to encourage wider support for the group. The organization was founded by GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL in 1956, and has been headquartered in Arlington, Virginia, since that time. The 2507 North Franklin Street, Arlington, Virginia address has been the headquarters of the group since before 1969, however, as of December, 1982, the group had been discussing moving the headquarters to the Mid West where they can generate more support.

Investigation with the CHESAPEAKE AND POTOMAC TELEPHONE COMPANY in Northern, Virginia, determined that telephone number 703-276-1776, has been disconnected.

On 1/28/86, the Postal Inspectors Office in Northern Virginia, advised that Post Office Box 88, Arlington, Virginia 22210, was closed on 12/10/85, with mail being forwarded to Post Office Box 27486, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53227. The box had previously been listed to the World Union of National Socialists (the NEW ORDER) with the names MATT KOEHL and [redacted] associated with the box.

It is noted that MATT KOEHL had been the National Commander of the NSWPP.
