### **FBI FOIPA Addendum**

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

### Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) Intelligence Records. To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that any such records do or do not exist.

### Part 2: The standard responses below apply to all requests for records on individuals:

- (i) **Requests for Records about any Individual—Watch Lists.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of any individual's name on a watch list pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(7)(E) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that watch list records do or do not exist.
- (ii) Requests for Records about any Individual—Witness Security Program Records. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could identify any participant in the Witness Security Program pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(3) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(3), 18 U.S.C. 3521, and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.
- (iii) Requests for Confidential Informant Records. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of confidential informant records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(7)(D), (b)(7)(E), and (b)(7)(F) [5 U.S.C.§ § 552 (b)(7)(D), (b)(7)(E), and (b)(7)(F)] and Privacy Act exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C.§ 552a (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records would reveal confidential informant identities and information, expose law enforcement techniques, and endanger the life or physical safety of individuals. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

### Part 3: General Information:

- (i) Record Searches and Standard Search Policy. The Record/Information Dissemination Section (RIDS) searches for reasonably described records by searching systems, such as the Central Records System (CRS), or locations where responsive records would reasonably be found. The CRS is an extensive system of records consisting of applicant, investigative, intelligence, personnel, administrative, and general files compiled by the FBI per its law enforcement, intelligence, and administrative functions. The CRS spans the entire FBI organization, comprising records of FBI Headquarters, FBI Field Offices, and FBI Legal Attaché Offices (Legats) worldwide; Electronic Surveillance (ELSUR) records are included in the CRS. The standard search policy is a search for main entity records in the CRS. Unless specifically requested, a standard search does not include a search for reference entity records, administrative records of previous FOIPA requests, or civil litigation files.
  - a. *Main Entity Records* created for individuals or non-individuals who are the subjects or the focus of an investigation
  - b. Reference Entity Records- created for individuals or non-individuals who are associated with a case but are not known subjects or the focus of an investigation
- (ii) **FBI Records.** Founded in 1908, the FBI carries out a dual law enforcement and national security mission. As part of this dual mission, the FBI creates and maintains records on various subjects; however, the FBI does not maintain records on every person, subject, or entity.
- (iii) **Foreseeable Harm Standard.** As amended in 2016, the Freedom of Information Act provides that a federal agency may withhold responsive records only if: (1) the agency reasonably foresees that disclosure would harm an interest protected by one of the nine exemptions that FOIA enumerates, or (2) disclosure is prohibited by law (5 United States Code, Section 552(a)(8)(A)(i)). The FBI considers this foreseeable harm standard in the processing of its requests.
- (iv) Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets. The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheet. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative "FBI file." An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. For a fee, individuals can request a copy of their Identity History Summary Check. ### **EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS**

### SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual:
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

### SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552a

- (d)(5) information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action proceeding;
- (j)(2) material reporting investigative efforts pertaining to the enforcement of criminal law including efforts to prevent, control, or reduce crime or apprehend criminals;
- (k)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to an Executive order in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy, for example, information involving intelligence sources or methods;
- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence:
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

5/27/77 VESTIGATIVE DIVISION Attached sets forth allegations made by to Shirley Chisholm, former Member of Congress. | was interviewed under oath claiming that during August and September, 1976, he was sent by Chisholm to New York to actively organize a primary campaign. He claimed his salary was substantially increased for the months of August and September and subsequently lowered again. He claimed that the increase was to take care of expenses in connection with campaign activities. also claimed that other staff members of Chisholm had received raises and that Chisholm's asked the b6 b7C staff members to pay back the increases to her so that depleted stationery funds could be replemished. This, he claims, was an apparent kickback arrangement. was dismissed from Chisholm's staff in February, 1977, for incompetence and he filed a job discrimination claim against Chisholm, however, his claim may have been dismissed before the House Employment Practices Committee. In this connection, attached is a newspaper article relating to this matter which appeared in the 5/26/77 issue of "The Washington Star". In view of the allegations concerning the kickback arrangement, AUSA Ogren requested FBI investigation to determine strength of allegations made by He indicated that the campaign fund issue will not be a subject of FBI investigation but if substantiated during the course of the investigation, it may be brought to the attention of the appropriate Congressional ethics committee. WFO indicated that unless advised to the contrary by the Bureau, appropriate interviews of key staff personnel in the office of Chisholm will be conducted at the outset of the investigation. Subsequently, an LHM will be prepared for dissemination if initial investigation warrants, setting forth facts

The complaint was dismissed by the House Fair Employment Practices Committee. It was formed primarily to hear discrimination charges brought by women, blacks and other minorities.

Investigation of this matter did not disclose any evidence whatsoever to substantiate allegations made by the complainant.

On January 31, 1978, Assistant United States Attorney Robert G. Ogren, Chief, Fraud Unit, United States Attorney's Office, Washington, D. C., opined that neither further investigation nor Rederal prosecutive action is deemed appropriate.

Complainant in the matter appears to have been terminated from his employment, as a staff member with Ms. Chisholm, due to his incompetence in his position and a change of responsibility of Ms. Chisholm on certain Congressional committees.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

# Chisholm is accused of misusing Congress

During her campaign for reelection last year Rep. Shirley Chisholm (D-B'klyn) used congressional funds to give temporary pay raises to three campaign staff aides, the Washington Post said today.

The raises were rescinded after the campaign. House rules forbid using appropriated funds for such work. Mrs. Chisholm's chief assistant, Carolyn J. Smith, conceded that the pay increases had been made. But she denied they were given as payment for campaign work.

She said the three staff members received the increases because they were doing extra congressional work which coincided in time with the campaign.

### SOURCE OF CHARGES

Miss Smith and Colleen O'Connor, Mrs. Chisholm's press secretary, said the charges were made by a former staff member, O'Dell Lewis, who was dropped for incompetence.

Miss O'Connor sald Lewis was "angry and embittered and is striking back." Neither Mrs. Chisholm nor

Neither Mrs. Chisholm nor Lewis could be reached for comment.

The aides whose salaries were raised were Lewis, Miss O'Connor and grant specialist

Helen Butter.
Miss Smith said the pay

Miss Smith said the pay boosts were to compensate for workloads which increased coincidentally during last summer's tough primary fight with City Councilman Samuel Wright.

The boosts were for extra Congressional work, she said, and extra Congressional work only.

### JOB CLAIM

Miss Smith also said that after being 'dropped in a "staff retrenchment" last February, Lewis filed a job discrimination claim against Mrs. Chisholm.

Mrs. Chisholm.

'Hearings before the House Employment Practices Committee ended yesterday, according to Miss Smith, and Lewis' allegation was dismissed. "He then went right out and gave out this story—it's ridiculous," she said.

Lewis had been hired as a legislative aide while the Congresswoman was a member of the House Education and Labor Committee, said Miss O'Connor.

When Mrs. Chisholm moved to the Rules Committee this year, she found his experience was no longer "appropriate," Miss O'Connor said.

 Because of that, Miss O'Connor said he had been moved from legislative duties to "community work" in Mrs. Chisholm's Brooklyn office last year, and the \$1600 per year raise was "to accommodate his family's move."

Any campaign work he did, said Miss Smith, was during "off-hours" and paid for from campaign funds.

"In my case I did nothing in the campaign," said Miss O'Connor, who confirmed that her annual salary rate went from \$14,833 before the election to \$17,083 during the campaign, then to \$16,722 afterward.

"In that time I was working 60 hours a week. "The pace of the office stepped up tremendously. But it doesn't mean I was doing campaign-related work.

"You know how hot that race was with Sam Wright," Miss O'Connor went on. "Some days I did nothing but answer the phone. But during the whole campaign I never went to Brooklyn once."

Lewis told the Washington Post that his pay, at an annual rate of \$17,296 before and after the election, rose to \$18,872 in August and September, when he was working in New York and campaigning in the primary.

# Rep. Chisholm Defends Raises to Aides

By Warren Brown Washington Post Staff Writer

Rep. Shirley Chisholm (D-N.Y.) gave emporary pay raises from congresonal funds to three staff aides who worked for her re-election last year. The raises were rescinded after the impaign work ended.

House rules forbid the use of approriated funds to pay for campaign ork. Chisholm's top staff aide, Caron J. Smith, denies the raises were ven specifically for that reason.

Instead, Smith said the pay was ested to compensate staff aides hose office workloads coincidentally creased during last year's campaign. It raises were for extra congressional was and extra congressional rk on the said.

However, Smith's contention is disted by O'Dell Lewis, who was dropi from Chisholm's staff last Febiry because of what the congressman called a "staff retrenchment."
wis claims his temporary raise—
m an annual rate of \$17,296.95 to
.872.14—was given to cover his
enses for campaigning for Chis-

holm during the New York Democratic primary last summer.

Lewis said he originally was supposed to be paid for his campaign expenses through cash advances drawn from the Chisholm campaign fund. But such advances were not available during the months of August and September when he campaigned for Chisholm in Brooklyn, he said.

"So Carolyn Smith said she would have to raise my salary to cover my expenses . . . I wasn't sure about doing that at first because I would have to pay taxes on the pay increase. But she said she would work it out," Lewis said.

Lewis said he paid the taxes. His salary dropped back to the annual pay rate of \$17,296 after he completed his campaign work, according to House payroll records.

Smith acknowledged she raised Lewis' House salary while he was working in Brooklyn. But she denies the raise was given to cover his campaign expenses.

"While he was up there in Brooklyn, he carried on congressional work in the Brooklyn office," she said. The was only supposed to be involved in campaign work on off-hours. I only increased his salary twice because he had a heavy workload," she said. Smith said Lewis was reimbursed from campaign funds for campaign-related expenses.

However, according to Federal Election Commission records, the only campaign fund reimbursement Lewis received was \$175 for setting up a breakfast meeting of Chisholm supporters.

Other Chisholm staffers whose salaries were raised during the compaign and reduced afterward are Helen C. Butler, a grant specialist, and the congresswoman's press secretary, Colleen A. O'Connor.

Butler's annual pay rate went from \$15,135.46 before the campaign to \$18,991.36 during the campaign and dropped to \$16,000 afterwards. O'Connor's annual pay rate went from \$14,833.34 before the election to \$17,083.86 during the campaign and dropped to \$16,772.80 afterwards, according to House records.

Smith said neither Butler nor O'Connor went to New York specifically to campaign. Instead, both spent much time in Washington "digging up information to answer charges" brought by Chisholm's primary opponent, New York City Councilman Samuel D. Wright, she said.

"Our opposition was trying to say that Mrs. Chisholm was not bringing [federal] money into the community," Smith said. "To disprove those, charges. we had to dig. Helen Butler is Mrs. Chisholm's grant specialist. Sha was in and out of HEW and HUD, working nights, sometimes to midnight digging up information. Mrs. Chisholm felt she deserved something extra for her work," Smith said.

O'Connor worked in a similar capacity and was given a raise in compensation for her efforts, Smith said, insisting that the raises were proper.

"They weren't out there knocking on doors and meeting people and doing that kind of thing," she said, "They just had extra work to do. Everybody has extra work to do during campaign time," she said.

Taken during the first three weeks of May, the poll reflects the views of 17,000 members selected from 850,000 names. Every fiftieth name was chosen from a computerized list.





LOS ANGELES---It was disclosed today that Rep. Shirley Chisholm (D-N.Y.) was committed to a private home for the mentally ill from Feb. 1951 until April 1952 near Hampton, Virginia at the Southern-Rest Nursing Home. At that time she was disgnoised as a hebephrenic schizophrenic. She was committed only after being detained by the authorities in Richmond, Virginia as a transvestite in men's clothing and being hostile and aggressive to local citizens. The attending physician at her commitment, Dr. Robert J. Swanson wrote that Rep. Chisolm , "makes facial grimaces, talks and gesters to herself, exhibits inexplicable laughter and weeping, and at times has an abnormal interest in urine and feces which she smears on walls and herself."

Since her discharge she has been and is currently under periodic psychiatio consultations in Washington, D.C. and New York City. She has not been committed to any institution since 1952.

The voters of the nation should be aware of a candidates full record and background so an intelligent and meaningful choice can be made.



An actual news release has a complete date in the lower left hand corner of the news release. This date is always one day ahead of the actual date of the news release. A news release dated June 5, 1972, will actually be written and furnished to the news media on June 4, 1972. The fake news release had only the date 1972 in the lower left hand corner.

A sequential number is also listed in the lower left hand corner. The number on the fake news release is 240 and this number was approximately 100 numbers off.

Examination of the envelope, in which the news release was enclosed, disclosed that a regular  $8\phi$  stamp was used, however, all Humphrey literature was mailed using the postage meter.

The address on the envelope appears to have been placed thereon using a gummed label. All Humphrey material was addressed using an addressograph machine.

There were several misspellings in the fake news release which would not have appeared in the actual news release because it is proofread numerous times to stop such an error.





BOGUS NEWS RELEASES ISSUED ON HEMPHREY LETTERHEAD, DENOUNCED BY 600 HUMPHREY AIDE

LOS ANGELES, June 5--Bogus news releases on Humphrey for President letterheads appeared throughout California today in an apparent last-minute effort to confuse voters and the news make. Humphrey for President Campaign Manager Jack Chestaut denounced the two begus releases as "the lowest kind of dirty politics."

One release purported to signify Humphrey support for Proposition 9, an antipollution preposition on the June 6 Mailot.

"Senator Humphrey has not spoken for or against Proposition 9, nor has anyone in his campaign organization," said Chestnut. "We have put out no news release. What has appeared on editors" desks this morning is bogus and does not emanate from the Humphrey campaign."

The other release mentioned Congresswoman Shirley Chisholm, who is also in the Democratic Presidential Primary ballot, in a derrogatory manner. "This release is completely false. It does not come from the Humphrey campaign," Chestnut said. "Like the other release, it is spurious and bogus."

He does not know whether or not any HUMPHREY stationery was stolen. A door in the supply closet had been taken off the hinges at some time but does not know whether this was done by a person who had forgotten his keys or whether it had been done by someone attempting to steal stationery. The campaign headquarters was organized in such a way that just about anyone walking off the street could walk through the xeroxing unit or the closet and pick up stationery. 





The Department received information from the General Accounting Office (GAO) that a political committee, the Shirley Chisholm for President Committee, received three contributions from corporations during the period of the 1972 Democratic Presidential primaries Chisholm is a Democratic Congresswoman from Brooklyn, New York.

On 1/14/74 Craig Donsanto of the Criminal Division of the Department advised that three of the Chisholm Committee's officers have previously been contacted by b7C GAO andthhe Department regarding alleged solicitation of corporate funds, however, according to Mr. Donsanto they have not been sufficiently responsive concerning the matter. ## E. <u>Corporate Contributions</u>

Section 610 of title 18, United States Code, prohibits corporations from making political contributions in connection with Federal elections and prohibits political committees from accepting such contributions.

Our examination of the Committee's records indicated that
they received at least three contributions from corporations:

100 from New York,
New York; \$200 from Spartacus Securities, Inc., Brooklyn, New York;
and \$386 from White Plains Manor, Inc., Bronx, New York.

Officers of the Committee, Spartacus Securities, Inc., and White Plains Manor, Inc. told us that they were unaware of the inlegality of corporate contributions to political committees.

for the \$100 contribution on May 16, 1972, and has furnished us with a copy of the cancelled reimbursement check.







As a result of this inquiry, I have elicited facts which demonstrate that the sum of \$386 was not a contribution by the corporation. White Plains Manor, Inc. Annexed is the affidavit of which, in my opinion, strongly leads to the conclusion that the check was merely a transmittal accommodation extended by White Plains Manor, Inc. to a group of supporters of the Chisholm campaign.



Sometime after April, 1973, following the audit by the General Accounting Office of the records of the Shirley Chisholm for President Committee, and after it was pointed out that several contributions by three corporation checks had been received by the committee and had been listed in its reports to the GAO, and that such contributions were illegal, I drove to the address of White Plains Manor, Inc. at 3510 White Plains Road, Bronx, New York. Since the contribution was said to be illegal, my purpose was to make a refund for the committee. I looked for the establishment, but I simply could not find it.

Recently, reviewed with me the matters pertaining to the corporate checks. He quizzed me on the fact that it seemed strange that a catering place, or anyone else for that matter, would make a contribution of such an uneven amount as \$386.00. Finally, there emerged recollections on my part which, I believe, correctly trace the origin of this so-called "contribution".

I have now been requested by trecord these recollections.

There was an occasion in the early period of the Shirley Chisholm for President campaign when I drove Mrs. Chisholm to the Bronx to attend an affair held in a building on White Plains Road, which affair was sponsored by

a group of Hispanic-American women. The affair was conducted by the women to raise funds to support the effort of Mrs. Chisholm as the first black woman ever to be a candidate for the Presidency. Mrs. Chisholm had been invited to attend, and we drove there with several other of her aides.

I recall that I was unfamiliar with the route of travel. It was the first time I had ever used the Throggs Neck Bridge, and besides I was unfamiliar with the Bronx in general, and especially with the particular area we had to get to. I got lost in the Bronx and we travelled around in circles during the very cold afternoon. Since Mrs. Chisholm disapproves of any kind of speed in car travel, it became early evening by the time we-reached the location.

Actually, we could find no building number, and it was only the fact that there were a number of women on the street on the lockout for us, that we were able to find the place at all. I believe there was a bar on the street floor of the building, and we were escorted upstairs. There, in a hall, were many Spanish-speaking persons who were having light refreshments, and I believe, a children's band and other children were providing bits of entertainment. All of the discourse was in Spanish, so that only Mrs. Chisholm, in our party, could get the drift of what was being said.

I recall that, at some point, plates were passed around for a collection for the Chisholm campaign, and I myself placed 75¢ in coins onto the plate.

have learnt from him that the affair I had recollected
was a "cocktail sip" conducted on Sunday, February 20, 1972,
at White Plains Manor Ballroom, located at 3510 White
Plains Road, Bronx, N.Y. He further advised me that sometime
after the affair, some lady representatives of the group
brought a check for the net proceeds of the affair to the
Brooklyn office of Congresswoman Chisholm, and the check
was turned over to the Shirley Chisholm for President
Committee, had no recollection as to the name
of the payor on the check or its amount.

However, I have no doubt at all that this was the check of \$386. which was deposited in the committee's bank account, recorded as received from White Plains Manor, Inc., and subsequently so listed in the committee's report to the GAO. I have no doubt that the check was written as an accommodation to the women's group, and was not actually a contribution by the corporation, White Plains Manor, Inc.

STATEMENT RELATIVE TO FINAL FINANCIAL REPORT FILED BY THE SHIRLEY CHISHOLM FOR PRESIDENT COMMITTEE WITH U. S. GENERAL ACCOUNTING OFFICE.

The Shirley Chisholm for President Committee appends this prefatory statement to its complete and final report to the U. S. General Accounting Office as to campaign finances.

The purpose of this statement is to present a summary of the information and data relative to the contributions and expenditures handled by the national committee. An ancillary purpose is to make such materials readily available to the thousands of persons in all parts of the United States who actively participated in, or who contributed financially to, the Chisholm presidential campaign, and to all others who may be interested in the information.

The committee considers the dissemination of this information to be particularly necessary because of recent widespread publication of news stories which presented partial and distorted accounts of some aspects of the committee's interim reports of its financial data. The published accounts bore little or no resemblance to the full picture.

This finance report embraces the entire period of the campaign. The report covers the early and tentative beginnings in the Fall of 1971, and continues through the Democratic national nominating convention in July, 1972. Also covered is the period subsequent to the convention, up to and including the committee's final transactions in December, 1973.

In sum, the national Shirley Chisholm for President Committee received contributions totalling \$118,620.62. These contributions were made by thousands of persons situated in almost every state of the United States. The donors made their contributions individually or through groups.

The overwhelmingly greater number of contributions consisted of amounts ranging from 25¢ to \$5.00. The committee recorded the names of thousands of the contributors. Thousands of other contributors are unknown to the committee because their contributions formed part of cumulative sums collected at many places. Their coins and dollars were given at meetings and rallies held in schools and colleges, churches, community centers, and union halls, and at parties in private homes. The contributions of amounts under \$100 added up to \$26,266.55. Contributions by individuals of amounts of \$100 and over totalled \$50,964.19. Contributions by groups amounted to \$39,200.48. Bank interest and telephone refund were \$2,189.40.

Separate and apart from the contributions to the national committee were monies raised and used by local groups in many states. Such monies were used by the local groups in support of activities connected with statewide primaries and party caucuses and conventions.

All of the relatively meagre funds (relative to the multi-millions of dollars reported by other presidential campaign committees) received by the Chisholm national committee were expended towards fulfillment of the insatiable demands of a

movement which placed Mrs. Chisholm in the primary elections conducted in seventeen states. The whirlwind campaign was mounted during a period of less than five months. When the Democratic national convention adjourned in July, 1972, the committee held sizeable unpaid bills, and it was without funds sufficient to pay the bills. Proceeds from a recent fund-raising dinner, together with a personal contribution of \$3,000 from Congresswoman Chisholm, have been used to meet the deficit. fact, the deficit would have been significantly larger, except that expenses for the travel of the candidate and of some of her aides throughout state after state were charged to her through use of her American Express credit cards. Mrs. Chisholm was reimbursed by the committee for only a part of the heavy charges thus imposed upon her personally. She was by far the largest financial contributor to the campaign, having expended out-of-pocket \$32,599.50, and received reimbursement from the committee of \$14,974.34.

The committee carefully nurtured the funds which it received from the candidate's supporters. The monies were placed in a savings account, to earn interest during the periods of non-use. As needed, monies from the savings account were transferred by means of bookkeeping entries to a checking account maintained in the same bank.

The number of full-time campaign aides supported by the committee, each of them for periods varying from 2 to 5 months, never exceeded six persons at any given time. This small band performed the mammoth task of assisting Mrs. Chisholm in the planning, coordination, and execution of a national campaign which placed her candidacy and her carefully-postulated

program before Democratic voters across the nation.

Mrs. Chisholm's candidacy was not long pre-planned, nor was it based on established political organizations. From the day of her announcement, on January 25th, 1972, that she intended to seek the Democratic presidential nomination, a myriad of supporters sprang up from grass roots in all sections of the country. Her congressional office and this newly-formed national committee were swamped by the massive public response. An avalanche of mail cascaded into the offices. The committee was deluged with calls for information, literature, materials, speakers, organizers, and everything else which concerned citizens were entitled to demand. In retrospect, the dynamics of the catalysis generated by the Chisholm candidacy appear awesome and inspiring. A recount of how Mrs. Chisholm and her handful of dedicated, but inexperienced, aides met the demands of people - incessant demands which seemed to come from everywhere - is better stated in the Congresswoman's book, "The Good Fight". .

The committee concerned itself strictly with the business of safeguarding the monies received in support of the campaign for the nomination of Shirley Chisholm. Every dollar was banked, on record. Every dollar was expended by bank check, on record. The committee employed no fund-raisers, overt or covert. It maintained no secret caches of slush-fund cash. No bagmen were hired to surreptitiously receive unlawful

contributions. No one applied pressures or practiced extortions. No one planned or countenanced unfair campaign tactics, although its candidate was a victim of the dirty tricks of criminal saboteurs.

### Alleged Inadequate Record-Keeping and Incomplete Reporting

The committee has been criticized by the General Accounting Office for inadequacy of its record-keeping and for incompleteness of its reporting. Apparently, the criticism is justified to some extent. The reasons for the shortcomings probably are not as apparent.

The committee has consisted of two, three, sometimes four persons, each of us part-time volunteers otherwise regularly engaged in our usual businesses and occupations. None of us is a lawyer or an accountant. We had no prior experience with or conception of a campaign like this one; we knew little about the new or old campaign finance reporting laws; we could hardly keep up with the not-so-simple reporting forms. As daily events overtook us, we were beset and staggered by belated discoveries of additional reporting requirements.

It has been estimated for us, that if we could and did prepare and file all reports which may have been required, the number of such reports would have exceeded fifty.

It was a colossal task just to constantly keep abreast of a veritable avalanche of records. Admittedly, we had to make abbreviated recordings, but it appears to us that the records were reasonably adequate.

It has also been estimated that, to have maintained the detailed and precise records required by law and regulation, the full-time employment of a clerical staff of at least six persons would have been necessary. In addition, the constant supervision of an attorney or an experienced accountant would have been indispensable. To employ such personnel, and to provide the supporting facilities for such a staff, it is probable that the committee would have expended half of its funds.

None of these comments is intended as criticism of the law or the regulations. On the contrary, we have learned, through difficult experiences, that the legal requirements are generally valid, logical and most necessary. The "great" discovery we have made is that a campaign of this order and dimension cannot be projected by shoestrings.

In 1972, we thought that our primary responsibility was to handle contributors' monies safely and honestly. We did not then sufficiently appreciate the equally critical need for, and the deep implications of, rigidly precise and detailed public disclosure. More simply stated, in 1972, like most other Americans, we scarcely imagined the kind and extent of the political pollution and corruption which became revealed in post-Watergate 1973.

We unreservedly subscribe to the fullest possible disclosure of campaign financing. Justice Holmes' admonition that, "The best disinfectant is the light of day", is more apt today than ever. Therefore, we pledge that, in the next campaign, we will do better record-keeping and reporting.

### Alleged "Possible Misuse of \$23,000 Surplus"

The most shocking distortion of fact, widely-published in news reports, was the allegation of "possible misuse of a \$23,000 surplus" by the committee. Some of the news reports even implied that the alleged "possible misuse" was by Mrs. Chisholm.

This reckless allegation was somehow extrapolated from data in an audit report made by the General Accounting Office.

The audit report showed the existence of a surplus as of a specified date. The calculations in the audit, of course, did not take into account the substantial bills which were presented to the committee after the period covered by the audit. When those bills were paid by the committee, not only was the temporary surplus wiped out, but a deficit loomed large.

Certainly there were times when the committee held funds in surplus. However, soon after the Democratic national convention adjourned, a fresh bunch of bills confronted the committee. Quickly, a seeming surplus became converted into a deficit.

Only recently has the committee been able to finally liquidate the last of its debts.

In the accompanying report, all transactions of the committee, from the first to the last, are recorded. Consequently, the report naturally eliminates the misleading appearance of a surplus or of a deficit at intermediate stages of the committee's existence.

### Alleged Illegal Corporate Contributions

The General Accounting Office cited as an "apparent violation" three contributions to the committee made by corporations.

Among the thousands of contributions received by the committee, there came contributions from three personally-held corporations. One such contribution was for \$100; another was for \$200; and the third, from White Plains Manor, Inc., was for \$386. These contributions were duly noted in the committee's records, duly deposited in the committee's bank account, and duly stated in the committee's reports to the General Accounting Office.

The committee now understands that such contributions, even by one-person corporations, are not legal. Apparently, this has long been the law. Accordingly, the first two corporations have been reimbursed. The third corporation, White Plains Manor, Inc., cannot be located by the committee. However, it has been learned that its \$386 check was actually a transmittal to accommodate a group of Hispanic-American women who had raised the funds in an affair for the benefit of the Chisholm campaign, conducted at the corporation's facilities.

This "apparent violation" by the Chisholm committee was also heralded in a front-page news item as a subject of Federal investigation.

Whereupon, several days following this news item, none other than President Nixon proclaimed that both parties had received tainted money in 1972, and he was reported as having further declared: "Some of that -- came from corporate sources and was illegal because the

law had been changed and apparently people didn't know it". Thus, millions of dollars in cash criminally passed under the table by sophisticated pillars of our corporate society to other sophisticated pillars of our society were equated with \$300 in two corporation checks received and recorded openly and publicly by this committee. Quite an equation!!

### Failure to Name a Committee Chairman

The General Accounting Office cited as another "apparent violation" the committee's failure to name a chairman.

The committee's registration statement, filed on June 1, 1972, listed as officers a treasurer and an assistant treasurer. Our reason for not listing a chairman at that time is now obscure even to us. We knew that we wanted and needed two signatories to safeguard bank withdrawals; so that we did designate a treasurer and an assistant treasurer for this purpose. Just why a chairman was not named, as such, at that time, we do not remember.

After the filing of the registration statment, we simply forgot that a chairman, as such, had not been designated. The matter did not come to our attention again, that is, not until more than a year later, when we were reminded by the General Accounting Office that the committee did not have anyone designated as a chairman.

#### CONCLUSION

In the accompanying report, the committee has presented a full account of all of its financial transactions. As far as possible, the U. S. Comptroller General's regulations have been complied with. In several relatively minor respects, compliance has not been possible because of the irretrievability of the information. However, the committee has compiled and substantially supplied the data vital to the law's objective of adequate disclosure. In fact, in various respects, much specific information set forth in the report exceeds the reporting requirements of the General Accounting Office.

The committee hopes, perhaps vainly, to be able to bring this statement and report to the attention of the innumerable persons who were impressed with the published news reports which were unfortunately based upon incomplete data. In any event, the committee will do whatever is possible to disseminate this information among thousands of Congresswoman Chisholm's supporters throughout the nation.

Sometime after April, 1973, following the audit by the General Accounting Office of the records of the Shirley Chisholm for President Committee, and after it was pointed out that several contributions by three corporation checks had been received by the committee and had been listed in its reports to the GAO, and that such contributions were illegal, I drove to the address of White Plains Manor, Inc. at 3510 White Plains Road, Bronx, New York. Since the contribution was said to be illegal, my purpose was to make a refund for the committee. I looked for the establishment, but I simply could not find it.

Recently, reviewed with me the matters pertaining to the corporate checks. He quizzed me on the fact that it seemed strange that a catering place, or anyone else for that matter, would make a contribution of such an uneven amount as \$386.00. Finally, there emerged recollections on my part which, I believe, correctly trace the origin of this so-called "contribution".

There was an occasion in the early period of the Shirley Chisholm for President campaign when I drove Mrs. Chisholm to the Bronx to attend an affair held in a building on White Plains Road, which affair was sponsored by

a group of Hispanic-American women. The affair was conducted by the women to raise funds to support the effort of Mrs. Chisholm as the first black woman ever to be a candidate for the Presidency. Mrs. Chisholm had been invited to attend, and we drove there with several other of her aides.

I recall that I was unfamiliar with the route of travel. It was the first time I had ever used the Throggs Neck Bridge, and besides I was unfamiliar with the Bronx in general, and especially with the particular area we had to get to. I got lost in the Bronx and we travelled around in circles during the very cold afternoon. Since Mrs. Chisholm disapproves of any kind of speed in car travel, it became early evening by the time we reached the location.

Actually, we could find no building number, and it was only the fact that there were a number of women on the street on the lookout for us, that we were able to find the place at all. I believe there was a bar on the street floor of the building, and we were escorted upstairs. There, in a hall, were many Spanish-speaking persons who were having light refreshments, and I believe, a children's band and other children were providing bits of entertainment. All of the discourse was in Spanish, so that only Mrs. Chisholm, in our party, could get the drift of what was being said.

I recall that, at some point, plates were passed around for a collection for the Chisholm campaign, and I myself placed 75¢ in coins onto the plate.

Again, at	request of several days
ago, I have checked with $lacksquare$	who is
Congresswoman Chisholm's	and

have learnt from him that the affair I had recollected
was a "cocktail sip" conducted on Sunday, February 20, 1972,
at White Plains Manor Ballroom, located at 3510 White
Plains Road, Bronx, N.Y. He further advised me that sometime
after the affair, some lady representatives of the group
brought a check for the net proceeds of the affair to the
Brooklyn office of Congresswoman Chisholm, and the check
was turned over to the Shirley Chisholm for President
Committee. had no recollection as to the name
of the payor on the check or its amount.

However, I have no doubt at all that this was the check of \$386. which was deposited in the committee's bank account, recorded as received from White Plains Manor, Inc., and subsequently so listed in the committee's report to the GAO. I have no doubt that the check was written as an accommodation to the women's group, and was not actually a contribution by the corporation, White Plains Manor, Inc.


## E. Corporate Contributions

Section 610 of title 18, United States Code, prohibits corporations from making political contributions in connection with Federal elections and prohibits political committees from accepting such contributions.

Our examination of the Committee's records indicated that they received at least three contributions from corporations: \$100 from New York. New York; (\$200) from Spartacus Securities, Inc., Brooklyn, New York; and \$386 from White Plains Manor, Inc., Bronx, New York. Officers of the Committee, Spartacus Securities, Inc., and White Plains Manor. Inc. told us that they were unaware of the illegality of corporate contributions to political committees. told us he reimbursed his corporation for the \$100 contribution and has furnished us with a copy of the cancelled reimbursement check. stated he would refund the other two corporate contributions and send us copies of the cancelled refund checks as soon as they are available. To date we have not received copies of the checks.

The making and acceptance of the corporate contributions appear to be violations of section 610, title 18, United States Code.

STATEMENT RELATIVE TO FINAL FINANCIAL REPORT FILED BY THE SHIRLEY CHISHOLM FOR PRESIDENT COMMITTEE WITH U. S. GENERAL ACCOUNTING OFFICE.

The Shirley Chisholm for President Committee appends this prefatory statement to its complete and final report to the U. S. General Accounting Office as to campaign finances.

The purpose of this statement is to present a summary of the information and data relative to the contributions and expenditures handled by the national committee. An ancillary purpose is to make such materials readily available to the thousands of persons in all parts of the United States who actively participated in, or who contributed financially to, the Chisholm presidential campaign, and to all others who may be interested in the information.

The committee considers the dissemination of this information to be particularly necessary because of recent widespread publication of news stories which presented partial and distorted accounts of some aspects of the committee's interim reports of its financial data. The published accounts bore little or no resemblance to the full picture.

This finance report embraces the entire period of the campaign. The report covers the early and tentative beginnings in the Fall of 1971, and continues through the Democratic national nominating convention in July, 1972. Also covered is the period subsequent to the convention, up to and including the committee's final transactions in December, 1973.

In sum, the national Shirley Chisholm for President Committee received contributions totalling \$118,620.62.

These contributions were made by thousands of persons situated in almost every state of the United States. The donors made their contributions individually or through groups.

The overwhelmingly greater number of contributions consisted of amounts ranging from 25¢ to \$5.00. The committee recorded the names of thousands of the contributors. Thousands of other contributors are unknown to the committee because their contributions formed part of cumulative sums collected at many places. Their coins and dollars were given at meetings and rallies held in schools and colleges, churches, community centers, and union halls, and at parties in private homes. The contributions of amounts under \$100 added up to \$26,266.55. Contributions by individuals of amounts of \$100 and over totalled \$50,964.19. Contributions by groups amounted to \$39,200.48. Bank interest and telephone refund were \$2,189.40.

Separate and apart from the contributions to the national committee were monies raised and used by local groups in many states. Such monies were used by the local groups in support of activities connected with statewide primaries and party caucuses and conventions.

All of the relatively meagre funds (relative to the multi-millions of dollars reported by other presidential campaign committees) received by the Chisholm national committee were expended towards fulfillment of the insatiable demands of a

aced Mrs. Chisholm in the rimary elections movement which conducted in seventeen states. The whirlwind campaign was mounted during a period of less than five months. When the Democratic national convention adjourned in July, 1972, the committee held sizeable unpaid bills, and it was without funds sufficient to pay the bills. Proceeds from a recent fund-raising dinner, together with a personal contribution of \$3,000 from Congresswoman Chisholm, have been used to meet the deficit. fact, the deficit would have been significantly larger, except that expenses for the travel of the candidate and of some of her aides throughout state after state were charged to her through use of her American Express credit cards. Mrs. Chisholm was reimbursed by the committee for only a part of the heavy ' charges thus imposed upon her personally. She was by far the largest financial contributor to the campaign, having expended out-of-pocket \$32,599.50, and received reimbursement from the committee of \$14,974.34.

The committee carefully nurtured the funds which it received from the candidate's supporters. The monies were placed in a savings account, to earn interest during the periods of non-use. As needed, monies from the savings account were transferred by means of bookkeeping entries to a checking account maintained in the same bank.

The number of full-time campaign aides supported by the committee, each of them for periods varying from 2 to 5 months, never exceeded six persons at any given time. This small band performed the mammoth task of assisting Mrs. Chisholm in the planning, coordination, and execution of a national campaign which placed her candidacy and her carefully-postulated

program before Democratic voters across the nation.

Mrs. Chisholm's candidacy was not long pre-planned, nor was it based on established political organizations. From the day of her announcement, on January 25th, 1972, that she intended to seek the Democratic presidential nomination, a myriad of supporters sprang up from grass roots in all sections of the country. Her congressional office and this newly-formed national committee were swamped by the massive public response. An avalanche of mail cascaded into the offices. The committee was deluged with calls for information, literature, materials, speakers, organizers, and everything else which concerned citizens were entitled to demand. In retrospect, the dynamics of the catalysis generated by the Chisholm candidacy appear awesome and inspiring. A recount of how Mrs. Chisholm and her handful of dedicated, but inexperienced, aides met the demands of people - incessant demands which seemed to come from everywhere - is better stated in the Congresswoman's book, The Good Fight".

The committee concerned itself strictly with the business of safeguarding the monies received in support of the campaign for the nomination of Shirley Chisholm. Every dollar was banked, on record. Every dollar was expended by bank check, on record. The committee employed no fund-raisers, overt or covert. It maintained no secret caches of slush-fund cash. No bagmen were hired to surreptitiously receive unlawful

contributions. No one applied pressures or practiced extortions. No one planned or countenanced unfair campaign tactics, although its candidate was a victim of the dirty tricks of criminal saboteurs.

## Alleged Inadequate Record-Keeping and Incomplete Reporting

The committee has been criticized by the General Accounting Office for inadequacy of its record-keeping and for incompleteness of its reporting. Apparently, the criticism is justified to some extent. The reasons for the shortcomings probably are not as apparent.

The committee has consisted of two, three, sometimes four persons, each of us part-time volunteers otherwise regularly engaged in our usual businesses and occupations. None of us is a lawyer or an accountant. We had no prior experience with or conception of a campaign like this one; we knew little about the new or old campaign finance reporting laws; we could hardly keep up with the not-so-simple reporting forms. As daily events overtook us, we were beset and staggered by belated discoveries of additional reporting requirements.

It has been estimated for us, that if we could and did prepare and file all reports which may have been required, the number of such reports would have exceeded fifty.

It was a colossal task just to constantly keep abreast of a veritable avalanche of records. Admittedly, we had to make abbreviated recordings, but it appears to us that the records were reasonably adequate.

It has also been estimated that, to have maintained the detailed and precise records required by law and regulation, the full-time employment of a clerical staff of at least six persons would have been necessary. In addition, the constant supervision of an attorney or an experienced accountant would have been indispensable. To employ such personnel, and to provide the supporting facilities for such a staff, it is probable that the committee would have expended half of its funds.

None of these comments is intended as criticism of the law or the regulations. On the contrary, we have learned, through difficult experiences, that the legal requirements are generally valid, logical and most necessary. The "great" discovery we have made is that a campaign of this order and dimension cannot be projected by shoestrings.

In 1972, we thought that our primary responsibility was to handle contributors' monies safely and honestly. We did not then sufficiently appreciate the equally critical need for, and the deep implications of, rigidly precise and detailed public disclosure. More simply stated, in 1972, like most other Americans, we scarcely imagined the kind and extent of the political pollution and corruption which became revealed in post-Watergate 1973.

We unreservedly subscribe to the fullest possible disclosure of campaign financing. Justice Holmes' admonition that, "The best disinfectant is the light of day", is more apt today than ever. Therefore, we pledge that, in the next campaign, we will do better record-keeping and reporting.

## Alleged "Possible Misuse of \$23,000 Surplus"

The most shocking distortion of fact, widely-published in news reports, was the allegation of "possible misuse of a \$23,000 surplus" by the committee. Some of the news reports even implied that the alleged "possible misuse" was by Mrs. Chisholm.

This reckless allegation was somehow extrapolated from data in an audit report made by the General Accounting Office.

The audit report showed the existence of a surplus as of a specified date. The calculations in the audit, of course, did not take into account the substantial bills which were presented to the committee after the period covered by the audit. When those bills were paid by the committee, not only was the temporary surplus wiped out, but a deficit loomed large.

Certainly there were times when the committee held funds in surplus. However, soon after the Democratic national convention adjourned, a fresh bunch of bills confronted the committee. Quickly, a seeming surplus became converted into a deficit.

Only recently has the committee been able to finally liquidate the last of its debts.

In the accompanying report, all transactions of the committee, from the first to the last, are recorded. Consequently, the report naturally eliminates the misleading appearance of a surplus or of a deficit at intermediate stages of the committee's existence.

### Alleged Illegal Corporate Contributions

The General Accounting Office cited as an "apparent violation" three contributions to the committee made by corporations.

Among the thousands of contributions received by the committee, there came contributions from three personally-held corporations. One such contribution was for \$100; another was for \$200; and the third, from White Plains Manor, Inc., was for \$386. These contributions were duly noted in the committee's records, duly deposited in the committee's bank account, and duly stated in the committee's reports to the General Accounting Office.

The committee now understands that such contributions, even by one-person corporations, are not legal. Apparently, this has long been the law. Accordingly, the first two corporations have been reimbursed. The third corporation, White Plains Manor, Inc., cannot be located by the committee. However, it has been learned that its \$386 check was actually a transmittal to accommodate a group of Hispanic-American women who had raised the funds in an affair for the benefit of the Chisholm campaign, conducted at the corporation's facilities.

This "apparent violation" by the Chisholm committee was also heralded in a front-page news item as a subject of Federal investigation.

Whereupon, several days following this news item, none other than President Nixon proclaimed that both parties had received tainted money in 1972, and he was reported as having further declared: "Some of that -- came from corporate sources and was illegal because the

law had been changed and apparently people didn't know it". Thus, millions of dollars in cash criminally passed under the table by sophisticated pillars of our corporate society to other sophisticated pillars of our society were equated with \$300 in two corporation checks received and recorded openly and publicly by this committee. Quite an equation!!

#### Failure to Name a Committee Chairman

The General Accounting Office cited as another "apparent violation" the committee's failure to name a chairman.

The committee's registration statement, filed on June 1, 1972, listed as officers a treasurer and an assistant treasurer. Our reason for not listing a chairman at that time is now obscure even to us. We knew that we wanted and needed two signatories to safeguard bank withdrawals, so that we did designate a treasurer and an assistant treasurer for this purpose. Just why a chairman was not named, as such, at that time, we do not remember.

After the filing of the registration statment, we simply forgot that a chairman, as such, had not been designated. The matter did not come to our attention again, that is, not until more than a year later, when we were reminded by the General Accounting Office that the committee did not have anyone designated as a chairman.

#### CONCLUSION

In the accompanying report, the committee has presented a full account of all of its financial transactions. As far as possible, the U. S. Comptroller General's regulations have been complied with. In several relatively minor respects, compliance has not been possible because of the irretrievability of the information. However, the committee has compiled and substantially supplied the data vital to the law's objective of adequate disclosure. In fact, in various respects, much specific information set forth in the report exceeds the reporting requirements of the General Accounting Office.


The committee hopes, perhaps vainly, to be able to bring this statement and report to the attention of the innumerable persons who were impressed with the published news reports which were unfortunately based upon incomplete data. In any event, the committee will do whatever is possible to disseminate this information among thousands of Congresswoman Chisholm's supporters throughout the nation.

"He deposited all receipts of the committee, and he signed all checks which were then co-signed by either Mr. [Cliff] Greene [Treasurer] or Mr. [Trevor] Spence [Assistant Treasurer]."







THORNBURGH." Also contained in these letters were a xeroxed copy of the last portion of an affidavit signed by and attested to by JULIA E. DAILEY, Notary Public, on the 30th day of June, 1988; a form letter signed by STEVEN SCHIFF, District Attorney, Albuquerque, New Mexico, regarding the writing of worthless checks in which SCHIFF's name has been circled; and a copy of a court document with a handprinted affidavit attached entered on behalf of the defendant, by his attorney, in the Metropolitan Court, County of Bernalillo, State of New Mexico. LYDIA WILLIAMS made the welcoming address.

CARLOS RUSSELL, who is the national chairman of the Black Caucus of the NCNP, was the conference chairman.

The keynote address was made by JAMES FORMAN, International Affairs Director of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC). He advised in his address that he did not want to be the keynote speaker at this conference. He stated there was disagreement among the leaders of SNCC as to whether he should speak at the conference. He said that he was against the ideas of calling it.

NY 100-158043 FORMAN stated that SNCC has placed prices on anyone in SNCC who is assassinated. He stated that if he were assassinated, his value would be a power plant and other things which cannot be recalled. He stated that if STOKLEY CARMICHAEL or RAP BROWN would be assassinated, there would be three times as much for them as for him. He chastised the black people who went into the poverty program. He said that SNCC is 100% against this program. He stated that those who have jobs in the program is only got them because of the black peoples' struggle. He said that they are going to have to donate to SNCC. DELORES HUERTE, Vice President of the Farm Workers Union, had asked to speak at this conference and was allowed to after FORMAN's address and thelunch period. She asked for the support of this conference for the California Grape Workers. She requested that the people not buy grapes produced by a certain grower. She also asked for letters of protest to be written to the growers in California. The lunch was served at the church at the cost of \$1.50 per person. After lunch the conference workshops were held. There were four workshops, which were: "Can Conventional Politics Liberate Black People?" "The Meaning of Politic 'Isms' for Black People" "Can Revolutionary Politics Liberate Black People?" "The Role of Black Youth in Liberation" LEO RABOUINE was appointed to run the tape recorder for the workshop number 3, "Can Rev olutionary Politics Liberate Black People?". Professor HARRY EDWARDS, San Jose State College, was one of the speakers on the panel of this workshop. EDWARDS lead the boycott of the New York Athletic Club track meet held at the new Madison Square Garden, Friday night 2/16/68, and the leader of the attempt to have Negro athletes boycott the 1968 summer Olympics. EDWARDS stated that the Olympics boycott is political in nature. He said it is a method to attempt to expose the

system of discrimination against the Negro in the United States. He condemned the United States for the readmission of South Africa to the summer Olympics.

OMAR ABU AHMED, a Black Nationalist, was also a speaker on this panel. He stated that all whites are no good. He chastised all black women and men who are married to whites. He stated that 1968 is the year of survival for the black people. He said that they should arm themselves and stock up food. He said that they didn't have to be put in concentration camps because they are already in one when they are in the ghetto.

JACK ODELL, editor of "Freedomways" magazine, also was on the panel. He was the most moderate of the panel speakers.

The name of the chairman of this workshop was unknown. He is a young Negro male who is about 24 to 25 years of age, 5'7", or 5'8", about 155 pounds, and has a light brown complexion.

After the workshops were over, which was about 4:45 p.m., the Plenary session was held. Reports were given from each workshop at the session. RASHEED STOREY gave the report from the workshop on the "The Meaning of Political 'Isms' for Black People". The others who reported on their workshops were unknown. The chairman of the workshop number 3 reported for his workshop.

SHIRLEY CHISHOLM, who is a New York State Assembly-woman and a black candidate for Congress from Brooklyn, was on the panel entitled "Can Cpnventional Politics Liberate Black People."

Rally at Ocean-Hill School #271 After Forced Entry of Ousted Teachers by N.YC.P.D.

The meeting was held at Saratoga Avenue and Herkimer Street in Brooklyn, at demonstration school #271. Approximately 400 people in attendance. HAGENWALLER an area director for Youth-in-Action; TOM FORTUNE, Democratic District Leader; Rev. OLIVER, Ocean-Hill Board Chairman; ROBERT (SONNY) CARSON, Chairman of Independent Brooklyn CORE; and OLIVER RAMSEY, Chairman of the Educational Committee of the "Council Against Poverty" which directs the Human Resources Agency; all called for the Black and Puerto Rican people to make a last ditch stand for decentralization in Brooklyn. They made it very clear that this must be done even if it means taking or giving of lives. Their were "Black Panthers" in the audience who were cheered constantly. Mob rule was being endorsed. RAMSEY said, "That when he saw the police in those classroom it was the first time in his life that he thought of throwing a molotov cocktail".

These were not just Black Nationalist at this meeting, but many community organizational people. One of such who was present was Miss SONIA ALLEN who is an Education Specialist for Youth-in-Action and a coordinator for the Assemblywoman SHIRLEY CHISOLM backed Bed-Stuy Parents Association that sent 400 people to Albany, New York on September 20, 1968 to protest to Governor ROCKEFELLER and State Commissioner on Education JAMES ALLEN.

There were also representatives from out of state who were interested in decentralization. It seem as though a wide community ground swell is being activated. TED GROSS of Mayor LINDSAY's office and HERMAN FERGUSON were present, but did not speak.

Meeting - Emma Lazarus Federation of Jewish Women's Clubs - Sunday, February 16, 1969, Brotherhood in action auditorium, 560 7th Ave., N.Y.C. at 1:30 P.M.

This meeting was advertised as a send off for the national delegation to Washington for presentation of a petition for ratification of the U.N. conventions on racism and genocide to the President and the Senate.

The auditorium was well filled with about 450 persons, mostly women in their sixties, some accompanied by their husbands. There were about 10 negroes in the audience.

The main speaker was SHIRLEY CHISHOLM, new congressman from Brooklyn. She spoke mostly of the need for women to band together to make the changes necessary to bring about peace and brotherhood. She also spoke about the problems she has met in Congress in trying to sponsor new legislation, held back by reactionary committee chairmen, who are there because of seniority rather than ability. Mrs CHISHOLM complemented the Emma Lazarus Federation for the work it has done in obtaining the signatures on its petition for US ratification of U.N. treaties on racism and genocide.

The next speaker was CLEVELAND ROBINSON, representing District 65, Wholesale & Retail Workers.

# Time for Talk Has Passed, Says Rep. Chisholm

America's first Negro woman in Congress, Rep. Shirley Chisholm of Brooklyn, flew to Buffalo today with a special charge for members of Iota Phi Lambda Sorority's Eastern Region.

"We are through with tokenism, gradualism and see-howfar-you've-come'ism. We want our share now," she told more than 125 delegates from 14 charters of the business and professional women's sorority, holding their 32d Eastern regional conference here.

"We must not, at all cost, all low petty differences between us and the man keeping his fect on our neck. We must focus on one thing in America, and the hour is growing late to do so. We must focus on achieving total liberation of our people."

#### From Several States

A tall, slender woman dressed in a fashionable blue and white stripe silk shantung suit, Rep. Chisholm addressed the sorority members from several states during an educational luncheon in the Statler Hilton.

"The student revolution, the black revolution, the women's revolution—are symptomatic of our society and its need to reassess its values very thoughtfully." said Rep. Chisholm, a Democrat, who has visited 17 college campuses during her four months in Congress. "We can't place such revolution invalvacu-

Until the white majority in this country rejects racism as a way of life, Rep. Chisholm continued, "no amount of money put into programs to help black people is going to help. We are no longer interested in the sermons (white people) preach—but in fitting the action to the word."

#### Holds 3 Degrees

Calling black people "unquestionably the most loyal citizens this country has ever seen," Rep. Chisholm said: "We love America because we measure her, not by her achievements, but by her potential."

A frequent visitor to Buffalq, where she has many friends, Rep. Chisholm, 44, urged heliateners to become more involved in politics. "If we're going to be very serious about correcting the ills in this society, we will have to have more women in politics." said the current admirer of Northern Ireland's 22-year-old woman MP, Bernadette Devlin.

A native of Brooklyn's Bedford-Stuyvesant area, Rep. Chisholm received her elementary education in Barbados, the West Indies, where her mother came from. She is a graduate of Brooklyn College and Columbia University, holds three degrees, and is only a few credits away from a doctorate in educational administration.

This group met with Congressman John Conyer in the Capitol Building where he directed them to a meeting room. There he was in the company of Congressman Nix (phonetic) of New York, Shirley Chisholm, a white male representing California, and an Administrative Assistant of Adam Clayton Powell. The purpose of this meeting was to attempt to gain Congressional support of RNA demands of reparation payments to black citizens. Nix immediately displayed antagonism toward the RNA group, while Conyer indicated a favorable attitude of silent agreement with the RNA.

Nix and Richard Henry engaged in an argument as to whether the U.S. actually owed reparations with Nix stating that his parents had been part of slavery, but he did not condemn the present U.S. Government. He indicated that all a black man has to do today is obtain an education to got ahose in society. Nix questioned Henry as to the population of the RNA and Henry displayed a long list of names of persons throughout the U.S., who had signed a petition in support of the RNA. Nix suggested and Chisholm

agreed that if the RNA had 15,000 followers as they claimed, the best thing they could do was to bus these people to by Washington, where they could put pressure on Congress. stated that if the RNA would do this, the Government would call out the Army and the RNA members would be massacred.
said the RNA was attempting to gain reparations in a peaceful manner and planned to take the matter to the United Nations and the World Court, if necessary. He threatened that if this would not work, the RNA would call out its Army and pointed out black legionaires who were present at the meeting as an example of the quality of the membership of the BL. stated he was certain Congressmen were familiar with the incident which had taken place at the New Bethel Church in Detroit, on March 29, 1969. claimed this was caused by the police when they came to that church to assassimate b7C but that a black legionaire had killed a policeman instead.
continued that the RNA did not want to do things in this manner, because the RNA would find itself up against the entire force of the U. S. the RNA, which is to be revolutionary in nature, is to make efforts for international recognition with assistance from other black nations of the world. The RNA proposes to make attempts to obtain an island or a plot of land in one of the Southern States, establish a government in exile, petition for a seat in the United Nations, and demand reparations from the United States Government for ancestral slave labor. These reparations are to be \$10,000.00 for every black person in the United States and the States of Alabama, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, and South Carolina, which are to be given to the RNA by the United States Government. The officers of the RNA also propose the establishment of a standing armed force, to be known as the Black Legion, which is to be financed through an income tax imposed on willing black persons in the United States.

In the furtherance of the purposes of the RNA, several executive officers have presented the Republic's credentials and an offer to negotiate for reparations to the United States Secretary of State.

### ORGANIZATION OF AFRO-AMERICAN \_UNITY, INCORPORATED (OAAU)

On June 28, 1964, MALCOLM X LITTLE, Founder and Leader of the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI), publicly announced the formation of a new, all-Negro militant civil rights action group to be known as the Organization of Afro-American Unit (OARU) with himself as Chairman. This announcement was made at a public rally held by the MMI in the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City.

A printed and published statement of basic OAAU aims read by MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that it shall include "all" people of African descent in the Western Hemisphere, as well as "our" brothers and sisters on the African continent. It is patterned after the "letter and spirit" of the Organization of African Unity established (by African Heads of States) at Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, in May, 1963.

A recording of the remarks of MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that the aim of the OAAU is to eliminate differences between Negroes so they can work together for "human rights" while the initial objective is to "internationalize" the American civil rights movement by taking it to the United Nations. LITTLE condemned the non-violent civil rights movement and claims that Negroes should be taught to protect themselves, when and if necessary. The OAAU will sponger a program for Negroes in education, politics, culture, economics and social reform.

MALCOLM X was assassinated on February 21, 1965, while addressing an OAAU rally at the Audubon Ballroom, New York City.

### MUSLIM MOSQUE, INCORPORATED, MMI

The March 13, 1964, edition of "The New York Times", a daily newspaper published in New York, New York, contained an article on page 20 which indicated that MALCOLM X (LITTLE), former national official of the Nation of Islam (NOI) who broke with the NOI on March 8, 1964, publicly announced in New York City on March 12. 1964, that he had formed the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated The MMI, according to the article, would be a broadly (MMI). based politically oriented black nationalist movement for Negroes only, financed by voluntary contributions. In this public statement, MALCOLM X urged Negroes to abandon the doctrine of non-violence when it is necessary to defend themselves in the civil rights struggle, and he also suggested that Negroes form rifle clubs to protect their lives and property in time of emergencies in areas where the government is unable or unwilling to protect them.

Incorporation papers of the MMI filed on March 16, 1964, with the Business Section, Clerk of Courts, New York County, New York, reflect that the MMI was incorporated under the Religious Corporation Law of the State of New York to work for the imparting of the Islamic Faith and Islamic religion in accordance with "accepted Islamic principals." The principal place of worship to be located in the Borough of Manhattan, New York, New York.

The May 23, 1964, edition of the "New York Amsterdam News", a weekly Negro newspaper published in New York City, contained an article by columnist JAMES BOOKER in which he indicated that he had heard that the visit by MALCOLM X with Muslim leaders during his African tour has changed him to become more religious.

"US" was chartered by the State of California as a non-profit corporation in September, 1966 with offices at \$211 South Broadway, Los Angeles, California. The corporate charter alleges that "US" is primarily an Afro-American cultural organization.

During the spring of 1968, however, a source advised that MAULANA RON KARENGA, true name Ronie McKinley Everett, Founder-Chairman of "US", has published a booklet entitled. The Quotable Karenga, in which he talks of revolution, black power and condemns Christianity for the plight of the black man.

In this booklet, Karenga stated: "...You must have a cultural revolution before the violent revolution. The cultural revolution gives identity, purpose and direction. ...The revolution being fought now is a revolution to win the minds of our people. If we fail to win this we cannot wage the violent one. ...When the word is given we'll see how tough you are. When it's 'burn', let's see how much you burn. When it's 'kill', let's see how much you kill. When it's 'blow up', let's see how much you blow up. And when it's 'take that white girl's head too', we'll really see how tough you are. ..."

A second source advised that Karenga has spoken at various meetings in Los Angeles, at which time he has talked of creating an "US"Army of 1,000 men, obtaining weapons and ammunition guerrila warfare tactics and revolution. Karenga has also stated, "The only way to get life is to take a life and as we get stronger we will take what we want from the white man's United States." He also stated that if the police killed any "US" members, the "US" organization would kill some of them.



At the workshop relating to Community Action it was decided that a National Committee for the exchange of ideas and literature as well as for news media, photographs and visual aids should be established. The purpose of this workshop was to show the true facts of how repression was occuring throughout the nation. This workshop was attended by approximately 300 people who represented 50 or 60 different organizations.

The evening session of the Conference, held on March 7, 1970, consisted of speeches by Arthur Kinoy, Sammy Rayner, a Chicago City Alderman and Congressional candidate, Reverend Calvin Morris of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), Nathan Wright, a Sociologist from New York and Jerry Lefcourt, an attorney involved in the defense of BPP members on trial in New York. All of these speeches, other than the one by Sammy Rayner, related to the theme of repression on the part of the courts against the BPP.

The overall crowd in attendance at the session held on March 7, 1970, consisted of approximately 40% black people, 50% white people and the balance being made up of Puerto Ricans, Mexicans and Orientals. Approximately 50% of the crowd appeared to be under the age of 35. The CP of Illinois was well represented in that a majority of the members of the State Board and State Committee were present. These individuals, however, took no active part in the proceedings.

On March 11, 1970, the first source advised that the ECD BPP was held in Chicago from March 6-8, 1970. This source provided the following information concerning that conference.

On Friday evening March 6, 1970, registration for the conference was held at the Church of the Epiphany, 201 South Ashland Avenue, Chicago. In addition a film was shown at 8:00. There was no further activity on that date.

On March 7, 1970, registration for the conference was continued at Malcolm X College, 840 West 14th Place, Chicago, from 9:00 to 10:00 AM. In that connection a total registration of 457 individuals was made. Since some of the persons did not register, sponsors figured that a total of 500 persons were present. Twenty-three states sent representatives to the conference along with 128 organizations which were represented.

IV Racism and Repression

The first source added that at the March 7, 1970 conference the additional individuals spoke:

Reverend Calvin Morris, Chicago, Illinois who represented the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. In that connection Morris remarked that all must join in the defense philosophically of the BPP, adding that everyone in a repressive society is threatened. He stated that talk is insufficient and that revolution must take place.

Dr. Nathan Wright, Jr., Professor of Urban Affairs, State University of New York then spoke and characterized the threat of counterviolence as being violence was incorrect. He added that it is the American tradition to arm for counterattack, and that those in positions of power, who advocate law and order obtained their positions by reason of violence. He stated that unless the black people are given equity then they should say no to the "masters".

Arthur Kinoy, an Attorney and Professor at Rutgers University Law School, New Jersey, stated that the BPP has the central task in operating the movement of the people at the present time. He said that the enemy moves out of weakness and fear and are afraid of movements in the ghettos and universities as well as being afraid of the peace movement. He added that the ruling class was unable to solve the problems of sub-society and in that connection emphasized that the BPP because of their power structure was vital in defending the rights of minority peoples. He called upon the conference to plan for the political defense of the BPP under a national campaign. Sammy Rayner from Chicago then spoke briefly calling for the election of more black Congressmen.

The afternoon session of the conference consisted of speakers of the Chicago "Conspiracy 7" who had recently been on trial in Chicago for violating Federal Anti-Riot Laws and who were then free on appeal of their convictions. One of the speakers was Tom Hayden of that group, who stated that racists fears come through in reverse. By way of example, he said that a person who is a racist and fears a revolutionary will create illegal acts, what usually happens is that illegal acts happen against the revolutionary. Hayden also remarked that if the peace movement is unable to end the war within the United States it can never end the war in Vietnam. He emphasized that a massive educational campaign must be organized within the United States to bring the Vietnam issue to a point of action.

Hayden's talk was followed by comments on the "Conspiracy 7" trial by the following defendants; David Dellinger, Jerry Rubin and John Froines.

During this session reports were given on the four workshops held on March 7, 1970. The essence of these reports are as follows:

Michigan gave a report on the demonstrative actions to the United Nations and other demonstrative actions toward repression. In this connection he stated that the workshop resolved, after charging the American government with genocide against black people, to petition the United Nations for redress of grievances on the question of racism. He added that the workshop called for organizing picket lines in front of department stores in the various cities.

gave a report on the National Defense Fund Workshop and stated that this workshop resolved that a defense organization to free all BPP members should be established by the conference. Among the things suggested were the following:

- 1) Assist in the immediate court fight regarding bail for Panther defendants;
- To conduct an educational and fund-raising campaign;

On March 8, and March 9, 1970, a fifth source provided the following. This information was substantiated by a sixth source on March 11, 1970. On March 8, 1970, approximately 700 people, predominantly blacks, attended a "People's Inquest" held at the First Congregational Church, 40 North Ashland Avenue, which inquest was being conducted by the Illinois Chapter of the BPP. These sources advised that the "jury" for the "Inquest" consisted of four men and eight women, three whites and nine blacks all reportedly selected from those attending the Emergency Conference.

The "coroner" appointed to conduct the "inquest" was of Malcolm X College.

Of the Illinois Chapter, BPP, performed the duties of the "prosecution".

At this affair a movie was shown which reportedly was a reconstruction of the police raid held on December 4, 1969 at \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ Chicago, at which time BPP leaders Fred Hampton and Mark Clark were slain, as a result of a shoot out at that time. In connection with the "inquest" the following survivors of the above mentioned raid and "shoot out" testified. \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ indicated she had been asleep in the front room of the first floor apartment at the above address when she was awakened by a knock on the door at which time Mark Clark inquired as to who was knocking. She stated that at that time the door

burst open and the persons entering here fired guns at the individuals inside the apartment. In that connection

another BPP survivor of the raid testified that he had been sleeping in the apartment when he was awakened by shots and before he new what was happening he had been hit by five bullets. He added that he was then handcuffed.

She testified that it was possible that Hampton was asleep when he was killed. another survivor of the raid testified that in addition to being kicked and cursed. b7C even though wounded she fell from a stretcher as the raiders roughly carried her down the steps of the apartment. another survivor of the raid did not testify before the "Inquest". Sources five and six stated that the "coroner" pronounced that the "jury" had found the BPP survivors innocent of any crime and that the raiders were guilty b7C

Both sources stated that the "inquest" was actually a complete farce and could not have been accurate as to detail inasmuch as it was based entirely on information of the survivors of the raid.

#### APPENDIX

BLACK PANTHER PARTY, Also Known As Black Panther Party for Self-Defense

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. NEWTON was sentenced in 1968 to serve 2 to 15 years after being convicted of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther," which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service," states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, GEORGE MASON MURRAY, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement "...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman Mao Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature Mao's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

The national headquarters of the BPP is located at 3106 Shattuck Avenue, Berkeley, California. Branches have been established at various locations throughout the United States.

APPENDIX

CHICAGO COMMITTEE TO DEFEND THE BILL OF RIGHTS (CCDBR)

The CCDBR maintains headquarters in Rooms 801-803, 431 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, Illinois.

A source advised in July, 1960, that RICHARD CRILEY, then a member of the Civil Liberties Commission of the Communist Party (CP) of Illinois, met with key leaders of the CP and was authorized by the CP to form a new organization with broad mass support so long as the new organization would protect the Party interests.

This source advised in October, 1960, that on October 28, 1960, CRILEY reported to the CP leadership that the CCDBR had been organized. He outlined its aims and purposes as being to obtain mass support to abolish the House Committee on Un-American Activities and to defend Smith Act and Taft-Hartley victims. He said there would be no formal affiliation with any other national organization having the same purposes. The CP leadership agreed with the general direction of the CCDBR as outlined by CRILEY.

A second source advised on October 31, 1960, that the CCDBR was formally organized on October 26, 1960, with RICHARD CRILEY as Executive Secretary after he motivated organizing the meeting of October 26, 1960.

A third source advised on May 20, 1969, that the original stated purposes of the CCDBR continue to be adhered to, with CRILEY continuing as the motivating force behind the Committee. The Board of Directors, however, now includes many individuals in the religious, educational and labor fields who are not known as CP members.



#### APPENDIX

## STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as presently regarded, came into being at a founding convention held June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan. From an initial posture of "participatory democracy" the line of the national leadership has revealed a growing Marxist-Leninist adherence which currently calls for the building of a revolutionary youth movement. Concurrently, the program of SDS has evolved from civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war stance to an advocacy of a militant anti-imperialist position. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as the leaders of worldwide struggles against United States imperialism whereas the Soviet Union is held to be revisionist and also imperialist.

At the June, 1969, SDS National Convention, Progressive Labor Party (PLP) forces in the organization were expelled. As a result, the National Office (NO) group maintained its National Headquarters at 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, and the PLP faction set up headquarters in Cambridge, Massachusetts. This headquarters subsequently moved to Each group elected its own national officers, which include three national secretaries and a National Interim Committee of eight. Both the NO forces and the PLP forces claim to be the true SDS. Both groups also print their versions of "New Left Notes" which sets forth the line and the program of the particular faction. The NO version of "New Left Notes" was recently printed under the title "The Fire Next Time" to achieve a broader mass appeal.

Two major factions have developed internally within the NO group, namely, the Weatherman or Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM) I faction, and the RYM II faction. Weatherman is action-oriented upholding Castro's position that the duty of revolutionaries is to make revolution. Weatherman is regarded by RYM II as an adventuristic, elitist faction which denies the historical role of the working class as the base for revolution. RYM II maintains that revolution, although desired, is not possible under present conditions, hence

emphasizes organizing and raising the political consciousness of the working class upon whom they feel successful revolution depends. Although disclaiming control and domination by the Communist Party, USA, leaders in these two factions have in the past proclaimed themselves to be communists and to follow the precepts of a Marxist-Leninist philosophy, along pro-Chinese communist lines.

A second source has advised that the PLP faction which is more commonly known as the Worker Student Alliance is dominated and controlled by members of the PLP, who are required to identify themselves with the pro-Chinese Marxist-Leninist philosophy of the PLP. They advocate that an alliance between workers and students is vital to the bringing about of a revolution in the United States.

SDS regions and university and college chapters, although operating under the outlines of the SDS National Constitution, are autonomous in nature and free to carry out independent policy reflective of local conditions. Because of this autonomy internal struggles reflecting the major factional interests of SDS have occurred at the chapter level since the beginning of the 1969-70 school year.





APPENDIX

PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

The "New York Times" city edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) which had been known as the Progressive Labor Movement.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962, by MILTON ROSEN and MORTIMER SCHEER after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line."

A source advised on June 3, 1968, that the PLP held its Second National Convention in New York City, May 31 to June 2, 1968, at which time the PLP reasserted its objective of the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism. This is to be accomplished through the Party's over-all revolutionary strategy of raising the consciousness of the people and helping to provide ideological leadership in the working class struggle for state power.

The source also advised that at the Second National Convention MILTON ROSEN was unanimously re-elected National Chairman of the PLP and LEVI LAUB, FRED JEROME, JARED ISRAEL, WILLIAM EPTON, JACOB ROSEN, JEFFREY GORDON, and WALTER LINDER were elected as the National Committee to lead the PLP until the next convention.

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor," a bimonthly magazine; "World Revolution," a quarterly periodical; and "Challenge-Desafio," a monthly newspaper.

The April, 1969, issue of "Challenge-Desafio" sets forth that "Challenge is dedicated to the peoples fight for a new way of life--where the working men and women control their own homes and factories; where they themselves make up the entire government on every level and control the schools, courts, police and all institutions which are now used to control them."

Source advised on May 8, 1969, that the PLP utilizes an address of General Post Office Box 808, Brooklyn, New York, and also utilizes an office in Room 617, 1 Union Square West, New York, New York.

# NATIONAL LAWYERS GUILD

The House Committee on Un-American Activities, House report 3123, September 21, 1950, cites the National Lawyers Guild (NLG) as a communist front which is the foremost legal bulwark of the Communist Party (CP) and has never failed to rally to the legal defense of the CP and individual members thereof, including known espionage agents.

A source advised on February 1, 1969, that from the speeches made and the workshops and panel discussions held at a recent Midwest Conference of the NLG, it clearly appeared that the NLG is being developed from a "complacent, old left type organization" into a strong active supporter of the "new left."

A second source advised during April, 1969, that the President of the NLG spoke at an NLG banquet held in New York City on April 12, 1969, stating that the NLG has organized young people to work in a radical movement which is seeking to destroy a corrupt, violent society and replace it with one which will benefit all.

A third source advised on April 17, 1969, that the President of the New York Chapter of the NLG spoke at the above banquet stating that the purpose of the NLG is to advance the "social revolution" taking place in this country. In furtherance of this purpose, the NLG has established Student Guild Chapters and given counsel to draft resistors and military personnel seeking peace.

As of July 23, 1969, the NLG National Office was located at 5 Beekman Street, New York, New York.



The next speaker was CHARLES GARRY, San Francisco, California, attorney for the BPP. GARRY brought greetings from HUEY NEWTON and GARRY said the situation faced by the conference is not to know the problem but to cope with its solution. The power structure is taking advantage of hysteria in the country to bring about a fascist state, American style. Actually, the problem is quite simple: racism and male supremacy are combined. According to GARRY, every white is a racist and every male is a supremist. Economic oppression leads to all other kinds of oppression. Unless this is recognized, the fight cannot be carried on. The position of the government is that in order to maintain the economy in this country, genecide must be committed even on people outside the United States. A curtain of fear must be drawn to keep the people divided. Dissent cannot be allowed if the United States

is carrying on an imperialist war inside and outside the United States. But, racism cannot be fought with racism; it must be fought with socialism. Then, in attempting to show how racism and fascism are taking place within the court system of the United States, GARRY spoke concerning the \_\_\_\_\_\_ case and the HUEY NEWTON case, in both of which GARRY is active for the defense. GARRY indicated that in the \_\_\_\_\_\_ trial the defense will attempt to prove that the murder with which he is charged was actually engineered by \_\_\_\_\_\_\_

(In a subsequent conversation with RICHARD CRILEY and JACK KLING, they stated that the Communist Party, USA does not like the characterization by GARRY of every white as a racist. They stated that this was an unfortunate formulation. They will agree that one can say in every white there may be an unconscious expression of racism, but GARRY did not give credit to some whites of goodwill.)

Unless the black people are given equity, then they should say no to the "master" for his crumbs.

the BPP is the central task of the people's movement today.

The enemy moves out of weakness and fear. They are afraid of the movements in the ghettos and the universities. They are afraid of the peace movement. The ruling class is unable to solve the immediate problems of the sub-society, and they have, therefore, decreed that the policy shall be that of "benign neglect." The BPP defense is crucial because the power structure is frightened of "power to the people." He called upon the conference to plan for the political defense of the BPP. Movements should be organized and directed against the judge in the "New York 21" trial. Demonstrations should be so directed to accomplish the freedom of the Panthers in New York. A national campaign must be organized to bring the murderers of FRED HAMPTON and MARK CLARK to justice. A movement

Hospital Workers Union, New York City, called for black-white unity and indicated that the real enemy of the people is the economic establishment. She stated that last week Local 1199 contributed \$1,000 to the BPP defense fund. BPP, San Francisco, California, then responded to a headline, "Panther Leader Rebukes Conference, Then Walks Out," which had appeared in the Sunday edition of the "Chicago Sun-Times" newspaper. This headline allegedly described actions at the Saturday session. threatened the reporters who would write such headlines. He said that if the reporters came around to interview the Black Panthers, the Panthers will kill them. Chicago, Illinois, indicated that the question of the BPP defense is a question of selfinterest for everyone. He showed how the "RAP BROWN bill" became the means of jailing white people; i.e., the "Conspiracy 7." He said we are not here to plan the defense, issue by issue, but to plan a program for survival. He tried to show that the country's hierarchy has a full-blown plan, not an issue by issue attack, and the people must respond to this with a full program of defense. called for the 1970s to be the years of the defense of civil liberties in this country.

During this session there were reports from the four workshops. The essence of these reports is as follows:

I Demonstrative Actions to the United Nations and Other Demonstrative Actions Against Repression

This workshop resolved, after charging the American Government with genocide against black people, to petition the United Nations for redress of grievances on the question of racism. They asked the Emergency Conference to establish a Continuations Committee to undertake the formulation of such a petition to the Secretary General of the United Nations. This petition is to be signed by other national liberation forces. The Continuations Committee should attempt to mobilize national progressive forces behind this petition. This petition should be used as a key to organize the peoples of the world around the issue of racism and ultimately against U.S. imperialism worldwide. There should be an agreement to attempt to institute through this petition reparation for crimes against black, brown, and minority people. The workshop called for the organization of picket lines in front of department stores that allow their names to be used in the indictment of the BPP in New York City.

- 5) To provide that the national staff of the BPP should decide on the priority of all funds;

This created an atmosphere that was not present throughout the rest of the conference which was conducted in an atmosphere of cooperation and black-white unity. This workshop recommended that regional and urban conferences on repression be organized. It called for the support of the "we charge genocide" workshop decisions (Workshop I). made the following recommendations from this workshop: 1) The key point of this workshop was that "we are at war and we must act accordingly." On the question of political stated that they must be gotten out of jail on prisoners. bail or they must be gotten out some other way. There was a clear implication in proposals that violence be used if nothing else worked. 2) We are at war with the total judicial system in this country and we must prevent people from going to jail by violence if necessary. 3) The workshop called for the development of local police power and for the development of people's courts. 4) The effectiveness of the Panthers is seen in the food and health programs which are being repressed because they

are being effective. The workshop called for the establishment of more food and health programs.

5) called for the development of revolutionary schools which would have not only standard curriculum but also a revolutionary curriculum.

workshops, presentation of the reports of the workshops, presented a resolution to the effect that the Emergency Conference would go on record as endorsing the World Peace Council call for a world conference against repression, a conference to be held during 1970, and that a copy of this resolution would be sent to the press and to the World Peace Council.

During the Sunday session,

Akron, Ohio, made an appeal for funds. These funds and checks were turned over to the Emergency Conference Committee. The mandate from the conference to the Continuations Committee is that it organize around the right of the BPP to exist and that funds are to be used for this purpose. Therefore, it would appear that the funds will be used at the discretion of the Continuations Committee, probably to pay the bills of the conference, the expenses of setting up a permanent office, the expenses involved in getting out certain immediate material to defense groups throughout the country, etc. The committee may also be making a direct contribution to the defense funds of


The Continuations Committee is empowered to enlarge itself if it so chooses. It was announced that the continuing organization will operate from a headquarters in New York City.

A review of our central records system at FBI Headquarters revealed that you are the subject of four main files or investigations.

The first file is a correspondence file which contains 36 pages, 34 of which are being released to you. Two pages were denied in their entirety pursuant to exemption (b) (1).

The second file concerns the investigation of a spurious news release of which you were the victim. This file consists of 136 pages, 135 of which are being released to you. One page originated with the Watergate Special Prosecution Force and has been referred to the National Archives and Records Service for review. A representative of this agency will correspond directly with you regarding this document.

You were also one of the subjects of a possible election laws violation. This file contains 54 pages, 51 of which are enclosed. The remaining three documents originated with the Department of Justice (DOJ) and have been referred to that agency for direct response to you.

In addition, one FBI document contained information from the DOJ and was referred for consideration. We will advise you of the results of this review when the consultation is completed.

The remaining file is an investigation regarding a fraud against the government. This file contains 23 pages, 14 of which are released to you. The remaining nine pages were denied pursuant to exemptions (b) (7) (C) and (b) (7) (D). Please be advised that all of these files are in a closed status.

In addition to the above, your name was referenced in one document which was located in the file of another individual and/or organization. This document is enclosed.

Unless noted and explained, a search of references to your name in the files of other individuals or organizations, i.e., "see" references, was not undertaken. To verify most "see" references requires the submission of information identifying the individual(s) and/or organization(s) with whom you were associated and the time frame of the association(s).

The search for information in response to your request was limited to those records in our central records system which are maintained at FBI Headquarters, Washington, D. C. During any significant FBI criminal or intelligence investigation, all substantive information developed by one or more field offices is reported promptly to our Headquarters where it is compiled in a single investigative file. It is from such a file or files that the enclosed records were copied. If you believe additional files of a minor nature exist which may be responsive to your inquiry and which were never reported to Headquarters, you may write directly to any field office for those materials.

The Central Intelligence Agency referred four documents to the FBI for consultation. Two of these documents were denied in their entirety pursuant to exemptions (b) (1) and (b) (7) (D). The remaining two documents are enclosed.
