> The headquarters of this office advised by communication. dated May 1, 1972, that Bernard Fensterwald, an attorney at Washington, D.C., had requested copies of photos of the unidentified white male which were shown to Mexico City resident Pedro Gutierrez Valencia as of January, 1964, in connection with investigation to develop activities and contacts of Oswald immediately prior to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, November 22, 1963. Gutierrez, who at that time was a credit investigator at Mexico City, had conducted inquiry at the Cuban Embassy, Mexico City, on or about September 30, 1963, and, shortly after the assassination of President Kennedy, reported that in the course of his inquiry at the Cuban Embassy he believed he had observed Oswald.

On approximately November 23, 1963, Mr. Winston M. Scott of your office furnished to this office for use in connection with the Oswald investigation photographs which were reportedly taken on October 1 and October 4, 1963, of an individual believed to be an American who had visited the Russian Embassy, Mexico City, on those dates.
