BACKGROUND

Reference is made to the memorandum of Mr. P. F. Dougherty to Mr.

V. P. Keay concerning the above subjects, dated March 7, 1952, wherein the Security Section was requested to prepare memoranda for transmittal to CIA (1) concerning the above subjects. The main files on these individuals have been reviewed and the following observations and recommendations are made. It is to be noted that there are many references in the Bureau's files to Alexandra Tolstoy, the Tolstoy Foundation and Mark Weinbaum. These references have not been reviewed in view of the fact that these individuals are informants or sources and have main files concerning them. (2)(c)(3)

Novitsky is an active, unpaid informant of the New York Office, 5-30-98 furnishing information regarding White Russian activities in New York. He has (JPK) been an informant since August, 1950. Prior to that time, the Bureau had not conducted any investigation of Novitsky and no derogatory information was located in the Bureau's files concerning him. (X)(4)

In view of this, it is recommended that CIA be advised that no investigation has been conducted concerning Novitsky. It is further recommended that previous background data concerning him be submitted in the blank memorandum. CIA is not being advised of his identity as an informant. (X)(4)

This individual has been an informant and confidential source of the New York Office since March, 1949. She furnishes valuable information concerning Russian activities in New York, and was the individual who first informed the New York Office of several Soviet defectees, including Oksana Kasienkian. X(4)

Countess Tolstoy is the Director of the Tolstoy Foundation, established in 1936 in memory of her father, Leo Tolstoy. S

An investigation was conducted in 1944 concerning Countess Tolstoy under a Security Matter - G character. This investigation was closed in October, 1944, in view of the fact that there was no evidence of any subversive tendencies on [her] part. It is recommended that reports of this investigation be furnished to CIA, and CIA be advised that no investigation has been conducted concerning Tolstoy or the Tolstoy Foundation since 1944, but that both Countess Tolstoy and the Foundation have been reliably reported to be anti-Communist and anti-Soviet. CIA should not be advised that Countess Tolstoy is a confidential source of the New York Office. X(4)

BACKGROUND:

By your memorandum to Mr. Belmont dated January 3, 1952,
entitled "Russian, Byelorussian, Ukrainian and Relevant Minority
Emigre Groups in the United States; Request from Central Intelligence
Agency," there was recorded the request of the Office of Policy
Coordination, CIA, for name checks on 99 items including 99
organizations, variations in their title and important officials,
making a total of 220 name check requests. With the exception of
two organizations on which there are pending cases being supervised
in the Espionage Unit and the name checks on which are being handled
by the Espionage Unit, all the name checks on the organizations and
individuals are being handled by the Correlation-Liaison Unit.

In connection with the request, CIA stated that they
wanted to contact some of the organizations or their representatives
to use in their psychological warfare program. CIA desires copies
of any reports or information concerning the organizations and
wants to be advised whether or not the Bureau is conducting an
investigation regarding the organizations. CIA desires to be
furnished information received in the future by the Bureau concerning
