Information has been reported previously concern-  
ing the presentation by Dr. Jose Miro Cardona, President of  
the Cuban Revolutionary Council (CRC), of his resignation on  
the night of April 9-10, 1963. At that time the CRC refused  
to accept his resignation.

It was also reported that Miro would again tender  
his resignation on April 18, 1963.

[On the evening of April 17, 1963, MM T-1] <sup>(u)</sup> who has  
furnished some reliable information in the past, and who is  
employed by the CRC, advised that Miro had been holding dis-  
cussions that day of an informal nature with other members  
of the CRC, and that Miro remained determined to submit his  
resignation and at the same time to make public a lengthy  
statement, one copy of which had already been turned over to  
Mr. Robert Hurwitch of the State Department. [MM T-1] said <sup>(u)</sup>  
this statement described in detail Miro's negotiations and  
agreements with the United States State Department, and with  
high government officials, and that, in effect, his state-  
ment charges that the United States Government has changed  
its policy to one of peaceful coexistence with communist  
Cuba, and expresses the belief that Cuban exiles will be  
abandoned by the United States in their fight against Fidel  
Castro. <sup>(u)</sup>
