The following information concerning the activities of the Soviet Embassy in Mexico City was developed during the month of November 1950:

3. 2. Activities of the Military Personnel:

- Q. S. On 1 November Captain Carlos SANTABLER Bonilla, of the Second Section of the Mexican Army Stair, contacted Micolay D. Billy, Soviet Assistant Navai Attache, and invited all the members of the military staif to attend a meeting at the Second Section's headquarters on 5 November 1950, at 12100 to meet the new head of the Second Section, Lt. Col. Arturo ONUMA Handloros. On > Hovember Visutair With Will, employee of the Military Attache's Office, contacted Major Alfredo WWW. - On 19 November an unidentified woman contacted the soviet Embassy on benaif of Guatemaian Military Attache, Colonel Fornando, COMEZ Ayau, to ascertain who would attend the dinner being given on the 21st. The following military men with their wives were to attend: Grigori Karakipukers, Naval Attache; Vladimia S. MAKOVKIN, Military Attache, Yuriy A. CHELLANOV, Assistant Military Attache; Vladimia COKOLOV, Assistant Military Attache; REMIZOV; and BIKOV
- H. On 20 hovember Nikolay I. MUSHCHIN, employee of the Naval Attache's office, informed Enrique Ball'Anaz Holt, Acting G-2 of the Navy, and that all persons who received invitations—NALIFORTS and wife, having and wife, would attend the cocktail party the following day. To a question by Ball'Anaz as to the other military officers, he replied that MAKOVKIN, CHALPANOV, and SEKOLOV would also attend.

(The phone number mentioned, 27-03-00, is believed to be the phone of Emilio CARCIA Riera, Spanish Communist and employee of the Czech Legation.)

Ignacie GUNZALEZ Guzman: GUNZALEZ Guzman, Communist front member, made arrangements to meet with PAPOROV on 17 November at 11:00 a.m. (also see HN 200)

5. David ALFARD: ALFARD, son of Mexican communist artist David ALFARD Siquieros, attempted to contact Matvey P. 120TOV, formerly of the Soviet Commercial Office and the representative for International Book, on 19 November. He was told that IZOTOV had left Mexico and that he should call on Aleksey CLEVCHENKO for anything he wanted.

On 29 November, however, he told her that everything was arranged and that the painters would be there the following day. They hlammed to meet at his new home, Musto Leon 192-10, the next day.

- 2. Francisco (lnu): On 26 November one Francisco (lnu) of the Migration Department was in contact with Yevgeniy M. POPOV, Third Secretary. (see HMM-2104)

C. Miscellaneous Contacts:

- 1. On 1 November Nikolay V. AKDENOV, Second Secretary, attempted to contact Marie FORASTIERI Garcia, mamber of the UGOCM (Union General de Obreros y Campesinos de Mexico), trade union group which was invited to Moscow in April 1900 by the Soviet Trade Union Council, and was informed that he would not be back to work until Saturday. - 11. On 17 November MATVEYEV spoke with an unidentified woman concerning the best place to send an invitation to Manuel ZORRILLA Rivers. He was given ZORRILLA's home address, Calle de Lerdo 102, Tizapan, and his office address, Madero 34-17. On 22 November ZORRILLA and Ricardo Li ZEVALA of the Banco Nacional de Comercio Exterior, informed the Embassy that they might be a little late to the luncheon with the Ambassador that day, as they had to attend an urgent meeting at the Union de Asucar (Sugar Union.)
- 12. Boris SCHEIMAN, partner in De Swaan, S.A., invited the Ambassador to dinner on 25 November, but the latter was unable to accept, and they then made arrangements for the Ambassador to visit SCHEIMAN at his home, Lomas Altas 190 on Sunday, 30 November. (see HMM-2106)

J. Andrey P. VOLUHKOV of the Commercial Office departed Mexico by KLM on 3 November, on return to the USSR.

V. Miscellaneous:

A. Anti-Soviet Demonstrations:

- During the month of November the Soviet smbassy in Mexico City received numerous complaints concerning the Russians' action in Hungary. Various Mexicans contacted the Embassy, accusing the Soviets of being murderers, and threatening to attack them.
- 2. An unidentified man, who claimed to be a member of the Comite de la Paz and a friend of Dionisios ENCINA and General Heriberto JARA, contidentially informed PAPOHOV on 7 November concerning certain activities being carried out against the Soviets. He stated that around five thousand leaflets were being printed for circulation protesting the Hungarian situation, and that an employee of Ultimas Noticias, Raul HODRIGUEZ, was being paid (by the United States) to publish articles in his paper against the Soviets. He also mentioned that a friend of his, who is a member of the Frente Popular Anti-Comunista, had approached him for aid in painting anti-Soviet signs on walls in Mexico City, but he had not been interested as he did not sympathize with their organisation.
- 3. On 8 November the head of the Mexican Police Service conferred with AKSENOV on the subject of police protection for the Embassy, ASENOV indicated that Secret Service men were around the Embassy at that time, and that he would be glad to furnish them with a pair of uniformed

grenadier guards to stand at the corner or door of the Embassy if they so desired. AKJE OV consulted with the Ambassador who agreed with the idea, and plans were made to have the grenadiers be at the Embassy for ten to fifteen days, or as long as was necessary.

- 4. On 10 November one Francisco ALOASO contacted the Embassy to inform them that the writer of an article in Lumiero protesting the Hungarian situation was a despicable person who was paid by the "Yank Embassy."
- 5. On 16 November HABITKEVICH sent Audio SARU EZ Va.ques of the Soviet propaganus office down to witness an anti-Soviet demonstration taking place in front of one of the Secretariats. SARC EZ reported that some three-numbered persons were there.
- B. On 18 November BRUHOV informed members of the Embassy that on that evening he was going to show films of Bulganin's reception in London.
- c. A Mexican medical student contacted the Empassy on 19 November requesting the name and address of the Soviet discus thrower who was involved in the uniortunate incident in London. He indicated that he would like to send her a letter and gift as an expression of friendship from a Mexican admirer.
- D. On 27 November SIDIAKIN, Administrative Officer of the Sabassy, contacted the firm of Almacen Chica concerning an automatic door which they wanted installed.
