There are 72 machines in operation.</p> <p>C. Exploitation of Material</p> <p>An example of LIEUNVOY material were the calls made by Carlos Fuentes Macias, Communist writer, to several Mexican Communists and to the Cuban Ambassador asking them for material on the situation in Latin America to be used in a proposed debate on NBC between himself and Richard Goodwin, Deputy Assistant Secretary of State. April 1962

April 3rd., a man from the comp. "Comercial Superior" called Czech informing him that they were purchasing the dir. corps. Their office was on the Str. Bixental St. Antonio. He asked if he could come to see Czech at the Emb. On April 4th., an other man from the same comp. called Czech saying that Mr. Marquez had to come to see Czech, but he could not come, so no would come to see him in 1 hr. OK.

April 5th., a man from the Emb. of Indonesia called Czech, who was not in. To call him at home. On (invitation).

April 5th., a woman from Mr. Espinosa (fmu), comp. "Importadora Mexicana" called Czech, who was not in. She wanted to talk about cigarettes, which Czech ordered. Mr. Espinosa called again about the franchise.

April 9th., Czech called the forwarding agency Villaseal y Guerrero about his lift-van. April 16th., he called ditto and was told to call Altmannsport (Frans Feuchtwanger).

April 11th., the Emb. of Japan asked when Czech was leaving. Answer April 16th., April 12th., Mr. Naito (phonetic, fmu) from the Japanese Emb. invited Mr. and Mrs. Czech for a Japanese dinner at the Japanese Club, April 14th., at 20.00. Accepted. He asked also to bring with him Czech's neighbour, whom he met at Czech's home 1st time. OK.

Frans Feuchtwanger sent Czech a message that his lift-van left for Veracruz April 11th.

April 12th.,(evening) Mrs. Czech called her husband at the Emb. informing him that a man, "Mr. Daniel" called him at home. She said that he could be from the Soviet Emb.

April 13th., "Mr. Daniel" called Czech at home. See special report.

April 13th., Mokes called Kubata at home asking for Czech. Kubata said that Czech is not with him, but he was not with Kubata at Kubata's home and then he was executed at Kubata's. Mokes said only 1/1/62.

April 16th., Cuban de Ivinçion called that their flight today was cancelled. Mr. Czech made the man to notify her husband at the Emb. Czech called his wife asking her to stop packing. Their leaving was postponed.

April 16th., Mrs. Czech called her husband at the office asking him to come home. Mr. and Mrs. Sboril came to visit them. OK, coming.

April 17th., was said that Mokes decided that Czech, Patrivaldo and Boack would fly together to Cuba April 20th., by Cubana de Av.

April 17th., Evoboda called Czech, who was for lunch at The 11's, asking him to come to the Emb. saying "it was necessary". Czech called from the Emb. Pushe asking him to come to the Emb. OK.

Dr. Strope (fmu) from the Emb. of Haiti called Czech, who was not in on March 23rd.

Cubana de Aviación called Czech, March 23rd., and left a message that tickets for him, his wife and children would be ready from Prague.

March 25th., Kubala told Noosa that he could fly to Prague with Czech's family by Cubana de Aviación. He said "Czech is not flying tomorrow, so you won't have time to arrange your matter with your lift-men in Mexico".

Cech called his friend at Cuban de Aviación, Mr. Guillermo Jaramillo, who was not in. He wanted to ask about arrival of the plane.

Cech called Mr. Santella Dorentes at the Ford Corp. of Mexico. He was not in. He called again and Dorentes promised Cech to come to the Emb. Feb. 20th., and bring him a letter authorizing the Emb. to take over a new car in Laredo, Mex.

The First Secr. of the Emb. of Haiti, Dr. Simeon (Snu) called Cech, who left for home. He said that he had an appointment with Cech at 14.30, so he was going to call him at home.

Cech went for holidays in Acapulco end of the month. He stayed in Acapulco at Hotel Versailles, near Galeria, phone 2-07-46.

Mrs. Petrivska was transferred to the Czechoslovak Embassy in Havana, Cuba. She made a reservation at Cubanair de Av. for the 16th of April and she wanted to fly with Czech and his family. Her leaving was postponed because the Cubanair flight was cancelled.

April 10th., Petrivska was writing an application for Rev. visa for Miroslav Sobotka, who was now vice-general manager of Kovo and wanted to come to Mexico to deal with the textile factory "Normig". She gave a message to Mr. Edward Cejka that his new Czechoslovak passport was ready, to come for it to the Emb.

Petrivska called Mr. Franz Neuchtwanger, April 11th., about transportation of Kovo's belongings to Czechoslovakia.

Kozosnikov called Petrivska asking her to tell Mr. Martin (fmu) (who was teaching Spanish at the Emb.) that she could not come to his lesson.

April 13th., Petrivska asked Mr. Josef Burian how long he planned to stay in Peru 3 weeks. The Cons. Wieser (or Vice) in Lima, Peru, would give references about Burian.

Mrs. Daniela Filipensky replaced Petrivska at the Emb., working in the morning until 13.00 and Mrs. Hela Svoboda, who was working in the afternoon.

OK, coming. Malosik said "we have a funny matter here, you manana will see when you are here". Malosik continues: "It is about mail etc., do you understand?"

Hokes told his wife that Mr. and Mrs. Nees arrived from Monterrey, March 5th.

Mr. Schind (Inu, phonetic) called Velosik notifying him that a snapshot of "Icke", Mr. Tello and the Mr. President would appear in "Ultima Noticia". Both agreed to meet in front of "Novedades" at 17.00, January 11th., and go to the coffee-shop Flamingo.

Mr. Ramon Seville from IV, Canal 11, called Velosik and asked him for film. Mrs. Leon Mrs. Brigitte Alexander told Velosik that she was back from Caracas and Europe, where she made many friends.

Mr. Tenner (fnu) from Acme Imause called Filipensky asking him what kind of machinery he was handling. Rolling machines, which were represented in Mexico by Eric Guegnier, Eric de Mexico, S.A. Filipensky called comp. "Superretato", Mr. Aleman asking him if he sold the car Oldsmobile \$1. yes, it will be paid in one week. Filipensky speaks Russian quite well.

Mr. Julio Treviño from Monterrey, Maquinaria Skoda, Monte Rey, called Filipensky informing him that Mr. Rodriguez (fnu) told him that he was now representing Eric de Mexico in Monterrey and that he, Treviño, could not sell machines. He also complained that he never got a commission from Balboa, Maquinaria Skoda, Mexico City, for whom he was working. Filipensky said that he would come to Monterrey and arrange the matter. - Mr. Ludek Hubeny from Czechoslovakia Consulate in Monte Rey called Filipensky about ditto matter. He said that Treviño was "an influential man" in Monterrey, so not to make him angry. Guegnier wrote an officiating letter to Treviño and his clients, asking them not to work with him (Treviño). Filipensky said that he could not eliminate Guegnier, because he was financing Czechoslovak machines on credit, "otherwise we would work in the North (of Mexico) alone". - Filipensky called Hubeny informing him that he arranged with Guegnier to give Treviño a commission of 5%, to make the liquidation with him easier. Guegnier's new agent in Monterrey would be the comp. "Impulsorn Industrial", which was unknown to Hubeny, who would investigate about this comp. He heard that several industries in Monterrey did not want to cooperate with this comp.

Boček said that Filipensky gave to eng. Eric Guegnier Sliwowitz. (Czechoslovak liquor). Guegnier called Filipensky many times. He asked to send the mechanic Peterek to Guadalajara. OK. He called again about air-ticket for Peterek, for his flight to Guadalajara. The com. had to pay it. Then he was talking about new contract, which Strojexport, Czechoslovakia, had to make with Guegnier. - Guegnier wanted Filipensky or Zboril to send a study about the economic situation in Mexico to Czechoslovakia, Strojexport, for the purpose to get for Guegnier better credit conditions. OK.

Filipensky called his landlord, 21-17-07, Mr. Usaljeju, about repairs at his apt. No. 2, Str. Hazel.

Filipensky was talking with Kryl about their custom agent, Mr. Zamudio, saying that he had a bad character and that they had to be careful with him.

April 23rd., Babel asked Mr. Filibensky to send regularly the Czech magazine, Czechoslovávia de Hoy to: Mr. Francisco Javier Lacina L., Street Galerna.

April 28th., Babel called a hotel (unclear name) making a reservation for Mr. Brabence, (fnn), who would stay one week or 10 days. Babel did not know his first name. He would arrive by Sabena tomorrow at 01.00. - Babel called eng. Joes Sautny informing him about Brabence's arrival. Sautny thought it would not be necessary to go with Babel to the airport. He suggested that Babel and Brabence would come to Sautny's office at 18.00 and then they would go for dinner. Sautny did not consider Brabence's arrival opportune, because commercial situation was bad and clients were cancelling orders.

Mr. Ferreras (fmu) called Babel, March 1st. Babel called Jillich many times. Mostly they were talking about business and payments from Mr. Elias Iaskovich (phonetic). March 8th., Junek called Babel informing him that the English material, he bought from Babel, which material was imported to Mexico either final franchise, was not original material. Junek gave the material to his brother-in-law, Dr. Francisco Roth, who found out at his tailor the swindle. Babel wanted to take the material back and give it back to the importer (Mr. Murray Long). March 20th., Babel asked Junek to transfer his visa, which Mr. Elias Iakovich asked for a Echo oficer (prob. Mr. Kratochvifl, fmu), from Caracas to Prague, because this officer would go first to Mexico.

Mr. José Kohn was No. 28 and Mr. King No. 7. Smutny expected orders from clients: Nezli, Vclav Vrany, Mr. Pablo Weil, Mr. Mateo in Guadalajara. Babel informed Smutny that Mr. José Kohn had now money, paid him without troubles 6000 Dllrs and was going now to St. Moritz, Switzerland where he wanted to meet vice-president from Gablons. Then Kohn planned a business trip to Hong-Kong in May. - Smutny called Babel Feb. 8th., about orders from Mr. King (fmu) and said that Mr. Lukay (phon) did not unpack the merchandise which he received. Mr. Guijara gave Smutny a large order for pearls, 9000 Dllrs. Smutny called Babel again and was informed that Mr. Korcina (fmu) from Gablons would arrive by Sabena Feb. 9th. So Babel could not fly with Smutny to Guadalajara. Korcina wanted to stay in Mexico about 10 days and deal with Mr. José Kohn about new orders. Smutny already sent all his orders to Czechoslovakia, not to appear Korcina's visit in Mexico successful. He had no answer, so he asked Smutny to write to Mr. Wilson (fmu) to check this matter. OK.

José Kohn called Babel asking him to bring him shipping documents and he would give Babel a check for 6.655.20 Dllrs. OK. Babel called Kohn's office leaving a message that Mr. Korcina would arrive by Sabena flight 555 Feb. 10th. Babel told Svestka

John would be back in one week and then meet Babel. On. Feb. 26th., John called Babel informing him that he met Korcina in Panama where he signed him new orders, one for Colombia for 9.000 Dllrs. John was urging shipping documents for the merchandise he already paid. Babel called him that part of the shipping documents arrived. He said that he just got a letter from Mr. V-nicek, Czechoslovakia, informing him that the merchandise was dispatched, but no documents arrived.

Babel called Mr. (Pedro?) Rainer, who said that he would come to Babel's office and bring him a check. OK. Engr. Freiser (phon) called Babel about merchandise from Chemapol. Babel asked for full name of Mr. David Freidkef, phone 25-25-06.

Babel called Lic. Luis Seville. He wanted to visit him and talk about the comp. "Anilina y Productos", which could not pay for merchandise from Chemapol. Seville asked him to come to his home Jardin del Centenario 16, Coyacan.

Kubat informed Babel that a Czech exhibition would take place beginning of March and asked him to come to see the exhibition place. Babel said that he would take with him Mr. William Junek, who was Czechoslovak representative for glass. He said that Mr. Faskowich was only a distributor. - Junek called Babel about glass for Palacio de Hierro and payments from Mr. Elies. Babel told Svestka that Korcina needed visa for Ecuador, to arrange it. Korcina needed also visa for Peru, which had to be transferred for him to Colombia.

Babel called Mr. Ximurgi urging him to pay the drafts from Gablonz.

Engr. Freitzer (phon, Ihu) called Babel about a contract he had to sign. Babel asked him to communicate with Lic. Luis Seville, the lawyer of the Fmb.

The differences would be paid in US\$, and Porcel would set a commission. Nizera wanted to see films, which Mexico was going to send to the film-festival in Karlovy Vary (Karlsbad), Czechoslovakia. - Porcel asked for a list of Czechos films with prices. Mr. Pescador told Porcel that he would buy Czech short films. - Porcel informed Nizera that "Peliculas Nacionales" bought the distribution rights for the film (Czechos) "Donde los Rios Tienen Sol" and they needed 3 copies and publicity material. The contract would be 60% of the interests one for Prague and 40% for "Peliculas Nacionales". Then Porcel asked how to get films to Mexico. Nizera said that "to get them through the Diplomatic pouch is better, and getting them through Cuba it is easier and cheaper".

Zboril said that he would come to Lic. Lagos' office at 18.30. OK. Petrivalská called Zboril informing him that a messenger brought pas ports of Lic. Lagos and his son. She said that he already got a Czechoslovakian visa before Christmas and it was not sure if Prague would ask to give him new visa or to extend the old ones. Zboril said "he is a special envoy of the highest person here (President of Mex.)".

Engineer Hector Dominguez from Monterrey called Hubeny informing him that he could not go for lunch with Zboril April 19th.

Mrs. Zboril went with Mrs. Hökes to have a tea party at the Emb. of Chile, April 23rd.

Zboril was called at the Emb. and informed that the Cuban attache, with whom he arranged a meeting, arrived at the com.dep. April 26th.

Zboril asked for the name of the Governor of the State Campeches. Jose Ortiz Avila.

March 16th., Zboril called Fuchs asking him to come to a meeting in the afternoon. He informed Fuchs that he spoke with Hokes and Cech about sending info about Central America and they had to talk about it at the meeting.
