Material Processed</p> <p>In March, the LIENVOY IP provided the Station with 113 pages of daily resumes, 69 tapes from three Czech lines, 110 tapes from the Soviet lines with the transcriptions of the Spanish conversations, (1 Spanish transcriptions from the Cuban lines and 10 pieces of other material. There are 12 machines in operation.</p>

Exploitation of Material</p> <p>An example of LIENVOY material were the calls made by Carlos MONTES Macias, Communist writer, to several Mexican Communists and to the Cuban Ambassador asking them for material on the situation in Latin America to be used in a proposed debate on NBC between himself and Richard Goodwin, Deputy Assistant Secretary of State. Howard G. Safarano continues to meet Arnold V. Arehart each morning.

April 3rd., a man from the comp. "Comercial Superior" called Cech informing him that they were supplying the dist. corps. Their office was on the Str. Diagonal St. Antonio. He asked if he could come to see Cech at the Emb. Of. April 4th., an other man from the same comp. called Cech saying that R. Marques had to come to see Cech, but he could not come, so NO would come to see him in an hour. OK.

April 5th., a man from the Emb. of Indonesia called Cech, who was not in. To call him at home. OK (invitation).

April 5th., a woman from Sr. Espinosa (Gnu), comp. "Importadora Mexicana" called Cech, who was not in. She wanted to talk about cigarettes, which Cech ordered. Sr. Espinosa called again about the franchise.

April 9th., Cech called the forwarding agency Villareal y Guerrero about his lift-van. April 16th., he called ditto and was told to call Alltransport (Frans Neuchtwanger).

April 11th., the Emb. of Japan asked when Cech was leaving. Answer April 16th. April 12th., Mr. Naito (phonetic, fna) from the Japanese Emb. invited Sr. and Mrs. Cech for a Japanese dinner at the Japanese Club, April 15th., at 20.00. Accepted. He asked also to bring with him Cech's neighbour, whom he met at Cech's home 1 at time. OK.

Frans Neuchtwanger sent Cech a message that his lift-van left for Veracruz April 11th.

April 12th., (evening) Mrs. Cech called her husband at the Emb. informing him that a man, "Mr. Daniel" called him at home. She said that he could be from the Soviet Emb.

April 13th., "Mr. Daniel" called Cech at home. Saw special report.

April 13th., Hoken called Kubata at home asking for Cech. Kubata said that Cech was not with him, but he was now with Lucha at Lucha's home and then he was expected at Kubata's. Hoken said only "OK".

April 16th., Cubana de Aviacion called that their flight today was cancelled. Mr. Cech asked the man to notify her husband at the Emb. Cech called his wife asking her to stop packing. Their leaving was postponed.

April 16th., Sr. Cech called her husband at the office asking him to come home. Mr. and Mrs. Boril came to visit them. OK, coming.

April 17th., was a id that Hoken decided that Cech, Petrivalak and Boeck would fly together to Cuba April 20th., by Cubana de Av

Mr. and Mrs. Cech were invited by the Japanese Emb. to a Japanese dance show at Bellas Artes, March 8th. Accepted.

Mr. Ferreras (fnu) was interested to buy (radio-cord-player) from Cech. Sports would bring Ferreras to Cech's home.

Dr. Nizeta (fnu) from the Emb. of Haiti called Cech, who was not in March 23rd.

Cubana de Aviación called Cech, March 23rd., and left a message that tickets for him, his wife and children arrived from Prague.

March 25th., Kubota told Neese that he could fly to Czecho with Cech's family by Cubana de Aviación. He said "Cech is not flying tomorrow, so you would have time to arrange your matter with your lift-ven in Mexico".

March 27th., Cech called 20-77-01, Mr. Ritter saying that he would visit him in the afternoon. OK.

Cech asked Haken to accompany him to a reception at the Emb. of United Arab Rep., Feb. 15th AM.

Cech called his friend at Cubana de Aviacion, Mr. Guillermo Jarroff, who was not in. He wanted to ask about arrival of the plane.

Cech called Mr. Santella Dorantes at the Ford Cons. of Mexico. He was not in. He called again and Dorantes promised Cech to come to the Emb. Feb. 20th., and bring him a letter authorizing the Emb. to take over a new car in Laredo, Tex.

The First Secy. of the Emb. of Haiti, Dr. Sineau (Gau) called Cech, who left for home. He said that he had an appointment with Cech at 14.30, so he was going to call him at home.

Cech called Mr. Ritter at "Electronica Electromecanica" about payment and repair of a tape recorder.

Feb. 26th., Cech called the Emb. saying that he visited a doctor who was making analysis of his blood-sugar and blood-pressure. (It seems that Cech has a diabetes).

Mr. and Mrs. Cech accepted invitation to a cocktail at the Emb. of Israel, given by the 1st. secretary, January 23rd.

The Consul of the Emb. of Haiti, Mr. Binera (phonetic, fnu) wanted to call on Cech at the Czecho Emb. Cech was ill.

Cech went for holidays in Acapulco end of the month. He stayed in Acapulco at Hotel Versailles, near Galea, phone 2-07-46.

April 10th., Petrivalaka was writing an application for Mex. visa for Miroslav Sobotka, who was now vice-gen. manager of Novo and wanted to come to Mexico to deal with the textile factory "Hornos".

She gave a message to Mr. Eduard Cejka that his new Czech passport was ready, to come for it to the Emb.

Petrivalaka called Mr. Franz Feuchtwanger, April 11th., about transportation of Kocak's belongings to Czechoslovakia.

Kozanikov called Petrivalaka asking her to tell Mr. Martin (fnu) (who was teaching Spanish at the Emb) that she could not come to his lesson.

April 13th., Petrivalaka asked Mr. Josef Burian how long he planned to stay in Peru 3 weeks. The cons. officer (or Vice) in Lima, Peru, would give references about Burian.

Hokes told his wife that Mr. and Mrs. Necas arrived from Monterrey. March 5th.

Necas called from Monterrey saying that his family with family of Hubery, Haken and all furniture (furniture truck) would arrive in Mexico April 1st. Hokes ordered that all would drive in a convoy for security reasons.

He also complained that he never got a commission from Bulboa, Maquinaria Skoda, Mexico, for whom he was working. Filipensky said that he would come to Monterrey and arrange the matter. - Mr. Ludek Hubery from Czechoslovak Consulate in Monterrey called Filipensky about ditto matter. He said that Treviño was "an influential man" in Monterrey, so not to make him angry. Guenier wrote an offending letter to Treviño and his clients, asking them not to work with him (Treviño). Filipensky said that he could not eliminate Guenier, because he was financing Czechoslovak machines on credit, "otherwise we would work in the North (of Mexico) alone". - Filipensky called Hubery informing him that he arranged with Guenier to give Treviño a commission of 5%, to make the liquidation with him easier. Guenier's new agent in Monterrey would be the comm. "Impulsora Industrial", which was unknown to Hubery, who would investigate about this comm. He heard that several industries in Monterrey did not want to cooperate with this comm.

Boack said that Filipensky gave to eng. Eric Guenier Sliwowitz. (Czechoslovak liquor). Guenier called Filipensky many times. He asked to send the mechanic Petjrek to Guadalupe. OK. He called again about air-ticket for Petjrek, for his flight to Guadalupe. The comm. had to say it. Then he was talking about new contract, which Strojexport, Czechoslovak, had to make with Guenier. - Guenier wanted Filipensky or Zboril to send a study about the economic situation in Mexico to Czechoslovak, Strojexport, for the purpose to get for Guenier better credit conditions. OK.

Filipensky called his landlord, 21-17-07, Mr. Ugalde Ju, about repairs at his apt. No. 8, Str. Hazel.

Filipensky was talking with Kryl about their custom agent, Mr. Zamudio, saying that he had a bad character and that they had to be careful with him.

Junek gave the material to his brother-in-law, Dr. Francisco Roth, who found out that his tailor the swindler. On Feb. 26th., Kohn called Babel informing him that he met Korcina in Panama where he signed his new orders, one for Colombia for 9,000 Dllrs. Kohn was urging shipping documents for the merchandise he already had. Babel called him that part of the shipping documents arrived. He said that he just got a letter from Mr. Venisek, Czechoslovakia, informing him that the merchandise was dispatched, but no documents arrived.

Babel called Mr. (Pedro?) Reiner, who said that he would come to Babel's office and bring him a check. OK.

Zboril said that they would visit the mayor of Mérida at 09.00, Governor of the State at 10.00, then they would go to "Technology" and at noon he would be at the "Bank" (dealing about henequen). Svestka called Haken informing him that he got an order from Prague to get Mex. visa for engineer Jaroslav Volny, who had to come to Mexico to make publicity for the industrial exhibition in Brno, Czecho. Volny worked formerly in Brazil as representative of Gablons, Czecho. Prague was writing that the National Chamber of Commerce in Guadalajara had to support the application.

Mr. Gruenberger (fnu) called Svestka about his birth-certificate. He said that he had friends in Michailovce, Slovakia, who could get it for him. Fuchs told his wife that he thought that their phone was listened. ^{can}
March 9th.

Fuchs called Mr. Luis Zamudio asking him if he was interested in a Simca car, which the Emb. was selling. To come to the Emb. OK.

March 16th., Zboril informed Fuchs that Mr. Augusto Rincón was in Mexcity. Fuchs needed to talk with him.

Mrs. Fuchs mentioned that they would leave México for good in June or July this year.

March 20th., Licenciado Guiterma (fnu, phonetic) called Fuchs saying that he could not come to see him today, because he had lunch with his father, who was leaving for Haiti. So they postponed their meeting for March 22nd.

Sulak informed Stejr that he had a client for the Skoda cars, which were in Mexico, and the former buyer did not pay them. Stejr said that Prague had to agree with the sale, because they wanted to sue the person, who ordered the cars. There were about 100 Skoda cars here, each could be sold for about 15,000 pesos.

Stejr called Mr. Farcir (fnu) saying that he had ads for him from Kovo, Czech.

Stejr called Mr. Kosebach (fnu), who said that he would say next day. OK. He called Kosebach again about liquidation of drafts.

Mr. Brux (or Brax, unclear name, phonetic, fnu) from the comm. "Precioso" called Stejr, who said that he had no news from Czech. Brux asked Stejr to come to see him. OK. Brux called again and Stejr said that he did not get answer to his cable. - Brux called and Stejr said that he got an answer from Sobotka from Czech, informing him that the measurement apparatus was sent by plane Dec. 7th., and did not arrive yet. Both agreed to meet at the restaurant "Vireuse", and talk it over. OK.

Stejr's Mexican visa expired January 9th., and had to be extended.

Mr. Aurencio Gonzalez called Stejr, who was not in.

Engineer Lause (fnu) from Mexico, S.A., called Stejr, who was not in. He needs spare parts for his Skoda car. To go for it to the Skoda and Jawa dealer Mr. Alejandro Garcia, Bolivar 477, "Motodistribuidora Jawa".

Mr. Gabriel Alvarez called Stejr about a factory, which he had wood-working machinery. Stejr informed Alvarez that Mr. Miroslav Sobotka, his predecessor in Mexico, was now vice-gen. manager of Kovo. Then Julrud informed Stejr that he spoke to the secretary of the Governor, who "will be very glad to receive the Czech commercial attache (Moril)". Both try to expand their business with Kovo.

Mr. Rodrigo Mendoza, who works as Stejr's agent, called informing Stejr about payment of clients and recommended him a man from Guadalejara as a new agent. This man worked formerly for Good Year Oxo. Stejr was very interested in meeting this man. Then Stejr asked Mendoza if he filled out the orders from Costa Rica. Yes, and he would bring them to Stejr next day when he came with the new man. Mrs. Mendoza called Stejr asking him to wait for her husband, who would come with the man from Guadalejara, Mr. de Avila (fnu). OK.

Sperka informed Kubicek that Smutny was giving formerly 1,000 pesos for a year to the Czecho-Mex. Cultural Institute and wanted to renew his subsidy. To write Smutny to his home: Av. New Jersey 15, Col. Méjico. Also Smutny wanted to send his two daughters to the Institute to Czecho lessons. OK.

Córdoba (man) sent a message to Sperka that he would visit him. Feb. 2nd. - Feb. 5th., Miguel Córdoba called Sperka saying that he would come to see him, but the other man would not come. He would tell him later why.

Mr. Weiss (fau) called Sperka several times. He called Sperka, he said that he would come to see him, he got an offer for him. Sperka called Weiss informing him that he got a confirmation (of an order). Feb. 26th., Weiss called Sperka saying that he did not receive the merchandise yet, to write to Prague. OK.

Mr. Elías (fau) called Sperka, who said that he would come to see him. OK.

Feb. 6th., Sperka called Joná Smutný. Both are close friends. Both agreed to go for lunch together.
