<p>(4) <u>LIFEMT/Black</u> LIFEMT's activity in this area has been limited to coverage of the home phone of a Cuban intelligence officer. Unfortunately, due to little of operational value has turned up on this line other than the usual matter of interest.</p> <p>(5) <u>LIFEMT/Mexico</u> LIFEMT's monitoring coverage of POLARIS-1 has provided information of interest to LIFEMT on B-1's planned travel and the delays to that travel as well as his current type and place of employment. Coverage of Judith PEREZ-TO Saura provided the lead on which the recruitment of LUCIANO-1 was based. L-1 was recruited as an access agent to PEREZ-TO for possible future recruitment attempt of her. This coverage has also enabled this station to advise another station of the possible susceptibility to recruitment of a Communist from the country of concern to that station.</p> <p>(6) <u>LIFEMT/PCN</u> In addition to the PEREZ-TO coverage mentioned in paragraph P.A. (5) above, coverage of a member of the PCN Central Committee, Maria CHAVA Tijerina has yielded good information on the pro-Chinese/pro-Soviet inclinations in the PCN as well as target analysis information on various PCN officials.</p> <p>(7) <u>LIFEMT/American Communist Group in Mexico (ACGM)</u> The information provided to the local ODENV office from the coverage of Boris BRUCKER, Charles SMALL (aka SMOLIKOFF) and Ruth and Anna HUBER has been evaluated as valuable by that office. It is particularly useful in cover-up agreements of American Leftists and Communists who travel to Mexico and frequently on to Cuba.</p> <p>(8) <u>LIFEMT/Miscellaneous</u> LIFEMT coverage of a former SMOON agent is of interest to SMOON, Headquarters and the earlier GEMOKS officer in Mexico. <p>LIFEMD-1 has managed to extend his "connection" as investigator of personnel for the telephone company. See SECURITY question below.</p>			
<p>During the reporting period special crew was provided by Headquarters for the treatment of a child of LIFEMD-5. This crew was not available locally and LIFEMD-5 was most grateful for the assistance of his "children" in obtaining this material.</p>

<p>E. <u>SECURITY</u></p>			
<p>LIFEMD-1's efforts to extend his investigatory connection to government layers of the telephone central has proven successful. This greatly increases the access of LIFEMT to a somewhat firm man; the security shown to the LIFEMT liaison and central man when working on installation, repair or removal of LIFEMT wires. This letter can not be fully negated since it is now apparent that in his natural status LIFEMD-1 can never provide the personal back up connection to these LIFEMT personnel that he could enjoy behind his shield. Although the wire tap coverage in a LIFEMT type operation can not be completely eliminated, it is felt that it can be reduced to a variable level.</p>			
<p>The coverage of the Mexican Embassy lines has been assumed by LIFEMOV. Therefore LIFEMT will not have to run the particular risk of re-establishing the coverage. It was the necessarily complicated "jump" from one central man to another that alerted the telephone company crew to check the tap line routing of this coverage. Reported in paragraph P.A. of reference.</p>
