1. Attached is a verifax copy of a letter acquired by Dale C. Gossage under the EMMA program. Juan Morenza, Ejercito Nacional 32-303, Mexico, D. F., is writing to Dr. Guillermo Alonso Pujol, Box 5102, Panama, congratulating him on his son's release from Cuba, saying that he hopes that others will also be liberated.
2. Morenza says that he has been doing all he can in Mexico for two years, in his capacity as a newspaperman, against the Castro regime. When Tony Varona, an old friend, began the Frente Revolucionario Democratico (Democratic Revolutionary Front) in Mexico, he put Morenza in charge of all the press coordination of the FRD as well as keeping contact with other revolutionary groups. As such, he has helped the unity movement which Prio proposed and which developed there in Mexico many months ago, organizing the FRC and the House of Cuban Exiles, whose existence today owes itself to their friend Max Santana and other good friends in exile. A year and a half ago they created the Association of Businessmen, Industrialists, and Professional Men in Exile, of which Morenza is the Press Secretary in the executive organ. He is also a member of the organization of newsmen in exile. All these groups have but one interest - to help return democratic institutions to Cuba.
3. Morenza says that there is now certain movement which indicates to him that action is being planned for very soon. Those involved are Martin Helena, Barquin, and other officials. He hopes the action will be backed by their friends in the US, as without their help there can be no positive solution.
