Dear Mr. Kantor:

In connection with a study concerned with the organization of Slavic studies in the Scandinavian countries and a survey of American scholars and graduate students who are currently taking part in Slavic courses here, I have been advised by friends in the Council of American Learned Societies that you are a graduate student of Slavics at the University of Copenhagen and that you might be interested in some aspects of the project during or after the completion of your work here.
