Acbert Martin RaPHAEL, Montreal, Quebec, a member of the Socialist Labour League (Ligue Socialiste Ouvriere) (L.S.O. - Trotskyist) had received a leaflet on the Congress of Black Writers Conference scheduled to be held at the Stephen Leacock Bldg., and the Student Union Bldg., McGill University, Montreal, Que., from October 11 to October 14, 1968. The leaflet outlined the program of the Conference to be dedicated to the late Rev. Martin Luther KING and Malcolm X, as follows:

- 8. Black Power in U.S. by Stokley CARMICHAEL.
- 9. Black Revolution 3rd World Capitalism by Eldridge CLEAVER and James FOREMAN.

Editorial: "It is in this context, this Congress of Black Writers hopes to make its contribution. Here for the 1st time in Canada an attempt will be made to recall, in a series of popular lectures by vast scholars, artists and politicians, the history which we have been taught to forget. The history, the Blackman's own response, in thought and in action to the conditions of his existence in the New World."

JAMES, POUSSIN, HILL, MOORE, DEPESTRE, JONES, CARMICHAEL, and CLEAVER were mentioned in our letter of September 18, 1968 concerning this Conference. James FOREMAN is believed identical to James FORMAN, an executive member of the Student Non-Violence Co-ordinating Committee in the United States. We have no identifiable reference on Richard SMALL. Rocky JONES, identical to Burnley Allan JONES of Halifax, Nova Scotia, is a prominent Canadian militant leader and organizer in the Halifax Negro community.
