SUBJECT Negotiations Between Ludwig Starke and Rolando Masferrer with a View Toward Mutual Support for Projected Revolutionary Movements

Costa Rica, San Jose ACO (15 - 23 February 1968)

A high-level member of the National Liberation Party (PLN) who has access to and the confidence of top leaders of his party. His strong identification with the PLN and the knowledge that his reporting will reach U.S. official circles probably cause him to present his reporting to the best advantage of the PLN. He has submitted reliable information during the past year, but he has been known to withhold pertinent information. He received the information from Daniel Oduber.

(Field Comment: TDCS-314/01096-68 reported that Ludwig Starke Jimones, a right-wing entropiet who is the leader of the security forces of the Bovinionto Costa Rica Libre (MCAL), Anti-Communist businessen's group, had in-formed Baniol Comber Quiros, of the Mational Liberation Party (PLE), that he was making plans and socking support for a possible move against the Costa Rican Government in the event that At should appear to be in danger of passing into the hands of leftists. To that end Starks was negotiating with sympathetic groups cutside of Costa Rica. He was in indirect contact with Lolando Manferror, a Cuban exile involved in plotting against the Governments of Exiti and Cuba, through Formando Eslo Fontanillo, a Cuban onile in Costa Rica who was in touch with a priest associated with Massforrer.) (201-645506)

In mid-Pohruary Odubor said that he had contacted Melo, whom he had known for come time, in an effort to learn more about the appotiations between Starke and Easterror, in which Eolo had been acting as an intermediary. Nelo said that the objective of the negotiations was to work out a plan whereby Haitian and Cuban exiles, with Starke's

tooperation, would use Costa Bican soil as a staging area for an invasion of Maiti, to overthrow President Bene Davalier. If successful, Masferrer and his Haitian cohorts would then supply funds and armament to Starks for his projected move against the Trojos government.

- 3. Molo later informed Couber that he was planning to go to New York City on 21 Pebruary, estensibly to visit new bers of his family. However, the true purpose of his visit is to talk with Masferrer and Father Diego Manuel Abilio Madrigal Alvarez, the priest who has represented Masferrer in the negotiations, through Molo, with Starke. Molo has been commissioned by Starke to ascertain the quantity and source of arms that the Masferrer group will make available to Starke if the group succeeds in overthrowing Duvalier. Hele also is to find out what other assistance the Masferrer group will provide to Starke, how many Haitian and Cuban exiles Masferrer will send to Costa Rica, and when they will arrive.
- 4. Molo said that a Costa Bican visa already has been obtained for Jacques Horinglane, a Haitian, who will be the first of the group of Haitian and Cuban entics to cose to Costa Rica to set up their staging area. Moringlane's visa was obtained by Starke through Modrigo Arauz Bonilla, who until recently was the chief clerk (official sayor) of the Ministry of Public Security.
- 5. (Pield Coment: Molo has the reputation locally of being an invoterate intriguer and a braggart. Therefore, his veracity is open to question. It is possible that the information he has given to Couber is to some outent eraggerated or distorted. It is also possible that Starks will find Melo to be a loss than trustworthy intermediary.)
