- 1. Reference is made to your cable SALV) Lu4, concerning Eunice CDIO. (TCG)96, 1 October 1947 stated that among the verious prises given by the Guatemalan Government for process and poetry, one prise was awarded in the last week of September to a young Costa Rican woman passed Eunice CDIO.
- 2. During her stay in Castemala City after receiving the award, Seforite CDIO gave two recitations of being poems. One was given in the CTG assembly hall, and the second was given before the Faculty of Humanities of the San Carles University. There, who was presented by the Gustemalan poet, Miguel Angel ASTURIAS.
- 3. Hies ODIO's style is distinctly Morudian. This is not strange, as she is a very active Communist in Costa Misa, being a member of the famous Communist literati cell Rugenio Maria of Hostos—to which Corina Redrigues also belongs.
- 4. Eurice CDIO was described in 1947 as being about twenty-five years of age, white, with black hair and black eyes, about five feet five inches tall, and weighing approximately 118 pounds. She is of attractive appearance and wears her hair long, which extends half way to her waist. Her platform personality is pleasing, and her voice, which is the most attractive feature, easily captivates her audiences, because of its low scothing tons.
- 5. Her fanaticies for the cause of Communism and her work and efforts were fully appreciated by the so-called Polithure of the Partide Vanguardia Popular in Costa Rica.

6. SANJ_133, IH_23963, 21 November 1947, mentioned a letter written by Jeaquin CUTIFREZ Mangel, som of the Costa Rican Ambasender to Washington, addressed to Bunice CDIO in which he special highly of Costan ROBRIGIES, wallknown Costa Rican Communicat. The source continued by caying that young

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GUTIERFEZ was a suspected Communist and that his close association with Communists such as Corina RUBRIGUEZ and Eunice UDIO strengthened the suspicion.

7. In a rather complicated document, TLR-1191, 18 September 1950, which went to San Jose and Lima, but not to San Salvador, the Colombian Rational Chief of Detectives, Carlos RURIGIEZ Telles reports on arms shipments in Costa Rican territory which are rumored may be intended to reach Colombia. He was sent to Costa Rica and made a general report covering the arms shipments, the involvment of the Caribbean Legion, the infiltration of the Legion by Communists, and the Costa Rican Communists who were involved. Discussing the Costa Rican Communists who had been obliged to seek sanctuary in Cuatemala, Mexico and Venesuela, he listed Eunice CDIO, Costa Rican poet, Communist agitator, residing in Guatemala.

8. No other information concerning Eunice ODIO is available at headquarters. Also, there is no confirmation of the allegation that Eunice ODIO had been the mistress of Jacobs ARBENZ.
