T-1, on Deptember 3, 1984, furnished the following information which was obtained from the files of the Mexican 29 Department of Immigration in Mexico City)

OSCAR ADDRIGUES MOLINA appared at the Immigration Station in the International Airport of Merida, Yucatan, Mexico, on August 3, 1081, stating that he was a Cuban citizen who desired to return to Cuba RODRIGUES said that he was born in Jaruco, Hayana, Cuba, was 31 years old, married, an employee, and had his permanent residence at Calle Galeano 31, Mayana, Cuba.

RODRIGUEL state of the entered Mexico at the International Airport in Mexico City on January 21, 1961, and was granted political adylum.

RODRIGUES presented a certificate of Cuban nationality issued by the Cuban Consulate in Merico City on July 27, 1981, and also exhibited a similar certificate for his minor so

RODRIGUES stated that the reasons for which he had requested political asylum in Mexico no longer were in effect and he desired to renounce his status of political asylum in Mexico. He stated that he wanted to return to Cuba with his 19-month-old son, OSCAR ENRIQUE RODRIGUES

EAHCHEZ, who had entered Mexico on June 23, 1980, accompanied by his mother, MALLY SAMCHEL DEVINDRIGUEE, who is a Mexican citizen.

Mexican Immigration Department File No. 4/201.7 1 183"/3728 disclosed that RODRIGUEZ first entered Mexico as a political extle on July 1, 1858, arriving from Cuba. He departed Mexico, on route Cuba, on January 5, 1869.

RODRIGUEL stated he was born in Jaruco, Eavana, Cuba, on December 13, 13.3.

RODRIGUES requested permission, prior to departing from Mexico, to manny RELLY TEODORY SAMCHEZ PRICES, a Mexican citizen; however, RODRIGUES did now marry SANCHEZ in Mexico, but rather married her in Guanabacoa, Havana, Cuba, on August 7, 1969.

After the re-entry of RODRIGUE into Mexico in January, 1961, he stated that he was a Sergeant in the Cuban Mational Police until Apail 23, 1989, at which time he resigned because he did not approve of the operations of the police. He claimed that he then obtained employment as Chief of the Water Pana Tank Department of the Albear Aueduct in Tavana Cuba, where he remained until September 1, 1960.

We came to Mexico as a tourist at about this time, 3 returning to Mavana, Cuba, from Mexico, on November 13, 1968. As a result of this trip, the <u>Cuban intelligence organization</u>, referred to as the G-L, allegedly persecuted him until he was obliged to request political asylum in the Mexican Embassy in Havana, Cuba.

He was authorised to remain in Mexico as a political devile on February 21, 1361, when he was given permission to accept employment as a salesman, since he is married to a Mexican citizen by birth.

On June 22, 1031, Mrs. RODRIGUEZ asked for authority 5 to accompany her son, OSCAR, of Cuban nationality, to the

city of Mouston, Texas, stating that her husband was located in that city. (There is no information in the files of 79 the Mexican Department of Immigration to indicate that RODRIGUEZ had left Mexico to enter the United States.)

As mentioned above, RODNIGUEZ appeared at the Immigration office in Merida, Yucatan, Mexico, on August 9, 1961, and departed Merida, en route Havana, Cuba, on August 16, 1961, accompanied by his son, OSCAR

Mrs. RODRIGUEL, on September 7, 1962, requested authority from the Mexican Department of Immigration for 79 her husband to enter Mexico as an immigrant. Mrs. RODRIGUEZ stated that Mrs. ALLRICA MONTERO DE SANCHEL, owner of the Nueva Kola Pharmacy in Mexico City, Mad offered him employment at a salary of 300 peros (\$72 U.S.) monthly.

RODRIGUEZ did not accept this employment, and on 3 February 3, 1994, INCTORNAMICED VAZIUEZ, owner of the Versalles Pharmacy, Napoles 86, Mexico City, offered RODRIQUEZ employment in that pharmacy at a salary of 1,000 pesos (\$20 U.S.) monthly.


RODPH To requested authority to enter Mexico, and authority was granted by Order No. 27060 dated April 21, 7 1984. He was admitted as an immigrant for a period of one year, since his wife is a Mexican litited by birth. He was admitted with permission to accept employment at the Versalles Pharmacy.

MODRIGUEZ entered Mexico at International Arport, Mexico City, on July 13, 1964, bearing Cuban Passport No. 00363 issued January 4, 1963. The also carried Mexican Immigration Document FME No. 7034.

RODRIGUEZ stated that his residence in Havana, Cuba, is located at Calle E, between Third Avenue and Final Naranjo, Guanabacoa, Havana, Cuba.

RODRIGUES furnished his residence in Mexico City as Sindicalismo No. 37, Apartment 317, Colonia Escandon.
