- 1. In connection with referenced telecon and in anticipation of receipt of memo on this request from Musulin, Maynes contacted Herbert Frensley and learned that he would only be available early in the morning of 8 January as he was leaving town for several days at mid-morning. Feeling that he was fairly well informed on what Musulin would request in his memo, Esynes made arrangements to see Frensley before he left town.
- 2. Frensley stated that there have been no further developments in the Gurevich approach (through the <u>Newsweek</u> correspondent) to Brown. Frensley had advised Brown to ignore the matter and thus far he has. Frensley says that Brown has not the slightest intention of trying to gain access to the documents referred to by the <u>Hewsweek</u> correspondent.
- 3. Frensley was most appreciative of the small amount of background we could furnish him on Gurevich and his methods. We will keep you informed if there are further developments.
