Dear Chico:

Thanks for your letter of February 22. How we hope you are alive. I could only imagine that you were out of luck as that the plane company went haywire.

We all had a wonderful time at Luray, but the plane is fairly cramped. Physically the hotel is utterly beautiful, but the help are all surly and the service is inadequate. Such things as the maître d' continually coming up to remind you that he does not share in the tips of the waiter. Big attraction is the gambling casino, and the planes shuttle back and forth from Miami to gamble. The last plane back to Miami leaves each morning at 3:00 A. M. There is a tremendous amount of construction, houses, apartments, highrises, etc. on Grand Bahama Isle. It is a flat island with scrub pine and there is no local color whatsoever. The water is much cooler than Haiti, but Ethel and I did finally leave her to smother leisurely. The reef was clearer and prettier than at Haiti.

As you probably know I received a wire from Boyce, but never did hear from Charles. I am much relieved that my failure to jump at Boyce's wire did not embarrass you.

Ethel's folks are now down here visiting us, but I am sorry to say that her father has a bad heart condition and cannot meet himself, even to the point of speaking more than 5 minutes at a time. Under the circumstances we are lucky to have them visiting.

Pernat, oil and gas concession, refining, etc. all add up to the same thing. If I can find a way to do something constructive rather than silly, I would much prefer to do it in Haiti rather than Wink, Texas.

Give Paul Boston our best wishes and urge him to drop by here for a visit if he goes back to Canada through Dallas.

There was a rerun of Dr. Strangelove here this week and I forced Ethel to see it. She agrees with me it is a work of pure genius.
