CONTACT REPORT

SUBJECT: Meeting with Tony Verona, La Moderns Motel, Coral Gables, Florida, late evening 28 September 1960.

1. Cupton and I met with Verona at the latter's urgent request. Verona informed us that he had had meetings with the Propaganda Committee and with the Military Committee. He indicated that he had approved certain actions to be conducted by the Propaganda Committee. He discussed these actions in detail with Cupton, and there is no difference of opinion on the usefulness of what Verona intends to do.

2. In the military field, Verona made the point that Goodie and Elena felt badly about ^{the} dealing over their heads with the second and third echelons of their commissions. He, Verona, felt that it would be best for ^{the} to deal only with Goodie, Elena, and the other members of the Frente's general staff and not with the subordinates of these people. He also said it is important for Elena and Goodie to have an early understanding as to our strategic planning, and that we should insure that Elena becomes not too unhappy at being kept in the dark. (Comment: These two items were transmitted by me to COS/WASH during the late hours of 28 September. COS/WASH indicated that he would strive for the solution of these two issues.)

3. I told Verona that we would send in the future certain equipment into Cuba. If everything went well, I would inform him and the FED could take the credit. If something went wrong, the FED, however, would have to take the blame (this was along instructions received from C/WH/4). Verona again reiterated the fact that he has received broad powers, that he intends to reorganize the Propaganda Department, and perhaps remove some people from the Military Department.

4. Verona also requested advice as to whether or not he should buy a number of C-46's which he could get cheap. We did not hold out too much hope for this. (See memorandum to C/WH/4/PH on this subject, dated 30 September 1960.)
