A Cuban emigre with emsellent contacts in the Movimiento Sevolucionario del Pueblo (KRP, Revolutionary Movement of the People). He has been an accurate reporter on this organization and on general emigre political developments since about mid-1862.

Field Comment: There have been a series of alleged plots to assessinate Fidel Castro Rum, planned by various emigres and emigres groups in Liami. This report provides additional information on the plet reported in CBUS-312/01954-55 dated 10 August 1965, from the same source. The people involved are Jose Prince, "Fito" Pelues, and Antonio Vectana Blanch, all Cuban emigres in Miami; an unnamed captain in the Cuban Bebel Army who had arrived in Miami from Cuba about nid-June; and one person in Cuba. Prince planned to solicit money in Caracas, Venezuela, to finance the operation. When he encountered difficulties in getting permission to re-enter the United States, he planned to send another person to Caracas to golicit money.

1. Jose Prince and "Tito" Pelacz, leaders of an alleged plot to assaszinate Fidel Castro Rus, said on 27 August 1965 that the plans were "coming along well," and that they had collected \$3,000 (U.S.) of the \$6,000 which is needed for the operation. However, on 8 September they said that their plans have been delayed for about a south and a half "for security reasons". They said that a communication was received from Cuba requesting the delay because "conditions were not right at the moment." It is not known when or how the members was received from Cuba. Also, the men said that the estimated cost of the mission has risen and they still need \$2,000. They appeared confident that they could raise the money, and that the mission would be a success, but were concerned with the effect that the delay might have on people who had contributed money and were expecting the assassination soon.

- 2. Frince west to Caracae, Venezuela, in about the last week of July and planned to return to Elami by 7 or 8 August, after stopping in Puerue Bico for two days. Sawores, he did not return until about 16 August.
- S. Pelass was interested in getting two poisons, potassium cyanide and ourses, from Caracar. Then Prince returned be brought a match box full of potassium cyanide which he had received from Armaldo Schwerert Ferrer, leader of the Movimiesto Revolucionarie del Fueblo (ZEF, Revolutionary Movement of the Puople) in Caracas. Schwerert promised to get the curare and send it to Miami with a "responsible person" in early September. Pelass maid that the poisons will not be used to this Castre, but did not volunteer information as to their mae.
