Mr. Alfons SUNDVIK (001-307030), assigned as chauffeur/clerk in SAC office, Wash, Helsinki, since 22, and at present in charge of unclassified mail room. Arranges travel docs for U.S. diplomatic carrier between Helsinki and Moscow and so visits Moscow from time to time... While on routine business Sundvik has talked a number of times to Subject... Sets forth personal data on Sundvik (filed Sundvik 201)...

Re SUNDVIK's account of summer with Subj at his apt Arnansttu 22, Apt on evening of 26 Apr 61. Subj's wife left and the two men alone... Talked about Helsinki and Finland in general... Subj said after graduating from the University of Moscow Law Institute, he held a First Lt. officer commission and worked in the Dept of Defense in Moscow thruout the wars. After demobilization, he had gone back to the University of Moscow for more studies and transferred to the Soviet Foreign Service -- Helsinki is his first foreign post as a vice consul... (for details see att to this dispatch filed in Sundvik 201)... Sundvik is not longer at Wash. Because of poor job performance and unsavory background as well as danger of security risk, Sundvik was asked to resign on 5 May 61... Att also gives account as reported by Sundvik of his trip to USSR...

Subj met CLASTONBURY (KUBARKER) ~~first time~~ first time at Consular Corps function 9 Aug 61. Subj invited Clastonbury to lunch same day. Subj pressed Soviet position re Berlin saying Berlin will be test of Soviet-U.S. friendly relations and insisted Sovs would sign peace treaty. (details being pouched)

Details pouched by [CFR] 5219 (copy in Subj 201) q.v.)
Subj said he had served in the Artillery. Said he was a Ukrainian born in Poltava, was 35 yrs old (b. ca. 26). Said that in 1944 when he only 18, spent three months on the Bulgarian front in the artillery and participated in the liberation of some of the Bulgarian Tsar's wines. Present German situation discussed... Said he had been stationed in Kishinev, Moldavia... Subj said he would probably go on leave after tourist season in October and would bring his 5-6 yr old dau back to Finland w/him. She was visiting her grandparents in Moscow. Subj said he had given up studying Finnish since it so difficult. CLASTONBURY found Subj rather dull, unimaginative, undiplomatic...
