2. Bookline interrogated Sundvik again on 2 May, at which time the latter gave him the two reports that he had been asked to prepare (Attachment B and C). Since nothing turned up that had not been reported earlier or that was not included in the reports Sundvik had prepared, no separate account of this interview was made.

3. Sundvik is no longer with the Embassy. Because of his poor job performance (he was on probation at the time), of his slavery background, and the danger as a security risk Sundvik was asked to resign his position at the Embassy on 5 May. He left on the morning of that date but we understand that his resignation is not effective until 19 May 1961.
