- l. The surpose of this dispatch is to report on a case involving one of the Finnish employees at the American Dabessy, Harry Alfons CUNDVIK. He has been employed as a chauffour/clerk in the Comeral Services Section of the Embassy since 1951 and presently is in charge of the Unclassified Rail Room, His duties also include arranging travel documents for U. 5. Explomatic courage between Helminki and Koncow and hence he has reason to virit the Soviet Subassay from time to time. Recently the makesay General Services Officer brought his suspicions to the attention of Roodine, saying that they were based on Sundvik's general attitude, portionizely after the latter had expressed his interest in making a trip to the Soviet Union and his taking massian lessons for this purpose. The GSO also reported that Sundvik was known to have talked a number of times with Soviet Vice Consul Anatolij Klimov while on routine business at the Soviet Embassy. These points led to the screening of fundvik's parsonnel file (with the concurrence of the Charge d'Affaires) and to a check of the references he had given on his employment application. The latter turned out to be quite shady. According to the VALIEES two of the three are listed as having a number of arrests each, including mensianchter, drunkenness, theit, etc., and the third could not be identified. These obviously were not investigated very closely at the time Sundvik applied for employment. On 5 April Valink surveillance was placed on Sundvik (again with the Charge's concurrence). He was followed each evening after he left the Ambasey and on 10 Arril. after it was learned that Sundvik was driving to the Soviet Union for a four-day trip. he was followed from Tarwakoeki to the Fireish-Soviet border point at Vanlines. Two VALLER detectives were on hand here to observe the exceeding. They reported a routine border orossing, that no oustons inspection was made, and that Sundvik met two Soviet Soldiers at the border station (on the Soviet side) before continuing from there. He drove off following the soldiers are. The circumstances of the border crossing are suspicious in that he crossed the border alone, in his own automobile, in bad weather, and for only four days. They also compare clonely to the clanks case where Alanko was asked by the Soviets to rent a car. leave his family on the Finnish side (Lappeanumta) and crosm the border alone for a short trip. On Sundvik's return trip 15 A; ril he was again followed from the Lorder to Terwakoski, and them to Helstinki where day to day survellance continued. Attached are translations of the Valida surveillance reports and a report of the border crossing which we have received to date. The weekend prior to his trip into the USSK Aundvik spent im Terrekceki with his fishese, hence there are no reports covering this period.
  - 2. We have now learned from the travel lists which we get every two weeks and which list all travelers going to and coming from the Soviet Union that Anatolij Klimov went to the USSR on 9 April, arcening the border at Vainikkala (railroad erosaing point). Whether he has returned to Finland we do not know at this point. Since Klimov's travel coincides with Sundvik's, it is possible that there is some connection.
  - 3. Herry Alsone SUBLVIK, formerly VESTERLUBDes, was born on 19 September 1930 in Relainki and lives at Stenbhokinkatu 4s A 29, Helainki. He is divorced but has reportedly mentioned the possibility of remarrying (present fiances is Hilkka Kyllikki TUCMIERHES, nes MHTYIM). His commonic standing is considered good as he has omed an automobile for a number of years and always dresses quite well. Follitically he is Co servative and has given the universtanding that his leanings are toward the West.
