- 1. This monorandum contains a suchestion, in Paragraph 3, for the consideration of the DCI.
- 2. On the night of 7 Nme, President Lopes Kateos requested hr. Scott to inform "his good friend, President Eisenhover," of the followings
 - A. That the President is a friend of the United States, "not only because of necessity but of genuine desire and ideology".
 - B. That the invitation to President Dorticos of Cuba was extended two works after it was indicated that Porticos was going to Mexico "on his own", through the Fexican Ambassador in Cuba.
 - C. That be will not invite Fidel Castro to Herico even though Cuban Ambassador Jose Antonio Portucado told President Lopes Hateos that Dorticos will request an invitation for Castro.
- 3. President Lopez Meteos also asked that President Eisenbover be informed that he is delighted that a decision has now been made to get rid of Castro. The DCI may wish to inform the President of the above.

h. President Lopes Nateos was indirectly informed of CIA intentions in remark to Castro through a conversation between Nr. Scott and

Cook Lopes Mateos would not invite Castro to visit Mexico, even though Dorticos is soing to sak him to do so. Mr. Scott suggested that if the Mexican President helped IIA to schieve the overthrow of Castro, he would not have to deal with the problem of inviting Castro to Mexico.
