1. On the 30th of September Brealey again had lunch with [VACC INT/1] to take up routine matters of business which included primarily visa and security checks. When the undersigned first walked into the Kabinetti (small private dining room) at the Officers' Club in Katajanokka, he commented on the unusually pleasant fall day! [VACC INT/1] laughingly replied, "Well, at least you agree with COUEB on one thing." He then remarked that he had seen COUEB just the other day and COUEB had commented about the beautiful fall weather. Naturally, we were curious about COUEB's business and just asked [VACC INT/1] what COUEB had to say for himself.

01 [VACC INT/1] replied that some weeks ago COUEB had come to him with some MTS letters which had been mailed to Soviet personnel in Helsinki and had asked for [VACC INT/1]'s assistance in investigating this matter! [VACC INT/1] said that he is happy to be of innocuous help to COUEB on matters of this type as long as it is kept within harmless limits. COUEB also told [VACC INT/1] at this time that he would be glad to help with the investigation in any way he could! [VACC INT/1] had the MTS letters investigated with the result that they found out that the envelopes had been typed on a Swedish Falda machine, and the envelopes which had been used ran out of stock in Helsinki stores about a year ago. The investigation pointed to Sweden as the place where these letters must have been typed, and [VACC INT/1] told COUEB this. COUEB then asked him if he could intercede with the Swedish authorities, and [VACC INT/1] has promised to write about it! [VACC INT/1] went on to explain that his relations with COUEB are far more important to him (V/I) as the chief of the VACC INTS than they can be to COUEB, because he (V/I) learns things from COUEB that he might not otherwise hear. At the last meeting the following items had come up:

a. COUEB, in commenting upon Soviet Ambassador Viktor I. LEFEDOV's departure, said that the latter has been seriously ill with diabetes for many years and has frequently requested to be relieved of his post, but has been turned down by Moscow because of the good work he has done in Finland. LEFEDOV's wife has been unhappy with her stay in Helsinki and has also been anxious to return to the Soviet Union.

b. COUEB brought up the Torreyson-VAPID case and said that VAPID had departed under a cloud, and whether he would return or not, COUEB did not know. [VACC INT/1] averred that he got the impression that VAPID must have undergone rigorous questioning before his departure. 02

c. COUEB told [VACC INT/1] that he had warned "his people" to be very careful in Finland to do nothing stupid. What he meant by "his people" was not clear other than he obviously meant just embassy personnel. [VACC INT/1] had replied rather maliciously to this by saying, "You should not be too worried about their doing stupid things since we know how to get them out discreetly." COUEB rose to this by asking, "Has such an incident happened while I have been here?" [VACC INT/1] was, of course, thinking of E. S. KUCHILOV, but responded, "If you don't know, then I guess I shouldn't tell you. After all, I have to have some secrets myself." This ended that part of their conversation.

2. Going back to the VAPID-Torreyson case, [VACC INT/1] explained to Brealey that three other incidents had been presented as evidence by the Soviets of attempts to recruit Soviet personnel in Finland. (See the attachment to CPMA 3543, 19 September 1958.) These three cases have been fully investigated, and there is very little basis in fact to them. For example, the first incident was to the effect that (rum) KUCHILOV had attempted to recruit a Soviet citizen as an informant. The truth of the matter was exactly the reverse, and this case had been reported to the Ministry of Interior some two months earlier by [VACC INT/1] himself. In other words, the Soviets had made the recruitment attempt and were trying to blame the Finns for it. The second case involved a Jewish engineer.

H. V. VASILYEV. The Finnish citizen Sergei VASILYEV had entertained VASILYEV but on company orders, since VASILYEV was living alone in a foreign country. Apparently this friendliness was interpreted by the Russians as a recruitment attempt. The end result to this is that the firm has been obliged to fire VASILYEV because it cannot afford to alienate the Soviet view of the Soviet business. The third case is somewhat similar, free drinking and the nonsense that goes along with it interpreted as something sinister by the Soviets. Whether or not these are the facts we cannot say, but at least this is [WACC HK/1]'s version for Stanley consumption.

3. A final paragraph last Headquarters feel concerned about [WACC HK/1]'s association with COL HS. [WACC HK/1] appears to know what he is doing and does not pass out information gratuitously. He has assured us that he has never mentioned our name to COL HS nor his relationships with even the British security police. In the latter case COL HS thinks that his contacts with the Swedes are with the police chief of Stockholm.
