1. At the same meeting at which we discussed the ECONOMIC and with FACT FIVE, a number of miscellaneous items came up, which we will briefly list below:

2. [VIAK DSA] said that Gregory Fe [REDACTED] had just called him and asked him to lunch, but since [REDACTED] was wearing the uniform, he had to postpone the meeting with OGPU. OGPU had said on the phone that he was leaving for vacation (presumably in the Soviet Union) on the 25th of June. [VIAK DSA] was to meet OGPU one hour after we left him, that is, at 1900 hours. [REDACTED] has [VIAK DSA] mentioned this, we suggested to him that he ask OGPU about the accusations in February, but [REDACTED] replied that the question is a little bit too delicate for him to put to OGPU. Although we asked [VIAK DSA] how long OGPU would be gone, [REDACTED] said he did not know but would try to find out. In reference to your old concerns regarding [REDACTED]'s relations with OGPU (CWT-2348, 13 February 1950), we have occasionally suggested replies and elements thereof to heroes OGPU, but almost without exception VIAK DSA has turned them down as unacceptable, just as he did on the above suggestion re Gregory. He would say that [VIAK DSA] is not quite the honest type that we have perhaps a bad reputation to believe in the past. He is deceiving in his apparent innocence and frankness, but we have noticed that he is also capable of being coldly clever and sly when the occasion demands. If we have given the impression that he is single-minded, we would like to correct that impression. Any person that has managed to hold the job that he has for the second longest period of my time in the 41-year history of the [VIAK DSA] organization has to have more than a simple esp's grace of the job. By the way, we learned from [VIAK DSA] that OGPU is now and has been for some time an excommunicated Soviet comrade.

3. Another topic which came up was radio operations. He asked [EX-10-A] what the status of the surveillance equipment on Tchitsukata was. He replied, contrary to his earlier optimistic version, that things were not going so smoothly. They had struck a lead which was red hot, so, having difficulty getting the heat out, turned to move out of the apartment. Of course, they can have the person arrested, but that would attract undue attention; so they are trying to work around the situation. [V/A] still has hoped that during the course of the summer, they will be able to get this apartment or if not this one, another one close by.

4. The subject of some operations for [VAC DEX/1] started on a short notice; namely, he expressed deep appreciation for the technical help which he was getting and cited a case which they now have going, involving an anti-operative against a Marxist citizen suspected of working with the Soviets. Four men and one car are assigned to the operation which involves surveillance from early morning till late at night and which will probably go on for from two to four months. [VAC DEX/1] explained that they had bypassed the suspect's apartment by running the microphone in through a air duct and the microphone wires run through another air duct to the adjoining apartment where a man was constantly listening when exposure was at hours. The car in the adjoining apartment was also in radio contact with the ; crews standing by in the car so that the suspect could be followed whenever he left the apartment. [] best can to say that this operation is, of course, very expensive in terms of men, money and equipment. In view of their limited staff, best do does feel that it is better to concentrate on our target at a time for the best results.

5. Other items brought up were the following:

a. Prentiss asked [REDACTED] if he could provide me with additional information
of "critic" property in the well [REDACTED] recalled that the last barrel of
gasoline had been all that they had in hand at that time. He furthered to
say if he could get more from the "critic" property in the
existing oil well [REDACTED].

b. [REDACTED] needed as a half-page memo concerning the investigation which has been conducted so far. In my opinion, until [REDACTED] is fully interviewed, the most recent of this investigation will be that although [REDACTED] was characterized as benevolent and anti-American, he was not forced to be involved in any circumstances that could be considered as detrimental to U.S. interests. He was released as a Communist, politically active. [REDACTED] will be kept under surveillance, but since we do not know, perhaps merely strict surveillance.

c. [REDACTED] also forwarded a page and a half report on an investigation of DELTA [REDACTED], also known as KILO 67. KILO is an individual who appears to be a local sheriff in Tando. His address has been given as 11½ Fortuna, Tando, c/o Dezhima. The name had been referred to the Consulate from Goteborg. The investigation in this case involved not only going through the [REDACTED] files, but also through the files of the Sheriff's Section, plus an investigation by the local sheriff in Tando. We make a point of mentioning this merely to advise you that frequently [REDACTED] are used for this type of investigation which does not show in the production file for the [REDACTED] project at Headquarters. There appears to be some doubt now as to the accuracy of the information furnished by KILO, but before anything is sent to the Consulate in Gothenburg, we intend to check the matter out carefully.
