- 1. A former KUBARK officer recently reported that an Oldamerican exchange student in Helsinki named fru HOHWATER has said that he became acquainted in Helsinki with fru GOLOB, Counsellor of the Soviet Embassy. According to LOHWATER he and GOLOB became fairly good friends and LOHWATER reports that GOLOB professes sympathy for the United States.
- 2. Headquarters has no record of a GOLOB (or DOLUB) serving in Finland, although there are some relatively low-level people with names such as GOLUREV, CCLUBIN, and GOLUBKOV. The Soviet Counsellors in Helsinki are Sergey Tikhonovich LOCINOV and Mikhail Crigoryevich KCTCV. The name, GCLOB, is possibly a phonetic garble of KCTOV, who has been positively identified as a long-time member of the RIS.

3. A month or two ago the Assistant POA in Helsinki told cur _____ there about a Rubright student who was evidently "being cultivated" by a Soviet official. In view of this and paragraphs 1 and 2, the Finnish desk has asked its ____ (in CFHW]1282) to try to identify LOHWATER, who may be identical with the _____ Fulbright student mentioned above, and the Soviet officials involved. There are no Headquarters traces on LOHWATER.
