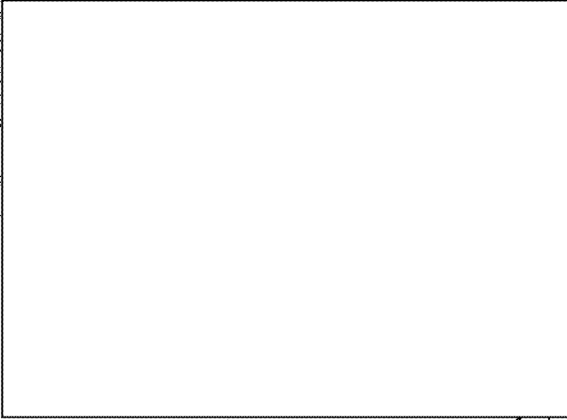

1. I had an opportunity to discuss with a reliable and discreet source on 16 Feb 62 who knows Kutner well. His assessment of Kutner is as follows.

2. Kutner is a highly intelligent, over-stimulated individual. He is inclined to accept stories as being true without confirming. He exaggerates and seeks to embellish. He will use every trick and angle "in the book" and anyone he can to further his efforts. If he does a favor for anyone he wants a favor in turn - sooner or later. He looks for publicity and recognition and will use anyone to accomplish this.

3. He was very active during the Kefauver hearings and, according to source, furnished unreliable information.

1. I have learned through a local bank that Luis Kutner had an account there until September 1960, when it was closed out. A few months prior to the closing Kutner was trying to borrow \$10,000; the bank would not loan it to him, setting a limit of \$2,000.

2. In 1954 he was shown as a partner - with K.L. Braun, 208 South LaSalle Street - in a company called American Industrial Enterprise. In 1955 he was involved in trying to obtain a letter of credit from the Bank of China to sell tanks and other machinery to the Central Trust Division of Chinese Procurement through a company called Productos Latinos Americanos.

3. The bank got curious about Kutner and his activities at one time and thought of making inquiries concerning him of the Chicago Crime Commission.

4. From a local friend in a large department store I learned Kutner is married (wife Rose), lives at 1431 Ridge Avenue, Evanston, Illinois, and has a son and a daughter. His bills are paid promptly.

5. I have heard a rumor, repeat rumor, that Kutner is a "close" friend of Maggie Daly, a local gossip columnist.

6. The American Bar Association informed me Kutner is "a member in good standing" born 1908, a 1930 graduate of Chicago University Law School and has offices at 105 West Adams Street. Here he becomes a little mysterious, for a check made at the University revealed a "former student named Luis Rytman Kutner, a non-graduate, employed as an associate attorney at 105 West Adams Street". He has no degree according to University records we checked, either bachelor's or law.

7. Roger White is attempting to learn more about Kutner's current activities.

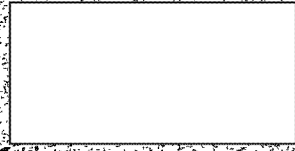

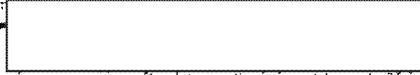

1. Please accept our apologies for having misinterpreted your [redacted] 493-68, which we thought implied that the transfer of your file included "Eyes Only" #3225. Thank you for your reassurance concerning your method of handling the security summaries which is in strict accordance with existing regulations, and we sincerely regret the confusion.

2. If the [redacted] Field Office plans to maintain contact with Subject, albeit, sporadic, we believe it should have the benefit of the Summary and will make arrangements to process it. Information reported in [redacted] 62-97, dated 30 August 1962, indicated that Subject had been appointed Consul General for Guatemala. Do you know whether he still is serving in this capacity? If this is true, we shall also be required to obtain the Director's approval to maintain contact.

1. Re your memo concerning transferring copies of Eyes Only security summaries, we have not sent this Eyes Only #3225 summary to the [redacted] Office, nor a copy of it. In response to their request (cc to [redacted] 204-68 to Director, DCS, dtd 29 Apr 1968, para. 7), we only sent copies of material in Kutner's file folder, which included a machine copy of Form No. 1124 (and covering ditto memo) which merely indicated there is an Eyes Only on Kutner. Our Eyes Only material is kept in a separate locked file drawer in the vault under strictest security measures. Eyes Only material is never kept in individuals' file folders.

2. We know name identification should never be forwarded with Eyes Only security summaries and not only have never done this in the past, but take extreme precautions that it will never occur in the future.

1. At home 30 June 1968, Contact Specialist [redacted] of the Washington Field Office, received a long distance telephone call from Iuis Kutner, head of the [redacted] International Due Process of Law (aka World Habeas Corpus) of 105 West Adams Street, Chicago, Illinois. As headquarters has been informed, Oakley has received two letters from Kutner since their encounter in [redacted] 26 April 1968; both are unanswered. There was one telephone conversation in the interim; [redacted] 7 May returned Kutner's call of about a week earlier but it was merely a noncommittal reference to papers Kutner had mailed and [redacted] had not yet received.

2. 30 June Kutner asked whether "yes or no", CIA would consider funding any of the World Habeas Corpus Centers which are proposed world wide. [redacted] replied that he "thought it had been made clear that CIA could not engage in such projects and, furthermore, that such an interest would be harmful to the project". Kutner reiterated that he would consider it most helpful.

3. It should be recalled that, while [redacted] thought he was definitive on the negation of financial aid in the conversation of 26 April, he had not yet the benefit of the background information on Kutner which appeared later. Accordingly he was careful not to be too negative on other aspects of the project. He suggested an approach to the Department of State as more appropriate. Moreover, he did not rule out the possibility of other conversations between Kutner and Agency representatives, including himself or even General Counsel [redacted]. It was believed that such was Mr. [redacted] intention.

4. Mr. Kutner appears to die hard. In the conversation 30 June he indicated he might be in Washington soon and would like to talk to [redacted] again, about the Department of State and about Washington-based law firms which might support the establishment

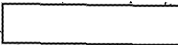
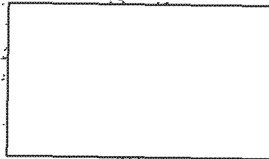

of a World Habeas Corpus Center in this city. Presumably such Centers would be staffed by retiring prestigious jurists and attorneys and law professors. Again [redacted] did not absolutely rule out contact because it appears Kutner might have something worthwhile if he will somehow eliminate his conspiratorial urge and include CIA out. In the telephone conversation Oakley said not once but thrice that any approaches should be to State and the law fraternity and that he, Oakley, could be nothing more than personally sympathetic.

Because buttressed knowledge must precede and accompany man's efforts in using technology to advance Human Freedom, it is essential that the best minds be put to work in examining the impact of technology on Human Freedom in a new age.

There are many regions of the world where Human Rights are merely abstractions, - and without meaning. These are the MILLIONS, - and probably TWO BILLIONS, - of persons who have seen no change affecting their welfare and freedom as a result of the well-intentioned expressions in the UNITED NATIONS CHARTER and the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS.



In response to their request (cc to [redacted]-204-68 to Director, DCS, dtd 29 Apr 1968, para. 7), we only sent copies of material in Kutner's file folder, which included a machine copy of Form No. 1124 (and covering ditto memo) which merely indicated there is an Eyes Only on Kutner. Our Eyes Only material is kept in a separate locked file drawer in the vault under strictest security measures. Eyes Only material is never kept in individuals' file folders.
2. We know name identification should never be forwarded with Eyes Only security summaries and not only have never done this in the past, but take extreme precautions that it will never occur in the future.

1. Contact Specialist [redacted] of the [redacted] Field Office, 26 April 1963 received a telephone call from his contact, Alan D. Hutchinson, of the Washington law firm Sharp, Soltner & Hutchinson, [redacted] an "old acquaintance", Luis Kutner, well known attorney who also heads the World Habeas Corpus organization headquartered in Kutner's own law offices at 105 West Adams Street, Chicago, Illinois. Hutchinson had lunched with Kutner 25 April together with another three or four friends in Washington for a meeting of the American Society of International Law. During the luncheon Kutner had made quite a point of saying that World Habeas Corpus, somehow affiliated with the World Peace Through Law organization of Washington and Geneva, Switzerland, is financed by the CIA. He added that he expected to spend considerable time at CIA headquarters while he is in Washington and expected also to obtain a sizeable budget increase. Hutchinson of course considered his "flamboyant" friend's remarks to be highly indiscreet and thought the Agency should know.

2. [redacted] promptly communicated this information to [redacted] General Counsel, by telephone. Houston was lunching with Kutner an hour later and asked Oakley to join them "as a witness".

3. It may be worth recording incidentally that Kutner told his luncheon companions 25 April that he was trying to get the former Congolese Premier Melina Tchamba released by the Algerian authorities. He had already succeeded to some extent, meaning he had "prevented" extradition to the Congo. If these efforts should fail, Kutner had some plan to "kidnap" Tchamba for deliverance.

Note: the foregoing was drafted before the events recorded below.]

4. Before the hour was up, Mr. [redacted] telephoned [redacted] to say he found it impossible to keep their luncheon engagement (sic). He asked [redacted] to find Kutner at their appointed rendezvous, the Lawyers' Club, take him somewhere to lunch, find out about FFI potential, assure him, if need be, that CIA financing is not available and, depending on the climate of the conversation, chide him for his indiscretions concerning CIA.

5. [redacted] did as requested. His conversational emphasis was on the positive efforts of Mr. Kutner which are channeled primarily through the Commission for International Due Process of Law, 105 West Adams Street, Chicago, Illinois, a corporation and through the Commission's close association with the World Peace Through Law organization (DCS Case 47197). Apparently Kutner has been in not very fruitful contact with DCS's Chicago Field Office over a period of years. The chiding about indiscretions took the form of the "reluctant" imparting of information that persons "possibly" trying to undermine Kutner's "fine efforts" had noticed it about that Kutner had claimed CIA financing. Mr. Kutner "should know and be wary" of the implications of such reports.

6. It was made quite clear that CIA financing was impossible and, moreover, would be "detrimental to the Commission's efforts". (World Roberts Corpus proves not to be an entity but a concept.) On the other hand, largely for public relations reasons, Kutner was led to believe that his efforts are of interest to the Agency in the broadest concept. Indeed they could be. He probably will contact Oakley on another visit to Washington. He has meanwhile been encouraged, to some extent, to contact DCS's Chicago Field Office should he have intelligence of importance to impart. Oakley tried to leave this possibility in such a status that the Chicago Field Office can play it any way it deems best. As a matter of fact, he tried to direct Kutner to the Department of State with his plans and proposals, especially a projected world tour to set up Centers for Due Process of Law. Unfortunately, without antagonizing Kutner, it seemed impossible to avoid further exposure by CIA components to his theoretically meritorious but somewhat grandiose plans.

7. Mr. [redacted] has been briefly informed of the above by telephone. The [redacted] Field Office will be pleased to receive background information about Mr. Kutner, especially from the [redacted] Field Office.

1. As requested, I telephoned Kutner and expressed our gratitude for his call "to Washington" and added that "we were not in a position to do anything right now." Unfortunately I did not know the subject of his call to Washington.

2. Kutner gave me a real blast. He said he was going to undertake publishing of a Yugoslavian-language newspaper in Chicago. That he has already printed the first edition and, because of some 300,000 Yugoslavians (Croats, Serbs, etc.) in the area, there is a definite need for such a paper. Kutner said he has been in contact with Andreas Kondich, Editor of "Abendpost", Chicago, a man who has pipelines all over Europe. (Just what Kondich has to do with this affair is not clear and I did not ask, for [redacted] there is a file in index.)

3. Kutner then proceeded to tell me he had called the DCI's office and spoke with "some assistant or something named Elder" and, after telling Elder of the plans for the new paper asked that the Agency nominate someone for the position of editor. Elder, he said, was vague, rude, impolite and "wouldn't last two days in my office." Kutner remarked he had called Elder two and one-half weeks ago, that Elder promised to call him back and never did. He then told me we were missing a big bet and that in his opinion it was "fantastic that we would not take advantage of the opportunity." His next remark was "I won't go into the Cuban mess and the Berlin Wall." (Just what he meant was not clarified.) "How Elder could make up his mind about the proposal was a mystery to him," he said.

4. I remarked that I did not know the details of the matter and suggested to Kutner that there could be reasons - which should not be discussed - as to why the proposal was not feasible. I was able to shut him off by telling him that I would see what I could learn about the whole thing and contact him again.

5. Kutner's reputation in Chicago is not good. From two or three unavoidable contacts I have had with him, I regard him as an opinionated, egotistical, vain, glory seeking trouble maker. I do not trust him and believe he can be vindictive. Rumor has it that he "shacks up" with Maggie Daly, a Chicago American gossip columnist. You can, therefore, appreciate my request for further details of his proposal and some plausible reason for getting him off my back, again.

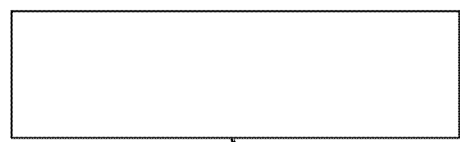

Mr. McConnell called to tell me that [redacted] had spoken to Mr. Louis Kuttner. Mr. Kuttner seems to be somewhat exercised and among a number of other remarks said that he found Mr. Alder a very distasteful person. He has talked to [redacted] several times and claims that he has received absolutely no assistance. He told Mr. Kuttner that all he wanted was for us to suggest the name of an editor for a Yugoslav paper in which he has an interest. (This does not tally with [redacted] statement to me that Mr. Kuttner wanted us to subsidize the paper). As Mr. Kuttner is a close and intimate friend of Miss Margie Daley of the Chicago American, and as he claims that the editor of ABEMPOST suggested that we call us, and as Mr. Kuttner would not be at all hesitant about airing his grievances to Miss Daley, or any other newspaper representative, our friend [redacted] was very polite to him. Unfortunately, Mr. Kuttner seemed to feel that [redacted] should reopen the question of headquarters. I, therefore, will have to call Mr. Alder again in the morning. Incidentally, [redacted] has known Mr. Kuttner for many years and he is not highly thought of by us.

SUBJECT: Leis Kutner--General Counsel for Formosa Exile Group 27 August 1970

1. On 21 August 1970 Leis Kutner called the [REDACTED] Office to relate his current activities. Kutner explained that our agency would have a file on him and that he was formerly in touch with one [REDACTED] (now probably retired) and one [REDACTED]. Kutner also mentioned that he is well known because of a book he authored entitled World Habeas Corpus. He also claims some notoriety from his past role as General Counsel for a Chansian exile group and for his activities on behalf of a group from Ecuador.
2. Kutner is currently serving as General Counsel for a Formosan exile group which has as its goal the influencing of world opinion for achieving Formosan independence. The principal target is the U.N. organization. Present plans are to force a plebiscite in Formosa for self-determination. Kutner said it is also the objective of the group to sue Chiang Kai Shek for an accounting of the "five billion dollars he has received from the US." Kutner said that one of their first efforts at ventilating the group's intention will occur at the Little League World Championship Games that are to be held in Waterford, Pa.
3. Kutner advised that the leader of the Formosan exile group is Professor Peng Ming Min, who was formerly Taiwan's representative to the U.N. According to Kutner, the professor returned to Taiwan from the U.N. assignment and wrote a paper that was practically a declaration of independence for Formosa. This caused him to be arrested and jailed but because of his scholastic reputation he was put under house arrest. The professor has since escaped from Taiwan and resides somewhere in the West.
4. Other background that Kutner recommends is the book Formosa Betrayed, written by George Kerr; also some writings by Lung-Chi Chen, a Fellow at Yale University. A third article purported to describe the Formosan exile group's intentions is one written by Flora Lewis, which appeared in the 18 August 1970 Chicago Sun Times.
5. Kutner said that he was calling our agency to see if there would be mutual interest in his project and we agreed to check our headquarters. Pursuant to headquarters' advice of 24 August 1970, we called Kutner and told him that we had no interest in his project at present. Kutner then said "Fine, I understand and now I am free to go ahead with other countries but I wanted to give our government the first opportunity." He was told that as a private citizen he

should pursue his interests as he saw fit. He also suggested that he might get in touch with the State Department. Kutner said that he assumed our agency had checked the State Department and he has fulfilled his obligation to inform the US Government of his plans. He also said he was not surprised that there was no interest in his venture in Washington because this parallels some of the policies our government is pursuing.

6. During the conversations Kutner was polite and proper. He expressed appreciation for our efforts in checking out interest in his project.
