2. Al (Alphonse) PICOD (name of firm illegible but probably L. RONDEAU and Company, of Tokyo, Japan). Listed as a personal reference by Subject in 1957.

The KANTO DIRECTORY for Tokyo and Yokohama, Japan for 1955 on page 325 lists L. R. and A. (Alphonse) PICOD, with residence address of 67 Hibi-machi, Ichigaya-ku, Tokyo, with business address for Alphonse PICOD as c/o L. RONDEAU and Company, Ltd. (Japan), Tokyo. Tel. 27-3521-4.

~~Alphonse~~ PICOD was identified in 1947 as a French citizen, residing in Shanghai, China at 75 Fante Street, who was serving as a contact carrying French Intelligence Requirements to a domestic agent in Shanghai in 1949.

3. Gregory TOPKA, of the PONYE Company, Tokyo, Japan. Listed by Subject as a personal reference in 1957.
4. Antonios (Anthony) E. VAFALOPOULOS, Greek Consul, Yokohama, Japan, listed as a personal reference by Subject in 1957.
5. Valentine HAN aka Valentina Vasiliyevich ZHAN aka Van-Skin HAN, former Soviet Agent, who is elsewhere identified.
6. Emmanuel Abraham USTRUVYKT, who in 1953 was the manager of the Tokyo Branch of Seedorf Brothers, Incorporated, by which organization Subject was then employed.
7. William Hamilton MARTIN, as reported in cover dispatch.

1. Reference is made to information orally furnished by your office to representatives of this Agency to the effect that William Hartacea JACKSON at one time mentioned the fact that prior to his resignation from his civilian contract employment with the Department of the Army in Tokyo, Japan, and prior to his actual return to the United States in late August or early September 1955, he had been offered a job as a rug salesman by one George PAULS at Tokyo, Japan.

2. A check of the indices of this Agency reveals that "William HARTACE JACKSON as acquaintance, who offered him a job as a 'rug salesman', and who is MAX TILLI called 'George PAULS' is undoubtedly identical with one George S. KALISTER FELJIUS aka MAX TILLI aka PERIS T S LIA POKLUS aka George S. PAULS aka George PAULS, born 4 January 1909 at Constantinople, Turkey, son of Greek nationality, stock birth. According to information provided about to representatives of this Agency by a [redacted] liaison service, George KALISTER FELJIUS in about 1946 abdicated his name to George PAULS. The liaison service added that he operated the Hickok Rug Company in Tianjin and Shanghai, China, as his own business" between 1947 and 1948, at which time the firm was closed down because of the war. Between 1948 and 1953 he was under house arrest, or "referred to his name in Shanghai, but officially was not interned by the Japanese. From 1948 to 1950 he operated the George PAULS CO LTD in Shanghai. He claimed to have been unemployed between 1950 and 1952, at which time he emigrated to Tokyo, Japan, from Shanghai, obtaining employment in Tokyo with the firm of ANDREW CH

ANASTASIOS PAPADAKIS, and in 1953 he became the manager of the Tokyo branch of this firm. In 1954 he established his own firm under the name of PARIS ASSOCIATED INCORPORATED, which firm appears in the trade indices published for Japan, and is reflected in attachment. In 1955 George PARISTIKIPLULIS aka PARIS was appointed to the position of honorary Deputy Greek Consul in Yokohama, in which position he was the deputy to Anastasios A. PAPPADIKULIS aka Anthony A. PAPPADIKULIS, the honorary Greek Consul in Yokohama. PARISTIKIPLULIS appears to have continued in this diplomatic post until sometime in mid 1959, when an official Royal Hellenic Diplomatic Mission to Japan was accredited to the current government of Japan, and the functions of the Yokohama Consular Office were taken over from the two honorary consuls.

3. Liaison reported that on 28 January 1960 George PARISTIKIPLULIS left Tokyo for Seoul, Korea, and that he had not returned to Japan as of 30 August 1960. Through a sensitive source in Seoul, with whom representatives of this Agency are in operational contact, and who is believed to be reliable, it has been ascertained that George PARIS left Naha Airport in Tokyo on 28 January 1960 aboard regular CAT scheduled flight to Seoul, Korea, where he was to assume the position of resident representative in Seoul, Korea, of the firm of CLAGGETT-NELAN COMPANY, INCORPORATED, an export-import firm, with offices in the Hotel Samia, in Seoul. This firm is listed in the Foreign Directory for Seoul as having headquarters in the United States, located at 24 California street, San Francisco, California. PARIS replaced a British national named Julian James PHILIP, as representative of the CLAGGETT-NELAN Company in Korea.

4. On basis of an official inquiry by a representative of our Agency to the United States Embassy in Tokyo, it was learned that the above firm of CLAGGETT-NELAN Company enjoys a good reputation locally and deals in the sale of electrical and mechanical machinery and equipment. It was also learned that the capital stock of the firm is controlled by one Mortimer C. CLAGGETT, Junior, and a Richard W. CHILD, both of whom are United States citizens. The indices of this Agency reveal that Mortimer C. CLAGGETT, Junior, of the above mentioned firm is identical with Mortimer Claggett CHILD, Junior, co-owner with Richard William Nolan CHILD of the firm of BA-JOC TRADING COMPANY INCORPORATED, which has offices in Tokyo, Japan, and is incorporated under the laws of Panama. Information concerning the above firms and regarding Richard & William Nolan CHILD and Mortimer Clappett CHILD, Jr., will be furnished separately.

5. The activities and contacts of George PLASTERPCULUS aka PERIS in Japan and Korea are currently being investigated by the Agency.

6. George S. PLASTERPCULUS aka PLAS, identified above, and known to William H. MARTIN as "George PARS", is identical with the individual whom Valentine HAHN aka Valentine Vasilievich KHN aka VALENTINA HAHN, admitted former (1947) Soviet agent, identified as "George PARS", a Greek businessman in Tokyo, and as one of HAHN's close contacts and friends in Japan. HAHN interviewed by representatives of this Agency in 1958, Valentine HAHN advised that the above "George PARS" was the person who introduced HAHN to a Tokyo nightclub, located off the Ginza, the name of which HAHN gave only as "The Tomorrow Is Too Late Club". HAHN claimed that this was an exact and direct translation into English of the actual Japanese name, which, however, he never mentioned during the interview. Date of HAHN's visit to this "club" is company of George PARS aka PLAS, is estimated to have been somewhere between 1956 and 1957. HAHN stated that in the "Tomorrow Is Too Late Club" he was introduced to a Japanese hostess by the name of Noriko SATSUKAWA alias NORIKO AW AJI, with whom HAHN subsequently enjoyed dates. It is believed that Noriko SATSUKAWA aka AW AJI became the mistress of Valentine HAHN for an undetermined period of time following his original introduction to her at the above "Club" while in the company of George PLASTERPCULUS aka PARS aka PARS. HAHN also advised, that following his original introduction to this establishment by PARS, HAHN had taken a number of married American nationals, who were stationed in Tokyo, to the same club, where such persons had also been introduced to and had enjoyed dates with the hostesses. At this time, there is no information to indicate that either William Hamilton MAHAN or Beressa Ferguson MITCHELL were among the United States nationals HAHN referred to as having been taken to the aforementioned club by PARS. Neither is there any information currently available to reflect that William Hamilton MAHAN was known to Valentine HAHN through their mutual acquaintanceship with George PLASTERPCULUS.

7. As often noted heretofore, we are furnishing a chronologically

organized biographical outline of all information on George PARISTEAPULUS aka PARIS, developed to date. Attachment to this communication indicates that PARIS has been or may still be a contact of MANUEL ABRAHAM USTROVSKY, suspect Soviet Agent, who is the Tokyo Branch Manager of the firm of JUNDVICH SALTHERS INCORPORATED, which firm has long been suspected of being a front or cover organization for Soviet intelligence operations. Attention is invited specifically to the fact that Attachment reflects that the 1954 Japan Directory of Foreign Firms lists a. WITROVSKY as Tokyo representative of this firm, which has offices at 61 - Tanura-cho, 4-chome, Shiba, Minato-ku, Tokyo, and telephone lines: 43-1509, 43-4369, 43-4237, whereas in 1958 subject is officially listed as George PARIS, of PARIS ASSOCIATED IMPORTERS, located at 44-3 Chome, Tanura-cho, Minato-ku, Tokyo, Telephones: 43-1509 and 43-4237, reflecting that he shared telephone numbers with JUNDVICH SALTHERS, and presumably with MANUEL A. USTROVSKY. It is suggested that the Department of the Army, since on the General Chief of Staff, G-2, Intelligence, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation may have additional information on George PARISTEAPULUS aka PARIS and associates.

8. No additional information, to supplement that which is reported in paragraph 6 above, identifiable with NORIKO MATSUZAKAYA & AWAJI, would be located in the indices of this Agency.

9. With reference to the 'Tomorrow is Too Late Club', mentioned in paragraph 5 above, to which Valentine HAHN claims to have been taken by George PARIS, an exact and direct re-translation of the club name into Japanese from the English as given by HAHN, would read "Asu de wa Cesugire". It is noted that the Tokyo Telephone Directory for 1957 contains a listing for an establishment of this name, as follows: ASU DE WA CESUGIRE, located at Chuo-ku, Ginza, 8-Chome, 3-Banchi, Tokyo-to, Telephone Nos.: 57-3945, 57-6363, 57-6328. A reliable source, who is familiar with the city of Tokyo, advised in October 1960, that as of 1959 this establishment was still operating at the listed location, and that it is a coffee-house rather than a nightclub in the western sense, although alcoholic beverages are available for consumption on the premises by the patrons. The same source also advised that the above coffee-house employs Japanese hostesses, as is customary in such establishments in Japan, and that such females might be dated under the circumstances indicated by Valentine HAHN. However, it should be noted

that the same source also indicated that the coffee-house known as ASU DE WA GUSUKIYA to which he was referring, which is identical with the establishment of this name listed in the 1957 Tokyo Directory, is the type of place which is not frequented by general American nationals stationed in or visiting Tokyo as tourists; rather it caters mainly to foreign spouses and their guests, or to foreign residents of Tokyo who have been transferred to the place and the management by indulgent patrons. These foreigners then become regular patrons after becoming known to the management. Inasmuch as the above described ASU DE WA GUSUKIYA coffee-house generally fits the description of the "Tomorrow Is Too Late Club" mentioned by Valentine HAHN as a "night-club" to which he was taken by George PERIS, it is suggested that they are one and the same establishment.

10. In light of the mutual acquaintanceship of WILLIAM H. MARTIN and Valentine HAHN with George FREDERIC LARCPULUS aka PERIS, and in turn, PERIS' role vis-a-vis HAHN's introduction to the ASU DE WA GUSUKIYA coffee-house, it is suggested that PERIS may have played a similar role in terms of introducing William MARTIN to Japanese night-life. This may have eventually led to MARTIN's contact and involvement with Japanese individuals, who introduced him to or indulged his masochistic interests.

11. Additional information on the individuals mentioned above will be forwarded as developed. It is requested that addressees forward to this Agency any information on George FREDERIC LARCPULUS aka PERIS, his contacts and activities, and on the other individuals mentioned herein.

- Mid-1952: Subject and wife from Shanghai, China applied for visas to enter Japan from China. Subject claimed he held Greek Passport A 6/50-1 issued by the Greek Consulate in Shanghai on 26 September 1950 and valid until 9 September 1951.
- Wife held Greek Passport A 26/50-1, issued Shanghai, 19 June 1951, valid until June 14, 1952.
- Subject indicated he was engaged in ~~the~~ ~~some~~ ~~and~~ ~~another~~ business, dealing in raw wool.
- 1952: First entered Japan at Yokohama on 2 February 1952, with status of semi-permanent resident. Stated on arrival in Yokohama to Japanese Police that he had come to Japan "to seek peace and freedom".
- Employed by Tokyo Branch of Sondovitch Brothers, Incorporated, through 1952.
- Other indices consulted reflect that Subject in 1952 operated the firm of George PARIS in Tokyo, Japan during 1952.

Subject reportedly terminated his employment with Sandovich Brothers sometime during 1954, exact date not known, and established his own firm under the name of PARIS ASSOCIATED ENTERPRISES.

The 1954 Japan Directory of Foreign Firms lists SUNDOVICH ENTERPRISES as a United States firm, with offices at 11 - Tacosra-cho, 4-chome, Shiba, Minato-ku, Tokyo, Japan. Telephones: 43-1609, 43-4369, 43-4287, and lists E. OSTROVSKY as the Tokyo Representative.

E. OSTROVSKY, of course, is Emanuel Abraham OSTROVSKY, who is known to have been the Tokyo Branch Manager of the above firm, who resided in 1954 at 19 Kouncho-Mita, Minato-ku, Tokyo. Home telephone: 43-6773.

1955:

Subject continued in his position as President of PARIS ASSOCIATED ENTERPRISES.

In 1955, exact date not specified, Subject was named to the position of Honorary Deputy Greek Consul in Yokohama, in which position he became the Deputy to Antonios I. PAPPADOPoulos, the Honorary Royal Greek Consul in Yokohama.

It is presumed that the Consulate in 1955 was probably located at the same address given in the December 1957 Calmeche "Consular List", which reports the following information:

It should be noted that this is the same address listed for subject and the P.T.O. ASSOCIATE LTD. & PHIS in the preceding year, but there is a change in the telephone exchange.

On 23 January 1966, Subject departed by air from Haneda Airport, Tokyo, ~~according to record~~ from a source believed to be reliable that subject was going to Korea as the Senior Resident Representative of the American-owned firm of Claggett-Nales Company, Inc., which has its home office at 25 California Street in San Francisco, California, and maintains an office in Seoul in the Bande Hotel. Subject allegedly replaced one William James PHILLIPS, a British national, in this post. The capital stock of Claggett-Nales Company, Inc. is controlled by Mortimer Claggett Coeke, Junius, and Richard William Nales CHILL, both American citizens, who are also the principal controlling stockholders and officers of the BALCO TRADING COMPANY, which has its main offices in the Fukushu Building, 2-1 Chisaiwai-cho, 1-Chome, Chiyoda-ku, Tokyo, Japan, but also has branches in Seoul and Pusan, Korea. BALCO TRADING COMPANY also controls another subsidiary firm known as Allied Distributors, incorporated, with which firm Thomas Robert KICK aka Boris YASHIN has been affiliated for a number of years.
