REF : HQ Memo (Vithorne), dated 5 Dec 63, Subj: Pickayay, Donny D., Correspondence with L. Ricciardelli.

1. Mr. Donny D. Pickayay, Aerospace Corp., El Segundo, Calif., has continued to correspond with Aleksei G. Ivakhnenko, Soviet automatic control scientist residing in Kiev. In the most recent letter, Ivakhnenko enclosed an original letter from Ricciardelli written in Moscow, dated 23 June 63, and addressed to Ivakhnenko. On the back side of Ricciardelli's letter Ivakhnenko posted a note to Pickayay, "It seems he is in prison in USA, he cannot forgotten our friendship." This remark is apparently in responsive to a phrase he underlined in Ricciardelli's letter which read "But we can at least write..."

2. Pickayay would like to know if there is any interest in his writing to Ricciardelli and determining his status and forwarding the information to Ivakhnenko. Pickayay has no preference either way, he simply wants to place himself at our (or FBI) disposal and help if he can.

3. Is the referenced memo still effective? It states the FBI has no objection to Pickayay writing him or visiting Ricciardelli, but that they would appreciate copies of correspondence written to him.

4. Also enclosed is a copy of Ivakhnenko's letter to Pickayay. Some immediate questions that are raised by Ricciardelli's letter are:
 (1) Why did Ivakhnenko decide to send the original letter to Pickayay?
 (2) What sort of copies did Ricciardelli promise to furnish Ivakhnenko?
 (See Ricciardelli's letter)
