SGBJECT: Meeting with Manuel FAY in San Jose, Costa Fica

1. I met with Manuel RAY in San Jose, Costa Rica on 7 and 8 August 1964. The meeting was routine; the business transacted is briefly summarized below.

A. No Operations from U.S. Territory

I reiterated to RAY that it was our understanding that he would not launch any operations from U.S. territory. FAY understood and agreed to thin. he did say, however, that rumors of such activity tould possibly reach us for the next few weeks mashich as it would take him some little while to reorient the activities and thinking of some of his followers.

B. IAY Again Plans to infiltrate tuba

within the next 10 to 20 days. This new sifert will be eade from Jazzica! The exact point from which it will be made was not told me, but it is supposedly from land owned by an American living in Jazzica and at a point approximately 60 miles from Cuba. The island of Jazzica itself live more clovely to more than 100 miles off Cuba. PAY is again a little confused on operational details for his speaking of some bit of land closer to Cuba that may actually fall within Jazzican authority.

t. RAY Asks for Apolt onal lanes

iAV made a plea for additional funds up to \$20,500 to order to seatet him in soving son, whips and equipment from the U.S. These exterials and non-will be keved to tosta size and the Cominican opiblic. Involved in these moves are the scapeus manufactured on the West tosat. I savised har that I would raise this issue with the proper sutherities. In our discussion of this need lay considered that with \$15,000 be could completely resolve the matter of the arms manufacture and shipment to Couta Bica from the dest tosat of the U.S.A. The total that he asked for is \$25,000. Please let me know your views on this.

U. The Situation in The Riks

RAY indicated that the leadership of the JURE is united, working effectively together and that despite the set-back they have suffered by hAY's failure to infiltrate, the organization is as strong at this moment as it has been. LAY advised be that the fital JUR mestership, that is, people was have signed application forms and and situally affiliated in a formal samer, in contrast to the loosely-buil manner of Commissions, is between 4 to 0,000. LAY recognics and meating that time is against him and the JURE and instead only action instead taba can reverse this trend.

F. FAY Erects with Prepiacent Collect, Ex-

PAY met with these three sen emediately on arriving in Costa lica. He ndvised me that the comperation of this group is excellent and that he could not ass for better support.

LAY told me that this matter of U.S. feelings toward his organization arose during President Unlich's visit with President Johnson and that it was Orlich's impression that kr. Johnson did not know a great deal about PAY,

but that Er. Mann had joined the conversation to may that both RAY's group and that of AFFIRE were good ones. (-hereas this was FAY's version, Other of Station, San Jose, advised me that Fr. Johnson reportedly stated that AFFIEL was the mero responsible of the two to which President Orlich reportedly countered with, "I think just the opposite is true;" that is, that EAY is the more responsible of the two.)

He asked if it would not be wise to inform the Ambassador
of my presence and activity. I told now that in view of
the fact that State was well aware of our association
with EAY and the possibility that the Ambassador might
hear through other channels of my presence, I agreed
with that he should advise the Ambassador
of my visit. I caltioned that the Ambassador morald
understand that this was for his information only.
