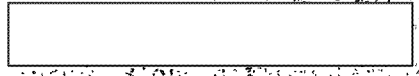

4. Compromise Possibilities

a. Indications of suspected or possible compromise, including references by opposition services:

There is no evidence that subject was ever blown while in Habana. He was arrested several times, but never for a connection with clandestine activities.

No one knows of his association with KUBARK except agents whom he has handled and none of these ~~xxx~~ knows him by true name.

c. Relatives and associates in and out of PERUEN who are witting:

Wife (a PERUEN citizen)

d. Knowledge of other operations and agents, including personal friendships:

Knows handled AMEX-1, AMEAT-1 (presumed dead), AMRYE-1, AMCONCEY-1, AMPARCH-1, AMWRAN-1, AMSTW-1, AMTURVY-1, AMFIN-1, AMSTNG-1, AMCAPCH-4, AMSLWR-1, AMCCCP-1. Has trained several agents under an alias in the WAVE area

5. Operational Use

a. Access to targets:

Not applicable. Subject is working as a WAVE case officer.

b. Targets assigned or projected:

To develop assets for coverage of targets set forth in headquarters requirements.

c. If previously used, production and evaluation:

Excellent work in Habana under difficult conditions.

d. Potential and future plans:

Continued use on the FERUMEN project as set forth above. Subject has long range value as a contract agent or ~~only~~ contract employee in any Spanish ^{speaking} area in Latin America.

e. Spotting leads, past or potential:

Subject recruited several agents in Habana. Under present circumstances he must rely on outside assets for this type of activity for the most part.

f. Access, current or potential, to persons with government connections in target areas:

None

7 Present evaluations and comments: Subject is industrious, should have no trouble living a cover in Latin America, speaks native Spanish, has firm area knowledge based on residence and study, has proved that he can work overseas under adverse conditions. He is a good teacher, and likes to teach, and would be qualified for training work as well as work as an agent manager. In short, subject is a fine agent and has long range value for the organization. He has proved useful in the WAVE office and is needed inside under present personnel conditions. His main weaknesses for inside work are faulty knowledge of KUBARK procedures (certainly not his fault and he is learning satisfactorily) and difficulty in using the written word in English. His Spanish is probably the best at this station, a very helpful asset since our communication with internal agents is almost exclusively in Spanish.
